BY virtue of the powers vested in me by regulation 1 of the Defence (Trading with the Enomy) (No. 3) Regulations and by regulation 1 (2) of the Defence (Trading with the Enemy) Regulations, 1939, I, Henry Monck-Mason Moore, Governor of Ceylon, do hereby—

(1) order that 12 midnight on March 15, 1946, shall be the time until which the territories described in the Schedule hereto shall, for the purposes of regulations 3A, 4, 5, and 6A of the Defence (Trading with the Enemy) Regulations, 1939, be treated, under regulation 1 of the Defence (Trading with the Enemy) (No. 3) Regulations, as if they had not ceased to be enemy territory as defined in the Defence (Trading with the Enemy) Regulations, 1939; and
(2) authorise any person in Ceylon, unless otherwise directed

(2) authorise any person in Ceylon, unless otherwise directed by me, to trade, after the aforesaid date, within any territory described in the Schedule hereto with any individual or body of persons (whether corporate or unincorporate) carrying on business therein, notwithstanding anything contained in regulation 1 of the Defence (Trading with the Enemy) Regulations, 1939.

THE DEFENCE (TRADING WITH THE ENEMY)
REGULATIONS, 1939.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by regulations 4 and 6A of the Defence (Trading with the Enemy) Regulations, 1939, I, Henry Monck-Mason Moore, Governor of Ceylon, do hereby—

- (1) sanction any assignment of a chose in action, any transfer of a negotiable instrument, and any transfer of any coupon or other security which is transferable by delivery and which is not a negotiable instrument, being an assignment or a transfer made on or after the fifteenth day of March, 1946, by or on behalf of any individual or body of persons to whom this paragraph applies;
- (2) order that Articles 1, 4 and 5 of the Trading with the Enemy (Custodian) Order, 1940, (which require payment of certain moneys to the Custodian of Enemy Property and impose restrictions and requirements in regard to the property in Ceylon of enemies) shall not apply to (a) any money which would but for the existence of a state of war become payable on or after the fifteenth day of March, 1946, to or for the benefit of any individual or body of persons to whom this paragraph applies, (b) any property which on or after the fifteenth day of March, 1946,

comes into the ownership of any such individual or body of persons, or (c) any money or property to which the aforesaid Articles would apply only because any such individual or body of persons became resident or commenced or recommenced to carry on business in Czechoslovakia on or after the third day of April, 1945;

and

- (3) declare that the preceding paragraphs shall apply-
  - (a) to any individual resident in Czechoslovakia
  - (b) as respects any business carried on in Czechoslovakia, to any individual or body of persons (whether corporate or unincorporate) carrying on that business; and
  - (c) as respects any business carried on in any territory which is not an area for the time being to be treated as enemy territory for the purposes of the aforesaid regulations 4 and 6a in accordance with the provisions of the Defence (Trading with the Enemy) (No. 3) Regulations, to any body of persons (whether corporate or unincorporate) carrying on that business if and so long as that body is controlled by any individual resident, or body of persons carrying on business, in Czechoslovakia.

## By-law.

The by-laws made by the Hambantota Urban Council, dated May 14, 1945, and published in Gazette No. 9,410 of May 25, 1945, are hereby amended as follows:-

- in by-law 2, by the substitution, for the words "ice factory or public, bathing place,", of the words "ice factory, hair dressing saloon or barber's shop, or public bathing place,";
   by the re-numbering of by-law 194 as by-law 204;
   by the insertion, immediately after by-law 193, of the following new by-laws:—

"Hairdressing Saloons and Barbers' Shops.

- No person shall be entitled to obtain a licence to keep a hairdressing saloon or barber's shop unless the building or part of the building to be used for the purpose, and the equip-ment of the saloon or shop, are in conformity with the following conditions and requirements:—
  - (1) The building or part of the building-
  - (a) must be substantially constructed, and must have a floor space of not less than 120 square feet provided that the requirements of this paragraph shall not apply to any building in which a saloon or shop is carried on or kept at the date of the publication of this by-law in the Gazette;

(b) must have its walls lime-plastered and lime-washed, its roof provided with a wooden or other similar ceiling painted white, its floor cemented, and the junction of the floor with the walls rounded off with

(c) must be well lighted and well ventilated; and

- (d) must be provided with satisfactory drains, and with satisfactory latrine accommodation either within the building or on the premises.
- (2) If any part of the building is used or is intended to be used for residential purposes, that part must be in conformity with the requirements of the Housing and Town Improvement Ordinance (Chapter 199).
  - (3) The saloon or shop must be provided with-

(a) a sufficient supply of water at all times during which

the saloon or shop is open to customers;
(b) means for securing an adequate supply either of boiling water or of disinfectants, for the purpose of washing or sterilizing the instruments or appliances in daily

(c) facilities for the hairdressers or barbers to wash their hands during the course of their work;

(d) a sufficient number of receptacles for the disinfectants to be used for sterilizing instruments or appliances; (e) a sufficient supply of towels and overalls for the use

of the customers;

(f) a sufficient number of spittoons, kept by the side of the seats in such manner as to be readily available to customers and employees; and

(g) a covered and movable bin made of galvanized iron or other impervious material, for the reception of hairclippings and refuse.

195. The licensee of a hairdressing saloon or barbers' shop shall

(a) keep affixed, in a conspicuous position outside the saloon or shop, a board bearing the words "Licensed Hairdressing Saloon" or "Licensed Barber's Shop", as the case may be; and

(b) keep affixed, in a conspicuous position within the saloon or shop, a framed copy of these by-laws in each of the languages, English, Sinhalese and Tamil.

196. The licensee of a hairdressing saloon or barber's shop shall-

- (a) cause the walls of such saloon or shop to be limewashed and the ceiling painted at least once in six months; and
- (b) cause the floor, walls, ceiling, fixtures, furniture and equipment of such saloon or shop to be kept clean

The licensee of a hairdressing saloon or barber's shop 197. shall take steps to ensure that every hairdresser or barber employed by him in such saloon or shop-

(a) keeps his person and his wearing apparel clean;(b) keeps his finger-nails short and free from dirt; and

washes his hands with soap and water immediately before attending to each customer.

The licensee of a hairdressing saloon or barber's shop shall-

(a) cause every spittoon in such saloon or shop to be maintained in a clean and sanitary condition;
(b) cause every hair brush or comb used in such saloon or shop to be washed or cleaned, and sterilized or disinfected, every day, and to be kept in a clean and sanitary condition at all times;

(c) cause every shaving mug or cup, shaving brush, clipper, razor, or other cutting instrument, used in such saloon or shop to be well rinsed and cleaned in hot water after each occasion on which it is used; and

(d) cause all hair-clippings and other refuse to be collected after each customer has been attended to, and to be deposited in the bin provided for the purpose.

199. The licensee of a hairdressing saloon or barber's shop shall not use, or permit any hairdresser or barber employed by him in such saloon or shop to use, on any customer—

any styptic pencil, powder-puff or sponge; or

(b) any alum or other material for the purpose of stopping any bleeding, unless such alum or other material is in powder or liquid form.

200. The licensee of a hairdressing saloon or barber's shop shall not supply, for the use of any customer, any towel which is not fresh from the wash or any overall which is not clean.

201. The licensee of a hairdressing saloon or barber's shop shall not-

(a) knowingly permit any person who is suffering from any infectious or contagious disease of any kind, or who has recently been in attendance on any person suffering from any such disease, to enter the saloon

or shop for any purpose;
(b) employ any person referred to in paragraph (a) in any capacity in such saloon or shops;

(c) knowingly permit any hairdresser or barber employed by him to attend in the saloon or shop on any person referred to in paragraph (a);

(d) permit any such hairdresser or barber who, by error or accident, attends on any person referred to in paragraph (a), to attend on any other customer unless that hairdresser or barber washes and cleans

his hands before attending on such other customer;

(e) permit any instrument that has been used on any person referred to in paragraph (a) to be used on any other person until it is sterilized.

202. No person shall expectorate within any hairdressing saloon or barber's shop, except into a spittoon provided for the purpose.

203. The licensee of a hairdressing saloon or barber's shop shall not use, or permit any other person to use, the licensed premises-

(a) as a place for taking meals at any time; or(b) as a place for sleeping, except at night when such premises are not open to customers".

## By-laws.

#### Slaughter-houses.

- 1. No person shall at any slaughter-house slaughter any animal-
  - (a) unless that animal has been inspected by the Medical Officer of Health and approved by him as fit to be
  - slaughtered for human consumption; or
    (b) at any time after the expiry of a period of thirty hours
    from the time of the approval of that animal under
- paragraph (a); or (c) except between 9 A.M. and 12 noon on any day:

provided that the Chairman may in exceptional circumstances authorise the slaughter of any animal at any time other than that herein specified.

- No person shall at any slaughter-house slaughter any animal which has been removed alive from the slaughter-house premises after it was approved under by-law 1, unless it is again inspected and approved under that by-law as fit to be slaughtered for human consumption.
- 3. (1) The Medical Officer of Health may prohibit the slaughter of any animal if, after it has been approved under by-law I, it has been found to be diseased or unfit to be slaughtered for human consumption.
- (2) No person shall slaughter any animal the slaughter of which is prohibited under this by-law.
- 4. Every person who brings any animal into the premises of a slaughter-house shall take all such measures as may be necessary to ensure that that animal is adequately fed and watered while it remains in those premises.
- 5. Every person who brings any animal into the premises of a slaughter-house shall, if the animal is rejected as unfit for slaughter, forthwith remove the animal or cause it to be removed from those premises.
- 6. If the carcase or offal of any animal slaughtered at any 6. If the carcase or offal of any animal staughtered at any slaughter-house is, in the opinion of the Medical Officer of Health, diseased or unfit for human consumption, he shall cause the carcase or offal to be forthwith destroyed or disposed of so as to prevent such carcase or offal being exposed for sale or used for human food. Except under the direction of the Medical Officer of Health, no person shall remove any such carcase or offal from the slaughter house. carcase or offal from the slaughter-house.
- 7. The keeper of a slaughter-house shall not permit the slaughter therein of any animal which has not been approved as fit to be slaughtered for human consumption, or the slaughter of which has been prohibited under by-law 3.
- 8. No person shall remove from the slaughter-house the carcase of any animal intended for human consumption unless such carcase has been stamped on its fore quarters and hind quarters by the keeper of the slaughter-house with the letters "V.C.A.P." and with such one of the marks "Australian Beef" "Country Beef" "Mutton Goat" "Mutton Sheep" or "Pork" as may be appropriate to the case.
- 9. No animal shall be slaughtered in the presence of any other animal or until the carcase of every animal previously slaughtered in the premises has been removed or screened off and the premises cleaned.
- 10. No person who is suffering or who has suffered from any contagious, cutaneous or infectious disease, or has been in any contagious, cutations of infections disease, or has been in attendance on any person suffering from such disease shall be permitted by the person in charge of any slaughter-house to enter such slaughter-house or take part in the slaughtering of any animal until the periods of infection and incubation have elapsed.
- 11. It shall be lawful for the Medical Officer of Health to enter and inspect at all reasonable times, any slaughter house, and the person in charge thereof shall render him all such assistance as may be necessary.
- 12. A fee at the following rates shall be paid in advance to the Committee for the use of any slaughter-house established by the Committee, and no animal shall be slaughtered without an official receipt in proof of payment of the fee:—
  - For cattle For sheep or goats For pigs ...
- One rupee per head
- Fifty cents per head
- Fifty cents per head

- 13. The keeper of every slaughter-house shall maintain in such form as the Committee may direct a register of particulars relating to each animal slaughtered at the slaughter-house.
- 14. The powers conferred on the Medical Officer of Health by these by-laws may be exercised by any officer acting under the general or special directions of the Medical Officer of Health.
  - 15. In these by-laws-

  - "animal" means any head of cattle, goat, sheep or pig;
    "cattle" includes buffaloes;
    "Charman" means the Chairman of the Committee;
    "Committee" means the Village Committee;
    "Medical Officer of Health" includes a Field Medical Officer.

## By-laws.

- 1. No water shall be drawn from the Committee's waterworks except from the public stand pipes or fountains or a private service pipe or otherwise than in the manner prescribed in these by-laws.
  - No person shall take water from a public standpipe-
  - (a) in a cart or barrel, or in any vessel other than a bucket or other similar receptacle, carried and capable of being ordinarily carried by hand; or

    (b) in any quantity or in any manner likely to cause any
  - waste of water.
- 3. No person shall attach any hose pipe, pipe, tube, shoot, or other contrivance of any nature whatsoever either temporarily or permanently to any public standpipe.
- 4. No person shall interfere with the automatic self closing valve or other automatic appliance attached to or forming part of any public standpipe, or do any other act likely to prevent either temporarily or permanently the automatic action of such valve or appliance.
- 5. No person shall take water from a public standpipe for any purpose other than domestic purposes.
- 6. No person who is suffering from any loathsome, contagious, or infectious disease, and no person who has recently been in attendance on any such person shall draw water from a public standpipe.
- 7. No person shall bathe or wash any part of his body or wash any animal or any vehicle, clothes, utensil, or other article whatsoever at or near any reservoir, standpipe, fountain, cistern, pipe, or other waterworks for the time being vested in or maintained by the Committee.

Requirements as to private service pipes and fittings.

- 8. Without the written approval of the Charman first had and obtained, on application made to him in the form "A" set out in the Schedule hereto, no person shall—
  - (a) construct a new service or lay any new service pipe from the Committee's mains or waterworks to any private premises, or commence any work for that purpose; or
  - (b) alter, extend, clean out, or renew any existing service pipe connected to the Committee's mains or water-works, or commence any work for any such purpose.
- Any work approved by the Chairman under by-law 8 shall be carried out in accordance with the written instructions of the Chairman and no fittings or appliances shall be used in such work unless approved by him.
- 10. Not more than one service pipe for the supply of water to any premises within the same curtilage and assessed by the Committee as one property shall be connected to the Committee's mains or waterworks.
- All pipes used in the construction of private services shall be either of cast iron coated with bituminous composition or of galvanized wrought iron and shall be of such thickness and quality as may have been approved by the Chairman.
- 12. After the date on which these by-laws come into force-
  - (a) no cistern or cisterns exceeding 10 gallons in capacity shall be installed or constructed on any premises for holding any part of the water supplied for domestic purposes; and.

- (b) no cistern or cisterns or bath shall be installed or constructed on any premises unless the size and design thoroof and the number that is to be installed or constructed, have received the prior approval of the Chairman.
- 13. The service pipe, cistorn or other service fittings of any premises shall not be connected with any service pipe, cistern, or other service fittings of any other premises.
- 14. No pipe forming part of a private water service shall be directly connected with any boiler, condenser, or any other mechanical appliance without the express sanction of the Chairman.
- 15. No pipes, valves, or other fittings forming part of a newly constructed service to any premises shall be covered up until they have been inspected and approved in writing by the Chairman or an officer or person authorised by him in that behalf.

Connection of Private Service to Mains.

- 16. (1) When a newly constructed service has been inspected and approved under by-law 15, the applicant shall deposit with the Committee—
  - (a) the cost of connecting the service to the Committee's mains or waterworks, including the cost of labour, materials, and supervision as estimated by the Chairman: and
  - Chairman; and

    (b) a promium or additional charge of Rs. 20 in respect of the connection and the supply of water.
- (2) The connection shall not be made until the amounts required by paragraph (1) of this by-law have been duly doposited.
- 17. The connection from the Committee's principal mains or subsidiary mains to the service pipe laid on any private premises to which water is to be supplied, shall not be made otherwise than under the supervision of an officer of the Committee authorised by the Chairman.

Prevention of Waste.

- 18. (1) The Chairman may, whonever he has reason to believe that the arrangement, size, position, nature, or condition of any pipe, tap, valve, or other fittings forming part of the private water service on any premises connected with the Committee's waterworks, is likely to lead to waste, misuse, undue consumption, or contamination of the water supplied from the waterworks for public or private use, or is likely to be prejudicial to the proper control and distribution of water from the waterworks, serve a notice in the Form "B" set out in the Schedule hereto upon the owner of the premises.
- (2) Every such notice shall specify the alteration which the Chairman considers necessary, and such alteration shall be made by the owner to the satisfaction of the Chairman within such period as may be specified in the notice.
- (3) In the event of the name or residence of the owner being unknown, the notice shall be deemed to be duly served on the owner if it is affixed in a conspicuous place upon the premises to which it relates.
- 19. The Chairman shall withhold, suspend, or diminish the supply of water to any premises or disconnect a private service pipe on those premises from the Committee's mains or waterworks—
  - (a) at the request of the owner or occupier of such premises;
  - (b) if the construction or line of any such service pipe by the owner or the occupier of such premises is not carried out or altered in accordance with the provisions of these by-laws; or
    (c) if any act or thing be done or omitted to be done by
  - (c) if any act or thing be done or omitted to be done by the owner or the occupier of such promises contrary to the provisions of these by-laws relating to damage or pollution of the waterworks, or waste, or the abuse of the water.
- 20. The occupier of a house or premises to which a private water service has been laid from the Committee's waterworks shall immediately notify the Chairman whenever the water is running waste from any tap, pipe or other fitting forming part of such service. Whenever a change of occupier takes place in such house or premises, the incoming occupier shall notify such change to the Chairman within forty-eight hours after the change takes place.
- 21. Whenever water is found running to waste from any tap, pipe, or other fitting forming part of the private water service on any premises, the Chairman, or any person authorised by him in that behalf, may at once disconnect the service from the Committee's mains, and such service shall not be reconnected until the cause of the waste is eliminated by the owner or the occupier of the premises.

#### General.

- 22. The amount estimated by the Chairman as the cost of reconnecting to the Committee's mains or waterworks any private service pipo disconnected on any of the grounds set out in by law 18, shall be paid by the owner of such premises in advance to the Committee. The unexpended balance, if any, shall be returned to the owner on the completion of the work. In the event of the actual cost exceeding the estimated cost, the amount of the excess shall be paid by the owner forthwith on the completion of the work.
- 23. The Chairman may, without any prejudice to any water rate, or other sums which may be or become due under the Ordinance or these by-laws, withhold, diminish, or divert the supply of water through any main, public fountain, service pipe, or other appliance connected to the Committee's waterworks either wholly or in any part whenever the Chairman is satisfied—
  - (a) that the water available in the waterworks is insufficient;
  - (b) that such action is expedient or necessary for the purpose of extending, altering, or repairing the mains or waterworks, or the purpose of the connection of service pipes to mains; or
  - (c) that such action is expedient or necessary by reason of any damage caused to a public standpipe or any pollution or waste of the water thereof; or
  - (d) that damage is caused, or likely to be caused, to the waterworks by an outbreak of fire.
- 24. The stopcock or valve of each private service and the part of the service pipe between the stopcock or valve and the main shall be deemed to be the property of the Committee, and the cost of the maintenance, repair, or renewal of that part shall be borne by the Committee: Provided, however, that where any repair or renewal is necessitated by any damage caused to that part by any wilful act or negligence of the owner or of the occupier of the premises to which the service belongs, the cost of such repair or renewal shall be paid to the Committee by that owner on demand made therefor by the Chairman.
- 25. The approval of any private service pipe or fittings under by-law 15, or the grant of any permission or concession under any of those by-laws to the owner or the occupier of the premises on which the service pipe is laid, shall not be deemed for any purpose to attach to the Committee any hability for any damage caused by the bursting of any part of the pipe or the overflow of water from any part of the pipe or fittings.
- 26. The Committee shall not be liable in damages for the failure on its part to supply water, whether under any contract, deed or agreement, or otherwise, if such failure is due to unusual drought or to any temporary interference with the supply caused by carrying out any work, or to any other unavoidable cause or accident.
- 27. (1) The Chairman, or any officer authorised on that behalf by him in writing may, after giving not less than one hour's notice of his intention to the occupier of any premises served by a private water service connected to the waterworks enter such premises at any time between sunrise and sunset for the purpose of examining the condition of the pipes, works, and fittings relating to such service, and of ascertaining if there be any waste of water supplied by such service.
- (2) When such notice cannot, for any reason, be given or served personally on the occupier of the premises, the affixing of such notice in a conspicuous place upon the premises shall be sufficient service of such notice for the purpose of this by-law.
- 28. All moneys payable to the Committee under these by-laws shall be paid at the Office of the Committee to the Chairman or to the officer of the Committee authorised to receive such payment.

## Interpretation.

- 29. "Chairman" means the Chairman of the Pallegampaha Village Committee.
- "Committee" means the Pallegampaha Village Committee;
- "domestic purposes" used in relation to a supply of water does not include water for horses or cattle or for washing vehicles where such horses or cattle are kept for hire, or a supply for any trade, manufacture, or business, or for fountains or swimming baths, or for any ornamental or for mechanical purposes, or for purposes of irrigation.

Bakeries, Eating-houses, Restaurants and Tea and Coffee Boutiques.

#### 1. In these by-laws

- "Bakery" means any premises in which broad, biscuit or confectionery is baked for sale as food for human consumption and includes any premises in which such food is prepared, or in which the materials for
- the preparation of such food are stored; '
  "Chairman" means the Chairman of the Village Committee;
  "Medical Officer of Health" includes a Field Medical Officer.
- (1) No person shall establish or carry on business at any bakery except on a licence issued in that bohalf by the Chairman on the recommendation of the Medical Officer of Health.
- (2) Every licence issued under this by-law shall expire on the thirty-first day of December of the year in respect of which it is issued.
- 3. No person shall be entitled to a licence under by-law 2, unless the premises to be used as a bakery are in conformity with the following requirements:
  - the premises must be well ventilated and well lighted;
  - (b) the walls must be plastered with lime mortar and white-washed;
  - (c) the floor must be comented;
  - (d) the premises must be provided with sufficient latrine accommodation and sufficient drains;
  - (e) a ceiling of suitable materials must be provided so as to prevent dirt and dust falling from the roof;
    (f) the premises must not be situated within fifty feet of any
  - cesspit, permanent manure heap, latrine or open
  - (g) the premises must be provided with a separate kneading room having superficial floor space of not less than
  - 12 feet by 10 feet;
    (h) there must be a free external air space, not less than 7 feet wide, on at least two of the sides of the kneading room which contain doors or windows
  - (\*) the door of the oven must not open directly into the kneading room.
  - 4. The licensee of a bakery shall cause-
  - (a) all utensils, furniture, and other requisites used in or
  - belonging to the bakery to be kept clean;
    (b) the tops of the tables in the bakery to be made of well-seasoned, closely-fitting planks, or of some nonharmful impervious material, and the tables to be scraped and cleaned daily;
    (c) the floor of the bakery to be swept at least once in every
  - twenty-four hours, and the sweepings to be placed immediately in an impervious and covered receptacle, and removed from the bakery daily;
  - (d) the premises of the bakery to be kept clean and free from effluva arising from any drain, privy or cesspit and from any other similar nuisance;
  - (e) the flour which is used in the bakery to be kept on a
  - platform raised at least three feet above the ground; (f) all refuse from the premises of the bakery to be removed and the drains to be flushed daily;
  - (g) at least two spittoons to be kept in some part of the premises other than the kneading room, but so as to be easily accessible to those engaged in the manufacture of bread;
  - (h) clean water, clean towels, nail brush and soap to be provided on the premises for the use of those engaged in the manufacture of bread; and
  - (i) a copy in Sinhalese of these by-laws relating to bakeries to be exhibited in a conspicuous part of the bakery.
  - 5. The licensee of a bakery shall not-
  - (a) allow the bakery to be used as a place for sleeping or for keeping any animal or any article other than an article necessary for the purposes of the bakery;
  - (b) allow any bread, biscuit or confectionery to be exposed for sale otherwise than in clean and properly
  - constructed fly-proof glass cases;
    (c) allow any person engaged in the manufacture of bread, biscuit or confectionery to use any flour, water or
  - other materials which are not good and wholesome;
    (d) use or keep in the bakery any furniture or equipment
    which cannot be moved about for the purpose of
  - cleaning the floor; or

    (e) allow any gambling or disorderly conduct to take place
    on the premises of the bakery.
- 6. Every person employed in the preparation or baking of bread, biscuit or confectionery, shall wash his hands before engaging in that process, and shall wear a clean white apron, covering the chest, armpits, and body and also white cap or
- 7. No person shall spit within the premises of the bakery except into a spitoton provided for the purpose.

- 8. No person who is suffering or has suffered from any contagious, cutanoous or infectious disease, or has been in attendance on any person suffering from such disease shall be permitted by any person in charge of a bakery to enter the bakery or to take part in the manufacture or sale of bread, biscuit or confectionery, until the periods of infection and incubation have elapsed.
  9. (1) It shall be lawful for the Chairman or Medical
- Officer of Health or the Sanitary Assistant or any officer authorised by the Chairman in writing, at all reasonable times, and at any time when the process of kneading or baking is being carried on, to onter and inspect the bakery
- (2) The licensee, or the person in charge of a bakery shall permit the Chairman or the Medical Officer of Health or the Sanitary Assistant or any officer authorised by the Chairman in writing to enter and inspect the bakery, and shall render the Charman or such officer, all such assistance as may be
- 10. It shall be lawful for the Village Tribunal, in addition to any other punishment that it may impose, to cancel the licence of any licensee convicted twice or oftener of any breach of any of these by-laws relating to bakeries; and the licensee shall not be entitled to any compensation in respect of such cancellation.
- 11. (1) No person shall establish or carry on business at any eating-house, retaurant, or tea or coffee boutique except on a licence issued in that behalf by the Chairman on the recommendation of the Medical Officer of Health.
- (2) Every licence issued under this by-law shall expire on the thirty-first day of December of the year in respect of which it is issued.
- 12. No person shall be entitled to a licence under by-law 11, unless the premises to be used as an eating-house, restaurant or tea or coffee boutique are in conformity with the following requirements-
  - (a) the premises must be well ventilated and well lighted;
  - (b) the walls must be plastered with lime mortar and whitewashed:
  - (c) the floor must be cemented; and
  - (d) a ceiling of suitable materials must be provided so as to prevent dirt and dust falling from the roof.
- The licensee of an eating-house, restaurant or tea or coffee boutique shall cause-
  - (a) the premises thereof to be kept in a clean and sanitary ondition;
  - (b) all utensils, furniture, or other equipment, used in or belonging to the eating-house, restaurant or tea or coffee boutique to be kept clean;
  - (c) all refuse and dirt in or about the premises of the eatinghouse, restaurant or tea or coffee boutique to be swept and removed twice daily;
  - (d) all cakes, sweets and other food exposed for sale on such premises to be kept in clean and properly constructed. fly-proof glass cases;
  - (e) all waste tea, coffee or milk and all remnants of food to be collected in a fly-proof receptacle, with a close-fitting lid or cover and removed from such premises
  - twice daily;

    (f) all utensils used in the preparation, sale and consumption of food or drink to be washed with soap and water at least once in every twonty-four hours;
  - (g) overy utensil or recoptacle used by a customer to be washed immediately after such use and before being used by another customer; and
  - (h) a list of names and addresses of all employees to be kept at all times in the premises so as to be available for
- The licensee of an eating-house, restaurant or tea or coffee boutique shall not permit-
  - (a) any waste tea, coffee or milk or any remnants of food to
  - be thrown on the floor of the licensed premises; or
    (b) any gambling or disorderly conduct to take place on the licensed premises.
- The licensee of any eating-house, restaurant or tea or coffee boutique shall cause at least two spittoons to be kept at all times on the licensed premises so as to be readily available to the visitors to the premises, as well as to the employees.

#### By-laws.

### Capitation Tax.

#### Exemption.

- The following classes of persons are hereby exempted from the liability to pay the capitation tax :-
  - (a) accredited priests or ministers of any religious denomination,
  - (b) members of the Ceylon Defence Force,
  - (c) Railway Telegraph linesmen, and (d) Persons over 55 years of age.

## Preparation of Lists.

- 2. The person or persons authorised in that behalf in writing by the Chairman shall, on or before December 1 in each year, prepare in such form as may be specified by the Chairman, a list of all persons resident within the village area who are liable to pay the capitation tax for the next succeeding year.
- 3. The chief occupier of every house shall, whenever equired by the Chairman or by any duly authorised person, fill in to the best of his knowledge any form supplied to him for the purpose of the preparation of the list or furnish all such information, written or oral, as may be required relating to the number of persons resident in the house (including the householder himself), and the name, age and race and other particulars of each such person.
- The list prepared in each year shall be kept at the office of the Village Committee or at any other suitable place appointed by the Chairman and shall be open for inspection to the public from December 1 to 31 of that year.
- 5. Any person whose name is included in the list may by a written statement addressed to the Chairman on or before January 31 next succeeding object to the inclusion of his name in the list on the ground that he is not a voter or that he has ceased to be resident in the village, or that he is exempted by by-law 1 from the hability to pay the capitation tax. Chairman shall, after holding such inquiry as he may consider necessary, make such order as may seem to him just.
- 6. Any person not already exempted under by-law 1 may, on or before February 15, make a written application to the Chairman for exemption from the liability to pay the capitation tax for that year. The Chairman may exempt such person from such lability for that year or for life or for such period as he may think fit on the ground that such person is by reason of bodily infirmity or disease, incapable for performing labour.
- The list shall be revised in accordance with the orders made by the Chairman under by-law 5, and with the exemptions granted under by-law 6, and shall be certified under the hand of the Chairman on or before March 1, as the final list of the persons liable to pay the capitation tax for that year.

## Annual Programme of Works.

- 8. (1) The Committee shall at a meeting to be held on or before March 15 in each year-
  - (a) prepare a programme of all items of works which have to be constructed or maintained during that year;
  - determine the number of days for which each person included in the final list should be called upon to perform labour for that year in payment of the capitation tax due from him; and
  - (c) determine the rate, not exceeding fifty cents in respect of each day, at which the labour due from any person may be commuted by payment of money.

- (2) Notice of the matters determined by the Committee under paragraph (1) shall be published by the Chairman as soon as may be, by beat of tom-tom in the village area, and by the exhibition of written notices in conspicuous places in that area.
- In the case of any item of work not included in the programme referred to in by-law 8 (1), any person included in the final list may be called upon to contribute labour for an additional period, but so however, that the total period for which any one person may be called upon to perform labour in any year does not exceed ten days.

## Commutation of Tax.

- 10. Any person whose name is in the final list prepared for any year may commute his liability to perform labour for that year by making payment of money at the rate determined by the Committee under by-law 8 (1), on or before March 31 of that year or such later date in that year as the Committee may fix with the approval of the Executive Committee of Local Administration.
- 11. Not less than one week before the date appointed by the Chairman for the commencement of any item of work information shall be given in the village area by beat of tomtom and by the exhibition of written notices under the hand of the Chairman specifying the place at which the work is to be done, the persons who are required to perform the labour necessary, the number of days for which each person has to contribute labour and the hours of work on each such day. The persons required to contribute labour may be described in the notice either by name or as inhabitants of any specified

village or part of a village or group of villages.

12. (1) Every person who elects to commute his liability to perform labour by making payment of money shall pay the money to such officer and at such place as may for the time being be appointed by the Committee.

(2) A written receipt in such form as may be provided for the purpose by the Committee shall be issued under the hand of the officer to whom such payment is made.

#### Performance of Labour.

13. Every person whose name appears in the final list referred to in by-law 7 and who has not commuted his liability to perform labour, shall attend with such implements and tools as may be necessary and perform labour on the days and at the time and place specified in such notice as may be issued, exhibited or published by the Chairman in that behalf.

## Performance or Commutation of Double Labour.

Every person who fails to perform labour on any day on which he is required to do so by by-law 13 shall be deemed to be in default on that day and shall be hable to perform double labour, that is to say, labour for two days m respect of each day for which he is in default.

15. Any person who is liable to perform double labour may commute his liability to perfrom such double labour by making payment of money at the rate determined under by-law 8 (1): provided that no person shall be permitted to make payment of money in commutation of the liability to

make payment of money in commutation of the habitry to perform such double labour after the expiry of a period of one month from the earliest day in respect of which he is in default.

16. Every person who is liable to perform double labour under by-law 14 and has not made payment in commutation thereof under by-law 15, shall attend with such implements and tools as may be necessary and perform labour on such days and at such time and place as may be specified in a notice which shall be issued by the Chairman. Such notice shall not require any person to perform labour for any period exceeding in length the total number of days for which such person is. liable to perform labour under by-law 14.

17. In these by-laws-

"Chairman" means the Chairman of the Committee; "Committee" means the Village Committee of Weuda village area :

"list" means the list of persons hable to pay the capitation tax in a village area.

## Conservancy and Scavenging.

1. The Chairman may, by notice in writing served on the owner of any premises, situated within an area for which a conservancy service has been established, require such owner to provide a pail latrine of such size and type and in such a position on the premises as may be approved by the Chairman on the recommendation of the Medical Officer of Health or an officer authorised by such Medical Officer.

2. If the Medical Officer of Health or an Officer authorised

by such Medical Officer certifies that any cosspit or latrine (not being a pail latrine of the size and type referred to in by-law 1) situated on any premises within the area for which a conservancy service has been established is insanitary and dangerous to health, the Chairman may, by notice in writing served on the owner of such premises require such owner to close such cesspit or latrine.

3. Every owner on whom a notice referred to in by-law 1 or

by-law 2 has boon served, shall comply with the requirements of such notice within such time, in no case to be less than two months, as may be specified in such notice.

4. Every occupier of premises provided with a pail latrine and situated within an area for which a conservancy service has been established; shall maintain such latrine at all times in a sanitary condition and in good repair.

5. No person other than a conservancy labourer employed by the Village Committee shall romove or otherwise dispose of the night soil from any pail latrine within an area for which a conservancy service has been established.

6. For the purpose of inspecting any cesspit or latrine, whether constructed or in course of construction, on any premises, it shall be lawful for the Medical Officer of Health or an officer authorised by him, to enter the premises at any time between sunrise and sunset, and the occupier of the premises shall render such officer all such assistance as may be necessary for the purpose of the inspection.

7. Upon the establishment of a scavonging service for the whole or any specified part of the villago area, the occupier of any premises, situated within an area for which such service has been established, shall cause all ashes, sweepings, and other refuse from his premises to be deposited in a bucket or bin with a suitable cover and of such shape and size as may be approved by the Chairman.

8. The occupier of any premises referred to in by-law 7

The occupier of any premises referred to in by-law 7

(1) daily between such hours as the Chairman may from time to time notify by beat of tom-tom or otherwise cause such bucket or bin to be placed by the edge of the road outside such premises but so as to cause no obstruction to traffic on the road, and

(2) cause such bucket or bin to be removed within half an hour of the emptying of such bucket or bin by the scavenging labourers of the Village Committee.

- 9. No person shall place on any road any bucket or bin referred to in by-law 7 except between such hours as are referred to in by-law 8.

10. The occupier of any premises served by the scavenging service, other than an occupier who is exempted by the Village Committee on the ground of poverty, shall pay to the Village Committee a scavenging fee at the rate of twnety-five cents

(25 cts.) every month.

11. The scavenging fee referred to in by-law 10 shall be paid to the Chairman of the Village Committee or to any person duly authorised by him in writing to collect such fee, on or before the 10th day of the month immediately following the month in respect of which such fee is due. Provided that when the owner or occupier of any premises has given written notice in advance to the Chairman that the premises will not be occupied during the whole of any specified month, and such owner or occupier subsequently satisfies the Chairman that such premises were in fact not occupied during the month, no scavenging fee shall be payable in respect of those premises for that month.

12. In these by-laws—"Chairman" means the Chairman of the Village Committee; "Medical Officer of Health" includes a Field Medical Officer.

### Internal Purchase Scheme-Harvesting of Paddy in the Province of Uva.

BY virtue of the powers vested in me by the Defence (Miscellaneous) Regulation 37, the Defence (Purchase of Foodstuffs) Regulations, 1942, the Defence (Paddy Cultivation), Regulations, 1943, and the Defence (Food Rationing—Special Provisions) Regulations, 1944, I, Siavax Hirji Wadia, Government Agent, Province of Uva, a competent and a proper authority, do by this Order direct that every person whether owner or cultivator of any land, which is situated within the divisions of Yatikinda, Wiyaluwa, Wellassa and Bintenna, and which is expected to be harvested after the date of this Order during any season of any year, until such date of this Order during any season of any year, until such time as this Order is rescinded by a proclamation in the Government Gazette, shall forward in writing, the following information to the Village Headman or the Vel-Vidane of the area in which the paddy land is situated:—

- (a) the name, situation and extent of the land;
- (b) the names and addresses of the person or persons entitled to take or receive any part of the produce of the land under any contract or agreement or otherwise;
- (c) the details of the share or shares of the produce to which such person or persons referred to at (b) above may be entitled; and
- (d) the dates on which it is proposed to reap and thresh the crop on the land.

The particulars for (a), (b) and (c) should be notified within fourteen clear days of sowing. The particulars for (d) should be notified at least ten clear days before the proposed date of reaping and threshing.

## 2. I do further direct that-

- (1) No paddy shall be removed or caused or permitted to be removed by any person or persons from a field or threshing floor to a barn or any other place of storage, until the Village Headman or Vel-Vidane of the area or any other person authorised by me shall have assessed and recorded the total harvest and the shares, and except on a written permit obtained from the preserve authority in terrograph 2 of this from the proper authority in terms of paragraph 3 of this Order;
- (2) The Government levy of two bushels of cleaned and winnowed paddy in good condition for Maha season and one bushel for Yala season per acre, which is a first charge on the crop shall be handed over at the threshing floor to the Village Headman or the Vel-Vidane of the area or any other person deputed by me;
- (3) No part of the paddy removed on permits in pursuance of paragraph 3 of this Order shall without prior authority be disposed of in any manner, except so much as is allowable at the following approved rates for consumption and other purposes, and except in pursuance of sub-clause (5) below.

Apporved rates .-

(a) Customary cultivation allowance of one cut bushel per acre; (b) An allowance not exceeding 4 cut bushels per acre

- for seed purposes;

  (c) A consumption allowance of 6 cut measures per head per week in the case of cultivators and owner-cultivators and their bona fide dependants and 4 cut measures per head per week in the case of non-cultivating owners and their bona fide dependants subject to the proviso that the maximum quantity allowable to any producer during any single cultivating season for consumption shall not exceed 50 cut bushels.
- (4) No paddy shall be utilised for consumption by an owner or cultivator, or his/her dependants, possessing a Rice Ration Book, until he/she had surrendered the coupons for the paddy allowed to him/her for consumption under subclause (3) (c) on the following basis:-
  - (a) One rice coupon for every six cut measures of paddy received per head by cultivators and owner-cultivators and their dependants.

- (b) One rice coupon for every 4 cut measures of paddy received per head by non-cultivating owners and their dependants;
- (5) Retransport permit in form I. P. S-33, referred to in para. 3 (3) below, will not be issued, until coupons liable to be surrendered in terms of sub-para. (4) above have been duly surrendered.
- (6) Any quantity of paddy in excess of the requirements until the following harvest for consumption and other allowances as prescribed in sub-clause (3) above, or such quantity of paddy as I may order, shall be sold to the Village Headman and delivered at the nearest purchasing centre or the Village Headman's office, and payment obtained at Govern-ment rates prevailing from time to time, the rates prevailing at the date of this order being Rs. 6 per bushel.
- 3. Permits for transport of paddy should be obtained in the following manner:
  - (a) Transport within a Village Headman's Wasama: The application for the permit should be made to the Village Headman in whose Wasama the field is situated; and he will issue a permit on form I. P. S—33.
  - (b) Transport from one Village Headman's Wasama to another Village Headman's Wasama within the same D. R. O's Division: A permt should be obtained from the Village Headman in the same manner as in (a) above and such permit must be endorsed by the D. R. O. of the area, before, it becomes valid.
  - (c) Transport from one D. R. O's Division to another D. R. O's division within Badulla District, excluding Haputale Emergency area: The application should be made in duplicate on form D. F. S. & C. 34 to the D. R. O. of the area in which the applicant resides, and the permit will be issued at the Kachcheri. The application must be supported by a report from the Village Headman of the Wasama in which the field or fields are situated.
  - (d) Transport from one Emergency area to another, or from one District to another: Application should be made on form D. F. S. & C. 34 in duplicate to the Government Agent, Assistant Government Agent or Assistant Government Agent (E) in which the applicant is resident.
- 4. To expedite the issue of permits, the applicants are requested to produce reports from the Village Headman or any other authorised person of the area in which the paddy lands are situated, and of the area of their residence, giving particulars of the shares of paddy from the various fields and the number of dependants in the household of the applicant and other particulars as requested in form D. F. S. & C. 34.
- 5. If no application is made in the manner described above within six weeks of the date of harvesting, all stocks of paddy are liable to be requisitioned under the Internal Purchase Scheme.
- 6. All transport permits should be carefully retained for a period of at least 12 months. Inability to produce a permit will render any stocks of paddy not proved to have been transported on a permit hable to be requisit.oned.
- 7. It should be carefully noted that it is an offence not to comply with any of the requirements of this Order.
