PERFORATED ZINC SHEETS.

THE CONTROL OF PRICES ORDINANCE, No. 39 OF 1939.

Order.

BY virtue of the powers vested in the Controller of Prices by section 3 of the Control of Prices Ordinance, No. 39 of 1939, as amended by paragraph (2) of the Defence (Control of Prices) (Supplementary Provisions No. 2) Regulations, I, Cedric Francis Ingledow, Controller of Prices (Miscellaneous Articles), do, by this Order—

- (i.) fix the prices specified in columns 2 and 3 of the Schedule hereto to be, respectively, the maximum wholesale prices and the maximum retail prices above which Perforated Zinc Sheets of the description and size specified in column 1 of the Schedule hereto shall not be sold in Ceylon;
- (ii.) direct that for the purposes of this Order—
 - (a) any sale, for the purpose of resale of any quantity of Perforated Zinc Sheets specified in column 1 of the Schedule hereto shall be deemed to be a sale by wholesale;
 - (b) any sale, for the purpose of use, of any quantity of Perforated Zinc Sheets specified in column 1 of the Schedule hereto shall be deemed to be a sale by retail;
 - (c) "maximum wholesale price" shall apply to all sales by wholesale;
 - (d) "maximum retail price" shall apply to all sales by retail;
- (iii.) direct that every dealer who, at any premises in Ceylon, sells any Perforated Zinc Sheets of the description and size specified in column 1 of the Schedule hereto shall exhibit in a conspicuous position at those premises the maximum prices fixed by this Order for Perforated Zinc Sheets of that description and size;
- (iv.) direct that every person who sells Perforated Zinc Sheets of the description and size specified in the Schedule hereto shall give to every purchaser of such Perforated Zinc Sheets, on demand, a receipt in which there shall be set out—
 - (a) the quantity, description and sizes of the Perforated Zinc Sheets sold;
 - (b) the price paid; and
 - (c) the date of the sale.

Order.

BY virtue of the powers vested in the Controller of Prices by section 3 of the Control of Prices Ordinance, No. 39 of 1939, as amended by paragraph (2) of the Defence (Control of Prices) (Supplementary Provisions No. 2) Regulations, I, Edward Heron Ryan Tenison, Deputy Controller of Prices (Miscellaneous Articles), do, by this Order—

- (i.) revoke with effect from January 28, 1944, Order dated May 3, 1942, published in *Government Gazette* No. 8,930 of May 3, 1942, in so far as it relates to the maximum prices fixed in respect of the following size of motor tyre:—

Schedule I.—Motor Car tyres: Michelin.
550 × 17 H Stop

- (ii.) fix the price specified in Schedule I. hereto to be the maximum retail price per tyre above which the tyre of the description and grade specified in the said Schedule shall not be sold by retail in any part of Ceylon;
- (iii.) direct that, for the purposes of this Order, any sale of the said tyre for the purpose of use shall be deemed to be a sale by retail;

- revoke with effect from this date the Orders of the Controller of Prices and the Controller of Prices (Miscellaneous Articles) on Drugs—
 - dated November 12, 1943, published in *Government Gazette* No. 9,033 of November 13, 1943 ;
 - dated June 21, 1943, published in *Government Gazette* No. 9,141 of June 25, 1943 ; and
 - dated August 17, 1943, published in *Government Gazette* No. 9,159 of August 20, 1943, in so far as they relate to the maximum wholesale and retail prices fixed for—

Urodonal ;
Sanmetto per 8 oz. bottle.
- fixed the prices specified in columns 2 and 3 of the Schedule hereto to be respectively the maximum wholesale price and maximum retail price above which drugs of the description specified in the corresponding entries in column 1 of the Schedule hereto shall not be sold in any part of Ceylon ;

- fix the prices specified in columns 2 and 3 of the Schedule hereto to be, respectively, the maximum wholesale prices and the maximum retail prices above which the articles of the description and size specified in column 1 of the Schedule hereto shall not be sold in Ceylon ;
- direct that for the purposes of this Order—
 - any sale for the purpose of resale of any quantity of any article specified in the Schedule hereto shall be deemed to be a sale by wholesale ;
 - any sale for the purpose of use of any quantity of any article specified in the Schedule hereto shall be deemed to be a sale by retail ;
 - "maximum wholesale price" shall apply to all sales by wholesale ;
 - "maximum retail price" shall apply to all sales by retail ;
- direct that any dealer who at any premises in Ceylon sells any article of the description and size specified in column 1 of the Schedule hereto shall exhibit in a conspicuous position at those premises the maximum prices fixed by this Order for any article of that description and size ;
- direct that every person who sells any article of the description and size specified in the Schedule hereto shall give to every purchaser of such article on demand a receipt in which there shall be set out—
 - the quantity, description and size of the articles sold ;
 - the price paid ; and
 - the date of the sale.

OVALTINE.

THE CONTROL OF PRICES ORDINANCE, NO. 39 OF 1939.

Order.

BY virtue of the powers vested in the Controller of Prices (Food) by section 3 of the Control of Prices Ordinance, No. 39 of 1939, as amended by Defence (Control of Prices) (Supplementary Provisions No. 2) Regulations, I, Reginald Sydney Vernon Poulter, Controller of Prices (Food), do, by this Order—

- (i.) revoke with effect from this date my Order dated March 2, 1944, published in *Government Gazette* No. 9,242 of March 3, 1944, in so far as it relates to the maximum prices fixed in respect of Ovaltine of the description specified in column 1 of the Schedule hereto;
- (ii.) fix the prices specified in columns 3 and 4 of the Schedule hereto to be, respectively, the maximum wholesale price per dozen tins and the maximum retail price per tin above which Ovaltine of the description specified in the corresponding entry in column 1 of that Schedule and of the net contents specified in the corresponding entry in column 2 of that Schedule shall not be sold by wholesale or by retail, as the case may be, in any part of Ceylon;
- (iii.) direct that for the purposes of this Order—
 - (a) any sale of any quantity of any article for the purpose of resale or any sale of any article in a quantity of a dozen tins or more at a time shall be deemed to be a sale by wholesale;
 - (b) any sale of any quantity less than a dozen tins of any article for the purpose of consumption or use shall be deemed to be a sale by retail;
- (iv.) direct that in every area where maximum prices are fixed by this Order no trader shall sell any article specified in column 1 of the Schedule hereto which is adulterated with any other article;
- (v.) direct that in every area where maximum prices are fixed by this Order every trader, who has in his possession at any premises any article specified in column 1 of the Schedule hereto, shall exhibit in a

conspicuous position at those premises a notice in which there shall be set out the maximum prices fixed by this Order in respect of that article;

- (vi.) direct that in every area where maximum prices are fixed by this Order every trader, who at any premises has been in the habit of selling any article specified in column 1 of the Schedule hereto and has for the time being no stocks of that article for sale, shall exhibit in a conspicuous position at those premises for a period of three months from the date he last sold that article a notice to the effect that he has no stocks of that article available for sale for the time being;
- (vii.) direct that in every area where maximum prices are fixed by this Order every person who sells by wholesale any article specified in column 1 of the Schedule hereto shall, and every person who sells by retail any article specified in column 1 of the Schedule hereto shall on demand, give the purchaser of that article a receipt in which there shall be set out—
 - (a) the date of sale;
 - (b) the description of the article sold;
 - (c) the quantity of the article sold;
 - (d) the price paid for the quantity sold; and
 - (e) the nature of the transaction, that is to say, whether the sale was by wholesale or by retail.
