#### RAZOR BLADES.

##### THE CONTROL OF PRICES ORDINANCE, No. 39 OF 1939.

#### Order.

BY virtue of the powers vested in the Controller of Prices by section 3 of the Control of Prices Ordinance, No. 39 of 1939, as amended by paragraph (2) of the Defence (Control of Prices)

(Supplementary Provisions No. 2) Regulations, I, Cedric Francis Ingledow, Controller of Prices (Miscellaneous Articles), do, by this Order—

- (i.) revoke with effect from this date Order dated July 4, 1944, published in *Government Gazette* No. 9,289 of July 7, 1944;
- (ii.) fix the prices specified in columns 2, 3 and 4 of the Schedule hereto to be, respectively, the importers maximum price (to a wholesale dealer), the maximum wholesale price and the maximum retail price above which razor blades of the descriptions specified in the corresponding entry in column 1 of the Schedule shall not be sold in any part of Ceylon;
- (iii.) direct that for the purpose of this Order—
  - (a) any sale for the purpose of resale or any sale of ten or more packets of the razor blades referred to in the Schedule hereto, to any one person in the course of one transaction, shall be deemed to be a sale by wholesale;
  - (b) any sale of razor blades, referred to in Schedule hereto, other than a sale by wholesale as defined above, shall be deemed to be a sale by retail;
- (iv.) direct that any trader, who, at any premises in Ceylon, sells any razor blades of the description specified in the Schedule hereto shall exhibit in a conspicuous position at those premises a notice on which there shall be set out the maximum prices fixed by this Order in respect of razor blades of those descriptions;
- (v.) direct that every trader, who has at any time during the three months prior to this date dealt in any razor blades of the descriptions specified in column 1 of the Schedule hereto and has for the time being no stocks of it available for sale, shall exhibit in conspicuous position at his premises a notice to the effect that he has no stocks of such razor blades available for sale for the time being;
- (vi.) direct that every trader who sells any razor blades of the description specified in column 1 of the Schedule shall give to every purchaser of such razor blades, on demand, a receipt in which there shall be set out—
  - (a) the quantity and description of the razor blades sold;
  - (b) the price paid;
  - (c) the date of the sale; and
  - (d) the nature of the transaction, that is to say, whether the sale was by wholesale or by retail.

- (i.) fix the prices specified in columns 2 and 3 of the Schedule hereto to be, respectively, the maximum wholesale price and the maximum retail price above which tooth paste of the description and size specified in column 1 of the Schedule shall not be sold in any part of Ceylon;
- (ii.) direct that for the purpose of this Order—
  - (a) any sale for the purpose of resale of the tooth paste referred to in the Schedule shall be deemed to be a sale by wholesale;
  - (b) any sale for the purpose of use of the tooth paste referred to in the Schedule shall be deemed to be a sale by retail;
- (iii.) direct that every person, who sells any tooth paste specified in column 1 of the Schedule hereto, shall give to every purchaser of such tooth paste, on demand, a receipt in which there shall be set out—

  - (d) the nature of the transaction, that is to say, whether the transaction was by wholesale or by retail;
- (iv.) direct that any trader, who, at any premises in Ceylon, sells any tooth paste of the description and size specified in the Schedule hereto, shall exhibit in a conspicuous position at those premises a notice on which there shall be set out the maximum prices fixed by this Order in respect of tooth paste of that description and size.

Defence (Control of Prices) (Supplementary Provisions No. 2) Regulations, I, Murari Prasad, Deputy Controller of Prices (Food), Badulla District, do, by this Order—

- (1) revoke with effect from September 11, 1944, my orders dated November 25, 1943, and July 12, 1944, published in *Government Gazette* Nos. 9,209 of December 3, 1943, and 9,295 of July 21, 1944, in so far as they relate to the maximum wholesale prices of rice and wheat fixed within the Badulla District;

BY virtue of the powers vested in the Deputy Controller of Prices (Miscellaneous Articles) by section 3 (read with section 2 (3)), of the Control of Prices Ordinance, No. 39 of 1939, as amended by the Defence (Control of Prices) (Supplementary Provisions, No. 2) Regulations, I, Philip James Hudson, Deputy Controller of Prices (Miscellaneous Articles), Kalutara District, do by this Order:—

- (1) revoke with effect from this date my Order dated November 26, 1942, and published in *Government Gazette* No. 9,041 of November 27, 1942, in so far as it applies to bricks of the description and sizes specified in the said Order;
- (2) fix the price specified in column 2 of the Schedule hereto to be the maximum price above which any bricks of the description and size specified in the corresponding entry in column 1 of the said Schedule shall not be sold at any kiln within the limits of the Kalutara District;
- (3) fix the price specified in column 3 of the Schedule hereto to be the maximum price above which any bricks of the description and size specified in the corresponding entry in column 1 of the said Schedule shall not be sold at any depot within the Urban Council limits of Kalutara or Panadure;

##### Order.

BY virtue of the powers vested in the Deputy Controller of Prices (Food), by section 3 (read with section 2 (3)) of the Control of Prices Ordinance, No. 39 of 1939, as amended by Defence (Control of Prices) (Supplementary Provisions No. 2) Regulations, I, William Holmes, Deputy Controller of Prices (Food), Matale District, do, by this Order:—

- (1) revoke with effect from this date the Food Price Order No. ML-1 of 1944, published in *Government Gazette* No. 9,238 of February 18, 1944 and the Food Price Order No. ML-6 of 1944, published in *Government Gazette* No. 9,264 of April 28, 1944, in so far as they fix the maximum prices above which Rice and Whole Wheat shall not be sold within the Matale District;
- (2) fix the prices specified in columns 2 and 3 of the Schedule hereto to be respectively the maximum wholesale price per bag and the maximum retail price per measure above which Rice shall not be sold in the areas mentioned in the corresponding entry in column 1 of the Schedule hereto;

- (3) fix the prices specified in columns 4 and 5 of the Schedule hereto to be respectively the maximum wholesale price per bag and the maximum retail price per measure above which Whole Wheat shall not be sold in the areas mentioned in the corresponding entry in column 1 of the Schedule hereto ;
- (4) direct that every trader who has in his possession Rice or Whole Wheat in the areas mentioned in column 1 of the Schedule hereto shall exhibit in a conspicuous position at his premises (store or boutique) a notice in which shall be set out the maximum prices for Rice and Whole Wheat fixed by this Order ;
- (5) direct that no person shall sell Rice or Whole Wheat which is adulterated with any other article ;
- (6) direct that every person who sells Rice or Whole Wheat by wholesale shall, and every person who sells Rice or Whole Wheat by retail shall, on demand, give the purchaser of that Rice or Whole Wheat a receipt in which there shall be set out :—
- (a) the date of sale ;
- (b) the quantity of Rice or Whole Wheat sold ;
- (c) the price paid for the quantity of Rice or Whole Wheat sold ;
- and (d) the nature of the transaction, that is to say, whether the sale was by wholesale or by retail ; and
- (7) direct that for the purpose of this Order :—
- (a) any sale of any quantity of Rice or Whole Wheat for the purpose of resale shall be deemed to be a sale by wholesale ;
- (b) any sale of any quantity of Rice or Whole Wheat for the purpose of consumption or use by the purchaser shall be deemed to be a sale by retail ;
- (c) "measure" shall be deemed to be the standard quart, dry measure ; and
- (d) the maximum wholesale price which may be demanded for any quantity of Rice or Whole Wheat which is less than one bag shall be determined by reference to the maximum wholesale price per bag fixed by this Order.

  - (a) any sale of any quantity of rice of the description and grade mentioned in column 1 of the First Schedule for the purpose of resale shall be deemed to be a sale by wholesale;
  - (b) any sale of any quantity for the purpose of consumption or use by the purchaser shall be deemed to be a sale by retail;
  - (c) "measure" shall be deemed to be the standard quart dry measure.
