### GOVERNMENT NOTIFICATIONS. PRICE ORDERS.

#### SUGAR—RAW BROWN WHITE REFINED.

THE CONTROL OF PRICES ORDINANCE, No. 39 OF 1939.

#### Order.

BY virtue of the powers vested in the Deputy Controller of Prices (Food) and Assistant Controller of Prices (Food) by section 3 read with section 2 (3) of the Control of Prices Ordinance, No. 39 of 1939, as amended by paragraph 2 of the Defence (Control of Prices) (Supplementary Provision No. 2) Regulations, published in *Ceylon Government Gazette Extraordinary* No. 9,054 of December 21, 1942, I, Alfred Silva Kohoban Wickrame, Deputy Controller of Prices (Food), Kandy District, and Assistant Controller of Prices (Food), Uda Hewaheta Division, Nuwara Eliya District, do, by this Order—

- (i.) revoke, with effect from this date, Order dated October 30, 1943, published in *Ceylon Government Gazette* No. 9,191 of November 5, 1943, fixing maximum prices of sugar for the Kandy District and Uda Hewaheta Division of the Nuwara Eliya District, in so far as it relates to Raw Brown Sugar and White Refined Sugar;
- (ii.) fix the prices specified in column 2 of the Second Schedule hereto, to be the maximum wholesale price per hundredweight gross above which sugar of the description and grade mentioned in the First Schedule hereto, shall not be sold within the respective areas mentioned in the corresponding entries in column 1 of the Second Schedule hereto;
- (iii.) fix the prices specified in column 2 of the Third Schedule hereto, to be the maximum retail price per pound above which sugar of the description and grade mentioned in the First Schedule hereto shall not be sold within the respective areas mentioned in the corresponding entries in column 1 of the Third Schedule hereto;
- (iv.) direct that, for the purpose of this Order—
  - (a) any sale of any quantity of sugar for the purpose of resale or any sale of sugar in a quantity of one hundredweight gross or more at a time, shall be deemed to be a sale by wholesale;
  - (b) any sale of any quantity of sugar less than one hundredweight gross at a time, for the purpose of consumption or use, shall be deemed to be a sale by retail;
  - (c) "sugar" shall exclude all forms of jaggery;
- (v.) direct that in every area where maximum prices are fixed by this Order, no trader shall sell any sugar of the description and grade mentioned in the First Schedule hereto, which is adulterated with any other article or with sugar of an inferior description or grade or quality;
- (vi.) direct that in every area where maximum prices are fixed by this Order, every trader who has in his possession at any premises sugar of any description and grade specified in the First Schedule hereto, shall exhibit in a conspicuous position at those premises a notice in which there shall be set out the maximum prices fixed by this Order in respect of sugar of that description and grade;
- (vii.) direct that in every area where maximum prices are fixed by this Order, every person who sells by wholesale any article specified in the First Schedule hereto shall, and every person who sells by retail any article

specified in the First Schedule hereto shall on demand, give the purchaser of that article a receipt in which there shall be set out—

- (a) the date of the sale;
- (b) the quantity of sugar sold (by weight);
- (c) the description and grade of sugar sold;
- (d) the price paid for the quantity of sugar sold; and
- (e) the nature of the transaction, that is to say, whether the sale was by wholesale or by retail.

LAMPS AND LANTERNS.

THE CONTROL OF PRICES ORDINANCE, No. 39 OF 1939.

Order.

BY virtue of the powers vested in the Controller of Prices by section 3 of the Control of Prices Ordinance, No. 39 of 1939, as amended by paragraph (2) of the Defence (Control of Prices)

(Supplementary Provisions No. 2) Regulations, I, Glanville Sextus Peiris, Acting Controller of Prices (Miscellaneous Articles), do, by this Order—

- (i) fix the prices specified in columns 3 and 4 of the Schedule hereto to be the maximum wholesale and retail prices respectively above which lamps and lanterns of the description, and make specified in columns 1 and 2 respectively of the Schedule hereto shall not be sold in Ceylon;
- (ii) direct that for the purpose of this Order, any sale for the purpose of use of any lamp or lantern of the description, and make specified in columns 1 and 2 respectively, of the Schedule hereto shall be deemed to be a sale by retail and any sale for the purpose of resale shall be deemed to be a sale by wholesale;
- (iii) direct that every dealer who at any premises in Ceylon sells any lamp or lantern of the description and make specified in columns 1 and 2 respectively, of the Schedule hereto shall exhibit in a conspicuous position at those premises a notice on which there shall be set out the maximum prices, fixed for such lamps or lanterns by this Order;
- (iv) direct that every person who sells any lamp or lantern of the description and make specified in columns 1 and 2 respectively, of the Schedule hereto, shall give to every purchaser of such lamp or lantern on demand a receipt in which there shall be set out—
  - (a) the description, make and quantity of the lamps or lanterns sold;
  - (b) the price paid; and
  - (c) the date and place of sale.

BRICKS AND TILES.

THE CONTROL OF PRICES ORDINANCE, No. 39 OF 1939.  
Order.

BY virtue of powers vested in the Assistant Controller of Prices (Miscellaneous Articles) by section 3, read with section 2 (3) of the Control of Prices Ordinance, No. 39 of 1939, as amended by paragraph 2 of Defence (Control of Prices) (Supplementary Provisions No. 2) Regulations, published in *Ceylon Government Gazette Extraordinary* No. 9,054 of December 21, 1942, I, Francis Reginald Hugh Edirisinghe, Assistant Controller of Prices (Miscellaneous Articles) for the Districts of Puttalam and Chilaw, do, by this Order—

- (1) fix the prices specified in columns 2 and 3 of the Schedule thereto, to be the maximum prices above which bricks/tiles of the description specified in column 1 of the said Schedule shall not be sold at any place within the districts of Puttalam and Chilaw;
- (2) direct that every manufacturer or dealer in bricks/tiles within the districts of Puttalam and Chilaw, who has in his possession a stock of bricks/tiles shall furnish to me within seven days of publication of this Order in the *Government Gazette* a return stating—
  - (a) the address of every premises, which contains bricks/tiles in his possession or under his control;
  - (b) the quantity of bricks/tiles in every such premises;
- (3) direct that every person carrying on such business as a manufacturer or dealer in bricks/tiles, who has in possession or under his control a stock of bricks/tiles of the description specified in column 1 of the Schedule, shall furnish to me a monthly return of stocks to reach me on or before the 5th of the following month in respect of the previous month;
- (4) direct that every person who sells within the districts of Puttalam and Chilaw, any bricks/tiles of the description in column 1 of the Schedule thereto, shall exhibit in a conspicuous position at that kiln a notice on which there shall be set out the maximum prices fixed by this Order;

- (5) direct that every person who sells within the districts of Puttalam and Chilaw, any bricks/tiles of the description specified in column 1 of the Schedule thereto shall give every purchaser of such bricks/tiles a receipt on which there shall be set out—
- (a) the number of bricks/tiles sold,
  - (b) the price paid for the bricks/tiles sold,
  - (c) the description of the bricks/tiles sold,
  - (d) the date of the sale,
  - (e) the number of the permit on surrender of which bricks/tiles were sold.

POWDER.

THE CONTROL OF PRICES ORDINANCE, No. 39 OF 1939.  
Order.

BY virtue of the powers vested in the Controller of Prices by section 3 of the Control of Prices Ordinance, No. 39 of 1939, as amended by paragraph (2) of the Defence (Control of Prices) (Supplementary Provisions No. 2) Regulations, I, Glanville Sextus Peiris, Acting Controller of Prices (Miscellaneous Articles), do, by this Order—

- (i.) revoke with effect from this date, Order dated July 19, 1943, published in *Government Gazette* No. 9,150 of July 23, 1943, in so far as it relates to the maximum prices fixed in respect of Cuticura Talcum Powder (large);
- (ii.) fix the prices specified in columns 2, 3 and 4 of the Schedule hereto to be the maximum prices respectively above which powder described in column 1 of the Schedule hereto shall not be sold wholesale or retail respectively in Ceylon;
- (iii.) direct that for the purposes of this Order—
  - (a) any sale of powder of the description specified in column 1 of the Schedule hereto to a wholesale dealer shall be deemed to be a sale by wholesale by an importer;
  - (b) any sale for the purpose of resale of any quantity of powder of the description specified in column 1 of the Schedule hereto shall be deemed to be a sale by wholesale;
  - (c) any sale for the purpose of use of any quantity of powder of the description specified in column 1 of the Schedule hereto shall be deemed to be a sale by retail;
  - (d) "importer's maximum price" shall apply to any sale by an importer to a wholesale dealer;
  - (e) "maximum wholesale price" shall apply to all sales by wholesale except sales by an importer to a wholesale dealer;
  - (f) "maximum retail price" shall apply to all sales by retail;
- (iv.) direct that every dealer, who at any premises in Ceylon sells powder of the description specified in the Schedule hereto, shall exhibit in a conspicuous position

at those premises the maximum prices fixed by this Order for Talcum and Toilet Powder of that description ;

(v.) direct that every person who sells powder of the description specified in column 1 of the Schedule hereto shall give to every purchaser of such powder on demand a receipt in which there shall be set out—

(a) the description and quantity of the powder sold ;

(b) the price paid; and

(c) the date and place of the sale.
