THE DEFENCE (MISCELLANEOUS) REGULATIONS.

ORDER made by the Governor under regulation 43D of the Defence (Miscellaneous) Regulations.

Order.

1. This Order may be cited as the Controlled Articles (Surgical Rubber Goods) Order, 1943.

2. Surgical rubber goods of the description specified in the Schedule hereto are hereby declared to be controlled articles within the meaning and for the purposes of regulation 43D of the Defence (Miscellaneous) Regulations.

3. (1) Every person who, on the date on which this Order is published in the *Gazette*, has in his possession or under his control a stock of any scheduled article shall, within fourteen days from that date, furnish to the Controller a return setting out—

- (a) the name and address and the place of business (if there is a place of business) of that person;
- (b) the description, size, make and quantity of such stock; and
- (c) the situation of the premises in which such stock is kept or stored.

(2) Every person who, after the date on which this Order is published in the *Gazette*, imports any scheduled article shall, within three days from the date on which he takes delivery of that article, furnish to the Controller a return setting out the particulars specified in the foregoing sub-paragraph (1).

(3) Where two or more premises are used by any person for keeping or storing any scheduled article in his possession or under his control a separate return shall be furnished in respect of the stock kept in each such premises.

4. (1) Except under the authority of a permit, no person who is required by paragraph 3 to furnish a return shall—

- (a) appropriate to his own use any quantity of any scheduled article in his possession or under his control; or
- (b) remove or permit the removal of any quantity of any such article from the premises specified in such return.

(2) Except under the authority of a permit, no authorised dealer (not being a person required by paragraph 3 (1) to furnish a return) shall—

- (a) appropriate to his own use any quantity of any scheduled article in his possession or under his control; or
- (b) remove or permit the removal of any quantity of any such article from the premises at which he carries on business.

(3) No permit under the preceding provisions of this paragraph shall be required for the purpose of authorising the removal of any quantity of any scheduled article which is sold or otherwise disposed of in accordance with the provisions of this Order.

5. (1) No importer shall sell or otherwise dispose of any quantity of any scheduled article to any person other than an authorised dealer.

(2) No importer shall sell or otherwise dispose of any quantity of any scheduled article to any authorised dealer unless that dealer is the holder of a general or special permit authorising him to purchase or otherwise acquire that quantity from that importer, or otherwise than in accordance with such terms and conditions as may be specified in the permit.

6. No authorised dealer shall sell or otherwise dispose of any quantity of any scheduled article to any person except upon the surrender by that person of a permit authorising him to purchase or otherwise acquire that quantity from that dealer.

7. Except under the authority of a permit, no person shall purchase or otherwise acquire any quantity of any scheduled article.

8. No person not being an importer or an authorised dealer shall sell or supply any scheduled article to any other person:

Provided that the preceding provisions of this paragraph shall not be deemed to prohibit any person who has furnished a return under paragraph 3 (1) and who has not been appointed to be an authorised dealer from selling or otherwise disposing of the stock of any scheduled article specified in such return in accordance with such directions as may be given to him by the Controller.

9. The Controller may in his discretion appoint such number of persons as he may deem necessary to be authorised dealers for the purpose of selling or supplying any scheduled article.

10. Every application for a permit under this Order shall be made to the Controller in such form as may be prescribed by him by notification published in the *Gazette*.

11. (1) The Controller may in his discretion—
 (a) refuse to grant a permit under this Order to any applicant therefor;
 (b) determine and specify in any permit the terms and conditions subject to which such permit is granted;
 (c) alter, add to or rescind any of the terms and conditions of any permit.
- (2) Every decision or determination of the Controller under the preceding sub-paragraph shall be final.
- (3) Every person to whom a permit is granted under this Order shall comply with the terms and conditions specified in such permit.
12. No person to whom a permit is granted under this Order shall—
 (a) transfer the permit to any other person; or
 (b) use the article obtained on such permit for any purpose other than the purpose specified in the application made in respect of that permit.
13. The Controller may cancel the appointment of any person as an authorised dealer if the Controller is satisfied after such inquiry as he may deem necessary that such dealer has contravened or failed to comply with any provision of this Order.
14. Every importer and every authorised dealer shall—
 (a) keep and maintain in such form as may be approved by the Controller for the purpose such records or registers relating to his stock of scheduled articles as the Controller may by notice require him to maintain; and
 (b) furnish to the Controller such returns or other information relating to such stocks as the Controller may from time to time by notice require him to furnish.
15. Every return and every application made under this Order shall be verified by a declaration to the effect that the particulars contained therein are true and accurate.
16. The Controller or any officer authorised by him in writing may for the purpose of verifying the correctness of any information furnished or any record maintained by any importer or authorised dealer in pursuance of this Order or for the purpose of securing compliance with the provisions of this Order—
 (a) enter the premises at which such importer or dealer carries on business or keeps his stocks of any scheduled article;
 (b) inspect the stock of any scheduled article kept on the premises; or
 (c) inspect and take copies of any record, books or accounts kept by such importer or dealer (whether in pursuance of this Order or otherwise) in relation to his stock of scheduled articles.
17. The powers conferred on the Controller by this Order may be exercised on his behalf by any officer acting under his general or special directions.
18. In this Order, unless the context otherwise requires—
 "Controller" means the Director of Medical and Sanitary Services;
 "importer" means any person who imports any scheduled article into Ceylon;
 "permit" means a permit issued by the Controller under this Order;
 "scheduled article" means any article described in the Schedule hereto.

THE EMERGENCY POWERS (DEFENCE) ACTS,
1939 AND 1940.

DEFENCE regulation made by the Governor by virtue of the powers vested in him by the Emergency Powers (Defence) Acts, 1939 and 1940, of the Imperial Parliament, as adapted, modified and extended to Ceylon by the Emergency Powers (Colonial Defence) Order in Council, 1939, and the Emergency Powers (Colonial Defence) (Amendment) Order in Council, 1940.

Regulation.

The Defence (Miscellaneous) Regulations, published in the *Supplement to Gazette* No. 3,533 of October 20, 1939, as amended by any subsequent defence regulation, are hereby further

amended in regulation 32H by the insertion immediately after paragraph (5) thereof, of the following new paragraphs:—

"(6) Where any person, having been required under this regulation to perform services or accept employment as a member of the crew of any ship, joins that ship but neglects or refuses to sign, or to attend for the purpose of signing, the agreement with the crew in accordance with the Merchant Shipping Act, 1894, and the Merchant Shipping Ordinance, there shall be inserted in place of his signature a note (to be authenticated in the same manner as his signature is required to be attested under the said Act and the said Ordinance) indicating his failure to sign the agreement and the nature of the requirement in pursuance of which he joined the ship, and thereupon the agreement shall for all purposes have effect as if he had signed it and he shall be deemed to be lawfully engaged as a member of the crew.

(7) Where such a note as aforesaid is inserted in an agreement with the crew and authenticated as aforesaid, it shall be presumed to have been properly inserted unless the contrary is proved."

The Controlled Articles (Cement) Order, 1943, published in *Gazette Extraordinary* No. 9,085 of February 13, 1943, as amended by Order published in *Gazette Extraordinary* No. 9,186 of October 28, 1943, is hereby further amended by the insertion, immediately after paragraph 9B of that Order, of the following paragraph:—

"9c. No person who obtains any cement on a permit issued under this Order shall use or cause or permit the use of that cement for any purpose other than that specified in the application for such permit."

(1) The raising and maintenance of a coconut plantation of over ten acres in extent and the disposal of coconuts from such plantation otherwise than by conversion into copra, desiccated coconut, coconut oil, or coir products; including—

(a) felling, burning and clearing jungle and old coconut land;

(b) draining and terracing;

Harvesting of Paddy in Galle District.

2. After a record of such paddy is taken, the cultivators or proprietors may remove their paddy to their barns or places of storage on a written pass obtained from the Food Production Overseer or Village Headman concerned.

3. Any cultivator or proprietor wishing to remove any paddy outside any of the above Chief Headman's or Divisional Revenue Officer's Divisions should obtain a permit from this Kachcheri.

4. Paddy realized at the harvest should be retained in the threshing floors until coupons therefor are collected and allowances made, the surplus being held at my disposal.

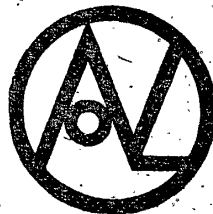
