THE CONTROL OF PRICES ORDINANCE, No 39 OF 1939

Order

BY virtue of the powers vested in the Controller of Prices (Food) by section 3 of the Control of Prices Ordinance, No 39 of 1939, as amended by Defence (Control of Prices) (Supplementary Provisions No 2) Regulations, I, Reginald Sydney Veinon Poulter, Controller of Prices (Food), do, by this Order—

- (i) revoke with effect from this date the Order issued in respect of curydstuffs by the Assistant Controller of Prices (Food) dated August 19, 1943, published in *Government Gazette* No 9,159 of August 20, 1943,
- (ii) fix the prices specified in columns 2, 3 and 4 of the Schedule hereto to be, respectively, the importer's maximum price, the maximum wholesale price and the maximum retail price above which the article of the description specified in the corresponding entry in column 1 of that Schedule shall not be sold by wholesale or by retail, as the case may be, within the Municipal limits of the town of Colombo,
- (iii) direct that the provisions of paragraphs (ii) to (vi) of my Order in respect of curydstuffs dated November 16, 1942, published in *Government Gazette Extraordinary* No 9,036 of November 16, 1942, shall apply to this Order as though they were herein embodied

DRUGS.

THE CONTROL OF PRICES ORDINANCE, No 39 OF 1939

Order

BY virtue of the powers vested in the Controller of Prices by section 3 of the Control of Prices Ordinance, No 39 of 1939, as amended by paragraph (2) of the Defence (Control

of Prices) (Supplementary Provisions No 2) Regulations, I, Cedric Francis Ingledow, Controller of Prices (Miscellaneous Articles), do, by this Order—

- (i) fix the prices specified in columns 2 and 3 of the Schedule hereto to be respectively the maximum wholesale price and the maximum retail price above which drugs of the description specified in the corresponding entries in column 1 of the Schedule hereto shall not be sold in any part of Ceylon,
- (ii) direct that every person, who at any premises in Ceylon sells any drugs of the description, specified in column 1 of the Schedule hereto, shall exhibit in a conspicuous position at those premises a notice in which there shall be set out the maximum prices fixed by this Order in respect of the drugs of that description,
- (iii) direct that any person, who at any premises deals or has at any time during the three months prior to this date dealt in any of the drugs of the description mentioned in column 1 of the Schedule hereto and has for the time being no stocks of such drugs available for sale, shall exhibit in a conspicuous position at those premises a notice to the effect that he has no stocks available for sale for the time being,
- (iv) direct that no person shall sell any of the drugs of the description mentioned in column 1 of the Schedule hereto which is adulterated with any other article or with drugs of an inferior description or grade or quality,
- (v) direct that every person whether carrying on business as an importer or dealer in drugs or not who has in his possession a stock of any of the drugs of the description mentioned in column 1 of the Schedule hereto shall furnish to the Director of Medical and Sanitary Services, Colombo, within three days of publication of this Order in the *Government Gazette* a return stating—
 - (a) the address of every premises in which are contained any of these drugs in his possession or under his control,
 - (b) the quantity and description of drugs in each store,
- (vi) direct that every person who sells any drugs of the description specified in column 1 of the Schedule hereto shall give to every purchaser of that drug on demand a receipt in which there shall be set out—
 - (a) the date of sale,
 - (b) the description of the drugs sold,
 - (c) the quantity of drugs sold, and
 - (d) the price paid

BY virtue of the powers vested in the Deputy Controller of Prices (Food), by section 3 (read with section 2 (3)) of the Control of Prices Ordinance, No 39 of 1939, as amended by Defence (Control of Prices) (Supplementary Provisions No 2) Regulations, I, Benjamin Franklin Perera, Deputy Controller of Prices (Food), do, by this Order—

- (i) revoke with effect from this date my Order in respect of Chilly Powder and Curry Powder dated July 10, 1943, published in *Government Gazette* No 9,148 of July 16, 1943,
- (ii) fix the prices specified in columns 2 and 3 of the Schedule hereto to be respectively, the maximum wholesale price per pound and the maximum retail price per pound above which the articles of the description specified in the corresponding entry in column 1 of the Schedule hereto shall not be sold by wholesale or by retail as the case may be, within the Revenue District of Kegalla,
- (iii) direct that the provisions of paragraphs 2 to 9 of my Order in respect of chilly powder and curry powder dated July 10, 1943, published in the *Government Gazette* No 9,148 of July 16, 1943, shall apply to this Order as though they were herein embodied

BY virtue of the powers vested in the Deputy Controller of Prices (Food), by section 3 (read with section 2 (3)) of the Control of Prices Ordinance, No 39 of 1939, as amended by Defence (Control of Prices) (Supplementary Provisions No 2) Regulations, I, Benjamin Franklin Perera, Deputy Controller of Prices, Kegalla District, do, by this Order—

- (i) revoke with effect from this date my Order fixing the maximum retail price of bread within the Revenue District of Kegalla, dated December 20, 1942, and published in *Government Gazette* No 9,055 of December 24, 1942, in so far as it relates to the maximum retail price fixed for—
“Any loaf weighing less than 8 oz”
- (ii) fix the price specified in column 2 of the Schedule here to be the maximum retail price of bread, above which bread of the description and grade mentioned in column 1 of the said Schedule shall not be sold within the Revenue District of Kegalla
