THE EMERGENCY POWERS (DEFENCE) ACTS,
1939 AND 1940.

DEFENCE regulation made by the Governor by virtue of the powers vested in him by the Emergency Powers (Defence) Acts, 1939 and 1940, of the Imperial Parliament, as adapted, modified and extended to Ceylon, by the Emergency Powers (Colonial Defence) Order in Council, 1939, and the Emergency Powers (Colonial Defence) (Amendment) Order in Council, 1940.

Regulation.

The Defence (Restriction of Meals) (No. 3) Regulations, 1944, published in *Gazette Extraordinary* No. 9,273 of May 25, 1944, are hereby amended as follows:—

(1) by the insertion immediately after regulation 3, of the following new regulation:—

“3A. Notwithstanding that eggs are specified in the Schedule hereto, nothing in regulation 2 (1) or in regulation 3 (1) shall apply to any cake, biscuit, confectionery or patty of which eggs are an ingredient” and

(2) in the Schedule thereto by the insertion, immediately after item 7, of the following new item:—

“7A. Edible eggs of all varieties.”

A PROCLAMATION.

HENRY MOORE.

KNOW Ye that by virtue of the powers vested in me by sections 3 and 6 of the Village Communities Ordinance (Chapter 198), I, Henry Monck-Mason Moore, Governor of Ceylon, do by this Proclamation declare that, with effect from the first day of February, 1945, the area now known as the town of Seeduwa, which is situated within the Divisional Revenue Officer's Division of Alutkuru Korale North (A) in the Colombo District and is more fully described in the Schedule hereto, shall be brought within the operation of the said Ordinance; and shall form part of the new Andiambalama village area constituted by Proclamation bearing the date hereof.

Schedule.

Limits of the town of Seeduwa.

East: The Dandugama-oya.

South: The Dandugama-oya, the Depa-ela to a point ten chains to the south of the Mahalangamuwa-Kotugoda road. From this point a line drawn westwards and parallel to the said road as far as the Colombo-Negombo road.

West: The Colombo-Negombo road.

North: A line drawn eastwards from the Colombo-Negombo road ten chains to the north of the Mahalangamuwa-Kotugoda road and parallel to it as far as the Depa-ela; thence along the Depa-ela northwards up to the Seeduwa-Amandoluwa village boundary; thence along the said village boundary eastwards to the Dandugama-oya.

A PROCLAMATION.

HENRY MOORE.

KNOW Ye that by virtue of the powers vested in me by Section 109 of the Customs Ordinance (Chapter 185), and by regulation 9 of the Air Navigation (Customs) Regulations, 1938, I, Henry Monck-Mason Moore, Governor of Ceylon, do by this Proclamation appoint the area described in the Schedule hereto to be a Customs Examination Station for the lading and unlading of goods within the Colombo Airport.

Schedule.

Bounds and extent of Customs Examination Station at the Colombo Airport.

The area enclosed within the following limits:—

- (a) on the North: the northern edge of the tarmac apron in front of the administration building and thence an imaginary line running due west to its point of intersection with the western limit;
- (b) on the West: the western wall of Shell Co., godown and thence an imaginary line running due North to its point of intersection with the northern limit;
- (c) on the South: the southern wall of No. 1 hangar and thence the south-eastern wall of No. 2 hangar and an imaginary line to the south-eastern corner of the administration building; and
- (d) on the East: the eastern wall of the administration building and the eastern edge of the tarmac apron in front thereof.
