The by-laws published in the *Supplement to Gazette* No. 5,901 of January 23, 1903, are hereby amended by the insertion, immediately after Chapter XVIII (inserted by Proclamation dated July 4, 1939, and published in *Gazette* No. 8,463 of July 7, 1939), of the following new chapter:—

Chapter XVII B.

Sale of Provisions.

"1. No person shall expose for sale any cooked food, pastry, sweatmeat, or preserved dried fruit, intended for human consumption, unless such cooked food, pastry, sweatmeat, or preserved dried fruit is kept covered so as to prevent its contamination by flies or dust."

THE WAR LOAN ORDINANCE, No. 1 OF 1941.

WHEREAS, of the sum of Rs. 100,000,000 for the raising of which by way of loan authority has been given by the War Loan Ordinance, No. 1 of 1941, the sum of Rs. 71,032,400 was raised, and the sum of Rs. 10,000,000 is to be raised in pursuance of an Order made under section 4 of the Registered Stock and Securities Ordinance and published in *Gazette* No. 8,819 of November 28, 1941, and the sum of Rs. 16,967,600 is to be raised in pursuance of an Order under that section dated 5th November, 1944, and published in *Gazette* No. 9,332 of November 17, 1944, as amended by an Order published in *Gazette* No. 9,353 of 5th January, 1945.

And whereas it is proposed to raise a further sum of Rs. 2,000,000 by authority of the War Loan Ordinance, No. 1 of 1941:

Now, therefore, by virtue of the powers vested in me by section 2 of the War Loan Ordinance, No. 1 of 1941, I, Henry Monck-Mason Moore, Governor of Ceylon, do by this Order direct that, in respect of the said sum of Rs. 2,000,000 to be raised by authority of that Ordinance, the provisions of the Registered Stock and Securities Ordinance specified in the first column of the Schedule hereto shall apply and have effect subject to the exceptions, modifications, and amendments specified in the corresponding entry in the second column of that Schedule.

I.

Section 4 (1) .. For paragraph (d) there shall be substituted the following new paragraph:—

“(d) the intervals at which interest in respect of any registered stock or securities issued for the purpose of raising that loan shall be payable to the holder of such stock or securities.”

For paragraph (f) there shall be substituted the following new paragraph:—

“(f) the period at the expiration of which any registered stock or securities issued for the purpose of raising that loan shall be redeemed; and the terms and conditions, if any, on which any such stock or securities may at the request of the holder thereof be redeemed before the expiration of the said period.”

Section 7 .. For the words “at the rate and on the dates specified by the Governor by Order” there shall be substituted the words “and the Order”.

Section 14 .. shall be omitted.

Sections 17 and 20 .. For the words “at the rate and on the dates specified in the Order of the Governor” there shall be substituted the words “and the Order”.

Section 22 .. (a) for the words “in each half-year ending with the date on which” there shall be substituted the words “in each year during which”;

(b) for the words “on that date” there shall be substituted the words “during that year”.

Section 23 (1) .. For the words “half-yearly on the dates” there shall be substituted the words “to the holder thereof at such intervals as may be”.

THE VILLAGE COMMUNITIES ORDINANCE.

Order.

WHEREAS by Proclamation the area now known as the town of Seeduwa in the Divisional Revenue Officer's Division of Alutkuru Korale North (A) in the Colombo District has, with effect from the first day of February, 1945, been excluded from the operation of the Small Towns Sanitary Ordinance (Chapter 197), and brought within the operation of the Village Communities Ordinance (Chapter 198), and added to the new Andiambalama village area constituted by Proclamation bearing the date hereof:

Now, therefore, by virtue of the powers vested in me by section 41 of the Village Communities Ordinance (Chapter 198), I, Henry Monck-Mason Moore, Governor of Ceylon, do by this order, with effect from the first day of February, 1945—

(1) transfer to the Village Committee of the aforesaid village area the whole of the property and the funds acquired or received by or vested in the Sanitary Board of the Colombo District for the use and benefit of the town of Seeduwa and specified in Schedule A hereto;

(2) declare that such funds and the revenue derived from that part of the village area which is now known as the town of Seeduwa shall be employed by the Village Committee for the use and benefit of the aforesaid part of that area;

(3) direct the Village Committee to keep separate books of accounts in respect of the aforesaid part of that village area;

(4) apportion and assign to the Village Committee the whole of the rights, liabilities, debts or obligations of the Sanitary Board of the Colombo District under any contract entered into by the said Board for the benefit of the town of Seeduwa;

(5) prescribe the terms and conditions set out in Schedule B hereto as the terms and conditions on which the officers and servants specified in that Schedule and employed by the said Sanitary Board for the purposes relating to the town of Seeduwa may be transferred to the service of the aforesaid Village Committee; and

(6) direct the Government Agent of the Western Province—

(a) to collect all moneys due to the Sanitary Board of the Colombo District (whether as rates, taxes, licence duties or otherwise), from the inhabitants of the area now known as the town of Seeduwa;

(b) to recover such moneys in the manner in which they would have been recovered if that town had not been excluded from the operation of the Small Towns Sanitary Ordinance; and

(c) to pay such moneys when so collected and recovered to the Village Committee of the aforesaid village area.

Order.

1. That part of the territorial waters of Ceylon which is specified in the Schedule hereto is hereby declared to be a controlled water area for the purposes of the Defence (Miscellaneous) Regulations.

2. The Military Port Security Officer and the Superintendent of Police, Ceylon Ports, shall, severally, be the authorities without whose permission no person or vessel shall be in the water area specified in the Schedule hereto.

3. This Order may be cited as the Controlled Water Area (Colombo Harbour) Order.

Schedule.

The water area bounded as follows:—

On the north, a line drawn due west from a point on the beach one geographical mile north of Mutwal Point to a distance of three geographical miles; on the south, a line drawn due west from a point on the beach one geographical mile south of the Colombo Clock Tower to a distance of three geographical miles; on the west, a line connecting the western ends of the above named north and south limits; on the east, the shore contained between the north and south limits.

Schedule.

Directions regulating the conduct of persons permitted to be in the Trincomalee Inner Harbour Protected Place No. 36.

1. No person holding any permit, pass, identity card or other authority, or exempted from holding such pass, shall be in the Trincomalee Inner Harbour Protected Place, unless he is actually engaged in business therein or going to or from his own ship.

2. Every such person shall, if required by any authorised officer, state his business at the time and satisfy such officer that he is actually engaged in such business or is going to or from such business.

3. (a) Passengers and crews on shore leave, from merchant vessels shall enter and leave the premises only by the Kachcheri Pier.

(b) Ships' chandlers, dubashes, fishermen, dhobies and other tradesmen shall enter and leave the premises only by the Kachcheri Pier or by the beach between the Kachcheri Pier and the Customs Boatshed opposite Kachcheri road.

(c) Members of the Ceylon Anglers Club shall enter and leave the premises only by Welcombe Hotel Cove.

4. (1) (a) No person holding any permit, pass, identity card or other authority, or exempted from holding such pass, shall take out or use in the Inner Harbour any boat, canoe, catamaran, raft or other craft, unless such craft has been registered by the Port Security Officer, and been clearly marked with letters and numbers in such manner as the Port Security Officer may direct.

(b) No such person shall take out or use in the Inner Harbour any craft specified in sub-paragraph (a) during the hours of darkness between sunset and sunrise.

(c) Every such person, who is the owner, or the person for the time being in charge, of any craft specified in sub-paragraph (a) shall, during the hours of darkness between sunset and sunrise, cause such craft to be securely moored or beached in such areas as the Port Security Officer may direct.

(d) No such person shall use for fishing in the Inner Harbour any craft specified in sub-paragraph (a) except within the areas bounded by the foreshore north of a line from Welcombe Jetty to Chardon Buoy, thence to north east Welcombe Buoy, thence to southernmost point of Powder Island and thence through D VI A mooring buoy to the shore at the western end of Admiralty fence.

(2) Exemption from the restrictions imposed by paragraph (1) is granted to persons on board the following :—

(a) Boats, seaplanes and other craft manned by members of the Naval, Military or Air Forces of His Majesty or of any foreign power allied with His Majesty, or of the Trincomalee Harbour Police;

(b) boats or other craft belonging to Admiralty Establishments or the Merchant Marine;

(c) ships belonging to or employed in the service of His Majesty or of any foreign power allied with His Majesty; and

AWARD UNDER THE ESSENTIAL SERVICES (AVOIDANCE OF STRIKES AND LOCKOUTS) ORDER 1942 IN THE TRADE DISPUTE BETWEEN THE BADULLA URBAN COUNCIL AND SOME OF ITS EMPLOYEES.

SOME of the employees of the Badulla Urban Council presented a petition to me under para 6 of the Essential Services (Avoidance of Strikes and Lockouts) Order 1942 regarding a trade dispute that had arisen between the employees and the Badulla Urban Council. The petition was referred to a Special Tribunal appointed by His Excellency the Officer Administering the Government under the proviso to para 5 of the said Order for adjudication.

The following award made by the Special Tribunal is published for general information in terms of para 8 (4) of the said Order:—

The petitioners are some of the employees of the Urban Council of Badulla. They are included in the category of workmen in an Essential Service. They say their war allowance has not been paid in full for the period January 1, 1943 to November 30. They have been paid war allowance before and after this period. The aggregate amount claimed by them is Rs. 2,484. It would appear that petitioners are employees whose salaries and allowance aggregate to more than Rs. 100 a month. The Urban Council of Badulla voted payment to them and revoked it unanimously.

The Chairman however thought that he should obtain the sanction of the Commissioner of Local Government under section 48 (2) of the Urban Councils Ordinance, No. 61 of 1939 before making payment and he applied accordingly. The Commissioner felt that he could not sanction the payment owing to the depleted finances of the Council. It now appears however that the year 1944 has been a very satisfactory year for the Council and the surplus balance on November 30, 1944 is about Rs. 35,000. Therefore it is but reasonable that the arrears claimed by the petitioners should be paid to them. It is not at all desirable that the salaries and allowances of the petitioners which I ascertained at the inquiry was hardly sufficient for their maintenance under present conditions should be made to depend on the fluctuating finances of the Urban Council.

My award is that the arrears of war allowances claimed by the petitioners be paid to them.

- (b) remove any threshed paddy from any field or threshing floor until a record of such threshing has been taken by the Vel-Vidane or Irrigation Headman of the field or his authorized deputy and until such record has been signed to, in acknowledgment of the correctness of such record and such levy or share of levy calculated at two bushels per acre has been delivered to such Vel-Vidane or Irrigation Headman on behalf of Government; nor except on such permit as such Vel-Vidane or Irrigation Headman will thereafter issue on form D. FS & C. 12 (a) provided that transport on such permit will be valid only within the limits of the hatpattu where the paddy field is situate.

2. I do further direct that—

- (a) on termination of the removal of such paddy on form D. FS & C. 12 (a) and in no case after seven days after the permit has lapsed, such permit shall be surrendered to the village headman of the area in which the place of storage of such paddy is situate.
- (b) no holder of rice ration books shall consume any part of such paddy as has been received into his possession or place of storage, until he shall have in terms of the Defence (Food Rationing) Special Provisions Regulation, 1944, surrendered to the village headman of the area in which he is resident, the equivalent in rice coupons of such paddy at the rate of five or eight coupons per bushel equally from himself and his dependants, according as whether he is a cultivator, owner-cultivator or non-cultivator-owner.
- (c) No holder of substitute ration books shall consume any part of such paddy as has been received into his possession or place of storage except at the rate of six measures or four measures per week for himself and everyone of his dependants according as whether he is a cultivator, owner-cultivator or non-cultivator-owner, provided that the maximum of allowance to such person and his dependants shall be fifty bushels, no person not resident in the same household being considered a dependant.

(d) No paddy other than as allowed at the rates of consumption set out in (c) above, together with the customary requirements of seed and cultivation allowances, latter not exceeding one bushel per acre, shall be disposed of, except by way of sale to Government and shall be held at my disposal unless earlier disposed of by such sale to Government.

3. Permits for transport out of this emergency area shall be applied for through the D. F. C. or A. G. A. (E) of the area in which such person is resident. Permits for transport within a Chief Headman's division after such paddy has been lodged in a customary place of storage or for transport from one Chief Headman's division to the other within this emergency area shall be obtained by application to me. All applications shall be on the usual form D.F.C. 34.

4. If no application is made for removal in terms of para. (3) above within a period of six weeks from date of threshing, the stocks of paddy not so applied for will be requisitionable under the I. P. Scheme.

F. S. & C. 12 obtained from the Village Headman of the area, who will obtain the signature of the remover on the triplicate of the permit in proof of removal.

- (4) not dispose of any paddy in any way, except so much as is allowable for consumption, at the approved rates by a share-holder and his dependants until the surrender of the appropriate number of coupons and the sale to Government of such quantity as I may order.
- (5) hand over to the Village Headman at the threshing floor itself the levy of two bushels per acre in respect of the Maha harvest.

2. For transport of paddy from one Chief Headman's or Divisional Revenue Officer's division to another or from one Emergency Assistant Government Agent's area to another or from one district to another application in duplicate should be made to the D. F. C. or A. G. A. (E) of the area where the applicant resides on Form D. F. C. 34, copies of which are available at any of the above-mentioned offices.

- (a) *Transport from the threshing floor to the barn or other place of storage within the same D. R. O's Division.*

The application either verbally or in writing should be made to the Village Headman of the area in which the field is situated who will issue the permit on D. F. S. and C. 12.

- (b) *Transport from one D. R. O's Division to another D. R. O's Division within the emergency area of Wellaboda pattu, Bentota-Walallawiti korale and Gangaboda pattu.*

The application should be made to the D. R. O. of the area in which the fields are situated. To expedite the issue of the permits the applicants are requested to produce reports from the Village Headmen in whose areas the fields are situated intimating the D. R. - (3) No part of the paddy so removed shall be used for consumption until the surrender of the appropriate number of coupons, and then only at the approved rates of 6 measures per head per week for owner-cultivators, cultivators and their dependants and 4 measures per head per week for non-cultivating owners and their dependants up to a maximum of 50 bushels per household per cultivating season.
- (4) No paddy other than that referred to in (3) above and seed and feeding allowances at the authorised rates shall be disposed of except by way of sale to a Government Purchasing Centre without prior instructions from me.
- (5) If no application for removal of any share of paddy to a place outside the emergency area of Wellaboda pattu, Bentota-Walallawiti korale and Gangaboda pattu is received by me within six weeks of the harvesting of same the paddy in question will be taken over by me and payment made at the rate of Rs. 6 per bushel of well dried paddy free from chaff, etc.

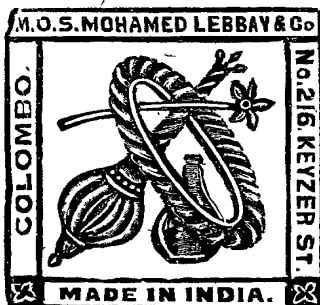

1. The first general election of the new Village Committees shall be held on such dates, between the date of the publication of this Proclamation and the thirty-first day of January, 1945, as the Government Agent of the Western Province may determine.

2. For the purposes of the general elections aforesaid—

- (a) section 14 of the Village Communities Ordinance shall have effect as though in sub-section (4) thereof, for the words "one month's notice" there were substituted the words "fourteen days' notice" and as though in sub-section (6) thereof, for the words "fourteen days" there were substituted the words "seven days", and
- (b) section 15 of that Ordinance shall have effect as though in sub-section (3) thereof, for the words "seven days" there were substituted the words "three days".

3. Each of the new Village Committees aforesaid shall be the successor of the old Village Committee for all such purposes of the Village Communities Ordinance as may relate to that new village area.

4. All by-laws made under the Village Communities Ordinance by the old Village Committee and in force on the thirty-first day of January, 1945, shall continue in force in each of the new village areas and shall be deemed to have been made by the new Village Committee of each such area.

5. One-half of the amount lying to the credit of the Communal Fund of the old Village Committee on the thirty-first day of January, 1945, shall, on the first day of February, 1945, be credited to the Communal Fund of each of the new Village Committees.

6. All movable property other than money vested in or under the control of the old Village Committee on the thirty-first day of January, 1945, shall be deemed to be vested in equal shares in each of the new Village Committees.

7. Each land, building or other immovable property vested in or under the control of the old Village Committee on the

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thirty-first day of January, 1945, shall be deemed to be vested in the Village Committee of the new village area within which the property is situated.

8. All the rights, debts, liabilities and obligations of the old Village Committee shall, so far as they relate to any of the new village areas, be deemed to be transferred to the Village Committee of such new area.

"old Village Committee" means the Village Committee of the Minuwangoda-Andiambalama village area constituted by Proclamation published in *Gazette* No. 8,030 of February 2, 1934.
