THE EMERGENCY POWERS (DEFENCE) ACTS, 1939 AND 1940

DEFENCE Regulations made by the Governor by virtue of the powers vested in him by the Emergency Powers (Defence) Acts, 1939 and 1940, of the Imperial Parliament, as adapted, modified and extended to Ceylon by the Emergency Powers (Colonial Defence) Order in Council, 1939, and the Emergency Powers (Colonial Defence) (Amendment) Order in Council, 1940.

Regulations.

- 1. These Regulations may be cited as the Defence Agricultural Corps Regulations, 1945.
 - 2. In these regulations-
 - "Accountant Officer" means a person for the time being holding the office of Accountant Officer, Agricultural Corps, by virtue of appointment made by the Governor;

"Assistant Commissioner" means a person for the time being holding the office of the Assistant Commis-sioner, Agricultural Corps, by virtue of appointment

made by the Governor;
"Commissioner" means the Commissioner for the time
being in charge of the Agricultural Corps by virtue

of appointment made by the Governor; "Corps" means the Agricultural Corps constituted under

regulation 3; "member" means a member of the Corps but does not include the Commissioner, an Assistant Commissioner or an Accountant Officer.

- 3. There shall be constituted a body to be called "The Agricultural Corps".
- 4. The Corps shall consist of such units as the Governor may from time to time determine.
- 5. The Commissioner shall be in charge of the Corps and be responsible for the general administration and control thereof, and shall be assisted in the performance of his duties and the exercise of his powers under these regulations by such number of Assistant Commissioners and Accountant Officers as may be appointed by the Governor.
- 6. (1) The Commissioner and every Assistant Commissioner shall in the exercise, performance or discharge of any power, duty or function conferred or imposed upon or assigned to them by or under those regulations be assisted by such number of officers as the Commissioner may from time to time mine.
- (2) The Commissioner, every Assistant Commissioner and every Accountant Officer shall be entitled to wear uniform and badges of the description set out in the First Schedule deterhereto.
- 7. (1) The grades and ranks of the members of the Corps shall be those set out in the Second Schedule hereto
- (2) Every member of the Corps shall be entitled to receive pay at such rates as may be determined from time to time by the Commissioner with the approval of the Financial Secretary.
- 8. (1) The uniform and badges of rank of the members of the Corps shall be as set out in the First Schedule hereto.
- (2) Every member of the Corps shall keep the uniform and equipment issued to him in his personal custody and shall take all such steps as may be necessary to prevent such uniform and equipment from being used by any unauthorised person and shall, in the event of his ceasing to be a member of the Corps, forthwith return such uniform and equipment to his Camp Stores.
- (3) Every member of the Corps to whom any uniform is issued under these regulations shall wear such uniform whenever directed so to do by the Commissioner or any officer authorised by the Commissioner to give such directions.
- 9. Every member of the Corps shall be deemed to be always on duty when not on leave and shall reside in quarters provided for the use of the Corps unless he has been specially exempted by the Commissioner.
- 10. (1) Subject to the exigencies of the service and to any special directions that may be issued by the Commissioner, every member of the Corps shall be entitled to leave on full pay as follows:—
 - (a) casual leave for periods which shall not, in the aggregate, exceed seven days in each year; and
 - (b) after the completion of nine months' service, vacation leave for period which shall not in the aggregate exceed thirty days in each year: provided that, before the completion of nine months' service, vacation leave may be allowed in case of sickness, upon application supported by a medical certificate, for periods which shall not in the aggregate exceed a period calculated at the rate of two days for each completed month of service.
- (2) Where a member of the Corps has exhausted the vacation leave for which he is eligible under paragraph (1) and requires further leave on account of sickness medically certified, he may be allowed to take on full pay any vacation leave which has not been used by him during the previous year.
- 11. Every member of the Corps shall be entitled to food and rations according to such scales as the Commissioner may from time to time determine with the approval of the Financial Secretary.
- 12. The Commissioner of any officer authorised by him in writing in that behalf may appoint as a member of the Corps any person who is fit and willing to serve in that capacity.
- 13. Every member of the Corps shall on appointment take the oath or make the declaration specified in the Third Schedule hereto before the Commissioner or any other person authorised by the Commissioner in writing in that behalf, either of whom is hereby empowered to administer such oath, or attest such declaration.
- 14. Every member of the Corps shall on appointment be given a warrant of appointment substantially in the form in the Fourth Schedule hereto.
- 15. Every member of the Corps shall be liable to serve in any part of the Island.
- 16. Except with the special permission of the Commissioner no member of the Corps shall be entitled to resign from the Corps unless written notice of resignation has, at least three months prior to the date on which it is desired that the resignation shall take effect, been submitted to the Commissioner:
 - Provided, however, that no member shall be entitled to give such notice of resignation until the expiry of twelve months from the date of his appointment.

- 17. It shall be the duty of every member of the Corps to perform all such functions and do all such work as may be assigned to him by or under the authority of the Commissioner.
 - 18. Every member of the Corps who—
 - (a) neglects or refuses to obey any lawful order or direction given or issued to him by or under the authority of the Commissioner; or
 - (b) acts or conducts himself in a manner likely to prejudice good order and discipline; or
 - (c) absents himself without leave; or
 - (d) deserts the Corps,

shall be guilty of an offence under these regulations.

- 19. (1) Where any offence under those regulations is committed by any member of the Corps, the Commissioner may hold such inquiry as he may deem necessary and may, by way of punishment—
 - (a) order the offender to pay a penalty not exceeding twenty-five rupees and direct that the amount of such penalty be deducted either in its entirety or in instalments from the pay of the offender;
 - (b) reduce the offender to a lower grade or rank;
 - (c) order the offender to be confined within the limits of his camp or any specified portion thereof for a period not exceeding forty-eight hours, or
 - (d) dismiss the offender from the Corps,

or may institute proceedings against the offender in a Magistrate's Court.

- (2) The Commissioner may, by Order made under regulation 23, authorise any Assistant Commissioner, Accountant Officer or member to exercise, subject to such conditions or limitations as may be specified in the Order, all or any of the powers vested in the Commissioner by paragraph (1), and, upon the making of any such Order, it shall be lawful for any person so authorised to exercise such powers in accordance with the terms of the Order.
- 20. Every member of the Corps who is convicted of any offence under these regulations by a Magistrate's Court shall be liable to imprisonment of either description for a term not exceeding six months, together with forfeiture of pay during such imprisonment.
- 21. The Commissioner or any other person authorised in that behalf by the Commissioner may, by order in writing, summarily dismiss from the Corps any member thereof, if, in the opinion of the Commissioner or the person so authorised—
 - (a) such member fails to discharge satisfactorily his duties as a member of the Corps, or $\,$.
 - (b) it is otherwise undesirable that such member should continue to be a member of the Corps.
- 22. An order of dismissal made under regulation 19 or regulation 21 shall be final and shall not be called in question in any court of law.
- 23. The Commissioner may from time to time make all such Orders as he may consider necessary for the government, organization, administration and training of the Corps. A copy of every Order made under this regulation shall be forthwith sent by the Commissioner to the Secretary to the Minister for Agriculture and Lands.

Examination for Appointment to Grade II. of the EXECUTIVE CLERICAL CLASS OF THE GENERAL CLERICAL SERVICE.

Date of Examination.—

1. A competitive examination for promotion to Grade II. of the Executive Clerical Class of the General Clerical Service will be held in all Kachcheri stations on December 15, 1945, on the terms set out in Sessional Papers XII. and XVII. of 1945.

Salary and Conditions of Service.

(a) Successful candidates will be appointed to Grade II. of the Executive Clerical Class of the General Clerical Service on the scale Rs. 1,044 per annum rising by annual increments of Rs. 108 to Rs. 2,448 per annum. Except in the case of candidates having continuous service paid from votes in the Government Estimates from a date not later than April 24, 1933, the conditions of service will be those applicable to new entrants to the public service. Rent allowance will, however, be payable to candidates appointed after April 24, 1933, if they have had continuous service on monthly pay in posts paid for from votes in the Government Estimates from a date prior to June 1, 1934. Candidates who were appointed to Class III. of the General Clerical Service on the scale Rs. 480—48—1,200 will if successful be placed on the scale Rs. 900—120—2,820.

(b) All successful candidates will be appointed on 2 years' probation. They will be liable to transfer and may be posted to any station in Ceylon. They will be required to pass a test in typewriting within one year of their appointment to Grade II. of the Executive Clerical Class. They will be subject to the Public Service, Financial and other standing Regulations

of the Government.

3. There will be approximately 400 vacancies. Ten per cent. of these vacancies will be filled by merit promotions. The remaining vacancies will be filled on the results of this examination provided the candidates attain the minimum

qualifying standard set out in para. 10.

Nine of these appointments will be specially reserved for clerks recruited to Class III. of the General Clerical Service on the results of the examination held in August, 1937, or of any previous examination, including those clerks who were already in that Class before August, 1937, and the clerks referred to in para. 7 (b) and (c) of the Notification.

The names of the successful candidates will be published

in the Government Gazette.

Applications -

Applications for admission to the examination must be addressed to the Director of Education on forms which may be obtained from his office up to October 27, 1945.

5. Applications must be sent by registered post to reach the Director of Education not later than 12 noon on November 3, 1945. Any applications received after that hour will be rejected.

6. The Director of Education will return those applications which are approved to the candidates concerned. Such applications will constitute the candidates' tickets of admission to the examination. Candidates presenting themselves for the examination must produce to the officer appointed to supervise the examination their forms of application approved by the Director of Education. A candidate not producing such a form will be refused admittance to the examination.

Eligibility.—

- 7. The following candidates only will be eligible to take the examination:
 - (a) Clerks in the General Clerical Class of the General Clerical service who complete 4 years' continuous service in the General Clerical Class on or before December 15, 1945. Applications from such clerks should be forwarded through the Heads of Departments and should be accompanied by certificates of satisfactory service.
 - (b) *Clerks who were in Government service or in the Rubber or Tea Control Departments prior to August 1, 1935 (other than members of the Customs, Postal Survey, Harbour Engineer's or Railway Departments) from whatever funds they may have been paid, who were at that time clerks in Government service as defined by section 11 of Appendix A to the Public Service Regulations (since cancelled), who have retained the same status, and whose services during the last three years have been satisfactory. applications must be forwarded by their Heads of Departments and must be accompanied by a certificate of satisfactory service and by a certificate of continuous employment from July, 1935, up to
- * "Clerks in Government service" as defined by section 11 of Appendix A to the Public Service Regulations include
 - temporary clerks and bookbinders and storekeepers whose or permanent Government Department and paid from votes in the Government Estimates. Provided that where such temporary officers_are daily paid they must be continuely and not sporadically employed;

(b) clerks and bookbinders and storekeepers whose duties are mainly clerical employed in any Government Department and paid from recognized and approved fees;

(c) clerks paid from Village Committee, Village Tribunals, Sanitary
Board, District School Committee and Education Distirct

Committee funds.

(c) Chief Headmen who were previously in Class III. of the General Clerical Service.

N.B.—Persons not in Government service are not eligible to sit for the examination.

8. Heads of Departments are required to grant to officers of their Departments, whose applications have been returned to them approved by the Director of Education, leave to present themselves at the examination.

Subjects .-

9. The subject of the examination are as follows:-

(1) Accounts (One and a half hour paper). 100 marks

The paper will consist of questions in accounts, tots, &c., and will be designed to test accuracy in handling figures and a knowledge of simple fundamental rules of accounts.

(2) Regulations, procedure and office systems 200 marks (Two hours paper)

The paper will be designed to test an officer's usefulness and competence as a clerk. He may be required to make a precis of an actual series of official letters, to submit a draft letter in terms of an order, to show a knowledge of index system, filing, &c., and to have the ability to express himself clearly on paper.

(3) Viva voce test ... 70 marks

10. The examination will be held in two parts. The written examination will be held in all Kachcheri stations. Any candidate who fails to obtain a minimum of 50 per cent.

of the marks in each subject will not be considered for the viva voce test which will be held in Colombo. The number to be called for the viva voce test will be fixed by the Deputy Chief Secretary in consultation with the Director of Education. In all written papers marks will be deducted for bad writing and mistakes in spelling. Candidates whose writing is illegible are liable to be disqualified.

(b) Successful candidates will be required to enter into an agreement and bond to serve on probation for a period of three years in the Dopartment. A method of preparing p-substituted benzene-sulphonamido-pyrimidines which comprises reacting a benzene-sulphonyl halide such as a chloride substituted in the para position by an amino group or a group transformable into an amino group by hydrolysis, or by reduction or by reaction with ammonia or an amine such as acylamino, nitro, halogen, or a zo group, with an amino-pyrimidine.

2. A method according to claim 1 in which the p-substituted

group, if other than an amino group, is then transformed into

the amino group.

3. A method according to claims 1 and 2 in which the reaction of the benzene-sulphonyl halide and the aminopyrimidine takes place in the presence of a compound capable of reacting with hydrogen halide to form salts, the compound being present in sufficient amounts to substantially neutralize the hydrogen halide set free by the reaction.
