DRUGS.

THE CONTROL OF PRICES ORDINANCE, NO 39 OF 1939

Order

BY virtue of the powers vested in the Deputy Controller of Prices by section 3 read with section 2 (3) of the Control of Prices Ordinance, No 39 of 1939, as amended by paragraph (2) of the Defence (Control of Prices) (Supplementary Provisions No 2) Regulations, I, Seemampillai Francis Chellappah, Deputy Controller of Prices (Miscellaneous Articles), for the Island of Ceylon, do, by this Order—

- (i) fix the prices specified in columns 2 and 3 of the Schedule hereto to be respectively the maximum wholesale price and the maximum retail price above which drugs of the description specified in the corresponding entries in column 1 of the Schedule hereto shall not be sold in any part of Ceylon,
- (ii) direct that every person, who at any premises in Ceylon sells any drugs of the description, specified in column 1 of the Schedule hereto, shall exhibit in a conspicuous position at those premises a notice in which there shall be set out the maximum prices fixed by this Order in respect of drugs of that description
- (iii) direct that any person, who at any premises deals or has at any time during the three months prior to this date dealt in any of the drugs of the description mentioned in column 1 of the Schedule hereto and has for the time being no stocks of such drugs available for sale, shall exhibit in a conspicuous position at those premises a notice to the effect that he has no stocks available for sale for the time being,
- (iv) direct that no person shall sell any of the drugs of the description mentioned in column 1 of the Schedule hereto which is adulterated with any other article or with drugs of an inferior description or grade or quality,
- (v) direct that every person whether carrying on business as an importer or dealer in drugs or not who has in his possession a stock of any of the drugs of the description mentioned in column 1 of the Schedule hereto shall furnish me with a return addressed to the Office of the Director of Medical and Sanitary Services, Colombo, within three days of the publication of this Order in the *Government Gazette*, stating the following particulars —
 - (a) the address of every premises in which are contained any of these drugs in his possession or under his control,
 - (b) the quantity and description of drugs in each store,
- (vi) direct that every person who sells any drugs of the description specified in column 1 of the Schedule hereto shall give to every purchaser of that drug on demand a receipt in which there shall be set out—
 - (a) the date of sale,
 - (b) the description of the drugs sold,
 - (c) the quantity of the drugs sold, and
 - (d) the price paid

- (6) direct that every trader who at any premises within the limits of the town of Matale or in the areas mentioned in column 1 of the Second Schedule hereto sells sugar of any description and grade mentioned in the First Schedule hereto shall exhibit in a conspicuous position at those premises a notice on which there shall be set out the maximum prices fixed by this Order in respect of sugar of that description and grade,

- direct that for the purpose of this Order—

(c) "measure" shall be deemed to be the standard quart, dry measure, and

(d) the maximum wholesale price which may be demanded for any quantity of rice which is less than one bag shall be determined by reference to the maximum wholesale price per bag of 80 measures fixed by this Order

- direct that every person who sells flour by wholesale shall and every person who sells flour by retail shall on demand give the purchaser of that flour a receipt in which there shall be set out,

- the date of the sale,
- the quantity of flour sold,
- the price paid for the quantity of flour sold,
- the nature of the transaction, that is to say whether the sale was by wholesale or by retail and

- (6) direct that for the purpose of this Order—

- any sale of any quantity of flour for the purpose of resale shall be deemed to be a sale by wholesale,
- any sale of any quantity of flour for the purpose of consumption or use shall be deemed to be a sale by retail,
- any sale of any quantity of flour to bakeries, eating houses and hotels shall be deemed to be a sale by wholesale,
- the maximum wholesale price which may be demanded for any quantity of flour which is less than one bag shall be determined by reference to the maximum wholesale price per bag of 150 lb fixed by this Order

RAZOR BLADES.

THE CONTROL OF PRICES ORDINANCE, No 39 OF 1939

Order

BY virtue of the powers vested in the Controller of Prices by section 3 of the Control of Prices Ordinance, No 39 of 1939, as amended by paragraph (2) of the Defence (Control of Prices) (Supplementary Provisions No 2) Regulations, I, Cedric Francis Ingledow, Controller of Prices (Miscellaneous Articles), do, by this Order—

- (i) revoke with effect from this date Order dated August 18, 1943, published in *Government Gazette* No 9,159 of August 20, 1943, in respect of "Chade" blades,
- (ii) fix the prices specified in columns 2 and 3 of the Schedule hereto to be, respectively, the maximum whole sale price and the maximum retail price above which razor blades of the description specified in the corresponding entry in column 1 of the Schedule shall not be sold in any part of Ceylon,
- (iii) direct that for the purpose of this Order—
 - (a) any sale for the purpose of resale or any sale of ten or more packets of the razor blades referred in the Schedule hereto, to any one person in the course of one transaction, shall be deemed to be a sale by wholesale,
 - (b) any sale of razor blades, referred to in the Schedule hereto, other than a sale by wholesale as defined above, shall be deemed to be a sale by retail,
- (iv) direct that any trader, who, at any premises in Ceylon, sells any razor blades of the description specified in the Schedule hereto, shall exhibit in a conspicuous position at those premises a notice on which there shall be set out the maximum prices fixed by this Order in respect of razor blades of that description,
- (v) direct that every trader who has at any time during the three months prior to this date dealt in any razor blades of the description specified in column 1 of the Schedule hereto and has for the time being no stocks of it available for sale, shall exhibit in a conspicuous position at his premises a notice to the effect that he has no stocks of such razor blades available for sale for the time being,
- (vi) direct that every trader who sells any razor blades of the description specified in column 1 of the Schedule shall give to every purchaser of such razor blades, on demand, a receipt in which there shall be set out—
 - (a) the quantity and description of the razor blades sold
 - (b) the price paid,
 - (c) the date of the sale, and
 - (d) the nature of the transaction, that is to say, whether the sale was by wholesale or by retail

THE CONTROL OF PRICES ORDINANCE, No 39 OF 1939

Order

BY virtue of the powers vested in the Deputy Controller of Prices (Food), by section 3, read with section 2 (3), of the Control of Prices Ordinance, No 39 of 1939, as amended by the Defence (Control of Prices) (Supplementary Provisions) Regulations, I, Richard Morgan Davies, Deputy Controller of Prices (Food), Jaffna District, do, by this Order—

- (i) revoke with effect from this date my Order dated June 18, 1943, and published in *Government Gazette* No 9,141 of June 25, 1943, in so far as it relates to the maximum prices fixed in respect of sugar of the description and grade specified in column 2 of the Schedule hereto,
- (ii) fix the prices which are for the time being fixed by the Order of the Controller of Prices as the maximum wholesale price per cwt gross and the maximum retail price per pound, above which sugar of the description and grade specified in column 2 of the Schedule hereto shall not be sold within the Municipal limits of Colombo, increased by the amounts specified in columns 3, 4, and 5 respectively of the Schedule hereto, as the Controller's maximum price per cwt gross, maximum wholesale price per cwt gross and the maximum retail price per pound, above which sugar of those descriptions and grades shall not be sold within the limits of the areas mentioned in the corresponding entry in column 1 of the Schedule hereto,
- (iii) direct that for the purpose of this Order, the Controller's maximum price shall apply to the sale by the Deputy Controller of Prices, Jaffna, of stores of the sugar of the descriptions and grades specified in column 2 of the Schedule hereto to a wholesale distributor
- (iv) direct that for the purpose of this Order—
 - (a) any sale of any quantity of sugar for the purpose of resale or any sale of sugar in a quantity of one hundred weight or more at a time shall be deemed to be a sale by wholesale,
 - (b) any sale of any quantity of sugar less than one hundred weight for the purpose of consumption or use shall be deemed to be a sale by retail,
 - (c) "sugar" shall exclude all forms of jaggery,
- (v) direct that for the purpose of this Order, the provisions of paragraphs (viii) to (x) of my Order on sugar dated June 18, 1943, and published in *Government Gazette* No 9,141 of June 25, 1943, shall apply to this Order, as though they were herein embodied
