BY virtue of the powers vested in the Deputy Controller of Prices (Food) by section 3 (read with section 2 (3)) of the Control of Prices Ordinance, No. 39 of 1939, as amended by Defence (Control of Prices) (Supplementary Provisions No. 2) Regulations, I, Velupillai Coomaraswamy, Deputy Controller of Prices (Food), Batticaloa District, do, by this Order:—

- (1) revoke with effect from this date my Order dated January 5, 1942, published in Government Gazette No. 8,845 of January 9, 1942, in so far as it relates to the articles
- January 9, 1942, in so far as it relates to the articles of the description and grade mentioned in the First Schedule hereto;

 (2) fix the prices specified in any Order for the time being in force made by the Controller of Prices (Food) under section 3 of the Control of Prices Ordinance, as the maximum wholesale price per candy of 525 pounds and retail price per pound above which the articles of the description and grade mentioned in the First Schedule hereto, shall not be sold within the First Schedule hereto, shall not be sold within the Municipal limits of Colombo increased by the amounts specified in columns 2 and 3 of the Second Schedule hereto, respectively, as the maximum wholesale price per candy of 525 pounds and retail price per pound above which the articles of the description, and grade mentioned in the First Schedule hereto, shall not be sold within the areas mentioned in the corresponding entries in column 1 of the Second Schedule
- (3) direct that for the purpose of this Order-
 - (a) any sale of any quantity of any article for the purpose of resale or any sale of any article in a quantity of one hundredweight or more at a time shall be deemed to be a sale by wholesale;
 - sale;
 (b) any sale of any quantity less than one hundredweight of any article for the purpose of consumption or use by the purchaser shall be
 deemed to be a sale by retail;
 (c) a "wholesale dealer" shall mean any person who
 is in the habit of selling by wholesale any article
 mentioned in the First Schedule hereto; and
 (d) "maximum retail price" shall apply to all sales
 by retail:

 - by retail;
- (4) direct that no trader shall sell any article specified in the First Schedule hereto, which is adulterated with any other article;
- (5) direct that any trader who, at any premises within the areas specified in column 1 of the Second Schedule hereto, sells any article specified in the First Schedule hereto, shall exhibit in a conspicuous position at those premises a notice on which there shall be set out the maximum prices fixed by this Order in respect of that article;
- (6) direct that every person who sells by wholesale any article specified in the First Schedule hereto, shall, and every person who sells by retail any article specified in the First Schedule hereto, shall, on demand, give to the purchaser of that article a receipt on which there shall be set out—
 - (a) the date of sale,
 - (b) the description of the article sold,
 - (c) the quantity sold,

- (d) the price paid for the quantity sold, and
- (e) the nature of the transaction, that is to say, whether the sale was by wholesale or by retail.

BY virtue of the powers vested in the Deputy Controller of Prices (Food), by section 3 (read with section 2 (3)) of the Control of Prices Ordinance, No. 39 of 1939, as amended by Defence (Control of Prices) (Supplementary Provisions No. 2) Regulations, I, Velupillai Coomaraswamy, Deputy Controller of Prices (Food), Batticaloa District, do, by this Order:

- (1) revoke with effect from this date the Order of the Assistant Controller of Prices (Food), Batticaloa District, dated September 16, 1943, published in *Government Gazette* No. 9,179 of October 8, 1943, in so far as it relates to the articles of the description and grade mentioned in the First Schedule thereto;
- (2) fix the prices specified in any Order for the time being in force made by the Controller of Prices (Food) under section 3 of the Control of Prices Ordinance, as the maximum wholesale price per candy of 525 pounds and retail price per pound above which the articles of the description and grade mentioned in the First Schedule hereto, shall not be sold within the Municipal limits of Colombo, increased by the amounts specified in columns 2 and 3 of the Second Schedule hereto, respectively, as the maximum wholesale price per candy of 525 pounds and retail price per pound above which the articles of the description and grade mentioned in the First Schedule hereto, shall not be sold within the areas mentioned in the corresponding entries in column 1 of the Second Schedule hereto;
- (3) direct that for the purpose of this Order-
 - (a) any sale of any squantity of any article for the purpose of resale or any sale of any article in a quantity of one hundredweight or more at a time, shall be deemed to be a sale by wholesale;
 - (b) any sale of any quantity less than one hundred-weight of any article for the purpose of consumption or use by the purchaser, shall be deemed to be a sale by retail;
 - (c) a "wholesale dealer" shall mean any person who is in the habit of selling by wholesale any article mentioned in the First Schedule hereto;
 - (d) "maximum wholesale price" shall apply to all sales by wholesale except sales by an importer to a wholesale dealer; and
 - (e) "maximum retail price" shall apply to all sales by retail;
- (4) direct that no person shall sell any article of any description or grade mentioned in the First Schedule hereto which is adulterated with any other article or with an article of any inferior description and grade or quality;
- (5) direct that any trader who, at any premises within the areas mentioned in column 1 of the Second Schedule hereto, sells any article of the description and grade mentioned in the First Schedule hereto, shall exhibit in a conspicuous position at those premises a notice on which there shall be set out the maximum prices fixed by this Order in respect of that article of that description and grade;
- (6) direct that every person who sells by wholesale any article of the description and grade mentioned in the First Schedule hereto, shall, and every person who sells by retail any article of the description and grade mentioned in the First Schedule hereto, shall, on demand, give the purchaser of that article a receipt on which there shall be set out—
 - (a) the date of the sale;
 - (b) the description and grade of the article sold;

(c) the weight of the quantity sold;

- (d) the price paid for the quantity sold; and (e) the nature of the transaction, that is to say whether the sale was by wholesale or by retail.

(i.) revoke with effect from this date Order dated September 10, 1943, published in Government Gazette No. 9,173 of September 17, 1943, in so far as it relates to the maximum retail prices fixed in respect of ready mixed paint;

(ii.) fix the prices specified in column 2 of the Schedule hereto to be the maximum retail prices above which paint described in column 1 of the Schedule hereto

shall not be sold by retail in any part of Ceylon;

(iii.) direct that for the purpose of this Order any sale of any
paint named in the Schedule hereto for the purpose of use shall be deemed to be a sale by retail;

- (i.) fix the prices specified in columns 2 and 3 of the Schedule hereto to be respectively the maximum, wholesale price and the maximum retail price above which drugs of the description specified in the corresponding entries in column 1 of the Schedule hereto shall not be sold in any part of Ceylon;
- (ii.) direct that every person, who at any premises in Ceylon sells any drugs of the description, specified in column 1 of the Schedule hereto, shall exhibit in a conspicuous position at those premises a notice in which there shall be set out the maximum prices fixed by this Order in respect of the drugs of that description;

- (iv.) direct that no person shall sell any of the drugs of the description mentioned in column 1 of the Schedule hereto which is adulterated with any other article or with drugs of an inferior description or grade or quality;

- (v.) direct that every person whether carrying on business as an importer or dealer in drugs or not who has in his possession a stock of any of the drugs of the description mentioned in column 1 of the Schedule hereto shall furnish me with a return addressed to the Office of the Director of Medical and Sanitary Services, Colombo, within seven days of publication of this Order in the Government Gazette, stating the following particulars:—
 - (a) the address of every premises in which are contained any of these drugs in his possession or under his control;
 - (b) the quantity and description of drugs in each store;
- (vi.) direct that every person who sells any drugs of the description specified in column 1 of the Schedule hereto shall give to every purchaser of that drug on demand a receipt in which there shall be set out—
 - (a) the date of sale;
 - (b) the description of the drugs sold;
 - (c) the quantity of the drugs sold; and
 - (d) the price paid.

- (i.) revoke with effect from this date my Order dated October 25, 1943, and published in Ceylon Government Gazette No. 9,187 of October 29, 1943, fixing the maximum wholesale price per bag of 80 measures of whole wheat and the maximum retail prices per measure;
- (ii.) fix the prices specified in columns 2 and 3 of the Schedule hereto to be respectively the maximum wholesale price per bag and the maximum retail price per measure above which whole wheat shall not be sold in the areas mentioned in the corresponding entry in column 1 of the Schedule hereto;
