TRADE DISPUTE—PORT OF COLOMBO.

A trade dispute having arisen in the Port of Colombo between the (1) Colombo Harbour Workers' Union, (2) All Ceylon Harbour and Dock Workers' Union of the one part and (1) The Ceylon Wharfage Co., Ltd., (2) The Cargo Boat Despatch Co., Ltd., (3) The Colombo Cargo Boat Co., (4) Messrs. Narottam & Pereira, Ltd., (5) The New Landing and Shipping Co., (6) The Lotus Boat Co., (7) The Wharf Lighterage Co., Ltd., (8) The Ceylon Cargo Boat Co., (9) The Indian Cargo Boat Co., and (10) The Harbour Lighterage Co., of the other part, as regards certain demands made by the aforesaid Unions, I, by virtue of the powers vested in me under the Defence (Port of Colombo) (Trade Disputes) Regulations, 1943, published in *Government Gazette* No. 9,220 of December 31, 1943, and appearing at page 152 of the Consolidated Reprint of the Defence (Miscellaneous) Regulations dated May 1, 1944, as amended by Order dated April 18, 1946, made by the Officer Administering the Government under the Supplies and Services (Transitional Powers) Act 1945, and published in the *Government Gazette* No. 9,544 of April 18, 1946, referred the said dispute to the District Judge, Colombo, under the provisions of the Essential Services (Avoidance of Strikes and Lockouts) Order 1942, published at pages 63 to 65 of the Reprint of the Orders, &c., made under the Defence (Miscellaneous) Regulations published on May 1, 1944, as amended by Order published in *Government Gazette* No. 9,468 of September 24, 1945.

2. The following award dated April 24, 1946, made by the District Judge, Colombo, is published for general information in terms of section 8 (4) of the Essential Services (Avoidance of Strikes and Lockouts) Order 1942, referred to above :—

“The Commissioner of Labour on April 19, referred this “trade dispute” to me under the provisions of the Essential Services (Avoidance of Strikes and Lockouts) Order published at pages 63 to 65 of the Orders, &c., made under the Defence (Miscellaneous) Regulations, as amended by Order published in *Government Gazette* No. 9,468 of September 24, 1945.

The parties to the trade dispute are—

- (1) The Colombo Harbour Workers' Union.
- (2) The All Ceylon Harbour and Dock Workers' Union and several Landing Companies.

Notices were duly served on all parties interested that the inquiry would be held on the 23rd instant.

Mr. M. G. Mendis, President of the Colombo Harbour Workers' Union appeared as representing the Colombo Harbour Workers' Union.

Mr. N. M. Perera appeared as representing the All Ceylon Harbour and Dock Workers' Union.

The landing companies were represented by Mr. N. E. Weerasooriya, K. C., with Mr. Chitty instructed by Messrs. F. J. & G. de Saram.

The Attorney-General with Mr. de Zoysa, appeared for the Crown.

Mr. M. G. Mendis tendered a statement (P)* and stated he would, as representing the Colombo Harbour Workers' Union, take no further part in these proceedings.

Mr. N. M. Perera also stated that the All-Ceylon Harbour and Dock Workers' Union of which he was President, would not participate in these proceedings.

There was therefore no evidence led in support of the demands made by these two Unions of workers.

As there was no evidence offered by the workers, I intimated to Mr. Weerasooriya that I would wish to hear some evidence at least to show that these demands which had been made by the workers had been inquired into by some competent authority.

The competent authority dealing with matters relating to the Port or Harbour is the Chairman, Port Commission.

Mr. Weerasooriya called Mr. de Silva, the Chief Assistant Port Controller who stated in evidence what action had been taken by the Chairman, Port Commission, on the representations and demands made by the workers.

From Mr. de Silva's evidence it is clear that the first 40 demands appearing in Schedule A* were discussed at a conference held by the Chairman at which representatives of the workers Union as well as of the Landing Companies were present. This conference was held on April 11, 1946, and the Minutes of the Conference were tendered in evidence (R. 1)*. At this Conference no less than 14 of these demands had after discussion been altogether dropped by the workers' Union, not pressed or referred to the decision of the Chairman. The Landing Companies agreed to two of the demands.

Both parties agreed that five of the demands should be decided by the Commissioner of Labour or higher authority.

The Chairman of the Port Commission was to make suitable orders in regard to two of the demands.

From the Minutes of this Conference it will be seen that of the 40 demands—

- 28 have been settled or dropped,
- 5 are to be referred to higher authority,
- 7 have been rejected by the Landing Companies.

The five demands for submission to higher authority are matters of policy affecting all labour—not only harbour workers—and matters not concerning the landing companies alone.

- (1) 45-hour week instead of 48 hours.
- (2) Accident leave to be paid on 1st day and not on 8th day.
- (3) Pensions and gratuities.
- (4) House accommodation near harbour for harbour labour.
- (5) Standby wages of tally clerks—affecting shipping companies.

The seven demands rejected by the landing companies are—

- (1) 14 days sick leave with pay (over and above 14 days leave and 5 Customs holidays).
- (2) Uniforms.
- (3) Victory Bonus of 3 months' pay.
- (4) Increments to start from new basic pay.
- (5) Lightermen to be paid Rs. 2 when lighters are under repair.
- (6) Day's wages for day of leave.
- (7) 25 per cent. all round increase of wages.

At first sight some of these demands appear to be not only unreasonable and extravagant but fantastic. Could that be the reason that there was no attempt to justify these demands ?

In the absence of any evidence on the part of the workers to justify their demands or to show that the terms and conditions of their present employment are either unjust or unreasonable, I have no alternative but to rely on the only evidence placed before me, that evidence being also acceptable.

Of the 42 demands in Schedule A* 40 were considered at the conference referred to.

The last two demands have nothing to commend them. I cannot see how any person with any show of reason can demand an advance of one month's wages for the Sinhalese New Year or for 14 days' leave when they have not qualified for it.

The demands in Schedule B* are more or less a repetition of some of the demands in Schedule A*.

Exhibit R. 5* shows that the rates were revised in April, 1945.

The demands in Schedule B* are covered in most cases by the rates provided for by R. 5*.

These demands were made on April 16, on behalf of the Coal Yard labourers who were on strike—and included a demand for an advance of pay for New Year and other festive occasions. No evidence was adduced to support any of these demands.

After this trade dispute was referred to me and after notices had been issued on the parties the Commissioner of Labour forwarded a letter sent to the Chairman, Port Commission, by the General Secretary of the Colombo Harbour Workers' Union containing extra demands.

This has not been referred to me as a "trade dispute" and as it concerns other companies and firms who have not been noticed, I make no award on these demands.

The Attorney-General pointed out that any increase in the cost of labour in the Port would appreciably raise the cost of living as any such increase would mean the higher cost of all commodities. All these increases in landing cost are naturally handed on to the consumer. Therefore from the point of view of the well-being of the community, one would hesitate to sanction any demand which would have the effect of interfering with the supplies of foodstuffs, &c., and "their availability at fair prices".

From the view-point of the Landing Companies I should think the total cost of these demands would amount to millions of rupees.

It is unnecessary to contemplate what further disastrous results any increase in rates for handling cargo might have on the Port of Colombo and resulting in unemployment.

On the demands made in Schedule A* and B*, I would confirm the settlements arrived at by the parties at the conference of April 11.

In regard to the five demands submitted to higher authority I make no order. The proper authority will in due course, I have no doubt, deal with these matters.

In regard to the seven demands rejected by the landing companies and demands 41 and 42 of Schedule A* and the demands in Schedule B*, I do not see any way of justifying them. I consider these demands to be unreasonable and they are accordingly refused."

MOTOR CAR ORDINANCE, No. 45 OF 1938.
List of Applications for Licences for Lorries, for 1946.

IN terms of section 46 of the Motor Car Ordinance, No. 45 of 1938, a list of applications for licences against the issue of licences, &c. —
 The following extract from the Ordinance applies to objections against the issue of licences, &c. —

- "46 (2). (a) Any licensing authority within whose area any part of the area of operation proposed by any applicant for a licence for a lorry, is situated, may make objection against the issue of that licence.
 46 (2). (b) Any person who is the holder of a valid licence, or who is himself an applicant for a licence, for a lorry in respect of the whole or any part of the area of operation which is proposed by any other applicant may on payment of the prescribed fee, make objection against the issue of the licence to such other person.
 46 (4). Any person, who is entitled under sub-section (2) to make objection to the issue of any licence, may, on payment of the prescribed fee*, inspect the application for that licence at any reasonable time at the Office of the Commissioner. Provided, however, that no fee shall be payable by any licensing authority in respect of the inspection of any application."
 Objections must be made in the manner stated below to the Commissioner of Motor Transport, Colombo, so as to be received by him not later than 2 P.M., ON TUESDAY, May 14, 1946.
 1. Every objection in respect of an application for a licence for a lorry shall be made by a written statement on good and suitable paper which shall be signed by the person making the objection. Where the objection is made by any body corporate or firm, it shall be signed by a person duly authorized in that behalf by such body or a partner of the firm, as the case may be.
 2. Every objection shall be made in duplicate and the original shall, where the objection is made by any person other than a licensing authority, bear stamps (uncancelled) to the value of Rs. 2.50.
 3. Every statement of objection shall set out the specific grounds on which the objection is based and shall indicate, by reference to the name of the applicant, for the licence and to the distinctive number of the motor car, the application in respect of which the objection is made.
 4. No objection relating to more than one motor car shall be made in any one statement of objection. Any objections not conforming to these requirements will be of no avail.
 Objectors under section 46 (2) are requested to state clearly in their objections the facts entitling them to object, i.e., whether they are holders of valid licences or are themselves applicants for licences for lorries in respect of the whole or any part of the area of operation and additional services proposed by any applicant. They are also requested to give the registered number of their vehicles in the area applied for or cite the serial number of their applications as listed in the Gazette.
 If the objection is in respect of any application for a licence for a lorry, "under construction" the serial number given to the application in the list should be quoted.

TENDERS for the collection and delivery of materials, &c., between Matara Railway Station and stations in the Hambantota District and between one station and another in the district for the period May to September, 1946.

Tenders are hereby invited for the collection, temporary storage, if necessary, transport and delivery of all goods, that is to say, goods consigned to or by the Assistant Government Agent or Deputy Food Controller, Hambantota, during the period May, 1946, to September 30, 1946.

The services include loading and unloading and stacking but at the Matara Railway Station loading and unloading into and from vehicles will be done by the Railway Labour Contractor except in case of (a) bulky and heavy articles, (b) bricks, (c) tiles, (d) loose coral stones, and loose coconuts, (e) straw, (f) earthenware, and (g) dangerous goods and explosives, the loading and unloading of which will have to be done under this contract.

2. Tenders should be in sealed covers addressed to the Assistant Government Agent, Hambantota. They should either be deposited in the tender box at the Hambantota

Kachcheri, or sent through post under registered cover. The tenders should be marked "Transport between Matara and Hambantota" in the left hand top corner of the envelope, and should reach the Assistant Government Agent, Hambantota, not later than 4.30 P.M. on May 10, 1946.

3. Tenders must be on forms available at the Hambantota Kachcheri.

4. Tenderers must state in their tenders the number of motor vehicles including hired vehicles and the petrol allotments at their disposal for the purpose of carrying out the contract. If none is available they should state what permits for—

- (a) Vehicles, and
- (b) Petrol, will be required if the contracts are awarded to them.

5. The tenderers are required to state separately the rates at which they are prepared to perform the above service in respect of Schedules A, B, and C. Rates quoted above the Defence Regulation rates will in no circumstance receive consideration.

In respect of Schedules A and B fractions of weights of half a cwt. and over only, will be treated as a cwt. Fractions of weights less than half a cwt. will not be counted.

6. A deposit of Rs. 50 must be made at the Treasury or at a Kachcheri and a receipt for the sum produced by the applicants for forms of tender. Should a tenderer decline or fail to enter into contract and bond or fail to furnish approved security, within ten days of receiving notice in writing that his tender has been accepted such deposit will be forfeited to the Crown. Notice of acceptance of the tender will be deemed to have been received by the tenderer if it has been sent by registered post to his address, or left at the address given by the tenderer. All such deposits will be returned upon signature of a contract.

7. Each tender must be accompanied by a letter signed by two responsible persons, whose addresses must be given, engaging to become security for the due fulfilment of the contract.

8. The successful tenderer will be required to deposit as security for the due discharge of the contract a sum not exceeding Rs. 1,000 in cash or Government Pro notes.

This security must be deposited by the contractor in the name of the Assistant Government Agent and shall be mortgaged, assigned, and set over to and with the Crown for securing the due and punctual performance of the contract on the part of the contractor and the payment of all monies which the contractor may become liable to pay to the Crown under the contract.

9. No tender will be considered unless in respect of it all the conditions above laid have been strictly fulfilled.

10. The Government reserves to itself the right, without question of rejecting any or all tenders, and the right of accepting any portion of a tender.

11. No contract may be assigned or sub-let without the authority of the Assistant Government Agent, Hambantota. The Government reserves to itself the right to refuse to recognise a power or attorney issued by a contractor to any person, authorising him to carry on the contract on the contractor's behalf and no such person shall be employed by the contractor.

12. A tenderer who has not previously held a Government Contract when applying for tender forms, should furnish the officer issuing the forms with a written statement giving his full name and permanent address, stating in which district or districts he owns landed property or other interests. The extent of the landed property, and the nature and extent of other interests should be given. A tenderer who has carried out contracts with the department, but not in the division or district concerned in the notice calling for tenders, should state in which division or district or divisions or districts he has held contracts.

A tenderer who has carried out Government contracts with any other department should state the name of such department and the district in which the service was rendered.

13. The contract shall be entered into by the contractor with the Assistant Government Agent, Hambantota, acting for or on behalf of His Majesty the King, and the designation of such officer shall mean and include the officer for the time being holding such office and his successors in office under the Government of Ceylon.

14. The service shall be performed as expeditiously as possible and in accordance with instructions issued. The contractor will be responsible for any demurrage or warehouse rent.

15. The contractor shall hold himself liable for all damage to or loss of goods, parcels, &c., while in his possession for claims for compensation arising therefrom, and for deductions on account of delays in complying with orders.

16. The contractor shall indemnify the Crown against any claim, by or in respect of any employee of the contractor, under the Workman's Compensation Ordinance, No. 19 of 1934.

18. The employment of only Ceylonese labourers in carrying out the work tendered for will be made a condition of the contract and the failure on the part of the successful

tenderer to fulfil this condition will be treated as a breach of the terms of the contract and will render the contract liable to cancellation. Provided however that in exceptional circumstances the Head of the Department with whom the contract is entered into may permit the contractor to employ any non-Ceylonese labourers previously approved by him in writing with the concurrence of the Treasury. The employment of non-Ceylonese labourers without such approval in writing and concurrence is forbidden.

The term "Ceylonese" shall mean and include all natural born British subjects born of parents domiciled in Ceylon.
