THE URBAN COUNCILS ORDINANCE.

Order under sections 21 and 30.

BY virtue of the powers vested in me by sections 21 and 30 of the Urban Councils Ordinance, No. 61 of 1939; I, Andrew Caldecott, Governor of Ceylon, do by this Order—

(1) revoke, subject to the provisions of the paragraph (4), the Order relating to the number of members of the Beruwala Urban Council and to the number and limits of the electoral divisions of the town of Beruwala published in Gazette No. 7,927 of June 2, 1932;

(2) order under section 30 that, subject to the provisions of paragraph (4), the Beruwala Urban Council shall consist of eight members and the town of Beruwala

consist of eight members and the town of Beruwala shall be divided into eight electoral divisions with the limits defined in the Schedule hereto;

(3) order under section 21 that, for the purposes of the general election of the members of the Beruwala Urban Council to be held next after the date hereof and for the purposes of the application of the provisions of the aforesaid Ordinance in any matter and for the purposes of the application of the provi-sions of the aforesaid Ordinance in any matter relating or incidental to or connected with that election, the order set out in paragraph (2) shall be deemed to be operative on any day, prior to the day specified in paragraph (4), on which it may be necessary that that order should be so operative; and

(4) declare that the provisions of paragraphs (1) and (2) shall come into effect on the day immediately following the date of expiration of the term of office of the members of the Beruwala Urban Council who are in office at the date hereof.

Limits of the Electoral Divisions of the Town of Beruwala.

Electoral Division No. 1-Polkotuwa.

North: From the western extremity of the northern limit of the Urban Council area eastwards along the said limit to the western limit of Karandagoda Village.

East: From the last mentioned point south-westwards along the centre line of Kappittangoda Road to the centre of the junction with Akkaragoda Road, thence south-eastwards along the centre line of the said road to the centre of the junction with Deenagoda Road.

South: From the last mentioned point westwards along the centre line of Deenagoda Road to a point in prolongation of the eastern boundary of the Muslim Boys' School premises, thence southwards along the said line of prolongation to the eastern boundary of the said school premises, thence south-wards, westwards and northwards along the eastern, southern and western boundaries of the said school premises to the centre of Deenagoda Road in prolongation of the western boundary of the said school premises, thence westwards and south-westwards along the centre line of the said road to the eastern limit of Electoral Division No. 1.



- 2. No person shall construct or place over a side drain any bridge, platform, or other structure of any kind, except with the written consent of the Chairman, or otherwise than in accordance with such conditions and such directions regarding the manner of construction as he may impose or issue.
- 3. The owner or occupier of every building or premises, to which access from any public street, road, or path is provided by means of a bridge, platform, or other structure constructed or placed over a side drain, shall maintain such bridge, platform, or other structure at all times in a sound and serviceable condition.
- 4. Where the Chairman is of opinion that a bridge, platform, or other structure should be constructed or placed over a side drain in order to provide access to any building or premises adjoining such drain, he may by written notice direct the owner of the building or premises to construct or place such bridge, platform, or other structure within such reasonable time as may be specified in the notice.
- 5. Where the Chairman is of opinion that any bridge, platform, or other structure, constructed or placed over side drain for the purpose of providing access to any building or premises adjoining such drain, is defective or in an unsatisfactory condition, he may by written notice direct the owner of the building or premises to carry out, within such reasonable time as may be specified in the notice, such works of repair, renovation, or construction as may be necessary for the protection of such drain.
- 6. It shall be lawful for the Chairman by written notice to require the owner or owners of any yard or ground adjoining a building, or the owner or owners of any alley, road, or path between buildings or ranges of buildings-
 - (a) to have such yard, ground, alley, road, or path paved to a distance not exceeding lifteen feet from such building or buildings or range of buildings as the case may be, and
 - (b) to lay sufficient drains or pipes for the purpose of draining such yard, ground, alley, road, or path,

within such reasonable time and in such manner as may be specified in the notice.

- 7. (I) If the Chairman is of opinion that any building or premises used for any purpose whatsoever is from lack of adequate means of drainage likely to expose those who occupy or use the building or premises to the risk of disease or to endanger the public health, he may by written notice require the owner of the building or premises to build any new drain, or to improve, alter, repair, rebuild, or fill up any existing drain, within such reasonable time as may be specified in the notice, or to take within that time such other measures for the improvement of the drainage of the building or premises as may be specified in the notice.
- (2) If the Chairman is of opinion from an examination of the plans of a building which any person is intending to erect or re-erect that the building is from lack of adequate means of drainage likely to expose those who may occupy or use it to the risk of disease or to endanger the public health, he may by written notice require that person to provide the building with suitable drains or to take such other measures for the improvement of drainage as may be specified in the notice.
 - 8. No person shall-
 - (1) without the written consent of the Chairman, lead to or connect with a side drain or a public drain or sewer, any drain from private premises;
 - (2) drive or haul any vehicle over or across a side drain except at such places as are provided with bridges, culverts, platforms, or other structures which afford protection to such drain; or
 - (3) without the written consent of the Chairman, remove, reconstruct, or in any way interfere with any pipe, drain or sewer.
- 9. No person shall obstruct or permit any obstruction of any private drain, except with the written consent of the Chairman, or otherwise than in accordance with such conditions as the Chairman may impose.
- 10. Every person served with a notice under any of the preceding by laws shall comply with the requirements of the notice within the time specified therein, or, if no time limit is specified, then within a reasonable time.
- 11. When any person served with a notice under any of the preceding by-laws makes default in complying with the requirements of the notice, the Chairman may cause the work specified in the notice to be carried out by the officers and servants of the Council, and the expenses incurred shall be recoverable from the defaulter.
- 12. Every person contravening any of the preceding by-laws shall on conviction be liable to a fine not exceeding fifty rupees.

Capitation Tax.

Exemption.

- 1. The following classes of persons are hereby exempted from the liability to pay the capitation tax:—
 - (a) accredited priests or ministers of any religious denomination;

(b) members of the Ceylon Defence Force;

railway telegraph linesmen; and

(d) persons over 55 years of age.

2. The person or persons authorised in that behalf in writing by the Chairman shall, on or before December 1 in each year, prepare in such form as may be specified by the Chairman, a list of all persons resident within the village area who are

liable to pay the capitation tax for the next succeeding year.

3. The chief occupier of every house shall, whenever required by the Chairman or by any duly authorised person, fedured by the Charman or by any duty authorises person, fill in to the best of his knowledge any form supplied to him for the purposes of the preparation of the list, or furnish all such information, written or oral, as may be required relating to the number of persons resident in the house (including the house-holder himself), and the name, age, and race, and other particulars of each such person.

particulars of each such person.

4. The list prepared in each year shall be kept at the office

4. The list prepared in each year shall be kept at the onice of the Village Committee or at any other suitable place appointed by the Chairman and shall be open for inspection to the public from December 1 to 31 of that year.

5. Any person whose name is included in the list may, by a written statement addressed to the Chairman on or before January 31, next succeeding, object to the inclusion of his name in the list on the ground that he is not a voter, or that he has coesed to be resident in the village or that he is everythed. has ceased to be resident in the village, or that he is exempted by by-law 1 from the liability to pay the capitation tax. The Chairman shall, after holding such inquiry as he may consider

necessary, make such order as may seem to him just,
6. Any person not already exempted under by-law I may,
on or before February 15, make a written application to the Chairman for exemption from the liability to pay the capitation tax for that year. The Chairman may exempt such person from such liability for that year, or for life, or for such other period as he may think fit on the ground that such person is by eason of bodily infirmity or disease, incapable of performing

labour.
7. The list shall be revised in accordance with the orders made by the Chairman under by-law 5, and with the exemptions granted under by-law 6, and shall be certified under the hand of the Chairman on or before March 1, as the final list of the persons liable to pay the capitation tax for that year.

Annual Programme of Work.

- 8. (1) The Committee shall at a meeting to be held on or before March 15, in each year-

 - (a) prepare a programme of all the items of work which have to be constructed or maintained during that year;
 (b) determine the number of days for which each person included in the final list should be called upon to perform labour for that year in payment of the capitation tax due from him;

(c) determine the rate, not exceeding fifty cents in respect of each day, at which the labour due from any person may be commuted by payment of money.

- (2) Notice of the matters determined by the Committee under paragraph (1), shall be published by the Chairman as soon as may be, by beat of tom-tom in the village area and by the exhibition of written notices in conspicuous places in that
- . 9. In the case of any item of work not included in the by left the case of any norm of work nor monded in the programme referred to in by-law 8 (1), any person included in the final list may be called upon to contribute labour for an additional period but so however, that the total period for which any one person may be called upon to perform labour in any year does not exceed ten days.

Commutation of Tax.

10. Any person whose name is in the final list prepared for any year may commute his liability to perform labour for that year by making payment of money, at the rate determined by

the Committee under by-law 8 (1), on or before March 31 or such later date in that year as the Committee may fix with the approval of the Executive Committee of Local Administration.

11. Not less than one week before the date appointed by the Chairman for the commencement of any item of work, the Chairman for the commencement of any item of work, information shall be given in the village area by beat of tom-tom, and by the exhibition of written notices under the hand of the Chairman, specifying the place at which the work is to be done, the persons who are required to perform the labour necessary, the number of days for which each person has to contribute labour and the hours of work on each such day. The person required to contribute labour may be described in the notice either by name or as inhabitants of any specified village or part of a village or group of villages.

specified village or part of a village or group of villages.

12. (1) Every person who elects to commute his liability to perform labour by making payment of money shall pay the money to such officer and at such place as may for the time

being be appointed by the Committee.

(2) A written receipt in such form as may be provided for the purpose by the Committee shall be issued under the hand of the officer to whom such payment is made.

Performance of Labour.

13. Every person whose name appears in the final list referred to in by-law 7 and who has not commuted his liability to perform labour, shall attend with such implements and tools as may be necessary and perform labour on the days and at the time and place specified in such notice as may be issued, exhibited or published by the Chairman in that behalf.

Performance or Commutation of Double Labour.

14. Every person who fails to perform labour on any day on which he is required to do so by by-law 13, shall be deemed to be in default on that day and shall be liable to perform double labour, that is to say, labour for two days in respect of each day on which he is in default.

Any person who is liable to perform double labour may commute his liability to perform such double labour by making payment of money at the rate determined under by law 8 (1): Provided that no person shall be permitted to make payment of money in commutation of the liability to perform such double labour after the expiry of a period of one month from the earliest day in respect of which he is in default.

16. Every person who is liable to perform double labour under by-law 14 and has not made payment in commutation thereof under by-law 15 shall attend with such implements and thereof under by-law 15 shall attend with such implements and tools as may be necessary and perform labour on such days and at such time and place as may be specified in a notice which shall be issued by the Chairman. Such notice shall not require any person to perform labour for any period exceeding in length the total number of days for which such person is liable to perform labour under by-law 14.

"public stand" means any space within the adminis-trative limits of the Badulla Urban Council which is defined and reserved for the parking of licensed jinrickshas by a notice signed by the Chairman and exhibited at the spot;

"rickshaw-puller" means the person pulling a jinricksha; "licensed" means licensed under the Vehicles Ordinance.

2. No vehicle other than a licensed jinricksha shall enter , into or be parked in a public stand.

3. Every jinricksha in a public stand shall be parked-

- (a) in accordance with the orders of either the police officer who may be on duty near such public stand, or the person authorised for this purpose by the Chairman; and
- (b) in such a manner as not to cause any obstruction to any other jinricksha which may enter or leave the stand.

The puller of a jinricksha parked in a public stand, or a person capable of pulling such jinricksha shall be in charge thereof while the jinricksha occupies the stand.

5. Every jinricksha on its arrival at a public stand shall be parked immediately behind the last jinricksha already occupying such stand, and shall be moved up on every occasion on which a vacancy arises in front.

6. The puller of any jinricksha halted at a public stand shall not refuse to convey passengers or goods for hire, when required so to do by any person.

7. The puller of any licensed jinricksha shall not ply or stand for hire on any part of a highway other than a public stand.

8. No licensed jinricksha shall-

(a) be parked in any public place except a public stand; or (b) be halted on any highway except for the purpose of setting down or taking up passengers or goods.

The puller of every licensed jinricksha shall exhibit in a prominent part of the jinricksha a copy of the Table of Rates and Fares supplied to him by the Chairman.

10. The rates and fares which the puller of any licensed

jinricksha may charge for the conveyance of passengers or goods shall be determined in accordance with the Table of Rates and Fares set out in the Schedule to these regulations.

The person liable for a contravention of any of the foregoing regulations shall be the puller of the jinricksha.

12. The regulations made for the town of Badulla under section 16 of the Vehicles Ordinance and published in Gazette No. 7,432 of November 28, 1924, and therein called "by-laws" are hereby revoked.

"Improvements in and relating to the manufacture of powdered silk or silk-like fibre dust for use in the preparation of cosmetics and/or pharmaceutical products ".

Abstract.—Raw silk or silk-like fibre is cleaned by boiling in a weak solution of sodium lauryl sulphate, and thereafter heated in a weak solution of sulphuric acid until it is easily broken between the fingers. Powdered borax is then added and the mixture is well stirred and boiled, and subsequently cooled slowly and the solids allowed to settle. The fluid is then drained off, fresh water added and the mixture boiled once again. The solids are then drained, dried slowly and pulverised.

The inventor states that the powder is suitable as face and dusting powder and may also be used in the preparation of pharmaceutical products. There are 12 claims.
