THE DEFENCE (TRADING WITH THE ENEMY) REGULATIONS, 1939.

WHEREAS Balasingham Duraisamy Amarasingham is an enemy within the meaning of the Defence (Trading with the Enemy) Regulations, 1939, by reason of his residence in Singapore, now enemy territory within the meaning of the said Regulations :

And whereas prior to the date on which the said Balasingham Duraisamy Amarasingham became an enemy as aforesaid, the said Balasingham Duraisamy Amarasingham duly appointed Dr. James Thambyayah Amarasingham his attorney in Ceylon by a Power of Attorney executed at Singapore on the 6th day of May 1941, and duly attested by the Police Magistrate, Singapore :

And whereas every person in Ceylon who has any commercial financial, or other intercourse or dealings with, or for the benefit of, the said Balasingham Duraisamy Amarasingham is liable to be deemed to have traded with the enemy within the meaning of the said Regulations, and will thereby be guilty of an offence against the said Regulations unless he has acted under authority given generally or specially by the Governor :

And whereas it is expedient in terms of paragraph (2) of regulation 1 of the said Regulations to give authority to Dr. James Thambyayah Amarasingham and to persons resident in Ceylon in the manner hereinafter provided :

The Defence (Miscellaneous) Regulations published in the *Supplement to Gazette* No. 8,533 of October 20, 1939, as amended by any subsequent defence regulation, are hereby further amended in regulation 29B, as follows :—

(1) in paragraph (1)—

(a) by the substitution, for sub-paragraph (c), of the following new sub-paragraph :—

“(c) On and after such date as the Collector may, for the purpose of this sub-paragraph, appoint by notification published in the *Gazette*, every member of the crew of such ship shall carry a document establishing his identity, issued to him by a proper officer at any authorised port in Ceylon.”

Provided, however, that where the identity of any member of the crew of such ship is established by the document referred to in paragraph (4A), nothing in the preceding provisions of this sub-paragraph shall require that member to carry the document aforesaid.”

(b) by the substitution in sub-paragraph (d), for all the words from "on and after the appointed date" to the end of that sub-paragraph, of the words "on and after the date referred to in sub-paragraph (c) of this paragraph, any person whose identity is not established by either of the documents required by that sub-paragraph.";

(2) by the substitution, for paragraph (4), of the following new paragraph:—

"(4) (a) No sailing ship to which this paragraph applies shall enter Ceylon—

(i) unless the master of such ship has in his possession a certificate containing such particulars relating to the ship, the cargo, the voyage and each member of the crew as may be required by the specified officer at her port or place of departure for Ceylon, and signed by such specified officer in token of his approval thereof; or

(ii) if she has on board as a member of the crew, any person in respect of whom particulars have not been specified in the certificate which the master thereof is required to have in his possession by the preceding provisions of this sub-paragraph.

(b) The master of every sailing ship to which this paragraph applies shall forthwith, upon the arrival of such ship at her port of destination in Ceylon, deliver to the proper officer at that port the certificate which such master is required to have in his possession by sub-paragraph (a) of this paragraph.";

(3) by the insertion, immediately after paragraph (4), of the following new paragraphs:—

"(4A) No sailing ship to which this paragraph applies shall enter Ceylon—

(a) unless the master of such ship has in his possession a document establishing the identity of all members of the crew of such ship, issued to him by the specified officer at her port or place of departure for Ceylon; or

(b) if she has on board as a member of the crew, any person whose identity is not established by the document which the master of such ship is required to have in his possession by the preceding provisions of this paragraph.

(4B) The master of every sailing ship to which this paragraph applies shall not—

(a) permit any person to disembark from such ship at any port or place in Ceylon other than the authorised port which is her port of destination; or

(b) permit any person to disembark from such ship at the authorised port which is her port of destination except with the permission of the proper officer at that port previously obtained in that behalf.";

(4) by the substitution, for paragraph (5), of the following new paragraph:—

"(5) No sailing ship to which this paragraph applies shall, save as hereinafter provided, enter Ceylon, if she has on board any person other than a person who is a member of the crew:

Provided, however, that nothing in the preceding provisions of this paragraph shall apply to any such ship which enters Ceylon having on board any person who is a survivor from any ship which has been wrecked, abandoned or lost.";

(5) by the insertion, immediately after paragraph (5), of the following new paragraph:—

"(5A) The Collector may, by notification published in the Gazette, apply the provisions of any of the preceding paragraphs (4) to (5) to sailing ships sailing on a voyage to Ceylon from any port or place outside Ceylon specified in such notification; and the expression "sailing ship to which this paragraph applies" occurring in any paragraph so applied shall be construed accordingly.

In any notification applying the provisions of paragraph (4) or paragraph (4A), the Collector shall specify the person who is to be the specified officer for the purpose of that paragraph.";

(6) in paragraph (6), by the substitution, for the words "a sailing ship which is on a voyage from any specified port or place in India" wherever they occur collectively therein, of the words "a sailing ship to which paragraph (5) applies"; and

(7) in paragraph (12), by the omission of the definitions "appointed date", "specified port or place", and "specified officer".

TRADE DISPUTE—MONERAKELLE ESTATE, MONERAGALLA.

IN pursuance of section 8 (4) of the Essential Services (Avoidance of Strikes and Lockouts) Order, 1942, it is hereby notified that a petition presented by the Ceylon Indian Congress Labour Union in connection with a trade dispute arising out of the refusal of the Superintendent, Monerakelle Estate, Moneragalla, to reinstate Kandan, a labourer of the above estate in his former employment as Kangany, was referred in terms of section 6 (2) of the aforesaid Order to a Tribunal appointed by His Excellency the Governor under the proviso to section 5 of the same Order.

The findings of the Tribunal dated June 19, 1945, were as follows:—

1. K. Kandan to be re-employed as an ordinary labourer on Monerakelle Estate, as from June 25, 1945.

2. K. Kandan to be paid Rs. 36 representing balance due on allowance for February, 1945, and as 1 month's wages in lieu of notice of change of status.

3. (a) At the end of two months from June 25, 1945, the Assistant Controller of Labour, Uva, to visit the estate and review Kandan's conduct in relation to the estate.

(b) If in the opinion of the Assistant Controller of Labour, Uva, Kandan's conduct has been satisfactory for the said period of 2 months and worthy of recognition Kandan is to be employed as Supervising Kangany.

(c) Kandan undertakes if re-appointed as Supervising Kangany that his conduct in relation to the estate will continue to be satisfactory.

(d) If Kandan's conduct at the end of the said 2 months is not found to have been satisfactory by the Assistant Controller of Labour, Uva, Kandan undertakes to leave the estate within such time as is allowed him by the Assistant Controller of Labour.

4. If in the course of the said 2 months it becomes necessary for the Assistant Controller of Labour, Uva, to visit the estate and review Kandan's conduct and if on such review the Assistant Controller finds that his conduct in relation to the estate has not been satisfactory, Kandan undertakes to leave the estate within such time as is allowed him by the Assistant Controller of Labour, Uva.

5. The petitioner Union undertakes to use its good offices to persuade Kandan to accept the decision of the Assistant Controller of Labour.

6. Any decision of the Assistant Controller of Labour, Uva, in this matter is to be final and binding on all parties.

7. The Petitioner Union undertakes to cause the withdrawal of all pending cases involving any labourers of Monerakelle Estate, Moneragalla.

- (1) No cultivator, shareholder or other person having interest in any paddy field situated within Weligam and Morawak Korales in Matara District shall remove any paddy harvested in YALA, 1945, from a threshing floor until the harvest has been checked and verified by the Vel-Vidane or any other officer authorised by me in writing.
- (2) Removal thereafter to the barn or other place of storage within the Korale should only be on permits on form D.F.S. and C. 12 issued by the Village Headman of the area in which the threshing floor is situated or any other officer authorised by me in writing.
Those in possession of rice ration books should produce the ration books of the members of their household so that the relevant number of coupons may be withdrawn. Others should produce the substitute coupon books for the information of the headmen.
- (3) Removal to places outside the Korale should only be on permits issued by me. 5.
