TRADE DISPUTE—MESSRS. CARGILLS, LTD., COLOMBO.

THE Ceylon General Workers' Union, Colombo, presenteda petition to me under section 6 of the Essential Services
(Avoidance of Strikes and Lockouts) Order, 1942, with regard
to a trade dispute that had arisen between the said Union and
Messrs. Cargills, Ltd., Colombo. The petition was referred to
a Special Tribunal appointed by H. E. the Governor under
the proviso to section 5 of the said Order for adjudication.
2. The following findings and award dated March 26, 1946,
made by the Special Tribunal is published for general information in terms of section 8 (4) of the above mentioned Order:

Cartain damands relating to the wages of labourous and

Certain demands relating to the wages of labourers and messenger boys employed by the respondent Company are embodied in the petition.

for a minimum wage and Item 6 relates, to the demand for a free midday meal.

I am satisfied that the type of work done by the labourers known as the Wharf Department Workers is in no way more difficult than that of the other labourers and that the work

performed by the labourers in this Company is not comparable to the work of labourers working at the Stores and Mills, of the Gas Company or the Oil Companies. It was also agreed that the rate of wage fixed for Peons and Messenger Boys working in the Sales Department be fixed at the same rates as the wages fixed for other labourers. I also find that all these employees are employed and paid on a monthly basis which affords them security and more favourable conditions of employment.

By an award of the Special Tribunal, the basic wages of these employees was fixed at Rs. 20 per month and that of messenger boys at Rs. 15 per month. Counsel for the respondent offered to pay in addition 15 cents a day in lieu of a free midday meal which is now supplied by most employers to all workers of this class. The cost of a free midday meal has been usually computed to be a minimum of 23 cents. This works out for 26 days to nearly Rs. 6. I find from the document R 2 that some employees at present receive more than Rs. 26 per month as wages and that all of them receive

war allowance as at Government rates. My award therefore is-

(1) that all labourers should be paid a minimum basic wage of Rs. 26 per month.

(2) Peons and Messenger Boys should be paid a minimum

basic wage of Rs. 26 a month.

(3) Boys under 18 should receive a minimum basic wage of Rs. 20 a month.

(4) That increments of salary to these workmen should be at the discretion of the General Manager based on length of service and efficiency. A workman to whom no increment is given will be informed by the respondent the reason for it in

writing.
(5) The respondent will continue to pay War Allowance at

Government rates as he does at present.

(6) No worker should in consequence of this award be paid in respect of his wage or War Allowance a sum less than the

in respect of his wage or War Allowance a sum less than the aggregate sum he is now receiving.

(7) Provident Fund.—I award that the Provident Fund which has been inaugurated should be continued on the basis of a contribution of 5 per cent. of the basic salary by each employee and the employer respectively.

(8) As was agreed to by the employer, the gratuity of such sum as is decided upon by the employer should be paid to an employee who retires after 15 years of service.

(9) In view of the existence of a Provident Fund. I do not

(9) In view of the existence of a Provident Fund, I do not... award that a Pension scheme for all workers should be inaugurated.

(10) In view of the increments in salary which this award provides for, I do not direct that the Company should also provide a free midday meal.

(11) Demands 7 and 8 were not pressed and I therefore

make no award relating to them.

(12) The workers cannot use the Tea-Room which is within the building for their meetings after 4.30 P.M. when the building is closed up. This demand is therefore rejected.

(13) The workers make use of the Notice-Board to put up

notices of their meetings and it is agreed that they shall be permitted to continue to do so.
