AMENDMENT TO THE MINUTES ON PENSIONS.

HIS Excellency the Governor has been pleased, with the approval of the Secretary of State for the Colonies, to direct that the rules relating to pensions to be granted to public servants of Ceylon, set out in the Minute on Pensions dated February 5, 1934, as amended by any subsequent Minute, be further amended as follows:—

- (1) in section 2, by the substitution, for the words and figures "which has been declared to be pensionable by a notification published in the *Government Gazette*, and drawing a salary of Rs. 400 per annum and upwards, either in respect of one or of several offices held permanently and conjointly," of the words "which has been declared to be pensionable by a notification published in the *Government Gazette*,";
- (2) in section 2 (v), by the substitution, for the words and figures "a locally appointed nurse or matron of the Medical Department who is in receipt of a salary of Rs. 400 per annum and upwards", of the words "a locally appointed nurse or matron of the Medical Department";
- (3) by the repeal of section 2A (3);
- (4) by the repeal of section 2B (4);
- (5) in section 7, by the insertion, immediately after sub-section (2), of the following new sub-section:—
" (3) An assistant shroff compulsorily retired on a change of shroffs shall be deemed to have been retired on abolition of office for the purposes of this section.";
- (6) in section 9, by the insertion, immediately after sub-section (ii), of the following new sub-section:—
" (iii) The monthly allowance paid to a Village Headman shall be deemed to be salary for the purposes of this Minute.";
- (7) in section 14, by the substitution, for the words and figures "female employees in the Post and Telegraph Department who are in receipt of a salary of Rs. 400 per annum and upwards";, of the words "female employees in the Post and Telegraph Department";
- (8) by the repeal of section 26 (iii);
- (9) by the repeal of section 27;
- (10) in section 29, by the substitution, for "1/18", of "1/12";
- (11) in section 30 (i), by the substitution, for the words "Subject to the provisions and exceptions contained in the preceding section when a person employed in the public service of Ceylon, whether serving in a pensionable or non-pensionable office, is injured",

of the words "Subject to the provisions and exceptions contained in the preceding section when a public servant or daily-paid employee is injured"; and
 (12) in section 31A, by the substitution, for the words "a non-pensionable officer or daily-paid employee", of the words "a person who is not a pensionable officer".

THE PROBATION OF OFFENDERS ORDINANCE,
No. 42 OF 1944.

RULES made by the Executive Committee of Home Affairs under section 20 of the Probation of Offenders Ordinance No. 42 of 1944, approved by the State Council and ratified by the Governor by virtue of the powers vested in him by the said section.

The Probation Rules, 1945.

- These rules may be cited as the Probation Rules, 1945.
- In these rules—
 - "Commissioner" means the Commissioner of Prison and Probation Services;
 - "Executive Committee" means the Executive Committee of Home Affairs;
 - "Order" means an order made under section 3 of the Ordinance;
 - "Ordinance" means the Probation of Offenders Ordinance, No. 42 of 1944;
 - "Probation officer", when used with reference to an offender, means the officer appointed by the Court making the order, or by the Commissioner under the proviso to section 17 (5) of the Ordinance, to undertake the supervision of that offender.
- Powers and duties of Probation Officers.*
 - It shall be the duty of every probation officer—
 - to comply with all directions given by the Commissioner for the purpose of the Ordinance;
 - to acquaint himself with the provisions of the Ordinance and any rules made under the Ordinance.
 - A probation officer shall not wear any uniform or badge distinctive of his office.
 - A probation officer shall, subject to any directions given by Court—
 - visit the place of residence of the offender at such intervals as he may consider necessary and make inquiries as to the general behaviour, mode of life and employment of the offender; and
 - meet the offender not less than once a week during the first month of the period specified in the order and thereafter for the duration of the order shall meet the offender or receive a report from the offender not less than once a month.
 - Where the offender is a child who attends school, the probation officer shall make inquiries from the headmaster of the school as to the progress and attendance of the offender, but shall not visit the offender at the school premises.

7. For the purpose of advising, assisting and befriending the offender, or for the purpose of finding employment or lodging accommodation for the offender, the probation officer shall endeavour to secure the co-operation and assistance of social and religious workers or agencies.

8. A probation officer shall take all steps to ensure that the offender understands the conditions inserted in the order and that the conditions are observed by the offender.

9. Where the order in respect of any offender has been expressed to be in force for a period of less than three years and the probation officer considers it expedient that the period specified in such order should be extended, he shall make an application to court for that purpose under section 9 of the Ordinance.

10. Where an offender desires, while the order is in force, to change his place of residence from one proclaimed judicial division to another proclaimed judicial division, the probation officer shall if he has approved of such change—

(a) forthwith notify the Commissioner of the proposed change so as to enable him to direct the probation officer of the judicial division to which the offender intends to move to undertake the supervision of the offender, and to take such other steps as are required by section 17 (5) of the Ordinance; and

(b) after such offender has changed his place of residence, furnish to the probation officer to whom directions are given by the Commissioner as aforesaid all information concerning that offender.

Reports, records and registers.

11. Where an offender fails to observe any of the conditions inserted in the order, or has been convicted of any offence while the order is in force, the probation officer shall forthwith report the fact to the Commissioner. The Commissioner shall thereupon direct such probation officer to report that fact to the Court which made the order, or to the Magistrate's Court having jurisdiction in the place in which the offender resides.

12. A probation officer shall maintain records, in such forms as the Commissioner may provide, of the investigations and reports made by him in respect of every offender under his supervision.

13. On the expiration of the period specified in the order, the records referred to in rule 12 shall remain for three years in the custody of the senior salaried probation officer of the proclaimed judicial division in which the offender was resident. Thereafter they shall be transferred to the Commissioner's office and shall not be destroyed until the expiration of ten years from the date on which the period specified in the order terminated.

14. The senior salaried probation officer of every proclaimed judicial division shall maintain a register in which he shall enter details of every case in which an order has been made in respect of a person resident in his judicial division.

15. The Commissioner, or any person authorised in that behalf by the Commissioner, may from time to time inspect the records or registers required to be kept by a probation officer under these rules.

TRADE DISPUTE—K. M. D. K. BUS CO., LTD.,
 KURUNEGALA.

THE Lanka Motor Workers' Union presented to me a petition under section 6 of the Essential Services (Avoidance of Strikes and Lockouts) Order, 1942, in regard to a trade dispute that had arisen between the Union and the K. M. D. K. Bus Co., Ltd., Kurunegala, consequent on the dismissal of 5 employees named W. Joseph Perera, G. Baron Silva, K. Garlis Perera, N. G. S. Silva and A. M. Podiappuhamy from the service of the Company. The petition was referred to a Special Tribunal appointed by H. E. the Governor under the proviso to section 5 of the said Order, for adjudication.

The following award dated December 18, 1945, made by the Special Tribunal is published for general information in terms of section 8 (4) of the above-mentioned Order :—

Parties agree and move to settle the dispute *re* conductor Garlis: Respondent will re-employ him on a monthly basis and he agrees (1) to be careful with tickets and ticket books, (2) to have Rs. 5 deducted monthly from his pay and deposited in the Savings Bank, up to Rs. 100 in the name of the Commissioner to stand as security against misconduct by him, interest to be paid to Garlis. I make award accordingly *re* Garlis.

The issue now is whether respondent had good cause to discontinue the other 4 employees. I will discuss each in turn.

1. Baron Silva, driver.

For respondent, Police Inspector Chellarajah has said this. He was in the bus from the starting place about 10 minutes and noticed that Baron was talkative and smelt of liquor, though he did not consider him to be drunk, he decided, after going 200 yards, to leave the bus and wait $\frac{1}{2}$ an hour for the next. He is a disinterested witness and seemed to be trying hard to help Baron. His evidence is decisive. Baron behaved in a manner calculated to scare passengers off the bus. That is good cause for dismissal.

Further 3 other witnesses, those of whom have no interest for or against either side, have deposed in detail that Baron was drunk. Those 3 are better worth belief than Baron and his witnesses, and I hold that Baron was drunk and has rightly been dismissed (Hendrick Perera's evidence was, I think, false, and needs no words).

2. Joseph Perera.

The chief witness against him was absent but other reliable witnesses prove the following. Joseph had words with the conductor Bennet, followed him into the petrol shed and slapped him: then, both went a few miles in the same bus and suddenly Bennet alighted and ran away, pursued by Joseph and did not reappear. The driver had to drive back to Kurunegala, passengers and all, and get a fresh conductor. That is proof that Joseph is an intolerably turbulent person, unfit to be driver of a bus. I find he was justly dismissed, but on his appeal *ad misericordiam*, to which respondent did not seem to object, I award him one month's pay in lieu of notice.

3. Simeon Silva and Podiappu alias Martin.

The acting manager Cornelis says that he refused to give Simeon a day's name because he came 10 minutes late, and after an interval, as he came out of his office, Simeon without provocation slapped him and Podi Appu pinioned him round his arms that he got free and clouted Simeon, that others then separated them and Simeon went and informed the Police, who warned Cornelis, that Cornelis then had his complaint entered in the Information Book. No case followed. But 13 days later, he says that the Directors had up Simeon and Podi Appu for inquiry, that they gave no explanation but refused to abide by the Directors' orders, unless they were sent back from office attendance to active work as drivers and threatened to kill Cornelis.

Respondent says that these two had been removed from the work of regular driving because of several complaints against them by passengers.

No recent complaints were proved, and I am inclined to think there is some substance in petitioner's plea, that they were being punished for promoting a petition to the Commissioner of Labour.

I am not satisfied that Cornelis spoke the whole truth about the assault, if it had occurred in the unprovoked manner described by him, he would naturally have prosecuted.

The evidence of Lairis is more reliable, and I am satisfied that one or both of these two drivers blustered and were insolent to their directors, but the witnesses say they have forgotten which man did so. Therefore, it is not certain which of the two deserved dismissal for that. Probably both deserved it, but that is not proved. I find no proof of good cause for dismissal and award Simeon six weeks' pay in lieu of notice and Podi Appu 3 months' pay.

I decline to order reinstatement because both of them seem to me to be undesirable people, and the buses and the public will be well rid of them. No costs. Neither side deserves costs.

"We, D. F. Ratnayake, R. P. Nandias Silva, Stephen Fonseka and George Wijeratne express to Mohandiram B. J. Fernando, the Managing Director of the Colombo Omnibus Co., Ltd., our sincere apologies for annoyance caused to him by anything we have done.

We undertake to conduct ourselves properly and discharge our duties faithfully and diligently."

The form of apology is translated into Sinhalese and is written by Interpreter Mr. D. H. Dhanapala in Sinhalese and each of the persons express the apology as set out and give the undertaking as mentioned above.

In view of the apology tendered and the undertaking given by these 4 persons the respondent agreed to reinstate all the 9 persons in regard to whom the two petitions have been presented and pay them all arrears of wages due and owing to them from the date of discontinuance.

In view of the settlement arrived at between the parties and the apology tendered and the undertaking given by the workmen, I award that all the nine workmen be reinstated in their employment as workmen under the Colombo Omnibus Co., Ltd., and that they be paid all arrears of wages or salary due to them less any amount already paid as from the date of their discontinuance until they are reinstated.

Village Headman) of the division in which the fields are situated, so as to reach him at least a week before the proposed date of reaping:—

- (a) The date on which it is proposed to reap and thresh the harvest.
- (b) The name, situation and the extent of the paddy land.
- (c) Names and addresses of the persons or person entitled to take or receive any part of the produce of the land under any contract, or agreement or otherwise.
- (d) The share or shares of the produce to which such person or persons may be entitled.

- (3) That no paddy be removed from the threshing floor or field until an assessment of the crop has been made by the Village Headman of the area, the levy of one bushel per acre handed over to him and unless a permit is obtained in the manner specified below:—

- (i.) an account of paddy threshed has been taken by the Village Headman or any other person by name or office authorised by me in writing;
- (ii.) permitted to do so in writing by the officers referred to above;
- (iii.) the government levy of one bushel per acre for those fields which are cultivated for both Maha and Yala (two bushels per acre in the case of those fields which are cultivated for Maha only) which is a first charge on the crop and any other surplus due to Government has been surrendered to the Village Headman or any other person by name or office authorized by me in writing.

It must be carefully noted that any person found in the possession of paddy the acquisition of which cannot be substantiated with a permit or permits as mentioned at (11) above is liable to have paddy so found immediately requisitioned without any payment whatsoever.

2. No person who has threshed paddy during "Maha" 1945/46 and removed same for storage in accordance with para. (1) of this order shall dispose of such paddy on any account except on written directions issued by me or an officer authorised by me in this behalf. This order, however, does not apply to the use of such paddy for—

- (i.) normal consumption by the shareholder and his or her *bona fide* dependents subject to a maximum rate of six cut measures per head per week in case of owner cultivators and cultivators who are actually engaged in the work of cultivation, and in the case of others a maximum rate of four cut measures per head per week for all dependents above the age of three years subject further to a maximum of fifty bushels per family;
- (ii.) sowing as seed in the field or fields from which the paddy was harvested subject to a maximum of two bushels per acre;
- (iii.) allowance as working expenses at the rate of one bushel per acre for the field or fields from which the paddy was harvested.

3. All paddy received from fields which are held on mortgages should not be disposed of on any account; and proviso to order (2) above does not apply to such paddy.

4. All paddy stocks not threshed and accounted for as aforesaid within one month of their reaping are liable to be requisitioned by Government.

5. For removal of any such paddy to any other place situated outside the same D. R. O's division as the field from which the paddy is obtained, permission should be obtained from me or an officer authorised by me.

Non-residents who desire to remove their shares to places outside my emergency area, *i.e.*, Hewagam and Salpiti korales

in Colombo District, should make their applications on forms D. F. C. 34 in duplicate to the Revenue Officer or the A. G. A. (E) of the area in which they reside.

It is further ordered that—

- (a) If no application for removal from this area is received by me within six weeks of the date of threshing, any such paddy is liable to be requisitioned; and
- (b) If after application for removal the quantity authorised to be removed is not removed within six months from the date of threshing such quantity or part thereof is also liable to be requisitioned. Forms D. F. C. 34 referred to above are available on application from my office.

6. Rice coupons must be surrendered at the rate of—

- (a) five coupons for every bushel of paddy allowed for consumption to owner cultivators and cultivators; or
- (b) eight coupons for every bushel of paddy allowed for consumption for non-cultivating owners (no substitute coupons need be surrendered). In the case of producers resident within the area the necessary coupons must be surrendered to the Village Headman concerned immediately on receipt of paddy for consumption.

7. Any producer acting in contravention of any of the above orders will be liable to prosecution.

Internal Purchase Scheme.

Harvesting of Paddy in Kuruwiti, Nawadun and Kukul Korales of Ratnapura District for the Maha 1945-46 Season.

BY virtue of the powers vested in me by the Defence (Miscellaneous) Regulation 37, the Defence (Purchase of Foodstuffs) Regulations, 1942, the Defence (Paddy Cultivation) Regulations, 1943, and the Defence (Food Rationing) (Special Provisions) Regulations, 1944, I, Melville Kevenne Trelawny Sandys, Government Agent, Province of Sabaragamuwa, a competent and a proper authority do, by this Order, direct that every owner or cultivator of any land which is cultivated with paddy during the Maha Season of 1945-46, and which is situated within the Divisional Revenue Officer's Divisions of Kuruwiti, Nawadun and Kukul Korales of the Ratnapura District shall—

- (1) inform the Village Headman of the area in which the paddy land is situated of the date on which it is proposed to reap the harvest on that land, not less than 10 clear days ahead;
- (2) give the Village Headman or other person authorised by me, at his request, the following information relating to the land:—
 - (a) the name, situation and extent of the land;
 - (b) the names and addresses of the person or persons entitled to take or receive any part of the produce of the land, under any contract or agreement or otherwise; and
 - (c) the share or shares of the produce to which such person or persons may be entitled.

2. I do further direct that—

- (1) no paddy shall be removed or caused or permitted to be removed by any person from a field or threshing floor to a barn or any other place of storage until the Village Headman or other person authorised by me shall have assessed and recorded the total harvest and the shares; and except on a permit obtained from the proper authority in terms of paragraph 4 of this Order;
- (2) the Government levy of 2 bushels of paddy per acre for Kuruwiti and Nawadun korales and one bushel of paddy per acre for Kukul korale for Maha 1945-46 shall be handed to the Village Headman;
- (3) no paddy shall, without prior authority be disposed of in any manner other than by way of consumption at approved rates by the owners and his *bona fide* dependants subject to a maximum of 50 bushels or such lower quantity as they may be entitled to, until the following harvest;
- (4) no paddy shall be utilised for consumption by an owner or his dependants possessing a Rice Ration Book until the surrender of the appropriate number of rice coupons;
- (5) any paddy in excess of the requirements for consumption as laid down in clause (3) and, in the case of those who normally supply seed paddy and customarily feed labourers during cultivation operations, any paddy in excess of the requirements for consumption, seed paddy at the rate of two bushels of paddy per acre and feeding allowance at the rate of one bushel of paddy per acre or such other quantity of paddy as I may order, shall be sold to the Village Headman on behalf of Government.

3. The approved rates of consumption of paddy by purchasers at present are 6 measures of paddy per person per week, in the case of cultivators and owner-cultivators and their dependants and 4 measures of paddy per person per week, in the case of non-cultivating owners and their dependants. Coupons in respect of paddy shall be surrendered at the rate of 1 rice coupon for every six measures of paddy received by a cultivator or an owner-cultivator and one rice coupon for every four measures of paddy received by a non-cultivating owner.

4. Permits on form IPS 33 (a) for transport of paddy from the field or threshing floor to a barn situated within the same Village Headman's Division or from one Village Headman's Division to another within the same Divisional Revenue Officer's Division shall be obtained from the Village Headman concerned, who will obtain the signature of the remover on the copy of the permit on form I.P.S. 33 (a) as proof of removal. For transport from one Divisional Revenue Officer's Division to another or from one Emergency A. G. A.'s area to another, or from one District to another, applications should be made to the Government Agent, Assistant Government Agent or the Assistant Government Agent (Emergency) of the area in which the applicant is resident giving all particulars asked for in form D.F.C. 34 (Duplicate) copies of which can be obtained from any of the above officers. To expedite the issue of permits, the applicants are requested to produce reports from the Village Headman or any other authorised person of the areas of their residence and of the areas in which the paddy lands are situated, giving particulars of their households and of their shares of paddy from the various fields respectively.

5. If no application is made in the manner described above within six weeks from the date of harvesting, all stocks of paddy are liable to be requisitioned under the Internal Purchase Scheme.
