A PROCLAMATION.

HENRY MOORE.

KNOW Ye that by virtue of the powers vested in me by section 2 of the Rent Restriction Ordinance, No. 60 of 1942, I, Henry Monck-Mason Moore, Governor of Ceylon, do by this Proclamation declare that the said Ordinance shall be in force in the rural area specified in the Schedule hereto, and appoint the first day of August, 1945, as the date on and after which the said Ordinance shall be in force in that area.

Schedule.

All that area situated in the villages of Utuwana, Utuwankanda, Anwarama, Habbunkaduwa, Hindeniya, Nungomuwa, Rankotdiwala, Mawanella Town, Godagama, Dewaragampola in Tanipperu Pattuwa, Hinguloya, Beligammana, Mawana, Kiringadeniya in Meda Pattuwa and Kappagoda in Egodapota Pattuwa of Galboda Korale in Galboda and Kinigoda Korales of Four Korales in Kegalle District, Sabaragamuwa Province and bounded as follows:—

North—by a line drawn from a point 8 chains north of the northern edge of the Colombo-Kandy Road at the 55th M.P. eastwards parallel to and at a distance of 8 chains from the said edge of the said road as far as a point 8 chains west of the western edge of the Mawanella-Rambukkana Road, thence a line drawn northwards parallel to and at a distance of 8 chains from the said edge of the said road till it meets the right bank of Maha Oya, thence eastwards along the said bank to the left bank of Hingul Oya.

East—by a line drawn from the last mentioned point southwards along the left bank of Hingul Oya as far as a point of the said bank 8 chains in a straight line south-east of the southern edge of the bridge over the Mawanella-Rambukkana Road; thence a line drawn southwards parallel to and at a distance of 8 chains east of the eastern edge of the said road as far as a point 8 chains north of the northern edge of the Colombo-Kandy Road; thence a line drawn eastwards parallel to and at a distance of 8 chains from the said edge of the said road as far as a point north of the 57th M. P. on the said road, thence southwards in a straight line crossing the said road at the said M.P. to a point 8 chains south of the southern edge of the said road.

South—by a line drawn from the last mentioned point westwards parallel to and at a distance of 8 chains south of the southern edge of the Colombo-Kandy Road as far as a point 8 chains east of the eastern edge of the Mawanella-Alpitiya Road, thence a line drawn southwards parallel to and at a distance of 8 chains east of the eastern edge of the said road as far as a point east of the ½ M.P. on the said road,

thence a line drawn westwards crossing the said road at the said M.P. to a point 8 chains west of the western edge of the said road, thence a line drawn northwards parallel to and at a distance of 8 chains west of the said edge of the said road as far as a point 8 chains south of the southern edge of the Colombo-Kandy Road, thence a line drawn westwards parallel to and at a distance of 8 chains south of the southern edge of the said road and crossing Maha Oya to its left bank, thence southwards along the said bank to a point east of the 1st M.P. on the Mawanella-Aranayake Road, thence a line drawn westwards crossing the said road at the said M.P. to a point 8 chains west of the western edge of the said road.

West—by a line drawn from the last-mentioned point northwards and westwards parallel to and at a distance of 8 chains west of the western edge of the Mawanella-Aranayake Road and 8 chains south of the southern edge of the Colombo-Kandy Road, as far as a point south of the 55th M.P. on the Colombo-Kandy Road thence a line drawn northwards crossing the said road at the said M.P. to the starting point of the northern limit of the area.

THE DEFENCE (MISCELLANEOUS) REGULATIONS.

ORDER made by the Governor under Regulation 26Δ of the Defence (Miscellaneous) Regulations.

Order.

- 1. The area specified in the Schedule hereto is hereby declared to be a regulated area for the purposes of the **Defence** (Miscellaneous) Regulations.
- 2. The Commodore Superintendent, Ceylon, and the Victualling Store Officer, Galle, shall severally be the authorities by whom directions may be given for the purposes of regulation 26a of the aforesaid Regulations:

Provided that no such direction shall be given by either of the authorities aforesaid except after consultation with the Government Agent of the Southern Province and the Superintendent of Police, Southern Province.

3. This Order may be cited as the Galle Regulated Area Order.

Schedule.

The area (together with all breakwaters, piers, jetties, landing places, beaches, and quays appertaining thereto) bounded as follows:—

On the North by the iron and wire fence from the Eastern corner of the Sun Bastion to the foreshore at low water mark

On the East by the foreshore at low water mark from the Eastern extremity of the iron and wire fence to the Northern end of Zwart Bastion rocks, thence by an imaginary line to the Northern corner of the Zwart Bastion rampart

On the South by the top of the ramparts wall running along the West side of the Zwart Bastion and along the North side of the Police Station premises; thence by the North Wall of the Customs warehouse to the Fort Gate; thence by the barrier across the Port Gate; thence by the North Wall of the Customs warehouse to its junction with the Eastern ramparts wall.

On the West by the top of the Eastern ramparts wall at the Junction with the Customs warehouse wall along the rampart to the Eastern corner of the Sun Bastion ramparts at the junction with the iron and wire fence. E.D.-CF. 7/44.

THE DEFENCE (MISCELLANEOUS) REGULATIONS.

ORDER made by the Governor under Regulation 32x of the Defence (Miscellaneous) Regulations.

Order.

- That part of the territorial waters of Ceylon which is specified in the Schedule hereto is hereby declared to be a controlled water area for the purposes of the Defence (Miscellaneous) Regulations.
- 2. The Government Agent of the Southern Province shall be the authority without whose permission no person or vessel shall be in the water area specified in the Schedule
- This Order may be cited as the Controlled Water Area (Galle Harbour) Order.

Schedule.

The water area bounded by

- (1) a line joining the Eastern extremity of Sun Bastion and the Porakpittaniya Trigonometrical Station. on Gibbet Island;
- (2) a line joining the Porakpittaniya Trigonometrical Station on Gibbet Island and the Muttumada Buoy;
- (3) a line joining the Muttumada Buoy and the Lighthouse; and
- (4) the shore along the rampart wall between Sun Bastion and the Lighthouse.

TEXTILES CONTROL ORDERS-1945.

Order No. 10.

Prescribed Prices of Textules Manufactured on Handlooms.

ORDER made by the Controller of Textiles under Regulation 20 of the Defence (Control of Textiles) Regulations, 1945.

1. No regulated textiles manufactured on handlooms and imported into Ceylon after June 27, 1945, shall be sold or supplied, or exposed for sale, by retail at prices exceeding those indicated in columns (6), (7) or (8) of Parts I. and II. in Schedule "A" hereto:

- Provided that:

Colombo, June 27, 1945.

- (a) in the case of goods on which import duty in Ceylon has been paid at 15 per cent, the prices indicated in columns (6), (7) or (8) shall be increased by 8.4 per cent.
- (b) in the case of goods on which import duty in Ceylon has been paid at 15 per cent. and 10 per cent. as surcharge, the prices indicated in columns (6), (7) or (8) shall be increased by 9 4 per cent.
- The retail prices prescribed under para. 1 above shall be increased:
 - (a) in the case of Sarees with borders and headings by the rates indicated in Part III. of the Schedule;
 - (b) in the case of Dhoties with borders and headings by the rates indicated in Part IV. of the Schedule; (c), in the case of Scarfs with borders and headings by the rates indicated in Part V. of the Schedule.

3. Textiles manufactured on Handlooms with Cellophane Yarn and imported into Ceylon shall not be sold or supplied or exposed for sale by retail at prices higher than those indicated in the appropriate column in Part VI. of Schedule "A". 4. Where any regulated textiles manufactured on handlooms and imported into Ceylon does not correspond to any individual item in Schedule A, and the Controller in the exercise of his powers under Regulation 20 has by special order prescribed and caused to be stamped upon such regulated textiles such price as he may have deemed appropriate, no such regulated textile shall be sold or supplied or exposed for sale by retail at a price exceeding the price so stamped.

5. No regulated textiles manufactured on Handlooms and imported into Ceylon after June 27, 1945, shall be

sold or supplied or exposed for sale by wholesale at prices higher than the appropriate maximum retail prices as determined

by the preceding paragraphs reduced by 15 per cent. 6. For the purposes of this order the date on which the goods are cleared from the Customs shall be deemed to be the date of import.

Textiles Control Order No. 4, published in Government Gazette Extraordinary No. 9,323 of October 26, 1944, shall continue to apply to all regulated textiles manufactured on Handlooms and imported into Ceylon on or before the above-mentioned

Schedule " B ".

Explanatory Notes and Instructions.

1. The rates specified in Schedule "A" are the maximum retail prices per yard applicable in any part of the Island

to that specified class of material.

2. Any regulated handloom textile imported into Ceylon carrying a "trade description" other than one of these specified in Schedule "A" will be assessed, for purposes of price marking, against the most appropriate head of trade description in the Schedule

in Schedule. "A" will be assessed, for purposes of proceedings of processing schedule.

3. In fixing the maximum retail prices 3 per cent. export cess levied in the country of export and 5 per cent. import duty levied at the port of entry have been taken into account, and no further addition will be allowed in respect of them.

4. In the case of articles which are sold by number, such as sarongs, camboys, dhoties, sarees, &c., and not by the yard, the goods will be price-marked and sold by the article, the price of the article to be stamped on it being determined by its length.

5. The term "nominal" in columns (2) and (5) of Schedule "A" indicates the recognized standard of count of yarn, length and width, subject to reasonable latitude.

6. The terms "ends and picks" in column (3) denote the number of threads per inch in the warp and weft respectively and make up the specification of the items in the Schedule. Materials falling below the specifications are liable to corresponding reductions of the Schedule prices.

- 7. The terms Full, Half, Light and Other in columns (6), (7) and (8) of Schedule "A" have the following meanings.
 - Full: The material contains more than 66-2/3 per cent. of dyed yarn;
 - Half: The material contains more than 33-1/3 per cent, of dyed yarn but not more than 66-2/3 per cent, of dyed yarn;
 - Light: The material does not contain more than 33-1/3 per cent. of dyed yarn;
 - Others: Plain, grey or bleached yarns.
- N.B.—Where no entry is made in column (9) of Schedule "A", the colour is not necessarily Fast Colour.
- 8. Any handloom materials imported into Ceylon with dyes inferior to those specified in column (9) of Schedule "A" shall be liable to assessment at reduced Schedule prices.
- 9. Importers of handloom goods shall be responsible for identifying, grading, and assorting of consignments for the purposes of price-marking.
- 10. THIS PRICE SCHEDULE IS PUBLISHED AS A PROVISIONAL MEASURE PENDING THE PUBLICATION OF A LIST OF PRESCRIBED EXPORT PRICES BY THE GOVERNMENT OF INDIA AND WILL BE SUPERSEDED BY SUCH LIST AS SOON AS IT IS PUBLISHED.
- 11. In parts III., IV., and V. of Schedule "A" the words "over all border width" means the over-all width of one border or, when the two borders are not of the same width, half the sum of the over-all widths of the two borders.

- 3. The selected officer will be paid Rs. 125 per mensem plus war allowance at Government rates. A travelling allowance of Rs. 15 per month will be paid if the number of miles travelled is not less than 300 miles and if not adequate deduction from the allowance will be made.
