North: By a line drawn from a point on the eastern boundary of the railway reservation at the north-western corner of lot P902 in P. P. 13994 eastwards along the northern boundary of the said lot to its north-eastern corner, thence by a line drawn south-eastwards

through Baduwatta claimed by C. Juliet Senaratne and others to the south-western corner of Monikkwatta claimed by T. 1. The area situated in Hikkaduwa in Wellaboda pattuwa, Galle District, Southern Province, and bounded as follows:—

North: By a line drawn from the centre of the bridge over the Hikkaduwa Ganga on the Colombo-Galle road north-eastwards along the centre of the Hikkaduwa Ganga as far as a point 53 chains to the north-east measured in a straight line from the centre of the said bridge.

South: By a line drawn from the last-mentioned point south-westward along the eastern boundary of the Wewala-Nalagasdeniya road and crossing the railway line and the Colombo-Galle main road to the northern boundary of Wellawatta claimed by M. K. Baptist and others, thence by a line drawn south-westwards along the northern boundary of the said premises to the low-water mark of the sea, thence by a line drawn north-westwards along the low-water mark of the sea to a point 10 chains due east of the south-eastern corner of lot 1 in P. P. A 731 (rocky islet).

West: By a line drawn from the last-mentioned point north-westwards and northwards along the low-water mark of the sea as far as a point in prolongation of the northern boundary of the cart track north of Kumarakanda, thence by a line drawn eastwards along the said prolongation and north-eastwards along the northern boundary of the said cart track and crossing the Colombo-Galle main road to its eastern boundary, thence by a line drawn south-eastwards along the eastern boundary of the said road to the western boundary of the Dodanduwa-Baddegama road, thence by a line drawn north-eastwards along the western boundary of the said road crossing the railway line to a point in line with the northern boundary of the Walamulla road, thence by a line drawn eastwards crossing the Dodanduwa-Baddegama road and along the northern boundary of the Walamulla road till it meets the western boundary of Kurunduwatta claimed by D. M. G. Sehamy and others, thence by a line drawn north-eastwards along the western boundaries of the said premises and Badugalagawakumburewita claimed by T. A. Gunawardena and others till it meets the southern end of the narrow inland strip of the Ratgama Lake, thence by a line drawn northwards along the southern boundary of the said narrow inland strip of the Ratgama Lake to the starting point of the northern limit of the area.

1. This Order may be cited as the Trading with the Enemy (Custodian) Order, 1946.

2. Article 1 of the Trading with the Enemy (Custodian) Order, 1940, requiring the payment of certain moneys to the Custodian of Enemy Property shall not apply to any money which would, but for the existence of a state of war, be payable to, or for the benefit of, any person to whom the provisions of this Order apply when—

(a) the money is payable in respect of a debt expressed as payable in foreign currency, not being the currency of any area under the sovereignty of a Power with whom His Majesty is at war;

(b) the debtor had before that person became an enemy acquired a draft or telegraphic or mail transfer in that currency for the purposes of making such payment; and

(c) the debtor has notified the Custodian of particulars of the draft or transfer acquired by him and of the debt in respect of which it was acquired.

3. Article 4 of the Trading with the Enemy (Custodian) Order, 1940, shall not apply to any draft or transfer referred to in Article 2 (b) of this Order.

4. The provisions of this Order shall apply—

(a) to any individual resident in territory not being an area under the sovereignty of a Power with whom His Majesty is at war;

(b) as respects any business carried on in any such territory, to any individual or body of persons (whether corporate or unincorporate) carrying on that business; and

(c) as respects any business carried on in any territory which is neither enemy territory nor an area which is for the time being to be treated as enemy territory for the purposes of regulation 6A of the Trading with the Enemy Regulations, 1939, in accordance with the provisions of the Defence (Trading with the Enemy) (No. 3) Regulations, to any body of persons (whether corporate or unincorporate) carrying on that business if and so long as the body is controlled by any individual resident in or body of persons carrying on business in any such territory as is referred to in paragraph (a).

TRADE DISPUTE—MESSRS. HARRISONS & CROSFIELD, LIMITED,
COLOMBO.

THE All-Ceylon Tea and Rubber Workers' Union presented a petition to me under section 6 of the Essential Services (Avoidance of Strikes and Lockouts) Order, 1942, with regard to a trade dispute that had arisen between the said Union and Messrs. Harrisons & Crosfield, Ltd., Colombo. The petition was referred to a Special Tribunal appointed by H. E. the Governor under the proviso to section 5 of the said Order for adjudication.

2. The following findings and award dated February 28, 1946, made by the Special Tribunal are published for general information in terms of section 8 (4) of the above-mentioned Order:—

"Item 1 in the petition relates to a demand that the 3 persons named therein be regarded as persons performing the duties of Tea Boys and that they be paid wages according to the scale provided for Tea Boys in the George Steuart award. Upon the evidence I am satisfied that these men do not perform the duties normally performed by Tea Boys. The respondent pays these men wages on the scale provided for messenger boys in the George Steuart award which provided for a wage scale commencing from Rs. 25 per month until a maximum of Rs. 30 per month is reached after a period of 5 years.

Generally speaking, a messenger boy after a period of 5 years as such becomes qualified to perform the duties ordinarily performed by a Peon. I therefore award that these 3 men should receive wages and allowances as at present and that K. I. Velaithan be given increments of one rupee a year up to Rs. 30 a month. These men may however elect to receive wages and special allowance as provided for unskilled labourers by the Wages Board. I would however recommend that these men or any of them, if found suitable should be promoted to the grade of Peons.

Item 2: This is a demand made by labourers employed in moving bales to presses for a higher rate of wage than the wage fixed for this class of unskilled labourer, by the Wages Board relating to the Rubber Export Trade. Their work as I found on my inspection while they were engaged on their duties at the Rubber Stores of the respondent Company consisted in moving on an iron wheelbarrow a bale of rubber sheets to the presses. The type of wheelbarrow used is somewhat heavy. The workman is required to balance the load on the barrow by means of his hands. When the load is so balanced the process of moving the barrow did not appear to me to be a difficult process. The work involved manual labour and required no special skill. This work is no doubt slightly more difficult than the work assigned to the other unskilled labourers who have been grouped in

Grade 2. I do not consider that these unskilled labourers can reasonably demand a higher rate of wage than the wage fixed for all manual labourers by the Wages Board after consideration. Their work also entails exertion and physical labour. I would nevertheless recommend for consideration by the respondent Company the desirability of providing a lighter wheelbarrow and providing rails on which the wheelbarrow can move easily from the store to the press and back to the store when facilities for obtaining a lighter type of wheelbarrow and the necessary rails become available regard being had to the difficulties of obtaining shipping space. I do not think that I should in these proceedings make an order for costs which was applied for by counsel for the respondent. I therefore make no order as to costs."

TRADE DISPUTE—INDIAN HUME PIPE CO., LTD., COLOMBO.

THE Ceylon General Workers' Union presented a petition to me under section 6 of the Essential Services (Avoidance of Strikes and Lockouts) Order, 1942, with regard to a trade dispute that had arisen between the said Union and The Indian Hume Pipe Co., Ltd., Colombo. The petition was referred to a Special Tribunal appointed by H. E. the Governor under the proviso to section 5 of the said order for adjudication.

2. The following award dated February 23, 1946, made by the Special Tribunal is published for general information in terms of section 8 (4) of the above-mentioned Order:—

Item 1.—All workers will receive their basic wage as determined by the Engineering Wages Board and special allowance as determined by the Engineering Wages Board in regard to various classes of workers falling under different categories of skilled, unskilled and semi-skilled.

In view of the agreement arrived at between the parties I further award that no workmen should as a result of this award receive as the aggregate of their basic wage and special allowance any sum less than what he has been receiving as shown in the document R 1*. I also award that each workman be paid a further special allowance of 25 cents per day.

As regards this allowance of 25 cents the payment of this sum would be made until the cost of living index drops down to 150. Thereafter for every drop of 7 points in the cost of living index figure a deduction of 4 cents per unit of seven will be made from this sum of 25 cents.

Item 2.—I award that a normal working day should be reckoned as 8 hours devoted to work exclusive of the hour devoted for the mid-day meal. The basic wage and special allowance will be paid in respect of work done for a period of 8 hours for each normal working day. If a workman is required to work beyond the period of 8 hours, he should be paid for each extra hour of overtime worked at time and a half the rate payable for each hour of work, computed on the basis of an 8-hour day.

Item 3.—Item 3 was withdrawn and I therefore make no award relating to it.

Item 4.—I award that the number of hours devoted to work on a Saturday should be 5 hours exclusive of the hour taken for the mid-day meal, and that in respect of the 5 hours worked on that day each workman should receive $\frac{3}{4}$ of his basic wage and special allowance for a normal working day as he is entitled to receive. If any workman is required to work beyond 5 hours on a Saturday, he should receive for each extra hour worked one half times the wage payable to him for an hour on a normal working day of 8 hours.

Item 5.—I make no award with regard to the payment of a bonus. I would however recommend to the Company that they should give due consideration to the question of the payment of a bonus as they have been accustomed to do in the past, regard being had to regular attendance and better output of work by the workman during the remaining period of the financial year of the Company.

Item 6.—The demand contained in item 6 is withdrawn. It is however agreed that the employer should continue, as it had done in the past to give increments to its workmen and in accordance with the increments paid by other employers who are concerned with the Engineering trades.

Item 7.—My award is that the existing Provident Fund Scheme should be continued on the basis of a contribution of 5 per cent. of the aggregate wage for each month by the employee and an equal contribution by the employer. I would however recommend to the Company that they should fall into line with the other trading Companies in Ceylon which either voluntarily or in consequence of awards by Special Tribunals are now making contributions at the rate of $7\frac{1}{2}$ per cent of the employees' earnings for the month.

Funds : Working Expenses.—The working expenses, during the year under review, amounting to Rs. 14,889.62 were met from the funds of the Corporation. The grant of Rs. 50,000 which the Corporation was entitled to under section 23 (1) of the Ordinance from the General Revenue in respect of the "preliminary" expenses has not been fully utilised. This grant will be utilised in due course when the Corporation obtains and moves to a separate office.

Loans : Section 22 (1).—The sum of Rs. 3,000,000 which the Corporation was authorised to borrow from the General Revenue under the Ordinance was fully utilised during the year to finance the loans. During the year a further sum of Rs. 647,000 was borrowed from the Treasury Funds. The Board having considered the question of issuing of debentures under section 24 of the Ordinance to finance its loans, decided to borrow money from Government for the present as it appeared to the Board to be more expedient to borrow money from Government at the present moment instead of proceeding with the issue of debentures. An amending Ordinance empowering the Corporation to borrow money on the guarantee of the Government of Ceylon was passed by the State Council on July 19, 1945.

During the period October 1, 1944, to September 30, 1945, a total of 31 loans amounting to Rs. 3,343,500 was granted out by the Corporation.

Interest Payable on Treasury Advances:—Interest payable to the Treasury on advances made to the Corporation on the sum of Rs. 3,467,000 amounted to Rs. 72,526.13.

Interest accrued on Loans granted:—Interest accrued on loans for the period October 1, 1944, to September 30, 1945, amounted to Rs. 104,073.48.

Debentures:—Debentures have not yet been issued as funds for loans are obtained as has been indicated above.

Profits:—The nett profit for the period October 1, 1944, to September 30, 1945, was Rs. 34,225.62.

General Remarks:—The main business of the Corporation has been so far confined to lending money for the purchase and/or development of land, and for the redemption of debts incurred in the purchase and/or development of land. Very few loans have been granted hitherto on the security of movables. The law with regard to the hypothecation of movables does not give sufficient protection to a Corporation which has still to build up reserves and assets to be in a position to face the risks entailed in the acceptance of movables alone as security. The absence of any scheme for insurance of livestock is an additional impediment to granting of loans to applicants desiring to build up dairy industries who have no other securities to offer except the livestock in their possession or those to be purchased.

It has been noticed that estates including some of large acreages have changed ownership. The purchase prices paid have been on the present market values which from pre-war standards can be regarded as highly inflated.

The Corporation has however well safeguarded itself by assessing the loans granted on what it considers to be strictly normal levels of values of the securities offered.

Wide publicity has been given to the existence and activities of the Corporation in order to bring them to the notice of especially the peasant classes in the country. It is encouraging to note that several inquiries and applications for loans have been made from all parts of the Island including the most remote. The Corporation is at present considering ways and means of circumventing the chief impediments to the entertainment of applications for small loans from peasants—namely, that of "Village Title" to lands and absence of plans. It is the policy of the Corporation to "stretch a point" if possible with regard to title to security in such cases. Circumstances being what they are, the main purpose of the creation of this Credit Corporation will be frustrated if strict adherence is made to good legal title of properties in the cases of applications for loans from peasants in rural areas.

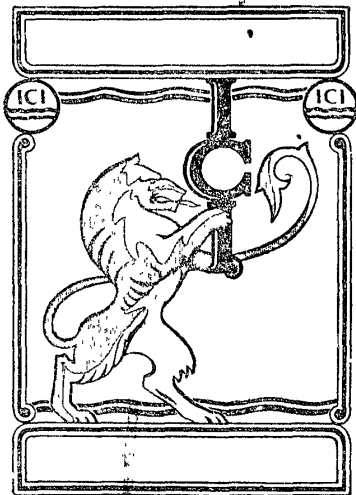
