The attention of all dealers is invited to the Textiles Control Order No. 4 published in the *Gazette Extraordinary* No. 9,323 dated Thursday, October 26, 1944, prescribing local ceiling prices for imported handloom textiles, and prohibiting the sale of any such textiles after November 30, 1944, unless they are stamped with a price-mark under the direction of the Controller of Textiles.

It is believed that the Indian Government has under consideration a scheme for the control of prices at which handloom textiles leave the Madras Presidency. The present Price Order is published as a matter of urgency, but the Controller hopes to co-ordinate local prices fixed by him with any scheme of controlled prices which the Indian Government may adopt, in the same manner as he has done in the case of mill-made textiles.

The Schedule of ceiling prices in English will be available for purchase at the Office of the Assistant Controller of Textiles, Distribution, No. 213, Main street, Pettah, Colombo, from Monday, October 30, 1944, at 15 cents per copy.

AWARD UNDER THE ESSENTIAL SERVICES (AVOIDANCE OF STRIKES AND LOCKOUTS) ORDER, 1942, IN THE TRADE DISPUTE BETWEEN THE LANKA MOTOR WORKERS' UNION, KANDY, AND THE SRI LANKA OMNIBUS CO., LTD., COLOMBO.

THE Lanka Motor Workers' Union presented a petition in regard to a trade dispute that had arisen between the Union and the Sri Lanka Omnibus Co., Ltd., Colombo. The petition was referred to a Special Tribunal appointed by His Excellency the Governor under the proviso to paragraph 5 of the Essential Services (Avoidance of Strikes and Lockouts) Order, 1942, for adjudication. The following award made by the Special Tribunal is published for general information in terms of paragraph 8 (4) of the above-mentioned Order.

The Union complains that this Bus Co. dismissed 6 drivers in December, 1943, because in November they wrote to the Controller their demand to be placed on monthly instead of daily pay.

Two of those drivers have deposed that one of the Directors Mr. Jayasena, sent for them and dismissed them expressly on that ground.

Mr. Jayasena has testified that he gave them no such reason, but discontinued them for misconduct. But (1) his evidence of the details of that misconduct seemed to me to lack verisimilitude, and (2) it is a remarkable coincidence that the Company found sudden reason about December to sack so many as 6 men.

I find that there was no lawful cause for the dismissal of these two drivers, Wilson and Andrew. They are entitled to be re-employed by respondent, if they apply for it, and to damages

at Rs. 10 per month from December up to the date of re-employment. Rs. 10 a month are enough, because they have not said that they were out of work for long.

I make no award about the other dismissed men, because they have failed to appear: for that reason, I do not feel so sure in their cases that the discontinuance was unjust. I think it probably was, but a slight doubt arises.

2. I make the following further awards. Employment on daily pay lacks security and seems out of date in regard to skilled men like bus drivers. Let monthly pay be a term of their employment, but the employer will be free to deduct pay for all days of absence without solid cause. I see in this no conflict with the regulations under the Motor Ordinance.

3. Each employee will further be entitled to four free days per month on full pay. They will also have casual and sick leave on the terms given in the Harrison & Crosfield award (*vide* award published at page 439 of *Government Gazette* No. 9,267 of May 5, 1944).

4. Each employee will further be entitled to batta at Rs. 2.50 per day of 24 hours for every night, on which he has on the Company's business to sleep away from his home.

5. I reject the other demands. They are mostly provided for in the Motor Ordinance regulation and call for no comments except that for more wages. About wages (1) it is not proved that the present wages are inadequate, (2) in view of the interesting argument of respondent's counsel, I have now some doubt whether the Legislature by its *Gazette* Notification of July, 1943, under the Motor Ordinance did not imply its intention to deal with minimum wages in this industry itself.

Let respondent pay the Union Rs. 75 costs.

TRADE DISPUTE—RAMBUKKANDE ESTATE, RATNAPURA.

IN pursuance of section 8 (4) of the Essential Services (Avoidance of Strikes and Lockouts) Order, 1942, it is hereby notified that a petition presented by the Ceylon Indian Congress Labour Union in connection with a Trade Dispute arising out of the notice issued by the Superintendent of Rambukkande Estate, Ratnapura, terminating the services of Veeramah, a labourer employed on the above estate, was referred in terms of section 6 (2) of the aforesaid Order to a Tribunal appointed by His Excellency the Governor under the proviso to section (5) of the said order.

2. The findings of the Tribunal were as follows:—

Veeramah was employed by respondent, and paid by him (1) to tap (2) to wash. She was therefore bound to obey his orders. That was her contract. In fact, she decided to obey the Union and disobey the respondent. She was rightly dismissed.

On the facts, this petition is frivolous and is dismissed with costs Rs. 30.

I have been asked to decide whether the Union can (1) maintain this action (2) make any complaint to the Controller for a labourer without proof that such labourer is a member of this Union.

Section 7 (4) of the Order of March 12, 1942, empowers this Tribunal to adopt "such procedure as it thinks proper". I think it proper to follow the Civil Code. That Code allows one man to represent another only if he has express authority. No such authority is pleaded or proved here. Therefore, this Union cannot appear or act here on behalf of any one other than its members.

But can it complain to the Controller *re* a labourer who is not a member? The Union's argument at first seemed sound on this point because section 2 (2) provides that "where any act is by this Order authorized or required to be done by any workmen, that act may be done by any of such workmen or the officer of a trade union of such workmen."

Again section 4 (1) provides that, "where any trade dispute arises between any employer and his workmen, it shall be the duty of the employer and the workmen to notify the Controller."

The words are very general "the workmen" in the last sentence above at first looks as if it meant "any workman".

But, if we so interpret it, many absurdities and anomalies follow, *e.g.*, (1) One Union will be free to act for members of a rival union without their consent. (2) A workman, who has no concern with or knowledge of some dispute between his employer and another workman, will be bound to notify such dispute and be liable to punishment in default under section 4.

I prefer to adopt another interpretation, which is tenable in itself and leads to no anomalies. That is to say, where any dispute arises "between an employer and his workmen", the workmen, who are bound to notify it, are those concerned in the dispute and no others. This interpretation is consistent with the common law of agency and with common sense. Therefore, this Union can only notify a dispute in which its members are concerned. The next issue is whether Veeramah was a member in July and is a member now.

The book produced is a ledger noting the names of members and the dates on which they paid their subscriptions: but this was not produced at the conference. Probably, the Union Clerks had not then entered it up to date. If so, the present entries may be based on memory, and there is no proof that their memories were reliable.

Counterfoils from a regularly kept receipt book would be the best proof but here that is absent.

Nevertheless, Veeramah told me yesterday that she was and is a member: I see no reason to reject her statement and find that it is true.

So much for the legal issues. On the merits, I would add that this Tribunal will never approve attempts to boycott non-unionists and coerce them into the Union.

Abstract.—Three ounces each of the following ingredients :—Ginger; coriander; black-pepper, tamarind; caraway seed; gall-nut; green cocoonut root; santalum album; mollugo stricta; ophiorrhiza mungo; tuospora cordifolia; solanum jacquini; plectranthus zeylanicus; oedrus deodara; phyllanthus emblica; terminalia bellerica; picrorhiza kurrooa; evolvolus alsimoides and twelve ounces each of alstonia scholaris and ocimum sanctum and thirty ounces of kitul jaggery are boiled in a clay pot containing six gallons of water for five hours to reduce the water to one gallon. The mixture is then filtered and allowed to cool under cover of a clay lid. After it is cooled to day temperature, one gallon of arrack thirty under proof is added to it and the mixture bottled. There is one claim.
