WHEREAS Miss J. D. Scott has become entitled to a

THE TRADING WITH THE ENEMY (CUSTODIAN)
ORDER, 1940.

And whereas the said Velupillai Kandiah is now believed to be residing in Malaya and is an enemy within the meaning of the Defence (Trading with the Enemy) Regulations, 1939, read with the Defence (Trading with the Enemy) Amendment Regulations :

And whereas it is expedient that a Vesting Order should be made in respect of the said immovable property and such powers in regard thereto as are hereinafter contained should be conferred upon the Custodian of Enemy Property :

Now therefore, I, Henry Monck-Mason Moore, Governor of Ceylon, by virtue of the powers vested in me by the Defence (Trading with the Enemy) Regulations, 1939, the Defence (Trading with the Enemy) Amendment Regulations, and the Trading with the Enemy (Custodian) Order, 1940, and all other powers enabling me in that behalf, do hereby order—

- (1) that all the right, title and interest of the said Velupillai Kandiah to and in the said immovable property do vest in the Custodian of Enemy Property ;

THE DEFENCE (TRADING WITH THE ENEMY)
REGULATIONS, 1939.

WHEREAS Naranapillai Kanapathipillai and his wife Annammah are enemies within the meaning of the Defence (Trading with the Enemy) Regulations, 1939, by reason of their residence in the Federated Malay States, now enemy territory within the meaning of the said Regulations :

And whereas prior to the date on which the said Naranapillai Kanapathipillai and his wife Annammah became enemies as aforesaid the said Naranapillai Kanapathipillai and his wife Annammah duly appointed, I. Vairavanathar their attorney in Ceylon by Powers of Attorney respectively executed at Kuala Lumpur and Seramban, on the 29th day of March, 1935 and the 20th day of May, 1940, and duly attested by the Assistant Registrar, Supreme Court, Kuala Lumpur, and the Magistrate of Seramban :

And whereas every person in Ceylon who has any commercial, financial, or other intercourse or dealings with, or for the benefit of, the said Naranapillai Kanapathipillai and his wife Annammah is liable to be deemed to have traded with the enemy within the meaning of the said Regulations, and will thereby be guilty of an offence against the said Regulations, unless he has acted under authority given generally or specially by the Governor :

And whereas it is expedient in terms of paragraph (2) of regulation 1 of the said Regulations to give authority to I. Vairavanathar and to persons resident in Ceylon in the manner hereinafter provided :

Now, therefore, I, Henry Monck-Mason Moore, Governor of Ceylon, do, by virtue of the powers vested in me by paragraph (2) of regulation 1 of the Defence (Trading with the

Enemy) Regulations, 1939, hereby authorise the said I. Vairavanathar to have such commercial, financial or other intercourse or dealings with persons in Ceylon for the benefit of the said Naranapillai Kanapathipillai and his wife Annammah as he could have had under the aforesaid Powers of Attorney prior to the date on which the said Naranapillai Kanapathipillai and his wife Annammah became enemies as aforesaid, and I do, further, authorise persons in Ceylon generally to have commercial, financial or other intercourse or dealings with the said Naranapillai Kanapathipillai and his wife Annammah through the said I. Vairavanathar.

THE EMERGENCY POWERS (DEFENCE) ACTS,
1939 AND 1940.

DEFENCE regulations made by the Governor by virtue of the powers vested in him by the Emergency Powers (Defence) Acts, 1939 and 1940, of the Imperial Parliament, as adapted, modified and extended to Ceylon by the Emergency Powers (Colonial Defence) Order in Council, 1939, and the Emergency Powers (Colonial Defence) (Amendment) Order in Council, 1940.

Regulations.

1. These regulations may be cited as the Defence (Control of Prices) (Supplementary Provisions No. 4) Regulations.

2. During the continuance in force of these regulations, the Control of Prices Ordinance, No. 39 of 1939, shall have effect subject to the modifications set out hereunder (in addition to the modifications made by any other defence regulation for the time being in force) :—

(a) in sub-section (1) of section 5 of that Ordinance, for the words "made thereunder" there shall be substituted the words "made thereunder, or of any general or special direction issued under section 5A";

(b) in sub-section (3) of section 5 of that Ordinance—

(i) in paragraph (b), for the words "wholesale business," there shall be substituted the words "wholesale business; or"; and

(ii) immediately after paragraph (b) there shall be inserted the following new paragraph :—

"(c) that the sale of the article on the occasion in question would have been contrary to any general or special direction issued to him under section 5A.";

(c) immediately after section 5 of that Ordinance, there shall be inserted the following new section, which shall have effect as section 5A of that Ordinance :—

Power to issue general or special directions. 5A. (1) The Controller may, by general directions issued to any class of persons or by special directions issued to any particular person, prescribe, in relation to that class or that person, as the case may be—

(a) the maximum quantity of any price-controlled article to be sold on any one day;

(b) the times during which, and the places at which, such article may be sold; and

(c) any other conditions as to the sale of that article;

and so long as such directions are in force, every person to whom such directions apply shall sell or dispose of that article in accordance with such directions and not otherwise.

(2) Every general direction issued by the Controller under sub-section (1) shall be published by him in the *Gazette* and in at least one newspaper circulating in Ceylon.

(3) Every special direction issued to any person by the Controller under sub-section (1) shall be in writing and shall be served on the person to whom it is issued; and any such direction shall be deemed to be served on such person if it is sent by post addressed to him at his place of business. In proving such service by post, it shall be sufficient to prove that the document containing the direction was duly addressed and posted.

(d) in section 7 of that Ordinance, immediately after the definition of "Order", there shall be inserted the following new definition :—

"price-controlled article" means any article in respect of which an Order is in force.

THE following amendment to the Public Service Regulation appearing in the Ceylon Government Manual of Procedure (2nd Edition) is published for general information :—

"Delete existing Public Service Regulation 94 and substitute the following therefor :—

94. Notwithstanding the above provisions, if the Chief Secretary considers that an officer should be removed on grounds of general inefficiency which cannot properly be dealt with by specific charges under the foregoing regulations, he shall procure from the Heads of Departments in which the officer has served statements as to the officer's efficiency or inefficiency and shall allow the officer an opportunity of considering such statements and showing cause why he should not be compulsorily retired or otherwise dealt with for general inefficiency. The Chief Secretary after considering the officer's statement shall report the case to the Governor, who if he decides that the procedure for framing charges is inapplicable to the case, may refer the matter to the Public Services Commission. The Commission after considering the documents in the case shall advise the Governor as to what action, if any, should be taken in regard to the officer. The Governor shall if he considers that the officer should be compulsorily retired or otherwise dealt with for general inefficiency, submit a full report on the case to the Secretary of State forwarding at the same time the recommendations of the Public Services Commission, the statements of the Heads of Departments, the reply of the officer showing cause, and other documents relative to the case. If the Secretary of State is satisfied that the officer's removal is necessary in the interests of the Public Service, it will be carried into effect by an intimation to the Governor that it is the pleasure of the Crown that the officer should no longer hold his office. In every such case the question of pension will be dealt with under the laws or regulations of the Island."

2. This amended regulation shall have effect from June 1, 1945.

The Rules for Passenger and Goods Train Traffic and Rates and Classification of Goods published in the *Supplement to Gazette* No. 7,514 of February 26, 1926, as last amended by rule published in *Gazette* No. 9,287 of June 30, 1944, are hereby further amended as follows:—

I. Under the heading "Passengers", in rule 26—

- (i) by the omission of paragraph (b); and
(ii) by the re-lettering of paragraphs (c) and (d), as paragraphs (b) and (c) respectively.

II. Under the heading "Concessions", in rule 32, by the substitution, for paragraph (1), of the following new paragraph:—

"(1) Officers, Sailors, Soldiers, members of the Royal Air Force and of the sea-going staff of Steamship Companies, and Nurses in Naval and Military Hospitals, Officers, Sailors, Soldiers, members of the Royal Air Force and of the sea-going staff of Steamship Companies, and Nurses in Naval and Military Hospitals on furlough will be conveyed at three-quarter fare for the single journey and at one and a quarter fare for the double journey on surrendering at the booking office their special railway furlough certificate. The return halves of the tickets issued to them will be available for the return journey up to and including the date of expiry of the furlough. This concession applies also to the wives and children of officers, sailors, soldiers, members of the Royal Air Force and of the sea-going staff of steamship companies if they are included in the railway furlough certificate."

III. Under the heading "Parcels" in rule 34, by the substitution in paragraph (d), for all the words from "All Parcels" to "any other day.", of the following:—

"(d) All Parcels left in the railway premises beyond the first day after their arrival will be subject to cloak room charges as follows:—

- (i) 20 cents per cwt. per diem for the first two days, subject to the minimum charge of 10 cents per package per diem.
(ii) 30 cents per cwt. per diem for any subsequent period subject to the minimum charge of 15 cents per package per diem.

In computing cloakroom charges on parcels Sundays shall be excluded except that in the case of parcels tendered for despatch or taken delivery of on a Sunday, such Sunday shall be reckoned in the same way as any other day. Fractions of a cwt. up to and including half cwt. shall be charged for as $\frac{1}{2}$ cwt. and those above $\frac{1}{2}$ cwt. as 1 cwt.

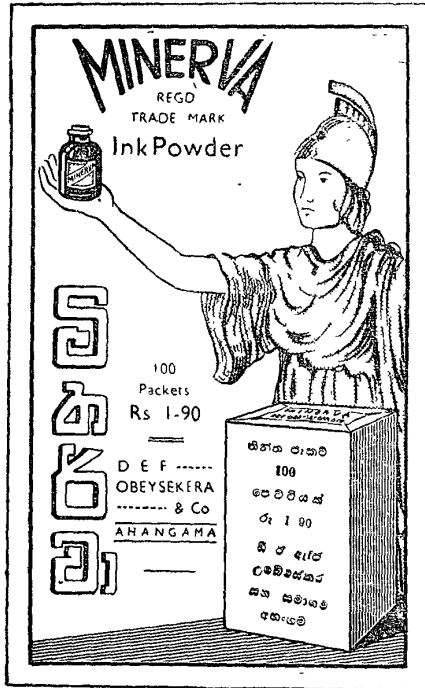
