PERCUSSION CAPS.

THE CONTROL OF PRICES ORDINANCE, No. 39 OF 1939.

Order.

BY virtue of the powers vested in the Controller of Prices by section 3 of the Control of Prices Ordinance, No. 39 of 1939, as amended by paragraph (2) of the Defence (Control of Prices) (Supplementary Provisions No. 2) Regulations, I, Cedric Francis Ingledow, Controller of Prices (Miscellaneous Articles), do, by this Order—

BY virtue of the powers vested in the Deputy Controller of Prices (Miscellaneous Articles) by section 3 (read with section 2 (3)) of the Control of Prices Ordinance, No. 39 of 1939, I, Conrad Boniface Peter Perera, Deputy Controller of Prices (Miscellaneous Articles), Vavuniya District, do by this Order—

- (1) revoke with effect from this date the Order by the Assistant Controller of Prices (Miscellaneous Articles) Vavuniya District dated May 16, 1944, and published in *Government Gazette* No. 9,272 of May 19, 1944, in so far as it relates to the maximum prices fixed in respect of kerosene oil of the description and grade named and specified in column 2 of the schedule hereto,
- (2) fix the prices specified in column 2 of the schedule hereto to be the maximum price per bottle above which kerosene oil of the brands specified therein shall not be sold by retail within the areas specified in the corresponding entry of column 1 of the schedule hereto.
- (3) direct that every trader who sells kerosene oil of the brands specified in column 2 of the schedule hereto, at any premises within the areas specified in column 1 of the schedule hereto shall exhibit in a conspicuous position at those premises a notice in which there shall be set out the maximum prices fixed by this Order in respect of that article.
- (4) direct that no such trader shall sell any kerosene oil of any brand specified in column 2 of the schedule hereto which is adulterated with any other article or with any oil of an inferior description or quality.
- (5) direct that every person who sells kerosene oil of any brand specified in column 2 of the schedule hereto shall give to the purchaser of that kerosene oil a receipt in which there shall be set out—
 - (a) the brand of kerosene oil sold,
 - (b) the quantity of kerosene oil sold,
 - (c) the price paid and
 - (d) the date of the sale.
- (6) direct that for the purpose of this order a "bottle" shall be deemed to be one-sixth (1/6) of an imperial gallon.

- (i.) fix the prices specified in columns 2 and 3 of the Schedule hereto to be respectively the maximum wholesale and retail prices above which percussion caps of the description specified in column 1 of the Schedule hereto shall not be sold by wholesale or retail in Ceylon;
- (ii.) direct that for the purpose of this Order, any sale of any percussion caps for the purpose of resale shall be deemed to be a sale by whole sale,

- (iii.) direct that for the purpose of this order any sale of any percussion caps for the purpose of use shall be deemed to be a sale by retail.
- (iv.) direct that every dealer who at any premises in Ceylon exhibits for sale percussion caps of the description specified in column 1 of the schedule hereto shall exhibit in a conspicuous position at those premises a notice on which there shall be set out the maximum prices fixed for such percussion caps by this Order;
- (v.) direct that every person who sells percussion caps of the description specified in column 1 of the schedule hereto shall give to every purchaser of such percussion caps, on demand, a receipt in which there shall be set out—
- the quantity and description of the Percussion caps sold;
 - the price paid, and
 - the date of sale.

KEROSENE OIL.

THE CONTROL OF PRICES ORDINANCE, NO. 39 OF 1939.

Order.

BY virtue of the powers vested in the Assistant Controller of Prices (Miscellaneous Articles) by section 3 (read with Section 2 (3) of the Control of Prices Ordinance, No. 39 of 1939, as amended by Defence (Control of Prices) (Supplementary Provisions No. 2) Regulations, I, Alvappillai Kandiah, Assistant Controller of Prices (Miscellaneous Articles), Jaffna District, do by this Order—

- revoke with effect from this date, the Order dated July 31, 1944, and published in *Government Gazette* No. 9,298 of August 4, 1944, fixing maximum prices for kerosene oil;
- fix the prices specified in columns 2 and 3 of the Schedule hereto, to be, respectively, the maximum price per gallon and the maximum price per bottle, above which kerosene oil shall not be sold, by wholesale or by retail, in the areas specified in the corresponding entry in column 1 of the schedule hereto;
- direct that where kerosene oil is sold in quantities of over one gallon whether in tins, drums, loose, or in bulk, for the purpose of resale, the maximum price to be charged therefor shall not exceed the amount calculated according to the price per gallon specified in column 2 of the schedule hereto;
- every agent, sub-agent, trader, or other person dealing in or authorised to deal in kerosene oil shall exhibit in a conspicuous position at his place of storage and/or business, a notice setting out the maximum prices fixed by this order for kerosene oil within the area in which such place of storage and/or business is situated;
- direct that no such trader shall sell any kerosene oil which is adulterated with any other article;
- direct that every trader who sells kerosene oil shall give the purchaser of the kerosene oil a receipt on which shall be set out—
 - the quantity of the kerosene oil sold;
 - the price paid; and
 - the date of sale.
- direct that for the purpose of this order a "bottle" shall be deemed to be one-sixth (1/6th) of the imperial gallon.
- direct that sales of any quantity below one bottle shall be restricted to half bottle and quarter bottle only, and sale of any intermediate quantity less than quarter bottle shall be prohibited.
- direct that the price shall be calculated on the bottle rate in the case of sale by half or quarter bottle.

KEROSENE OIL.

THE CONTROL OF PRICES ORDINANCE, NO. 39 OF 1939.

Order.

BY virtue of the powers vested in me by section 3, read with section 2 (3), of the Control of Prices Ordinance, No. 39 of 1939, I, Don Lionel Joseph Jayasuriya, Assistant Controller of Prices (Misc. Articles), Kurunegala District, do by this Order—

- revoke with effect from this date Order dated February 1, 1944, published in *Government Gazette* No. 9,234 of February 4, 1944, relating to the maximum prices per four-gallon tin, the maximum price per gallon (in bulk) and the maximum price per bottle of kerosene oil of the brands specified therein;
- fix the prices specified in columns 2, 3 and 4 of the schedule hereto to be respectively, the maximum price per four-gallon tin, the maximum price per gallon and the maximum price per bottle above which kerosene oil of the brand named and specified at the head of each column shall not be sold (by wholesale or retail) within the areas specified in the corresponding entry in column 1 of the schedule hereto;
- direct that when four-gallon or any multiple of four gallons of kerosene oil of any description specified in column 1 of the schedule hereto are sold in four-gallon tins the maximum price to be charged for the same shall be determined by reference to the appropriate maximum price specified in column 2 of the schedule hereto;
- direct that every trader, who sells any kerosene oil of the brand specified in the schedule hereto at any premises within the limits of any areas mentioned in column 1 of the schedule hereto shall exhibit in a conspicuous position at those premises a notice on which shall be set out the maximum price fixed by this Order in respect of that brand of kerosene oil;
- direct that no such trader shall sell any kerosene oil of any brand specified in the schedule hereto which is adulterated with any other article or with any oil of an inferior description or quality;
- direct that every trader, who sells kerosene oil of any brand specified in the schedule hereto, shall give to the purchaser of the kerosene oil, on demand, a receipt on which shall be set out—
 - the brand of the kerosene oil sold;
 - the quality of kerosene oil sold;
 - the price paid; and
 - date of sale;
- direct that for the purposes of this order a "bottle" shall be deemed to be one-sixth (1/6th) of an imperial gallon;
- direct that sale of any quantity below one bottle shall be restricted to half bottle and quarter bottle only and sale of any intermediate quantity shall be prohibited;
- direct that the price shall be calculated on the bottle rate in the case of sale by half or quarter bottle.

RAZOR BLADES.

THE CONTROL OF PRICES ORDINANCE, No. 39 OF 1939.
Order.

BY virtue of the powers vested in the Controller of Prices by section 3 of the Control of Prices Ordinance, No. 39 of 1939, as amended by paragraph (2) of the Defence (Control of Prices) (Supplementary Provisions No. 2) Regulations, I, Cedric Francis Ingledow, Controller of Prices (Miscellaneous Articles), do, by this Order—

- (i.) fix the prices specified in columns 2 and 3 of the Schedule hereto to be, respectively, the maximum wholesale price and the maximum retail price above which razor blades of the description specified in the corresponding entry in column 1 of the Schedule shall not be sold in any part of Ceylon;
- (ii.) direct that for the purposes of this Order—
 - (a) any sale for the purpose of resale of any sale of ten or more packets of the razor blades referred to in the Schedule hereto, to any one person in the course of one transaction, shall be deemed to be a sale by wholesale;
 - (b) any sale of razor blades, referred to in Schedule hereto other than a sale by wholesale as defined above, shall be deemed to be a sale by retail;
- (iii.) direct that any trader, who, at any premises, in Ceylon, exhibits for sale any razor blades of the descriptions specified in the Schedule hereto, shall exhibit in a conspicuous position at those premises a notice on which there shall be set out the maximum prices fixed by this Order in respect of razor blades of those descriptions;
- (iv.) direct that every trader, who has at any time during the three months prior to this date dealt in any razor blades of the descriptions specified in column 1 of the Schedule hereto and has for the time being no stocks of it available for sale, shall exhibit in a conspicuous position at his premises a notice to the

effect that he has no stocks of such razor blades available for sale for the time being;

- (v) direct that every trader who sells any razor blades of the description specified in column 1 of the Schedule shall give to every purchaser of such razor blades, on demand; a receipt in which there shall be set out—
 - (a) the quantity and description of the razor blades sold;
 - (b) the price paid;
 - (c) the date of the sale; and
 - (d) the nature of the transaction, that is to say, whether the sale was by wholesale or by retail.

BY virtue of the powers vested in the Controller of Prices (Food) by section 3 of the Control of Prices Ordinance, No. 39 of 1939, as amended by Defence (Control of Prices) (Supplementary Provisions No. 2) Regulations, I, Reginald Sydney Vernon Poulter, Controller of Prices (Food), do, by this Order—

- (i.) revoke with effect from this date my Order dated July 21, 1943, and published in *Ceylon Government Gazette* No. 9,150 of July 23, 1943, in so far as it fixes maximum prices for concentrated essence (for manufacture of aerated water);
- (ii.) fix the price specified in column 2 of the Schedule hereto to be the maximum price above which the concentrated essence of the description mentioned in the corresponding entry in column 1 of that Schedule shall not be sold in any part of Ceylon;
- (iii.) direct that in every area where maximum prices are fixed by this Order every trader, who at any premises has in his possession or under his Control concentrated essence of any description mentioned in column 1 of the Schedule hereto, shall exhibit in a conspicuous position at those premises a notice in which there shall be set out the maximum price fixed by this Order for concentrated essence of that description; and
- (iv.) direct that every trader who sells concentrated essence of any description mentioned in the Schedule hereto shall give to the purchaser thereof a receipt on which shall be set out—
 - (a) the description of the concentrated essence sold;
 - (b) quantity of the concentrated essence sold;
 - (c) the price paid therefor; and
 - (d) the date of sale.

COCONUT POONAC.

THE CONTROL OF PRICES ORDINANCE, No. 39 OF 1939.

Order.

BY virtue of the powers vested in the Controller of Prices (Food) by section 3 of the Control of Prices Ordinance, No. 39 of 1939, as amended by Defence (Control of Prices) (Supplementary Provisions No. 2) Regulations, I, Reginald Sydney Vernon Poulter, Controller of Prices (Food), do, by this Order—

- (i.) revoke with effect from this date my Food Price Order No. C—62 published in *Government Gazette Extraordinary* No. 9,424 of June 28, 1945, in so far as it fixes maximum prices above which coconut poonac shall not be sold within the Revenue District of Nuwara Eliya;

- (ii.) fix the price specified in column 2 of the First Schedule hereto to be the Miller's maximum price above which coconut poonac shall not be sold within the area specified in column 1 of that Schedule;
- (iii.) fix the prices specified in columns 2 and 3 of the Second Schedule hereto to be respectively the dealer's maximum price per cwt. and the dealer's maximum price per pound above which coconut poonac shall not be sold within the areas specified in the corresponding entries in column 1 of that Schedule;
- (iv.) direct that for the purposes of this Order—
 - (a) "Miller," shall mean any person or Company who manufactures coconut poonac;
 - (b) A "Dealer" shall mean any person or company who sells coconut poonac, other than a miller;
 - (c) the "Miller's maximum price" shall apply to any sale of coconut poonac by a miller;
 - (d) the "Dealer's maximum price per hundred-weight" shall apply to any sale of coconut poonac of over 14 lb. at a time made by a dealer;
 - (e) the "Dealer's maximum price per pound" shall apply to any sale of coconut poonac of 14 lb. or less at a time made by a dealer;
- (v.) direct that in every area where maximum prices are fixed by this Order every miller or dealer, who at any premises has in his possession or under his control any coconut poonac, shall exhibit in a conspicuous position at those premises a notice in which there shall be set out the maximum prices fixed by this Order in respect of coconut poonac;
- (vi.) direct that in every area where maximum prices are fixed by this Order every miller or dealer who sells any coconut poonac shall give to the purchaser thereof a receipt in which there shall be set out—
 - (a) the date of sale;
