This Council resolves under section 9 of the Customs Ordinance (Chapter 185)—

- (1) that, with effect from the date on which the sanction of the Secretary of State to this resolution is notified in the Government Gazette, import duty upon the goods specified in Column I of the Schedule to this resolution shall be levied and paid at the corresponding general rates set out in Column III or preferential rates set out in Column II of that Schedule, in accordance with the provisions of Schedule A to the Ordinance as to the levy
