THE PILGRIMAGES ORDINANCE.

Regulations for St. Anne's Festivals.

BY virtue of the powers vested in me by section 2 of the Pilgrimages Ordinance (Chapter 133), I, Andrew Caldecott, Governor of Ceylon, do by this notification make the regulations set out hereunder in anticipation of the customary pilgrimage to Talavillu for St. Anne's Festivals in March, 1944.

Regulations.

1. In these regulations the expression "camp area" means the space within the boundaries specified in the schedule hereto.

and "Assistant Government Agent" means the Assistant Government Agent of the Puttalam and Chilaw Districts.

2. No person shall camp in any place within the camp area where camping is prohibited by special or general order of the Assistant Government Agent.

3. No person shall ease himself within the camp area, except at the places provided for that purpose by, or with the approval of the Assistant Government Agent.

4. No person shall deposit any liquid or solid refuse or any rubbish within the camp area, except in the places or receptacles provided for that purpose by, or with the approval of the Assistant Government Agent.

5. (a) No cattle shall be kept within the camp area, except those brought there for slaughter and those permitted by special or general order of the Assistant Government Agent to be kept within such area.

(b) No cattle shall be kept in the vicinity of the camp area, except at a place specially appointed as a cattle gala or at a place approved for such use by the Assistant Government Agent.

(c) The person in charge of the cattle shall cause their droppings to be removed to the nearest place provided therefor, and shall at all times keep clean the place occupied by his cattle.

6. All prepared foods sold within the camp area shall be protected from flies and dust by being (a) wrapped in or covered with clean paper or cloth, or (b) kept in closed glass cases, or (c) kept in other covered containers approved by the Medical Officer, or by the Sanitary Officer in charge of the camp area.

7. No person who is likely to affect prejudicially the cleanliness of the camp area, and no person who is suffering from an infectious disease shall be permitted to enter the camp area.

8. In the event of an epidemic breaking out in the camp area during the festival, the Assistant Government Agent may direct the pilgrims to leave the place of pilgrimage, and may prescribe the routes and methods for their conveyance.

9. (a) Every person within the camp area who is suffering from an infectious or a contagious disease, and (b) every person who resides with him knowing that he is so suffering shall report the case to the Medical or Sanitary Officer in charge of the camp area.

10. When any tank or well within the camp area is set apart for any particular purpose and a notice to that effect is exhibited on the spot, no person shall use the tank or well for any purpose other than that for which it is set apart.

11. No person shall keep any bakery, aerated water manufactory, tea or coffee boutique, eating-house or gala within the camp area without previously obtaining a licence from the Assistant Government Agent permitting him to do so. The licence shall be issued free of charge.

12. No person shall, without the previous sanction of the Assistant Government Agent, construct any booth, or extend any building within the camp area so as to encroach on the main or other streets of the camp.

13. No person shall, without the previous sanction of the Assistant Government Agent, discharge fireworks and firearms within the camp area, or within a radius of one mile from the boundaries of such area.

14. No person shall slaughter any animal within the camp area except in the place provided for the purpose by, or with the approval of the Assistant Government Agent, and every person slaughtering any animal in such a place shall be responsible for its cleanliness.

ORDER made by the Governor under Regulation 10 of the Defence (Air Raid Precautions Services) Regulations.

Order.

The Defence (Air Raid Precautions Services) Order, 1942, published in *Gazette Extraordinary* No. 8,843 of January 7, 1942, as amended by any subsequent Order, is hereby further amended, by the substitution, for paragraph 9 of that Order, of the following new paragraph:—

"9. Resignation—(1) Subject as hereinafter provided, no officer or member of the Service who receives any remuneration or allowance from the Controller shall, except with the written permission of the Commissioner, be entitled to resign from the Service unless he has, not less than six months prior to the date on which it is desired that the resignation shall take effect, submitted a written notice of resignation through his immediate superior officer—

- (a) in the case of an officer, to the Controller;
- (b) in the case of a member appointed on the recommendation of the Chief Warden, to the Chief Warden; and
- (c) in the case of a member appointed on the recommendation of the Officer-in-Charge of any subordinate Service, to such Officer-in-Charge:

Provided, however, that the preceding provisions of this sub-paragraph shall not apply to an officer or member appointed prior to the twenty-ninth day of February, 1944, unless he has expressly consented to be bound by those provisions by a written communication to that effect addressed to the officer to whom notice of resignation is hereinbefore required to be submitted.

(2) An officer or member of the Service, not being an officer or member to whom the provisions relating to resignation set out in sub-paragraph (1) apply, shall not be entitled to resign from the Service unless he has, not less than fourteen days prior to the date on which it is desired that the resignation shall take effect, submitted a written notice of resignation through his immediate superior officer—

- (a) in the case of an officer, to the Controller;
- (b) in the case of a member appointed on the recommendation of the Chief Warden, to the Chief Warden; and
- (c) in the case of a member appointed on the recommendation of the Officer-in-Charge of any subordinate Service, to such Officer-in-Charge.

(3) An officer or member of the Service who submits a notice of resignation as provided in sub-paragraph (1) or sub-paragraph (2) shall continue to be an officer or member of the Service and be subject to all the provisions of this Order until his resignation has been duly accepted."

THE DEFENCE (MISCELLANEOUS) REGULATIONS.

ORDER made by the Governor under Regulation 43D of the Defence (Miscellaneous) Regulations.

Order.

1. This Order may be cited as the Control of Distribution (No. 1) Order.

2. This Order shall have no application in relation to any article of food or drink.

3. This Order shall have no application in relation to any article other than an article of food or drink unless—

- (a) that article has been declared by the Governor by Order made under Regulation 43D of the Defence (Miscellaneous) Regulations to be a controlled article, and
- (b) the Governor has by Order made under that Regulation declared that the provisions of this Order shall apply in relation to that article.

Every article, to which the provisions of this Order are applied, is hereinafter referred to as a "controlled article".

4. (1) Every person who, on the date of the publication in the *Gazette* of an Order applying the provisions of this Order to any article, has in his possession or under this control a stock of that article shall, within seven days from that date, furnish to the Controller a return setting out—

- (a) the name and address and the place of business (if there is a place of business) of that person;
- (b) the nature and quantity of such stock;
- (c) the purpose for which such stock is kept; and
- (d) the situation of the premises in which such stock is kept or stored.

(2) Every person who, after the date of the publication in the *Gazette* of an Order applying the provisions of this Order to any article, imports any quantity of that article shall, within three days from the date on which he takes delivery of that article, furnish to the Controller a return setting out the particulars specified in the foregoing sub-paragraph (1).

(3) Where two or more premises are used by any person for keeping or storing any controlled article in his possession or under his control a separate return shall be furnished in respect of the stock kept in each such premises.

5. (1) Except under the authority of a permit, no person, who is required by paragraph 4 to furnish a return, shall—

- (a) appropriate to his own use any quantity of any controlled article in his possession or under his control; or
- (b) remove or permit the removal of any quantity of any such article from the premises specified in such return.

(2) Except under the authority of a permit, no authorised dealer (not being a person required by paragraph 4 (1) to furnish a return) shall—

- (a) appropriate to his own use any quantity of any controlled article in his possession or under his control; or
- (b) remove or permit the removal of any quantity of any such article from the premises at which he carries on business.

(3) No permit under the preceding provisions of this paragraph shall be required for the purpose of authorising the removal of any quantity of any controlled article which is sold or otherwise disposed of in accordance with the provisions of this Order.

6. No importer shall sell or otherwise dispose of any quantity of any controlled article to any person unless that person is the holder of a general or special permit authorising him to purchase or otherwise acquire that quantity from that importer, or otherwise than in accordance with such terms and conditions as may be specified in the permit.

7. No authorised dealer shall sell or otherwise dispose of any quantity of any controlled article to any person except upon the surrender by that person of a permit authorising him to purchase or otherwise acquire that quantity from that dealer.

8. Except under the authority of a permit no person shall purchase or otherwise acquire any quantity of any controlled article.

9. No person not being an importer or an authorised dealer shall sell or supply any controlled article to any other person:

Provided that the preceding provisions of this paragraph shall not be deemed to prohibit any person who has furnished a return under paragraph 4 (1) and who has not been appointed to be an authorised dealer from selling or otherwise disposing of the stock of any controlled article specified in such return in accordance with such directions as may be given to him by the Controller.

10. Every application for a permit under this Order shall be made to the Controller in such form as may be prescribed by him by notification published in the *Gazette*.

11. (1) The Controller may in his discretion—

- (a) refuse to grant a permit under this Order to any applicant thereof; and the decision of the Controller shall be final;
- (b) determine and specify in any permit the terms and conditions subject to which such permit is granted;
- (c) alter, add to or rescind any of the terms and conditions of any permit.

(2) Every person to whom a permit is granted under this Order shall comply with the terms and conditions specified in such permit.

12. No person to whom a permit is granted under this Order shall—

- (a) transfer the permit to any other person; or
- (b) use the article obtained on such permit for any purpose other than the purpose specified in the application made in respect of that permit.

13. The Controller may in his discretion appoint such number of persons as he may deem necessary to be authorised dealers for the purpose of selling or supplying any controlled article.

14. The Controller may cancel the appointment of any person as an authorised dealer if the Controller is satisfied after such inquiry as he may deem necessary that such dealer has contravened or failed to comply with any provision of this Order.

15. Every importer and every authorised dealer shall—

- (a) keep and maintain in such form as may be approved by the Controller for the purpose such records or registers relating to his stock of controlled articles as the Controller may by notice require him to maintain; and
- (b) furnish to the Controller such returns or other information relating to such stocks as the Controller may from time to time by notice require him to furnish.

16. Every return and every application made under this Order shall be verified by a declaration to the effect that the particulars contained therein are true and accurate.

17. The Controller or any officer authorised by him in writing may for the purpose of verifying the correctness of any information furnished or any record maintained by any importer or authorised dealer in pursuance of this Order or for the purpose of securing compliance with the provisions of this Order—

- (a) enter the premises at which such importer or dealer carries on business or keeps his stocks of any controlled article;
- (b) inspect the stock of any controlled article kept on the premises; or
- (c) inspect and take copies of any record, books or accounts kept by such importer or dealer (whether in pursuance of this Order or otherwise) in relation to his stock of controlled articles.

18. The powers conferred on the Controller by this Order may be exercised on his behalf by any Deputy Controller or other officer acting under the general or special directions of the Controller.

19. In this Order, unless the context otherwise requires—
- “Controller” means the Controller of Prices (Miscellaneous Articles);
- “importer” means any person who imports any controlled article into Ceylon;
- “permit” means a permit issued by the Controller under this Order.

Order.

1. All vessels shall comply with the Public Traffic Regulations issued in respect of the Port of Trincomalee and for the time being in force.
2. The Trincomalee Navigation Order, 1941, published in Gazette No. 8,712 of February 14, 1941, is hereby rescinded.
3. This Order may be cited as the Trincomalee Navigation Order, 1944.

PUBLIC TRAFFIC REGULATIONS.

1. By order of the Governor, with the approval of the Naval Authorities, the following regulations are to be observed by all Merchant Vessels (see definition in paragraph 5) approaching or moving within the Port of Trincomalee.
2. The Port area shall consist of all the water area to the west of a line joining Foul Point and Elizabeth Point.
3. The ordinary Regulations of the Port are to be adhered to, except where varied by these regulations.

4. *Use of Wireless Telegraphy, Wireless Telephony, and Sound Signalling.*—The use of any of these methods of communication for signalling within the limits of the Port is forbidden except that British vessels may continue to work their receiving outfits and tune and test emergency aerials, if necessary, provided that they can do so without interfering in any way with the efficient sealing of transmitting apparatus. Subject to this exception in the case of British vessels, when a vessel enters the Port the Detaining Officer will seal either the wireless telegraphy office or the handle of the starter of each wireless set or auxiliary set on board the vessel. During the stay of the vessel in the Port access to the wireless telegraphy office or apparatus will, subject to the Defence Regulations, be allowed only for the purpose of effecting any work of maintenance or repair under the authority of a permit which will be issued by the Commodore-in-Charge, Trincomalee, on the application of the Master. The wireless apparatus may be used, after the completion of any work of maintenance or repair, only for the purposes of such tests as are authorised by the permit. The Detaining Officer will re-seal the wireless telegraphy office or the handle of the starter of each wireless set or auxiliary set on the completion of any work and of any tests authorised by the permit.

In the case of a foreign Merchant Vessel the Detaining Officer is further authorised by the Defence Regulations to cause the aerials to be disconnected and to be taken down from the masts.

The Master will be held responsible for the observance of the Defence Regulations and of the preceding provisions of this paragraph.

In the absence of special instructions from the Naval Authority, non-commissioned Mercantile Fleet Auxiliaries will generally be subject to the same regulations as regards use of wireless telegraphy as Merchant Vessels.

5. *Definitions.*—For the purposes of these Regulations—

- (c) The term “Merchant Vessel” includes all vessels other than Examination Steamers and British and Foreign War Vessels.
- (d) The term “Small Craft” refers to coasting type craft, either sail or steam, other than those flying the White Ensign or a Foreign Naval Flag.
- (e) *Night.*—The port is normally closed at night, but the Examination Service remains in force. The duration of official night is from $\frac{1}{4}$ hour after sunset to $\frac{1}{4}$ hour before sunrise.
- (f) *Examination Steamer.*—This term includes any vessel employed in the Examination Service which displays the signals specified in paragraph 17.
- (g) The *Examining Officer* is the Officer of the Examination Service, normally in the Examination Steamer, who examines the Merchant Vessels wishing to enter the Port, prior to their entry. As a result of this examination, he permits, or does not permit, a Merchant Vessel to enter the Port.
- (h) “*Detaining Officer*” means the Officer appointed by the Governor to deal with the shipping in the Port upon the outbreak of war, and includes any officer acting on the instructions of the officer so appointed.

PART I.—ENTRANCE TO THE PORT.

6. *Advice to Shipowners and Shipping Agents.*—Shipowners and Shipping Agents are advised that, in their own interests, and in order to avoid delays to their vessels in their recognition by and passage through the Examination Service, they should, when circumstances permit—

- (a) as a general rule, arrange for their vessels to arrive at the Port during daylight;
- (b) see that their vessels are provided with a complete set of International Code Flags, also with 2 white and 2 red lanterns—ready and available for use—in addition to the Regulation navigation lights.

7. *Instructions for Merchant Vessels wishing to enter the Port.*—Merchant Vessels arriving from seaward will be met by the Examination Steamer or will receive instructions from the Port War Signal Station.

Normally, Merchant Vessels are permitted to enter the Port after they have satisfied the Examining Officer of their *bona fides*. For night, fog and thick weather instructions on approach and entry to the Port, see paragraph 16.

For other restrictions on entry, see paragraph 18.

8. Merchant Vessels approaching the Port are especially cautioned against making use of private signals of any description, either by day or night; the use of such signals will render Merchant Vessels liable to be fired on.

9. All Merchant Vessels must pass through the Examination Service before they will be permitted to enter the Port.

10. All Merchant Vessels approaching the Port must hoist their signal letters on arriving within visual signal distance of the Port and are not to wait for the signal "what ship is that?" to be made from the Examination Steamer or Signal Station.

11. Merchant Vessels (including small craft, see paragraph 21) wishing to enter the Port will be given permission and the necessary instructions to proceed into the Port by the Examining Officer.

12. All orders and instructions necessary to enable a Merchant Vessel to enter the Port will be given by the Examining Officer, whose orders and instructions are to be implicitly obeyed. Disobedience will render a Merchant Vessel liable to be fired on.

13. As a general rule, Merchant Vessels will be examined by the Examining Officer in the order of their arrival in the approaches to the Port.

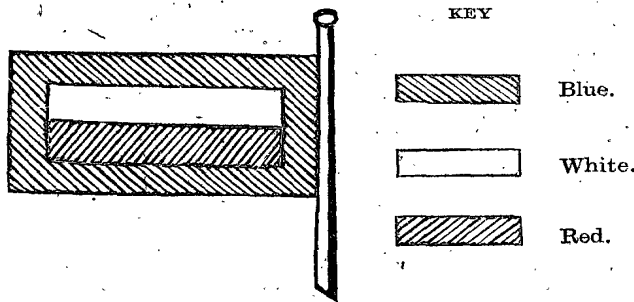
14. Should bad weather or other cause prevent a Merchant Vessel passing through the boom, she will be ordered by the Examining Officer to sea, and will not be permitted to enter the Port unless she can be identified while underway by the Examining Officer.

15. Port dues will not be collected from Merchant Vessels which close the Examination Steamer solely for the purpose of obtaining information.

16. *Night, Fog, and Thick Weather Restrictions.*—Should Merchant Vessels have to approach the Port after dark they are to burn navigation lights when within limits of the Port area. They are not to approach in fog or thick weather. The sudden sighting of a vessel near the Port entrance due to non-compliance with the above regulations may result in her being fired upon. The Port will be closed in fog or thick weather.

17. *Examination Steamer.*—The Examination Steamer will be found between Round Island and the entrance to the Port and will be known by the following distinguishing marks:—

(a) *By Day.*—The Examination Steamer will fly a special flag—white and red, horizontal, surrounded by a blue border—at the fore masthead, and the Blue Ensign.



Should the Port be closed (see paragraph 18), the Examination Steamer will hoist, in addition to the above, 3 red balls vertical, 6 feet apart, in a position where they are clearly visible all round the horizon.

(b) *By Night.*—The Examination Steamer will carry, in addition to the ordinary navigation lights, 3 lights vertically, 6 feet apart, in a position where they are clearly visible all round the horizon. These 3 lights will be white when the Port is open and red when the Port is closed (see paragraph 18).

(c) The port is always closed at night to Merchant Vessels and these lights will therefore only be exhibited when necessary, and will not be displayed throughout the night.

18. "Port Closed"—*Meaning of the Term.*—The term "Port Closed" means that vessels are not permitted to proceed inward and they will receive further instructions. The Port is normally closed at night and may be closed in fog, thick weather (see paragraphs 7 and 16), and at any other time by order of the Commodore-in-Charge.

19. *The Signal for "Port Closed" and where it is hoisted.*—The signal to indicate that the Port is closed is:—

(a) *By Day.*—(1) Three red balls hoisted vertically, 6 feet apart, in a position in the Examination Steamer (see paragraph 17) where they are clearly visible all round the horizon.

(2) A similar signal hoisted at the Signal Station on Chapel Hill.

(b) *By Night.*—(1) Three red lights hoisted vertically, 6 feet apart, in a position in the Examination Steamer where they are clearly visible all round the horizon, in lieu of the three white lights hoisted when the port is open (see paragraph 17).

(2) A similar signal hoisted at the Signal Station on Chapel Hill.

(3) See paragraph 17 (c) above.

20. *Instructions as to what Merchant Vessels must do when the Port is Closed.*—When the signals specified in paragraph 19 are displayed, the Port is closed, and movement through the boom, inwards and outwards, will not be permitted to Merchant Vessels.

21. The boom gate will be opened as necessary at intervals to allow small craft to leave or enter harbour after examination between 1000 and 1600 daily only. Incoming vessels should assemble outside the boom to await examination.

PART II.—INTERNAL MOVEMENT.

22. *Local Authority controlling Internal Movement.*—No vessel is permitted to move within the port or to leave the Port unless permission has been received from the Commodore-in-Charge. The Officer responsible for arranging such movements will be the King's Harbour Master, who acts in conjunction with the Assistant Government Agent.

23. *Anchorages.*—Merchant Vessels will be berthed inside the harbour as convenient by the Assistant King's Harbour Master.

24. *Lights.*—(1) No anchor lights are to be shown. Lights are to be reduced to a minimum at night and totally extinguished on receipt of Air Raid Message "Yellow".

(2) The Lighting Restriction Order, 1940, requires that where a blackout is in force in any harbour area, the Master of every ship within that area shall comply with the directions of the Minister for Local Administration in regard to the blackout. These directions will normally be conveyed by the Commodore-in-Charge, Trincomalee.

25. *Steaming Lights and Bow Lights.*—Navigation lights are to be displayed by Merchant Vessels entering the Port area (see paragraph 16) and by vessels permitted to move inside the Port at night.

26. *Visibility from the Air.*—All lights are to be fitted with overhead screens so that they are not visible from the air.

27. *Fog or Thick Weather.*—No internal movement will be allowed in fog or thick weather.

28. *Merchant Vessels to keep clear of His Majesty's Ships.*—All Merchant Vessels are to keep clear of His Majesty's Ships being navigated in the Port.

29. The following signals will be displayed by His Majesty's Ships and other Ships when carrying out movements in the Port as indicated below:—

Note.—(1) In the event of more than one ship entering or leaving at the same time, the berth number of the first ship only will be shown.

(2) All Royal Fleet Auxiliaries, Merchant Fleet Auxiliaries and Merchant Ships underway are to give uninterrupted passage to, and are to keep clear of, all His Majesty's Ships showing the signals in sub-paragraph A above.

(3) When the British Pilot Jack is shown at the Dockyard Signal Station as in sub-paragraph C above, no Fleet Attendance Vessel or Merchant Ship shall cast off from any vessel, or shall weigh, and any such vessels underway shall keep clear of the approach and channel to the Warship berths.

30. *Patrol of Internal Waterways and Approaches to the Port.*—The internal waterways of the Port and the approaches thereto will be patrolled by Naval Patrol Boats (and/or other Government Vessels). Captains, Masters and others in charge of Merchant Vessels are hereby warned to observe any orders given by the Naval Patrols. All Merchant Vessels are subject to inspection and search by these Patrols.

Disregard of orders given by these Patrols renders a Merchant Vessel liable to be fired on.

PART III.—LEAVING THE PORT.

31. *Steps necessary on the Part of Masters and/or Agents before a Vessel may leave the Port.*—The Master should visit the Assistant Collector of Customs and obtain from him the Detaining Officer's special clearance. He should obtain permission to sail from the Naval Control Service Officer, who on behalf of the Commodore-in-Charge, Trincomalee, will grant such permission after the necessary documents have been issued.

32. *Signal Prohibiting Sailing.*—A blue flag hoisted at the Dockyard Signal Station indicates that no Merchant Vessel is to leave the Port while the signal is flying.

PART IV.—BOOM DEFENCES.

33. Attention is drawn to Admiralty Notice to Mariners No. 1770 of 1939.

The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Regulations, 1937, published in *Gazette* No. 8,338 December 17, 1937, as amended by regulation published in *Gazette* No. 9,075 of February 1, 1943, are hereby further amended in regulation 22 as follows:—

- by the omission of paragraph (1) of that regulation;

REGULATED SAREES.

1. The attention of all textiles dealers all over the Island is drawn to the fact that all sarees, which fall within the definition of "regulated textiles", are sarees on which only the rates of profits allowed in the Defence (Control of Textiles) (No. 2) Regulations, 1943, published in *Gazette Extraordinary* No. 9,144 of July 8, 1943, may be charged. Regulated sarees are defined in Regulation 2 of the above Regulations as:—

Group A, item (9). Sarees, exclusive of embroidered sarees having a gold, silver or embroidered border.

Reference is requested in Textiles Control Notice No. 8 published in the English Press on July 9, 1943, and in the Sinhalese and Tamil Press a few days later.

2. The above definition means that all sarees which are pure cotton or mixtures of cotton containing less than 50 per cent. of art silk, silk or material other than cotton are regulated sarees, but if any saree of that description is embroidered all over, and has in addition a gold, silver or embroidered border, such saree would not be a regulated saree. Thus, a saree containing 50 per cent. or more of art silk, silk or material other than cotton would also not be a regulated saree. Even if a saree is dutiable at 15 per cent. *ad valorem*, it may still be a regulated saree, if it contains less than 50 per cent. of art silk, silk or material other than cotton, and is not embroidered all over and in addition does not have a gold, silver or embroidered border.

3. The Tamil and Sinhalese translations of item (9) of Group A in Regulation 2 of the above Regulations should be read in accordance with the further explanation given in para. 2 of this notice.

4. In the Sinhalese translation of item (13) in Group A of the First Schedule to the Defence (Control of Textiles) (No. 1) Regulations, 1943, the word "alupata" should be substituted by "amu-reddha".

5. In the Sinhalese translation of items (14) and (16) in Group A of the First Schedule to the Defence (Control of Textiles) (No. 1) Regulations, 1943, and in item (16), Regulation 2 of the Defence (Control of Textiles) (No. 2) Regulations, 1943, the word "alupata" should be substituted by "sudhukala".

THE DEFENCE (MISCELLANEOUS) REGULATIONS.

ORDER made by the Governor under Regulation 43D of the Defence (Miscellaneous) Regulations.

By His Excellency's command,

H. A. C. DOBBS,

Acting Secretary to the Governor.

Colombo, 1st March, 1944.

Order.

1. This Order may be cited as the Controlled Articles (Coconut Poonac) Order, 1944.

2. In this Order—

“Controller” means the Controller of Animal Foods appointed by the Governor, and in relation to any specified area includes any Deputy Controller of Animal Foods for that area appointed by the Civil Defence Commissioner;

“permit” means a permit issued by the Controller under this Order.

3. Each of the articles specified in the Schedule hereto (hereinafter referred to as a “scheduled article”) is hereby declared to be a controlled article within the meaning and for the purposes of regulation 43D of the Defence (Miscellaneous) Regulations.

4. The Civil Defence Commissioner may by notification published in the *Gazette*, prohibit any manufacturer of any scheduled article in any area specified in that notification from selling or otherwise disposing of any quantity of that article manufactured by him in that area to any person unless that person is the holder of a permit authorising him to purchase or otherwise acquire that quantity from that manufacturer. Any such notification may be amended from time to time or revoked by the Civil Defence Commissioner by a like notification.

5. The Civil Defence Commissioner may by notification published in the *Gazette* prohibit the sale or other disposal of any scheduled article in any area specified in that notification

by persons other than authorised dealers. Any such notification may be amended from time to time or revoked by the Civil Defence Commissioner by a like notification.

6. So long as a notification under paragraph 4 is in force in any area the following provisions shall have effect in that area:—

(1) No manufacturer of any scheduled article in that area shall sell or otherwise dispose of any quantity of that article manufactured by him in that area in contravention of the provisions of that notification.

(2) Every manufacturer of any scheduled article in that area shall—

(a) keep and maintain, in such form as may be approved by the Controller for the purpose, such records or registers relating to his stock of scheduled articles as the Controller may by notice require him to maintain; and

(b) furnish to the Controller such returns or other information relating to such stocks as the Controller may from time to time by notice require him to furnish.

7. So long as a notification under paragraph 5 is in force in any area the following provisions shall have effect in that area:—

(1) No person other than an authorised dealer shall sell or otherwise dispose of any scheduled article in that area:

Provided, however, that where a notification under paragraph 4 is also in force in that area, nothing in the preceding provisions of this sub-paragraph shall apply to the sale or other disposal of any scheduled article manufactured in that area by the manufacturer of that article so long as such sale or disposal is not in contravention of that notification.

(2) Every authorised dealer in that area shall—

(a) keep and maintain, in such form as may be approved by the Controller for the purpose, such records or registers relating to his stock of scheduled articles as the Controller may by notice require him to maintain; and

(b) furnish to the Controller such returns or other information relating to such stocks as the Controller may from time to time by notice require him to furnish.

8. (1) The Controller may in his discretion appoint such number of persons, as he may deem necessary, to be authorised dealers for the purpose of selling or supplying any scheduled article in any area in which a notification under paragraph 5 is in force.

(2) The Controller may cancel the appointment of any person as an authorised dealer if the Controller is satisfied after such inquiry as he may deem necessary that such dealer has contravened or failed to comply with any provision of this Order.

9. (1) Every application for a permit to purchase or otherwise acquire any quantity of any scheduled article shall be made to the Controller and shall state the purpose for which that article is required.

(2) The Controller may in his discretion—

(a) refuse to grant a permit to any applicant therefor or grant a permit for a smaller quantity than the quantity specified in the application ;

(b) determine and specify in any permit the terms and conditions subject to which the permit is granted ; and

(c) alter, add to or rescind any of the terms and conditions of any permit.

(3) Every decision or determination of the Controller under the preceding sub-paragraph shall be final.

(4) Every person to whom a permit is granted shall comply with the terms and conditions specified in the permit.

10. No person to whom a permit is granted shall—

(a) transfer the permit to any other person ; or

(b) use the scheduled article obtained under the permit for any purpose other than the purpose specified in the application made in respect of the permit.

11. Every return furnished and every application made under this Order shall be verified by a declaration to the effect that the particulars contained therein are true and accurate.

12. The Controller or any officer authorised by him in writing may, for the purpose of verifying the correctness of any information furnished or any record maintained by any manufacturer of any scheduled article in any area in which a notification under paragraph 4 is in force or by any authorised dealer in any area in which a notification under paragraph 5 is in force or for the purpose of securing compliance with the provisions of this Order—

(a) enter the premises at which such manufacturer or authorised dealer carries on business or keeps his stock of scheduled articles ;

(b) inspect the stock of scheduled articles kept on the premises ; or

(c) inspect and take copies of any record, books or accounts kept by such manufacturer or dealer (whether in pursuance of this Order or otherwise) in relation to his stock of scheduled articles.

13. The powers conferred upon the Controller by any provision of this Order may be exercised on his behalf by any other officer acting under the general or special directions of the Controller.

Schedule.

1. Coconut poonac.

2. Any other article or substance containing coconut poonac and used or capable of being used as food for animals.
