COMMON SALT.

THE CONTROL OF PRICES ORDINANCE, No. 39 of 1939.

BY virtue of the powers vested in the Assistant Controller of Prices by section 3 (read with section 2 (3)) of the Control of Prices Ordinance, No. 39 of 1939, I., Alfred Silva Kohomban-Wickrema, Assistant Controller of Prices for the Matara District, do by this Order:

- revoke the Order dated April 9, 1942, published in Gazette No. 8,915 of April 17, 1942, prescribing the maximum prices for common salt within the Revenue District of Matara;
   fix the prices specified in column 2 of the Second Schedule hereto to be the maximum wholesale price per hundred-
- weight above which salt of the description and grade specified in the First Schedule hereto shall not be sold

- weight above which salt of the description and grade specified in the First Schedule hereto shall not be sold by wholesale within the areas specified in the corresponding entry in column 1 of the Second Schedule hereto;

  (3) fix the price specified in column 2 of the Third Schedule hereto to be the maximum retail price per pound above which salt of the description and grade specified in the First Schedule hereto shall not be sold by retail within the areas specified in the corresponding entry in column 1 of the Third Schedule hereto;

  (4) direct that no trader shall sell salt of any description and grade mentioned in the First Schedule hereto which is adulterated with any article or salt of an inferior description or grade or quality;

  (5) direct that overy trader who at any premises within the areas specified in the Second and Third Schedules hereto exposes for sale salt of any description and grade mentioned in the First Schedule hereto shall exhibit in a conspicuous position at those premises a notice on which there shall be set out the maximum price fixed by this Order in respect of salt of that description and grade;

  (6) direct that every trader who sells salt of the description and grade mentioned in the First Schedule hereto, shall give the purchaser of that salt on demand a receipt on which there shall be set out—

  - (a) the date of sale;

  - (b) the quantity, description, and grade of the salt sold;
    (c) the price paid for the quantity of salt sold; and
    (d) the nature of the transaction, that is to say, whether the sale was by wholesale or retail.
- (7) direct that the maximum wholesale price fixed by this Order shall include the price of the container in which the

COMMON SALT.

THE CONTROL OF PRICES ORDINANCE, No. 39 of 1939.

Order.

BY virtue of the powers vested in the Deputy Controller of Prices by section 3, read with section 2 (3), of the Control of Prices Ordinance, No. 39 of 1939, I, Samson Felix Amerasinghe, Deputy Controller of Prices, Kegalla District, do by this Order:—

(1) revoke my Order fixing the maximum price of common salt within the Revenue District of Kegalla, dated April 13, 1942, and published in the Government Gazette No. 8,915 of April 17, 1942;

- (2) fix the prices specified in columns 2 and 3 of the Schedule hereto to be respectively the maximum wholesale price per cwt. and the maximum retail price per pound above which common salt of the description and grade specified in column 1 of the Schedule hereto, shall not be sold by wholesale or by retail, as the case may be, within the Revenue District of Kegalla;
- (3) direct that for the purpose of this Order
  - (a) any sale of any quantity of salt for the purpose of resale shall be deemed to be a sale by wholesale;
  - (b) any sale of any quantity of salt for the purpose of consumption or use shall be deemed to be a sale by retail;
  - (c) the maximum wholesale price fixed by this Order shall include the price of the container in which the salt is sold:
- (4) direct that no trader shall sell salt which is adulterated with any article or with salt of an inferior description or grade or quality;
- (5) direct that every trader who at any premises within the Revenue District of Kegalla exposes common salt for sale, shall exhibit in a conspicuous position at these premises a notice on which there shall be set out the maximum prices fixed by this Order in respect of common salt;
- (6) direct that every trader who sells common salt shall give to the purchaser of that salt, on demand, a receipt on which there shall be set out-
  - (a) the date of the sale ;

  - (b) the quantity, description and grade of salt sold;
    (c) the price paid for the quantity of salt sold; and
    (d) the nature of the transaction, that is to say, whether the sale was by wholesale or by retail.

BY virtue of the powers vested in the Deputy Controller of Prices by section 3 (read with section 2 (3)) of the Control of Prices Ordinance, No. 39 of 1939, I, Richard Morgan Davies, Deputy Controller of Prices, Ratnapura District, do by this Order:

- (1) revoke my Order dated April 8, 1942, published in Government Gazette No. 8,915 of April 17, 1942, in so far as it relates to common salt :
- (2) fix the price specified in column 2 of the Second Schedule hereto, as the maximum wholesale price per cwt. above which common salt of the description and grade mentioned in the First Schedule hereto, shall not be sold in the area mentioned in the corresponding entry in column 1 of the Second Schedule; (3) fix the price specified in column 2 of the Third Schedule hereto, as the maximum retail price per pound above
- which common salt of the description and grade mentioned in the First Schedule hereto shall not be sold in the areas mentioned in the corresponding entry in column 1 of the Third Schedule;
- (4) direct that for the purpose of this Order
  - (a) any sale of any quantity of any article for the purpose of resale shall be deemed to be a sale by wholesale; (b) any sale of any quantity of any article for the purpose of consumption or use shall be deemed to be a sale by retail.
- (5) direct that every wholesale dealer who purchases salt from Railway Goods Sheds shall deliver to the Officer-in-Charge a sound empty rice gunny bag for every bag of salt purchased, and every dealer who purchases salt from a wholesale dealer shall likewise surrender a sound empty rice gunny bag for every bag of salt purchased.
- (6) direct that no trader shall sell common salt of any description and grade mentioned in the First Schedule heretowhich is adulterated with any other article or common salt of an inferior description or grade or quality;
  (7) direct that every trader who exposes common salt of the description and grade mentioned in the First Schedule
- hereto for sale (by wholesale or retail) shall exhibit in a conspicuous position at his premises (store or boutique) a notice on which there shall be set out the maximum prices fixed by this Order in respect of common salt of that description and grade;
- (8) direct that every trader who sells (by wholesale or retail) common salt of the description and grade mentioned in the First Schedule hereto, shall give to the purchaser, on demand, a receipt on which there shall be set out-
  - (a) the description and grade of salt sold (by wholesale or retail);
  - (b) the quantity of salt sold :
  - (c) the price paid for the salt sold; and
  - (d) the date of the sale.

- (1) revoke my Order dated April 2, 1942, published in Government Gazette No. 8,908 of April 10, 1942, in so far as it relates to the maximum wholesale and retail prices of salt fixed in respect of the Kalutara District;
- (2) fix the prices specified in columns 2 and 3 of the Schedule hereto, to be respectively the maximum wholesale price per bag and the maximum retail price per pound above which salt of the description and grade specified in the corresponding entry in column 1 of that Schedule shall not be sold by wholesale or by retail, as the case may be, within the Kalutara District;
- (3) direct that for the purposes of this Order-

  - (a) any sale of any quantity of salt for the purpose of resale shall be deemed to be a sale by wholesale;
