THE DEFENCE (MISCELLANEOUS) REGULATIONS.

The Essential Work (Maintenance of Production) Order, 1943, published in Gazette No. 9,248 of March 18, 1944, as amended by any subsequent Order, is hereby further amended in the Schedule thereto, by the addition, immediately after item 4, of the following new items, each of the entries comprised therein being inserted in the appropriate column of the Schedule:-

"5. February 27, (a) The manufacture and supply 1945 of coconut oil, other edible oils or cattle cake, intended for use in His Majesty's
