THE DEFENCE (TRADING WITH THE ENEMY)
REGULATIONS, 1939.

WHEREAS Madduma Acharige Kovis otherwise known as Martin Dharmapala (hereinafter referred to as "Dharmapala") is an enemy within the meaning of the Defence (Trading with the Enemy) Regulations, 1939, by reason of his residence in Singapore now enemy territory within the meaning of the said Regulations:

And whereas prior to the date on which he so became an enemy the said Dharmapala duly appointed M. A. Paulis Hamy his attorney in Ceylon by a Power of Attorney executed in Singapore on the 4th day of October, 1940, and duly attested by the Magistrate of Police and Justice of the Peace, Fifth Police Court, Singapore:

And whereas every person in Ceylon who has any commercial, financial, or other intercourse or dealings with, or for the benefit of, the said Dharmapala is liable to be deemed to have traded with the enemy within the meaning of the said Regulations, and will thereby be guilty of an offence against the said Regulations, unless he has acted under authority given generally or specially by the Governor:

And whereas it is expedient in terms of paragraph (2) of regulation 1 of the said Regulations to give authority to M. A. Paulis Hamy and to persons resident in Ceylon in the manner hereinafter provided:

Now, therefore, I, Andrew Caldecott, Governor of Ceylon, do, by virtue of the powers vested in me by paragraph (2) of regulation 1 of the Defence (Trading with the Enemy) Regulations, 1939, hereby authorise the said M. A. Paulis Hamy to have such commercial, financial, or other intercourse or dealings with persons in Ceylon for the benefit of the said Dharmapala as he could have had under the aforesaid Power of Attorney, prior to the date on which the said Dharmapala became an enemy as aforesaid, and I do, further, authorise persons in Ceylon generally to have commercial, financial or other intercourse or dealings with the said Dharmapala through the said M. A. Paulis Hamy.

WHEREAS the immovable property more fully described in the Schedule hereto belongs to Mrs. P. S. Perera:

And whereas the said Mrs. P. S. Perera is now believed to be residing in Junun, Kedah, and is an enemy within the meaning of the Defence (Trading with the Enemy) Regulations, 1939, read with the Defence (Trading with the Enemy) Amendment Regulations:

And whereas it is expedient that a Vesting Order should be made in respect of the said immovable property and such powers in regard thereto as are hereinafter contained should be conferred upon the Custodian of Enemy Property:

Now, therefore, I, Andrew Caldecott, Governor of Ceylon, by virtue of the powers vested in me by the Defence (Trading with the Enemy) Regulations, 1939, the Defence (Trading with the Enemy) Amendment Regulations, and the Trading with the Enemy (Custodian) Order, 1940, and all other powers enabling me in that behalf, do hereby order—

- (1) that all the right, title and interest of the said Mrs. P. S. Perera to and in the said immovable property do vest in the Custodian of Enemy Property;
 - (2) that the said Custodian do have all such powers as may be necessary for the purposes of the control and the management of the said immovable property, including the power to employ such agents as he may consider necessary for such purposes;
- and
- (3) that out-of-pocket payments duly made by the said Custodian in relation to the receiving, collecting, vesting, management, holding or disposing of the said immovable property shall be reimbursed to the said Custodian out of such property and shall be chargeable accordingly.

THE DEFENCE (MISCELLANEOUS) REGULATIONS.

ORDER made by the Governor under regulation 43D of the Defence (Miscellaneous) Regulations.

Order.

1. This Order may be cited as the Photographs (Control of Production for Fee or Reward) Order, 1944, and shall come into operation on such date as the Controller may appoint by notification published in the *Gazette*.

2. Photographs made or supplied for fee or reward are hereby declared to be controlled articles within the meaning and for the purposes of regulation 43D of the Defence (Miscellaneous) Regulations.

3. (1) No person shall, after the expiry of a period of thirty days from the date on which this Order comes into operation, make or supply photographs for fee or reward unless he is for the time being registered under this Order as a photographer.

(2) Every application for registration as a photographer shall be made to the Controller and shall specify the following particulars:—

- (a) the name of the applicant;
- (b) the premises at which he proposes to carry on his business,

(3) The Controller may in his discretion determine whether or not a person is to be registered under this Order as a photographer.

(4) The Controller shall allot a registered number to every person who is to be registered under this Order as a photographer.

4. The following provisions shall apply to the making or supplying of photographs for fee or reward by a registered photographer—

(1) Except with the special authority of the Controller no registered photographer shall make or supply for fee or reward—

(a) from a single negative, photographs exceeding in the aggregate two hundred square inches in area during the period of twelve months commencing on the date on which such negative is exposed or during any subsequent period of twelve months; or

(b) from more than one negative of the same subject exposed on the same date, photographs exceeding in the aggregate three hundred square inches in area during the period of twelve months commencing on such date or during any subsequent period of twelve months.

(2) Every registered photographer shall insert or cause to be inserted the following particulars on the face of each photograph exceeding twenty square inches in area made or supplied by him for fee or reward—

(a) his name and registered number; and

(b) except in the case of a photograph supplied by him for fee or reward from a negative not made by him, the date on which the negative used for the purpose of making each such photograph was exposed.

(3) Every registered photographer shall insert or cause to be inserted his name and registered number on the back of each photograph not exceeding twenty square inches in area made or supplied by him for fee or reward.

5. (1) No registered photographer—

(a) who makes a photograph for fee or reward to the order of any person; or

(b) who supplies a photograph for fee or reward to any person, shall supply any copy of such photograph to such person or to any other person by way of gift.

(2) Every registered photographer—

(a) who makes a photograph for fee or reward from a negative which has been made by himself; or

(b) who supplies for fee or reward to any person a photograph made from a negative which has been made by himself, shall at all times thereafter keep every such negative in his possession and under his control.

6. Except with the special authority of the Controller no person shall acquire for fee or reward from any registered photographer or photographers or shall commission such photographer or photographers to make for fee or reward—

(1) from a single negative, photographs exceeding in the aggregate two hundred square inches in area during the period of twelve months commencing on the date on which such negative is exposed or during any subsequent period of twelve months; or

(2) from more than one negative of the same subject exposed on the same date, photographs exceeding in the aggregate three hundred square inches in area during the period of twelve months commencing on such date or during any subsequent period of twelve months.

7. Every registered photographer shall keep and maintain a record of the following particulars relating to each photograph made or supplied by such photographer for fee or reward from negatives made by himself:—

(1) the name and address of the person to whose order each such photograph was made or to whom each such photograph was supplied;

(2) the size of each such photograph; and

(3) the date on which the negative used for the purpose of making each such photograph was made.

8. The Controller may cancel the registration of any person as a photographer if the Controller is satisfied after such inquiry as he may deem necessary that such photographer has contravened or failed to comply with any provision of this Order.

9. The Controller or any person authorised by him in writing may for the purpose of verifying the correctness of any record maintained by a registered photographer in pursuance of this Order—

(1) enter the premises at which such photographer carries on his business; or

(2) inspect and take copies of any record, books or accounts kept by such photographer (whether in pursuance of

this Order or otherwise) in relation to the photographs made or supplied for fee or reward by such photographer.

10. The powers conferred on the controller by this Order may be exercised on his behalf by any Deputy Controller or other officer acting under the general or special directions of the Controller.

11. In this Order, unless the context otherwise requires—

“Controller” means the Controller of Prices (Miscellaneous Articles) appointed under the Control of Prices Ordinance, No. 39 of 1939;

“negative” means a photographic negative;

“photograph” means a positive print produced on sensitised paper by a photographic process, and includes proofs but does not include line reproductions made by the blue-print or any other similar process;

“photographic negative” means the product of a single exposure on sensitised photographic material in a camera;

“registered photographer” means a person registered for the time being under this Order as a photographer;

“subject”—

(1) in relation to a negative of one person, means that person;

(2) in relation to a negative of more than one person, means each such person; or

(3) in relation to any other negative, means the subject matter of that negative.

12. The Controlled Articles (Hydroquinone and Metol) Order, 1943, and the Controlled Articles (Photographic Paper and Films) Order, 1943, are hereby rescinded.

EMERGENCY POWERS (DEFENCE)

ORDER IN COUNCIL CONTINUING IN FORCE THE EMERGENCY POWERS (DEFENCE) ACT, 1939, AS AMENDED BY SUBSEQUENT ENACTMENTS.

At the Court at Buckingham Palace, the 10th day of August, 1944.

Whereas by subsection (1) of section eleven of the Emergency Powers (Defence) Act, 1939, as amended by subsection (3) of section one of the Emergency Powers (Defence) Act, 1940, the first-mentioned Act was limited to expire at the end of a period of two years beginning with the twenty-fourth day of August nineteen hundred and thirty-nine unless continued in force in accordance with the said subsection (1):

AMENDMENT TO THE MINUTES ON PENSIONS.

HIS Excellency the Governor has been pleased, with the approval of the Secretary of State for the Colonies, to direct that the rules regulating the pensions to be granted to public servants of Ceylon set out in the Minute on Pensions dated February 5, 1934, as amended by any subsequent Minute be further amended, in section 47, as follows:—

- (1) in sub-section (i), by the substitution, for the words "as a teacher in a School or Schools", of the words "as a teacher in a school or schools (irrespective of the order in time of either description of service)";

- (2) in sub-section (ii)—

(a) by the substitution, for the words and figures "Provided that—

(a) The pension of such an officer shall be $\frac{1}{720}$ th of the officer's salary",

of the words and figures "The pension of such an officer shall be $\frac{1}{720}$ th of the officer's salary", and

(b) by the omission of paragraph (b) of the Proviso to that sub-section; and

- (3) by the insertion immediately after sub-section (v), of the following new sub-sections:—

"(vi) The total amount which a person referred to in sub-section (i) may receive as climate bonus under these sections and under the School Teachers' Pension Rules (published in *Gazette* No. 7,631 of February 24, 1928) shall not in the aggregate exceed $\frac{5}{60}$ ths of his salary.

(vii) For the purposes of this section, the pension and climate bonus shall—

(a) in the case of a person referred to in sub-section (i) who held, during the period of three years immediately preceding the date of his retirement, a permanent office or offices to which the same fixed salary or the same incremental scale of salary was attached, be computed on the salary he was drawing on that date;

(b) in the case of a person referred to in sub-section (i), who held, during the period of three years immediately preceding the date of his retirement, an office or offices to which the same fixed salary or the same incremental scale of salary was not attached, be computed on the monthly average of the salaries received by him in respect of such office or offices during that period:

Provided that where a person to whom paragraph (b) applies has retired within three years of his promotion to a higher class or grade, he may elect to have his pension and climate bonus computed on the salary which he received immediately before his promotion to such class or grade in lieu of having such pension and climate bonus computed on the monthly average referred to in that paragraph."

- (2) in paragraph (ii), by the substitution, for the words "of his salary as hereinafter defined" wherever those words occur collectively in that paragraph, of the words "of his salary";

- (3) by the substitution, for paragraph (iii), of the following new paragraph:—

"(iii) The total amount which a person referred to in paragraph (i) may receive as climate bonus under these rules and under the provisions of the Minute on Pensions dated February 5, 1934 (as amended by any subsequent Minute) shall not in the aggregate exceed $\frac{5}{60}$ ths of his salary."; and

- (4) by the insertion immediately after paragraph (vii), of the following new paragraph:—

"(viii) For the purposes of this rule, the pension and climate bonus shall—

(a) in the case of a person referred to in paragraph (i) who held, during the period of three years immediately preceding the date of his retirement, a permanent office or offices to which the same fixed salary or the same incremental scale of salary was attached, be computed on the salary he was drawing on that date;

(b) in the case of a person referred to in paragraph (i), who held, during the period of three years immediately preceding the date of his retirement, a permanent office or offices to which the same fixed salary or the same incremental scale of salary was not attached, be computed on the monthly average of the salaries received by him in respect of such office or offices during that period;

Provided that where a person to whom sub-paragraph (b) applies has retired within three years of his promotion to a higher class or grade, he may elect to have his pension and climate bonus computed on the salary which he received immediately before his promotion to such class or grade, in lieu of having such pension and climate bonus computed on the monthly average referred to in that sub-paragraph."

The toddy, arrack and vinegar trade, that is to say—

- (1) the preparation of palm trees for tapping;
- (2) the tapping, collecting and sale of toddy;
- (3) the distillation and sale of arrack; and
- (4) the manufacture and sale of vinegar;

including—

- (a) taking a census of trees for tapping, and marking trees for tapping;
- (b) climbing trees for coupling;
- (c) coupling trees;
- (d) preparing spadices for tapping;
- (e) tapping trees;
- (f) collecting toddy from trees;
- (g) transporting toddy to collecting station, distillery, or tavern;
- (h) measuring toddy at collecting station, distillery, or tavern;
- (i) selling toddy at tavern;
- (j) loading and unloading barrels of toddy;
- (k) washing barrels, toddy vats, utensils and other vessels;
- (l) distilling toddy at distillery;
- (m) chopping and splitting firewood at distillery;
- (n) cleaning and washing barrels, wash backs, stills and other vessels at distillery;
- (o) transporting arrack to warehouse or tavern, loading and unloading arrack casks;
- (p) measuring arrack at distillery, warehouse, or tavern;
- (q) bottling arrack;
- (r) selling arrack at tavern;
- (s) making vinegar from toddy;
- (t) bottling vinegar and labelling vinegar bottles;
- (u) transporting vinegar for distribution; and
- (v) any other operation connected with or incidental to work specified in this paragraph;

but excluding the work of the following workers:—

lorry and van driver, carter, electrician, engine driver, boilerman, furnaceman, mechanic and clerk.

1. Every Indent Agent shall maintain a register of indents in which the following information is entered in respect of each indent placed by him:—

- (1) The date.
- (2) The serial number of the indent.
- (3) The name, licence number, and the address of the dealer on whose order the indent was placed.
- (4) The description of the textiles and the quantity ordered.
- (5) Date of receipt of the textiles.
- (6) The date of delivery of the textiles to the dealer.

2. The entries under 1 (1), (2), (3) and (4) shall be made in the register as soon as the indent is forwarded to the Country of export, under 1 (5) within 4 days of receipt, and under 1 (6) within two days of the delivery of the textiles.

3. Every Wholesale Dealer shall maintain a register of Wholesale stocks in which a separate folio will be opened for each kind of article of apparel such as Sarongs, Sarees, Veddies, Cumbles, Handkerchiefs, Socks, Banians, Towels, Sheets, &c., and for each of the following classes of textiles ordinarily sold by the yard:—

- (1) Bleached goods;
- (2) Unbleached goods;
- (3) Printed goods;
- (4) Dyed goods;
- (5) Other regulated textiles;

provided that it shall be open to a dealer to break down the textiles under any of the above categories into sub-categories at his discretion and to maintain a separate folio for each sub-category.

4. (a) Every wholesale dealer shall enter in his register of wholesale stocks all textiles imported by him within seven days of their arrival at his store.

(b) All textiles imported by the holder of both a wholesale and retail licence shall be deemed to have been imported by him as a wholesale dealer and shall be brought to account in his register of wholesale stocks.

5. All quantities shall be shown by number in the case of those textiles which are ordinarily sold by number and by yardage in the case of those textiles that are ordinarily sold by the yard.

6. The entries on the receipt side of the register of wholesale stocks shall include,—

- (a) all textiles imported by the dealer;
- (b) all textiles purchased from licensed indent agents;
- (c) all purchases made by him from manufacturers;
- (d) all transfers from the stocks of another business carried on by the same dealer under a separate wholesale licence;
- (e) receipts from other sources.

7. (a) Every entry in the register of wholesale stocks shall be supported by a voucher which will normally consist of the invoices which the dealer received in the case of the entries on the receipt side, and duplicates of invoices issued by him in the case of entries on the expenditure side.

(b) All vouchers shall be kept in two files—the receipt voucher file and the expenditure voucher file, and the vouchers in each file shall be consecutively numbered; provided that in the case of invoices issued from duplicate books, the copies must remain in the books.

8. The wholesale register shall be balanced for each day, within two days of the close of the day to which the entries relate.

9. *Register of Retail Stocks.*—(a) Every retail dealer shall maintain a register of retail stocks, in which will be entered all receipts. All entries on the receipt side of this register shall be supported by vouchers in the same manner as the wholesale stock register.

(2) Every retailer who imports textiles shall bring to account in his register of stocks all textiles imported by him within seven days of their arrival at his place of business.

(3) All quantities shall be shown by number in the case of those textiles which are ordinarily sold by number, and by yardage in the case of those textiles which are ordinarily sold by the yard.

(4) The entries on the receipt side of the register of retail stocks shall include,—

- (a) all textiles imported by the dealer if he does not at the same time hold a wholesale licence;
- (b) all textiles purchased from licensed indent agents;
- (c) all textiles purchased from a wholesale dealer;
- (d) all purchases made by him from manufacturers;
- (e) all transfers from the stocks of another business carried on by the same dealer under a separate licence;
- (f) receipts from other sources.

If any regulated textiles leaving a port or railway station in India on or after October 1, 1944, is imported to Ceylon without an invoice authenticated as above, such import will be treated as a violation of the condition of the authority to import and such authority will be withdrawn.

5. Trade Dispute—Harrisons & Crosfield, Limited.

AWARD UNDER THE ESSENTIAL SERVICES (AVOIDANCE OF STRIKES AND LOCKOUTS) ORDER 1942, IN THE TRADE DISPUTE BETWEEN THE ALL CEYLON TEA AND RUBBER WORKERS' UNION AND MESSRS. HARRISONS & CROSFIELD, LTD.

I. The All Ceylon Tea and Rubber Workers' Union presented a petition in regard to a trade dispute that had arisen between the Union and Messrs. HARRISONS & CROSFIELD, Ltd., consequent on the dismissal of 4 labourers named Edwin Silva alias Edwin, T. de S. Perera alias Tiddy, Cyril Perera alias Peter and Johanahamy by the Company and it was referred to a Special Tribunal appointed by H. E. the Governor under the proviso to para 5 of the Essential Services (Avoidance of Strikes and Lockouts) Order, 1942, for adjudication.

II. After inquiry the Special Tribunal made the following award based on an agreement reached between the parties to the dispute:—

(1) The three workmen, Edwin, Peter and Tiddy agree to tender an unqualified apology for their behaviour to Mr. Sherwood, on September 13, 1944, in the presence of the Tribunal and all the workers in the Mills at 9.45 A.M.

(2) If such apology is made, they will be re-employed as new entrants from September 14, 1944. The management agrees to re-instate them to their former seniority, if their work and conduct prove satisfactory to the management during the next 12 months.

(3) The workers undertake to treat Mr. Andriesz and the other storekeepers with respect at all times.

(4) In respect of any disciplinary action taken by the management against any worker during the next 12 months, the Union agrees that the management's discretion (subject only to the final decision of the Controller of Labour) will not be questioned and that such disciplinary action will not in the next 12 months form the subject of any petition under the Strikes and Lockouts Order or the Industrial Disputes Ordinance. This is to apply to any worker future or present.

(5) The workers undertake to co-operate with the management in maintaining satisfactory output in terms of the previous award.

(6) The management agrees to reinstate Johanahamy from September 13, 1944, with her former seniority.

III. The Special Tribunal visited the Mills on September 13, 1944, and heard the 3 men make their apology and give the promises agreed.

"Improvements in coverings for roadways, runways or the like and in methods of manufacture thereof".

Abstract.—The inventor states that when roadways are covered with asphaltic material with woven fabric as reinforcing material, care has to be taken that the asphaltic material is not laid at a temperature destructive to the fabric. According to the present invention the roadway is made by laying on it the fabric coated with bitumen at a temperature which is not high enough to be destructive to the material, allowing it to cool, and applying on it a mastic at a temperature which would have been harmful to the fabric if directly laid thereon. Suitable composition for the mastic is bitumen 12%, filler 18%, aggregate 70% by weight extruded at a temperature of 450°F. This, according to the inventor, remains sufficiently hard even when heated on service by the sun to a temperature of 160°F.

If necessary, a plurality of heated jute hessian surfaces and mastic may be laid. Suitable apparatus is described.
