#### SUGAR

THE CONTROL OF PRICES ORDINANCE, NO 39 OF 1939

#### Order

BY virtue of the powers vested in the Deputy Controller of Prices (Food), by section 3 (read with section 2 (3)) of the Control of Prices Ordinance, No 39 of 1939, as amended by Defence (Control of Prices) (Supplementary Provisions No 2) Regulations, I, Wilfrid Ernest Hobday, Deputy Controller of Prices (Food), Colombo District, do by this Order—

- (1) revoke with effect from this date my Order dated June 18, 1943, published in the *Ceylon Government Gazette* No 9,141 of June 25, 1943, in respect of sugar,
- (2) (a) fix the price which is for the time being fixed by the Controller of Prices (Food) as the maximum whole sale price within the Municipal limits of the town of Colombo for a particular packing of sugar of any description specified in the First Schedule hereto, increased by the excess calculated with the factor specified in column 2 of the Third Schedule hereto, in accordance with the directions contained in the Second Schedule hereto, to be the maximum wholesale price above which that packing of sugar of that description shall not be sold by wholesale in the areas mentioned in the corresponding entry in column 1 of the Third Schedule hereto,
- (b) fix the price which is for the time being fixed by the Controller of Prices (Food) as the maximum retail price per pound of sugar of any description specified in the First Schedule hereto, increased by the amount specified in column 3 of the Third Schedule hereto to be the maximum retail price per pound above which sugar of that description shall not be sold by retail in the areas mentioned in the corresponding entry in column 1 of the Third Schedule hereto,
- (3) direct that for the purpose of this Order—
  - (a) any sale of any quantity of sugar for the purpose of resale shall be deemed to be a sale by wholesale,
  - (b) any sale of any quantity of sugar for the purpose of consumption or use shall be deemed to be a sale by retail,
  - (c) "wholesale dealer" shall mean any person who has been selected by me or by an Assistant Government Agent (Emergency) as such,
  - (d) "sugar" shall exclude all forms of jaggery,
- (4) direct that provisions of paragraphs 4, 5, and 6 of the Order dated June 18, 1943, published in the *Ceylon Government Gazette* No 9,141 of June 25, 1943, relating to sugar shall apply to this Order as though they were herein embodied

BY virtue of the powers vested in the Controller of Prices by section 3 of the Control of Prices Ordinance, No 39 of 1939, as amended by paragraph (2) of the Defence (Control of Prices) (Supplementary Provisions No 2) Regulations, I, Cedric Francis Ingledow, Controller of Prices (Miscellaneous Articles), do, by this Order—

- (1) fix the prices specified in column 2 of the Schedule hereto, to be the maximum prices above which the articles of the description specified in column 1 of the Schedule hereto shall not be sold in Ceylon

- (ii) direct that every dealer, who at any premises in Ceylon, sells Hill Diesel Engines and Electric Motors of the description specified in column 1 of the Schedule hereto shall exhibit in a conspicuous position at those premises the maximum prices fixed by this Order for Hill Diesel Engines and Electric Motors of that description,
- (iii) direct that every person who sells any article of the description specified in column 1 of the Schedule hereto shall give to every purchaser of such article, on demand, a receipt in which there shall be set out—
- the quantity and description of the article sold,
  - the price paid, and
  - the date and place of sale

BY virtue of the powers vested in the Controller of Prices by section 3 of the Control of Prices Ordinance, No 39 of 1939, as amended by paragraph (2) of the Defence (Control of Prices) (Supplementary Provisions No 2) Regulations, I, Cedric Francis Ingledow, Controller of Prices (Miscellaneous Articles), do, by this Order—

- revoke with effect from this date Order dated February 25, 1943, published in *Government Gazette* No 9,090 of February 26, 1943, in so far as it relates to the maximum prices fixed in respect of Galvanized piping 4" mentioned in the First Schedule thereto,
- fix the prices specified in columns 2 and 3 of the Schedule hereto to be, respectively, the maximum wholesale prices and the maximum retail prices above which galvanized piping of the description and size specified in the corresponding entries of column 1 of the Schedule hereto shall not be sold in Ceylon,
- direct that for the purposes of this Order—
  - any sale for the purpose of resale of any quantity of galvanized piping specified in column 1 of the Schedule hereto shall be deemed to be a sale by wholesale,
  - any sale for the purpose of use of any quantity of any galvanized piping specified in column 1 of the Schedule hereto shall be deemed to be a sale by retail,
  - "maximum wholesale price" shall apply to all sales by wholesale,
  - "maximum retail price" shall apply to all sales by retail,
- direct that every dealer who, at any premises in Ceylon, sells any galvanized piping of the description and size specified in column 1 of the Schedule hereto, shall exhibit in a conspicuous position at those premises the maximum prices fixed by this Order for galvanized piping of that description and size,
- direct that every person who sells any galvanized piping of the description and size specified in the Schedule hereto shall give to every purchaser of such articles on demand a receipt in which there shall be set out—
  - the quantity, description and size of the galvanized piping sold,
  - the price paid, and
  - the date of the sale

BY virtue of powers vested in the Deputy Controller of Prices (Food), by section 3, read with section 2 (3), of the Control of Prices Ordinance, No 39 of 1939, as amended by Defence (Control of Prices) (Supplementary Provisions No 2) Regulations, I, Stuart Murray Duff, Deputy Controller of Prices, Vavuniya District, do, by this Order—

- revoke with effect from this date my order dated November 10, 1942, and published in *Government Gazette* No 9,033 of November 13, 1942, in so far as it relates to the maximum prices of country paddy,
- fix the prices specified in columns 2 and 3 of the Schedule hereto to be, respectively, the maximum wholesale price per bag, and the maximum retail price per measure, above which country paddy shall not be sold in the areas mentioned in the corresponding entry in column 1 of the Schedule hereto,
- direct that every trader, who sells country paddy in the areas mentioned in column 1 of the Schedule hereto, shall exhibit in a conspicuous position at his premises (store or boutique) a notice in which there shall be set out the maximum prices for country paddy fixed by this Order,
- direct that no person shall sell country paddy which is adulterated with any other article,
- direct that every person who sells country paddy by wholesale shall and every person who sells country paddy by retail shall, on demand, give the purchaser of that country paddy a receipt in which there shall be set out—
  - the date of sale,
  - the quantity of country paddy sold,
  - the price paid for the quantity of country paddy sold, and
  - the nature of the transaction, that is to say, whether the sale was by wholesale or by retail, and
- direct that for the purpose of this Order—
  - any sale of any quantity of country paddy for the purpose of resale shall be deemed to be a sale by wholesale,
  - any sale of any quantity of country paddy for the purpose of consumption or use by the purchaser shall be deemed to be a sale by retail,
  - "measure" shall be deemed to be the standard quart, dry measure, and
  - the maximum wholesale price which may be demanded for any quantity of country paddy which is less than one bag shall be determined by reference to the maximum wholesale price per bag fixed by this Order

## BENGAL GRAM, DRY GINGER AND PEAS

THE CONTROL OF PRICES ORDINANCE, No 39 OF 1939

## Order

BY virtue of powers vested in the Deputy Controller of Prices (Food), by section 3, read with section 2 (3) of the Control of Prices Ordinance, No 39 of 1939, I, Stuart Murray Duff, Deputy Controller of Prices (Food), Vavuniya District, do, by this Order—

- (i) fix the prices specified in columns 2 and 3 of the Schedule hereto to be the maximum price per hundred weight wholesale and maximum retail price per pound, respectively, above which any article of the description and grade mentioned in column 1 of the Schedule hereto shall not be sold in the areas mentioned in columns 2 and 3 of the Schedule hereto,
- (ii) direct that for the purpose of this Order—
  - (a) any sale of any quantity of any article for the purpose of resale or any sale of any article in a quantity of one hundredweight or more at a time shall be deemed to be a sale by wholesale,
  - (b) any sale of any quantity less than one hundred weight of any article for the purpose of consumption or use by the purchaser shall be deemed to be a sale by retail,
  - (c) "wholesale dealer" shall mean any person who is in the habit of selling by wholesale any article mentioned in column 1 of the Schedule hereto,
  - (d) "maximum wholesale price" shall apply to all sales by wholesale,
  - (e) "maximum retail price" shall apply to all sales by retail,
- (iii) direct that no trader shall sell any article of any description and grade mentioned in column 1 of the Schedule hereto which is adulterated with any other article or with an article of an inferior description and grade or quality,
- (iv) direct that no trader who at any premises within the limits of the areas mentioned in columns 2 and 3 of the Schedule hereto sells any article of the description and grade mentioned in column 1 of the Schedule hereto, shall exhibit in a conspicuous position at those premises, a notice on which there shall be set out the maximum price fixed by this Order in respect of that article of that description and grade,
- (v) direct that every person who sells by wholesale any article of the description and grade mentioned in column 1 of the Schedule hereto shall, on demand, give the purchaser of that article a receipt in which there shall be set out—
  - (a) the date of the sale,
  - (b) the description and grade of the article sold,
  - (c) the weight of the article sold,
  - (d) the price paid for the article sold, and
  - (e) the nature of the transaction, that is to say, whether the sale was by wholesale or retail

## Order

BY virtue of the powers vested in the Deputy Controller of Prices (Food), by section 3, (read with section 2 (3)), of the Control of Prices Ordinance, No 39 of 1939, as amended by the Defence (Control of Prices) (Supplementary Provisions) Regulations, I, Philip James Hudson, Deputy Controller of Prices (Food), Kalutara District, do, by this Order—

- (1) revoke my Order dated March 29, 1943, published in *Government Gazette* No 9,106 of April 2, 1943, in so far as it relates to the maximum retail prices fixed in respect of the articles specified in column 1 of the First Schedule thereto,
- (2) fix the prices which are for the time being fixed by the Order of the Controller of Prices (Food), as the maximum retail prices per pound above which the articles of the descriptions and grades specified in column 1 of the First Schedule hereto shall not be sold within the Municipal limits of the town of Colombo, increased by the amounts specified in column 2 of the Second Schedule hereto, as the maximum retail prices per pound above which the articles of those descriptions and grades shall not be sold in the areas specified in the corresponding entries in column 1 of the Second Schedule hereto,
- (3) direct that for the purposes of this Order Curry Powder shall mean any mixture containing any two or more of the following curyrustuffs in powdered form—  
chillies, coriander, pepper, cummin seed, fennel seed, mathe seed, turmeric, cinnamon, cloves, cardamoms, nutmeg, and salt,
- (4) direct that no person shall sell any powdered chillies mixed with any article or articles other than one or more of the following—  
coriander, pepper cummin seed, fennel seed, mathe seed, turmeric, cinnamon, cloves, cardamom, nutmeg and salt
- (5) direct that no person shall sell any powdered chillies mixed with any other article or articles, as allowed by clause (3) above, unless the mixture contains not less than 20 per cent of powdered chillies by weight,
- (6) direct that no person shall sell any curry powder containing any article or articles other than those specified in clause (2) above,
- (7) direct that no person shall sell any curry powder made by the India Condiment Co for the Government of Ceylon, except in unopened one pound packets bearing the following marks—

1 lb nett

- (8) direct that every trader who at any premises within the limits of any area specified in column 1 of the Second Schedule hereto sells any article of the description and grade specified in column 1 of the First Schedule hereto shall exhibit in a conspicuous place at those premises a notice on which there shall be set out the maximum prices fixed by this Order in respect of those articles,
- (9) direct that every person who sells any article of the description and grade specified in column 1 of the First Schedule hereto shall give the purchaser of that article on demand a receipt in which there shall be set out—
  - (a) the date of the sale,
  - (b) the weight of the quantity sold,
  - (c) the description of the article sold (specifying whether it contains chilly powder or not),
  - (d) the price paid for the quantity sold,
  - (e) the nature of the transaction, that is to say whether the sale was by wholesale or by retail,

- (10) direct that for the purposes of this Order—

- (a) any sale of any quantity of any article for the purpose of resale shall be deemed to be a sale by wholesale,
- (b) any sale of any quantity of any article for the purpose of consumption or use shall be deemed to be a sale by retail
