THE URBAN COUNCILS ORDINANCE.

Order under sections 21 and 30.

BY virtue of the powers vested in me by sections 21 and 30 of the Urban Councils Ordinance, No. 61 of 1939; I, Andrew Caldecott, Governor of Ceylon, do by this Order—

- (1) revoke, subject to the provisions of the paragraph (4), the Order relating to the number of members of the Beruwala Urban Council and to the number and limits of the electoral divisions of the town of Beruwala published in *Gazette* No. 7,927 of June 2, 1932;
- (2) order under section 30 that, subject to the provisions of paragraph (4), the Beruwala Urban Council shall consist of eight members and the town of Beruwala shall be divided into eight electoral divisions with the limits defined in the Schedule hereto;
- (3) order under section 21 that, for the purposes of the general election of the members of the Beruwala Urban Council to be held next after the date hereof and for the purposes of the application of the provisions of the aforesaid Ordinance in any matter relating or incidental to or connected with that election, the order set out in paragraph (2) shall be deemed to be operative on any day, prior to the day specified in paragraph (4), on which it may be necessary that that order should be so operative; and
- (4) declare that the provisions of paragraphs (1) and (2) shall come into effect on the day immediately following the date of expiration of the term of office of the members of the Beruwala Urban Council who are in office at the date hereof.

Limits of the Electoral Divisions of the Town of Beruwala.

Electoral Division No. 1—Polkotuwa.

North: From the western extremity of the northern limit of the Urban Council area eastwards along the said limit to the western limit of Karandagoda Village.

West: From the last mentioned point southwards along the northern limit of the Urban Council area to the centre of Polkotuwa Road, thence south-westwards along the centre line of the said road to the point where the eastern village limit of Polkotuwa takes a turn towards the south, thence southwards along the said village limit to the centre of Deenagoda road, thence westwards along the centre line of the said road to the centre of the Railway Line, thence southwards along the centre of the Railway Line to the centre of Beruwal Ela.

South: From the last mentioned point westwards along the centre line of Beruwal Ela to the western limit of the Urban Council area.

West: From the last mentioned point northwards along the western limit of the Urban Council area to the starting point of the northern limit of the Division.

Electoral Division No. 2—Deenagoda.

North: From a point at which the centre of Polkotuwa Road meets the northern limit of the Urban Council area south-eastwards and eastwards along the northern limit of the Urban Council area until it meets the centre of Kappittangoda Road.

East: From the last mentioned point south-westwards along the centre line of Kappittangoda Road to the centre of the junction with Akkaragoda Road, thence south-eastwards along the centre line of the said road to the centre of the junction with Deenagoda Road.

South: From the last mentioned point westwards along the centre line of Deenagoda Road to a point in prolongation of the eastern boundary of the Muslim Boys' School premises, thence southwards along the said line of prolongation to the eastern boundary of the said school premises, thence southwards, westwards and northwards along the eastern, southern and western boundaries of the said school premises to the centre of Deenagoda Road in prolongation of the western boundary of the said school premises, thence westwards and south-westwards along the centre line of the said road to the eastern limit of Electoral Division No. 1.

West: From the last mentioned point northwards along the eastern limit of Electoral Division No. 1 to the starting point of the northern limit of the Division.

Electoral Division No. 3—Central.

North: From the centre of the Railway Level Crossing on Deenagoda Road eastwards along the eastern limit of Electoral Division No. 1 and north-eastwards along the southern and eastern limits of Electoral Division No. 2 to the northern limit of the Urban Council area, thence eastwards along the said limit to its eastern extremity.

East: From the last mentioned point south-westwards, south-eastwards and southwards along the eastern limit of the Urban Council area to the centre of New Kankanangoda Road.

South: From the last mentioned point westwards along the centre line of New Kankanangoda Road to the centre of Beruwal Ela, thence south-westwards along the centre line of the said Ela to the centre of the Railway Line.

West: From the last mentioned point northwards along the centre of the Railway Line to the starting point of the northern limit of the Division.

Electoral Division No. 4—Kankanangoda.

North: From the centre of the bridge over Beruwal Ela on Colombo-Galle Road eastwards along the southern limits of Electoral Divisions Nos. 1 and 3 to the eastern limit of the Urban Council area.

East: From the last mentioned point southwards along the eastern limit of the Urban Council area to the landmark shown in M.S.P.P. 19, 27.62 chains East of the Railway Line measured along the eastern limit of the Urban Council area.

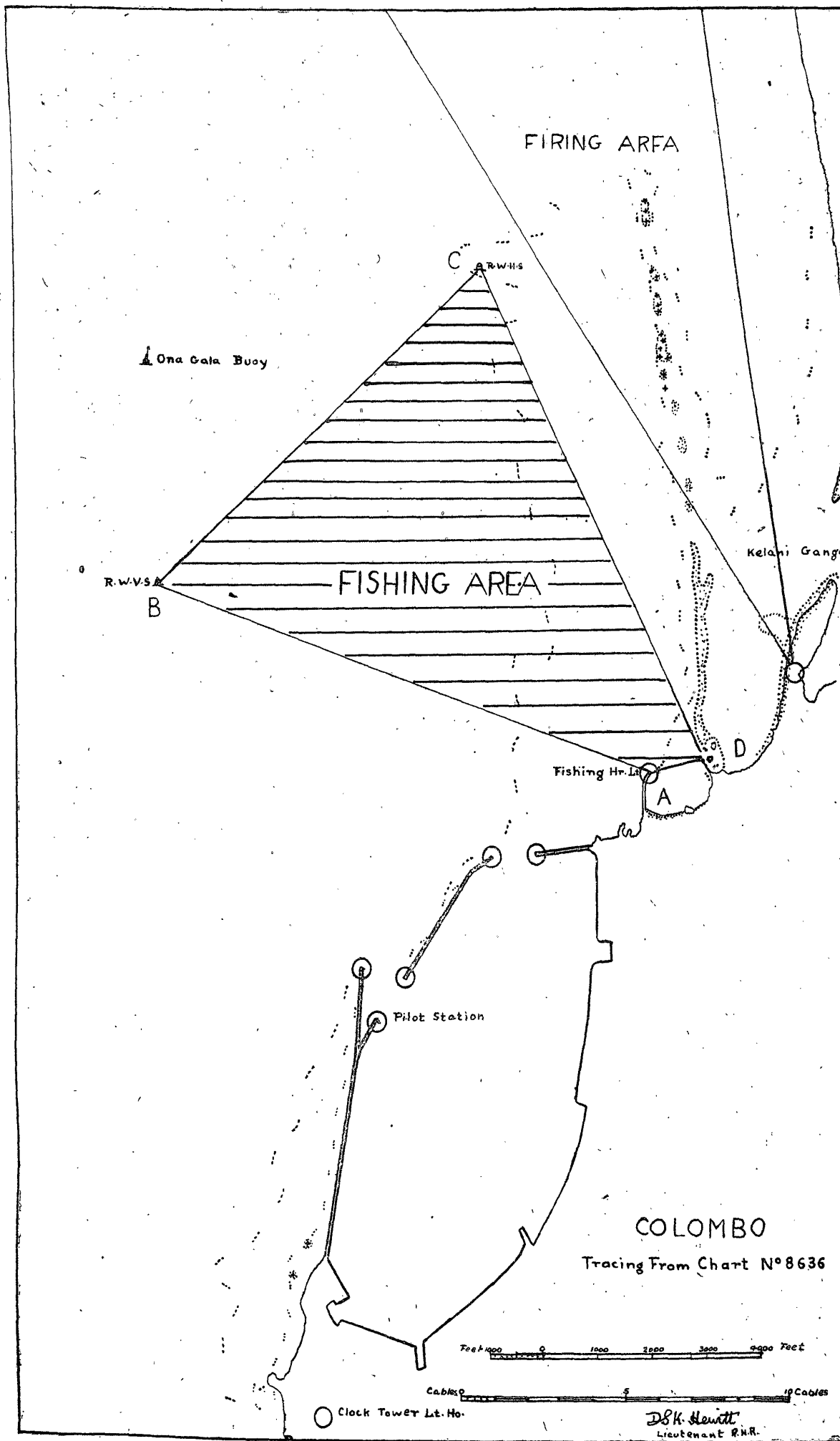

1. In these by-laws "side drain" means a drain which runs along the side of any public street, road, or path.

2. No person shall construct or place over a side drain any bridge, platform, or other structure of any kind, except with the written consent of the Chairman, or otherwise than in accordance with such conditions and such directions regarding the manner of construction as he may impose or issue.

3. The owner or occupier of every building or premises, to which access from any public street, road, or path is provided by means of a bridge, platform, or other structure constructed or placed over a side drain, shall maintain such bridge, platform, or other structure at all times in a sound and serviceable condition.

4. Where the Chairman is of opinion that a bridge, platform, or other structure should be constructed or placed over a side drain in order to provide access to any building or premises adjoining such drain, he may by written notice direct the owner of the building or premises to construct or place such bridge, platform, or other structure within such reasonable time as may be specified in the notice.

5. Where the Chairman is of opinion that any bridge, platform, or other structure, constructed or placed over a side drain for the purpose of providing access to any building or premises adjoining such drain, is defective or in an unsatisfactory condition, he may by written notice direct the owner of the building or premises to carry out, within such reasonable time as may be specified in the notice, such works of repair, renovation, or construction as may be necessary for the protection of such drain.

6. It shall be lawful for the Chairman by written notice to require the owner or owners of any yard or ground adjoining a building, or the owner or owners of any alley, road, or path between buildings or ranges of buildings—

(a) to have such yard, ground, alley, road, or path paved to a distance not exceeding fifteen feet from such building or buildings or range of buildings as the case may be, and

(b) to lay sufficient drains or pipes for the purpose of draining such yard, ground, alley, road, or path,

within such reasonable time and in such manner as may be specified in the notice.

7. (1) If the Chairman is of opinion that any building or premises used for any purpose whatsoever is from lack of adequate means of drainage likely to expose those who occupy or use the building or premises to the risk of disease or to endanger the public health, he may by written notice require the owner of the building or premises to build any new drain, or to improve, alter, repair, rebuild, or fill up any existing drain, within such reasonable time as may be specified in the notice, or to take within that time such other measures for the improvement of the drainage of the building or premises as may be specified in the notice.

(2) If the Chairman is of opinion from an examination of the plans of a building which any person is intending to erect or re-erect that the building is from lack of adequate means of drainage likely to expose those who may occupy or use it to the risk of disease or to endanger the public health, he may by written notice require that person to provide the building with suitable drains or to take such other measures for the improvement of drainage as may be specified in the notice.

8. No person shall—

(1) without the written consent of the Chairman, lead to or connect with a side drain or a public drain or sewer, any drain from private premises;

(2) drive or haul any vehicle over or across a side drain except at such places as are provided with bridges, culverts, platforms, or other structures which afford protection to such drain; or

(3) without the written consent of the Chairman, remove, reconstruct, or in any way interfere with any pipe, drain, or sewer.

9. No person shall obstruct or permit any obstruction of any private drain, except with the written consent of the Chairman, or otherwise than in accordance with such conditions as the Chairman may impose.

10. Every person served with a notice under any of the preceding by-laws shall comply with the requirements of the notice within the time specified therein, or, if no time limit is specified, then within a reasonable time.

11. When any person served with a notice under any of the preceding by-laws makes default in complying with the requirements of the notice, the Chairman may cause the work specified in the notice to be carried out by the officers and servants of the Council, and the expenses incurred shall be recoverable from the defaulter.

12. Every person contravening any of the preceding by-laws shall on conviction be liable to a fine not exceeding fifty rupees.

By-laws.

Capitation Tax.

Exemption.

1. The following classes of persons are hereby exempted from the liability to pay the capitation tax:—

- (a) accredited priests or ministers of any religious denomination;
- (b) members of the Ceylon Defence Force;
- (c) railway telegraph linesmen; and
- (d) persons over 55 years of age.

2. The person or persons authorised in that behalf in writing by the Chairman shall, on or before December 1 in each year, prepare in such form as may be specified by the Chairman, a list of all persons resident within the village area who are liable to pay the capitation tax for the next succeeding year.

3. The chief occupier of every house shall, whenever required by the Chairman or by any duly authorised person, fill in to the best of his knowledge any form supplied to him for the purposes of the preparation of the list, or furnish all such information, written or oral, as may be required relating to the number of persons resident in the house (including the householder himself), and the name, age, and race, and other particulars of each such person.

4. The list prepared in each year shall be kept at the office of the Village Committee or at any other suitable place appointed by the Chairman and shall be open for inspection to the public from December 1 to 31 of that year.

5. Any person whose name is included in the list may, by a written statement addressed to the Chairman on or before January 31, next succeeding, object to the inclusion of his name in the list on the ground that he is not a voter, or that he has ceased to be resident in the village, or that he is exempted by by-law 1 from the liability to pay the capitation tax. The Chairman shall, after holding such inquiry as he may consider necessary, make such order as may seem to him just.

6. Any person not already exempted under by-law 1 may, on or before February 15, make a written application to the Chairman for exemption from the liability to pay the capitation tax for that year. The Chairman may exempt such person from such liability for that year, or for life, or for such other period as he may think fit on the ground that such person is by reason of bodily infirmity or disease, incapable of performing labour.

7. The list shall be revised in accordance with the orders made by the Chairman under by-law 5, and with the exemptions granted under by-law 6, and shall be certified under the hand of the Chairman on or before March 1, as the final list of the persons liable to pay the capitation tax for that year.

Annual Programme of Work.

8. (1) The Committee shall at a meeting to be held on or before March 15, in each year—

- (a) prepare a programme of all the items of work which have to be constructed or maintained during that year;
- (b) determine the number of days for which each person included in the final list should be called upon to perform labour for that year in payment of the capitation tax due from him;
- (c) determine the rate, not exceeding fifty cents in respect of each day, at which the labour due from any person may be commuted by payment of money.

(2) Notice of the matters determined by the Committee under paragraph (1), shall be published by the Chairman as soon as may be, by beat of tom-tom in the village area and by the exhibition of written notices in conspicuous places in that area.

9. In the case of any item of work not included in the programme referred to in by-law 8 (1), any person included in the final list may be called upon to contribute labour for an additional period but so however, that the total period for which any one person may be called upon to perform labour in any year does not exceed ten days.

Commutation of Tax.

10. Any person whose name is in the final list prepared for any year may commute his liability to perform labour for that year by making payment of money, at the rate determined by

the Committee under by-law 8 (1), on or before March 31 or such later date in that year as the Committee may fix with the approval of the Executive Committee of Local Administration.

11. Not less than one week before the date appointed by the Chairman for the commencement of any item of work, information shall be given in the village area by beat of tom-tom, and by the exhibition of written notices under the hand of the Chairman, specifying the place at which the work is to be done, the persons who are required to perform the labour necessary, the number of days for which each person has to contribute labour and the hours of work on each such day. The person required to contribute labour may be described in the notice either by name or as inhabitants of any specified village or part of a village or group of villages.

12. (1) Every person who elects to commute his liability to perform labour by making payment of money shall pay the money to such officer and at such place as may for the time being be appointed by the Committee.

(2) A written receipt in such form as may be provided for the purpose by the Committee shall be issued under the hand of the officer to whom such payment is made.

Performance of Labour.

13. Every person whose name appears in the final list referred to in by-law 7 and who has not commuted his liability to perform labour, shall attend with such implements and tools as may be necessary and perform labour on the days and at the time and place specified in such notice as may be issued, exhibited or published by the Chairman in that behalf.

Performance or Commutation of Double Labour.

14. Every person who fails to perform labour on any day on which he is required to do so by by-law 13, shall be deemed to be in default on that day and shall be liable to perform double labour, that is to say, labour for two days in respect of each day on which he is in default.

15. Any person who is liable to perform double labour may commute his liability to perform such double labour by making payment of money at the rate determined under by-law 8 (1): Provided that no person shall be permitted to make payment of money in commutation of the liability to perform such double labour after the expiry of a period of one month from the earliest day in respect of which he is in default.

16. Every person who is liable to perform double labour under by-law 14 and has not made payment in commutation thereof under by-law 15 shall attend with such implements and tools as may be necessary and perform labour on such days and at such time and place as may be specified in a notice which shall be issued by the Chairman. Such notice shall not require any person to perform labour for any period exceeding in length the total number of days for which such person is liable to perform labour under by-law 14.

17. In these by-laws—

“Chairman” means the Chairman of the Committee;

“Committee” means the Village Committee;

“list” means the list of persons liable to pay the capitation tax in the village area.

18. The by-laws published in *Gazette* No. 7,628 of February 10, 1928, and therein called “Rules” are hereby amended, in so far as they relate to this village area, by the rescission of by-laws 56 to 62.

By-laws.

1. For the purposes of the assessment tax, the percentage or rate to be deducted from the annual value for the probable annual average cost of insurance, repairs, maintenance and upkeep, shall be as follows:—

- (a) in the case of any building which has a thatched roof of any description or which is covered with any other material which requires replacement as frequently as thatch, twenty per centum of the annual rent;
- (b) in the case of any building other than a building referred to in paragraph (a), fifteen per centum of the annual rent;
- (c) in the case of any land on which there is no building (other than a building used solely for the purpose of housing animals or poultry) and which is under regular cultivation of any kind, four per centum of the annual rent; and

(d) in the case of any land on which there is no building (other than a building used solely for the purpose of housing animals or poultry) and which is under permanent cultivation, one per centum of the annual rent.

2. (1) For the purpose of the land tax, the Chairman may by notice in writing require any person who is liable or may be supposed to be liable to such tax—

(a) to render a return substantially in the form prescribed in the Schedule hereto, and

(b) to furnish such other information or to produce or cause to be produced such documents as may in the opinion of the Chairman, be necessary for that purpose.

(2) Every person on whom a notice under clause (a) of paragraph (1) is served shall within fourteen days from the date of such service, correctly and truly fill up, sign, date, and deliver or transmit to the office of the Committee the form served with such notice, and every person on whom a notice under clause (b) is served shall comply with the requirements of such notice.

(3) For the purposes of this by-law, any notice which is addressed to any person and which is (a) delivered to an adult member of his household or his servant, or (b) affixed on a conspicuous part of the premises in respect of which the tax is to be imposed, in any case where such adult member or servant refuses to accept the notice or where there is no such adult member or servant on the premises, shall be deemed to have been duly served on that person.

3. No person shall obstruct any assessor or any person acting under the orders of an assessor, in the lawful discharge of his duties.

4. In these by-laws—

“building” includes any hut, shed, or roofed enclosure, whether used for human habitation or otherwise;

“Chairman” means the Chairman of the Committee;

“Committee” means the Village Committee.

I do further direct that no paddy and/or kurakkan shall be removed from the threshing floor and/or the chena until the quantity of such paddy and/or kurakkan has been assessed and a record taken by the Vel Vidane or the Village Headman of the area concerned or by any other person authorised by me, and that no person who is entitled to take or receive any part of such paddy and/or kurakkan shall in any manner dispose of the same except with my prior authority.

3. Permits for removal of paddy and/or kurakkan from the field and/or the chena to the barn or place of storage situated within the same Divisional Revenue Officer's division should in the case of paddy be obtained from the Vel Vidane and in the case of kurakkan from the Village Headman of the division in which the paddy field and/or the chena is situated. As regards permits for removal of paddy and/or kurakkan for consumption or for any other purpose and for removal from one pattu to another, reference should be made to my notice dated December 6, 1943, copies of which are available with the Village Headmen. In the case of paddy, claims to cattle shares, walahan shares or casual labourers permits should be registered beforehand with the Cultivation Officers as already laid down.

"Improvements in and relating to the manufacture of powdered silk or silk-like fibre dust for use in the preparation of cosmetics and/or pharmaceutical products".

Abstract.—Raw silk or silk-like fibre is cleaned by boiling in a weak solution of sodium lauryl sulphate, and thereafter heated in a weak solution of sulphuric acid until it is easily broken between the fingers. Powdered borax is then added and the mixture is well stirred and boiled, and subsequently cooled slowly and the solids allowed to settle. The fluid is then drained off, fresh water added and the mixture boiled once again. The solids are then drained, dried slowly and pulverised.

The inventor states that the powder is suitable as face and dusting powder and may also be used in the preparation of pharmaceutical products.

There are 12 claims.
