TRADE DISPUTE-PORT OF COLOMBO.

A trade dispute having arisen in the Port of Colombo between the (1) Colombo Harbour Workers' Union, (2) All Ceylon Harbour and Dock Workers' Union of the one part and (1) The Ceylon Wharfage Co., Ltd., (2) The Cargo Boat Despatch Co., Ltd., (3) The Colombo Cargo Boat Co., (4) Messrs. Narottam & Pereira, Ltd., (5) The New Landing and Shipping Co., (6) The Lotus Boat Co., (7) The Wharf Lighterage Co., Ltd., (8) The Ceylon Cargo Boat Co., (9) The Indian Cargo Boat Co., and (10) The Harbour Lighterage Co., of the other part, as regards certain demands made by the aforesaid Unions, I, by virtue of the powers vested in me under the Defence (Port of Colombo) (Trade Disputes) Regulations, 1943, published in Government Gazette No. 9,220 of tions, 1943, published in Government Gazette No. 9,220 of December 31, 1943, and appearing at page 152 of the Consolidated Reprint of the Defence (Miscellaneous) Regulations dated May 1, 1944, as amended by Order dated April 18, 1946, made by the Officer Administering the Government under the Supplies and Services (Transitional Powers) Act 1945, and published in the Government Gazette No. 9,544 of April 18, 1946, referred the said dispute to the District Judge, Colombo, under the provisions of the Essential Services (Avoidance of Strikes and Lockouts) Order 1942, published at pages 63 to 65 of the Reprint of the Orders, &c., made under the Defence (Miscellaneous) Regulations published on May 1, 1944, as amended by Order published in Government Gazette No. 9,468 of

amended by Order published in Government Gazette No. 9,468 of September 24, 1945.

2. The following award dated April 24, 1946, made by the District Judge, Colombo, is published for general information in terms of section 8 (4) of the Essential Services (Avoidance of Strikes and Lockouts) Order 1942, referred to above:

"The Commissioner of Labour on April 19, referred this "trade dispute" to me under the provisions of the Essential Services (Avoidance of Strikes and Lockouts) Order published strages 63 to 65 of the Orders. &c.. made under the Defence

at pages 63 to 65 of the Orders, &c., made under the Defence (Miscellaneous) Regulations, as amended by Order published in Government Gazette No. 9,468 of September 24, 1945.

The parties to the trade dispute are—

(1) The Colombo Harbour Workers' Union.(2) The All Ceylon Harbour and Dock Workers' Union and several Landing Companies.

Notices were duly served on all parties interested that the inquiry would be held on the 23rd instant.

Mr. M. G. Mendis, President of the Colombo Harbour Workers' Union appeared as representing the Colombo Harbour Workers' Union.

Mr. N. M. Perera appeared as representing the All Ceylon Harbour and Dock Workers' Union. The landing companies were represented by Mr. N. E. Weera-

sooriya, K. C., with Mr. Chitty instructed by Messrs. F. J. & G. de Saram.

The Attorney-General with Mr. de Zoysa, appeared for the

Mr. M. G. Mendis tendered a statement (P)* and stated he would, as representing the Colombo Harbour Workers' Union, take no further part in these proceedings.

Mr. N. M. Perera also stated that the All-Ceylon Harbour and Dock Workers' Union of which he was President, would not participate in these proceedings.

There was therefore no evidence led in support of

the demands made by these two Unions of workers.

As there was no evidence offered by the workers, I intimated to Mr. Weeraşooriya that I would wish to hear some evidence at least to show that these demands which had been made by the workers had been inquired into by some competent authority.

The competent authority dealing with matters relating to the Port or Harbour is the Chairman, Port Commission.

Mr. Weerasooriya called Mr. de Silva, the Chief Assistant Port Controller who stated in evidence what, action had been taken by the Chairman, Port Commission, on the representations and demands made by the workers.

From Mr. de Silva's evidence it is clear that the first 40 demands appearing in Schedule A* were discussed at a conference held by the Chairman at which representatives of the workers Union as well as of the Landing Companies were present. This conference was held on April 11, 1946, and the Minutes of the Conference were tendered in evidence (R. 1)*. At this Conference no less than 14 of these demands had after discussion been altogether dropped by the workers' Union, not pressed or referred to the decision of the Chairman. The Landing Companies agreed to two of the demands.

Both parties agreed that five of the demands should be decided by the Commissioner of Labour or higher authority.

The Chairman of the Port Commission was to make suitable orders in regard to two of the demands.

From the Minutes of this Conference it will be seen that of the 40 demands-

28 have been settled or dropped,

5 are to be referred to higher authority,

7 have been rejected by the Landing Companies.

The five demands for submission to higher authority are matters of policy affecting all labour—not only harbour workers—and matters not concerning the landing companies

- (1) 45-hour week instead of 48 hours.
- Accident leave to be paid on 1st day and not on 8th day.

Pensions and gratuities.

- (4) House accommodation near harbour for harbour labour.
 (5) Standby wages of tally clerks—affecting shipping companies.

The seven demands rejected by the landing companies are—

(1) 14 days sick leave with pay (over and above 14 days leave and 5 Customs holidays).

Uniforms.

- (3) Victory Bonus of 3 months' pay.
 (4) Increments to start from new basic pay.
 (5) Lightermen to be paid Rs. 2 when lighters are under repair.
- Day's wages for day of leave.
- (7) 25 per cent. all round increase of wages.

At first sight some of these demands appear to be not only

unreasonable and extravagant but fantastic. Could that be the reason that there was no attempt to justify these demands? In the absence of any evidence on the part of the workers to justify their demands or to show that the terms and condi-tions of their present employment are either unjust or unreasonable, I have no alternative but to rely on the only evidence placed before me, that evidence being also acceptable.

Of the 42 demands in Schedule A* 40 were considered at the conference referred to.

The last two demands have nothing to commend them. I cannot see how any person with any show of reason can demand an advance of one month's wages for the Sinhalese New Year or for 14 days' leave when they have not qualified

The demands in Schedule B* are more or less a repetition of some of the demands in Schedule A*

Exhibit R. 5 * shows that the rates were revised in April,

The demands in Schedule B* are covered in most cases by the rates provided for by R. 5*.

These demands were made on April 16, on behalf of the Coal Yard labourers who were on strike—and included a demand for an advance of pay for New Year and other festive occasions. No evidence was adduced to support any of these demands.

A . Comment is in the same

After this trade dispute was referred to me and after notices had been issued on the parties the Commissioner of Labour forwarded a letter sent to the Chairman, Port Commission, by the General Secretary of the Colombo Harbour Workers

Union containing extra demands.

This has not been referred to me as a "trade dispute" and as it concerns other companies and firms who have not been naticed, I make no award on these demands.

The Attorney-General pointed out that any increase in the cost of labour in the Port would appreciably raise the cost of living as any such increase would mean the higher cost of all commodities. All these increases in landing cost are naturally handed on to the consumer. Therefore from the point of view of the well-being of the community, one would hesitate to sanction any demand which would have the effect of interfering with the supplies of foodstuffs, &c., and "their availability at fair prices ".

From the view-point of the Landing Companies I should think the total cost of these demands would amount to millions of rupees.

It is unnecessary to contemplate what further disastrous results any increase in rates for handling cargo might have on the Port of Colombo and resulting in unemployment.

On the demands made in Schedule A* and B*, I would confirm the settlements arrived at by the parties at the conference of April 11.

In regard to the five demands submitted to higher authority I make no order. The proper authority will in due course, I have no doubt, deal with these matters.

In regard to the seven demands rejected by the landing companies and demands 41 and 42 of Schedule A* and the demands in Schedule B*, I do not see any way of justifying them. I consider these demands to be unreasonable and they are accordingly refused."

No. 45 OF 1938. MOTOR CAR ORDINANCE,

List of Applications for Licences for Lorries, for 1946.

IN terms of section 46-of the Motor Car Ordinance, No. 45 of 1938, a list of applications for licences for lorries for the rest of the year, 1946, is published below for general information. The following extract from the Ordinance applies to objections against the issue of licences, &c.

"46 (2). (a) Any licensing authority within whose area any part of the area of operation proposed by any applicant for a licence for a lorry, is situated, may make objection against the issue of that licence.

46 (2). (b) Any person who is the holder of a valid licence, or who is himself an applicant for a licence, for a lorry in respect of the whole or any part of the area of operation which is proposed by any other applicant may on payment of the prescribed fee*, inspect the application for that licence at any reasonable time at the Office of the Commissioner. Provided, however, that one fee shall be payable by any licensing authority in respect of the inspection of any application.

1. Objections. The manner stated below to the Commissioner of Motor Transport, Colombo, so as to be received by him not later than 2 p.m., ON TUESDAY, May 14, 1946.

1. Devy coppetent of an application for a hence for a lorry shall be made by a written statement on good and sutable paper which shall be signed by a person duly authorized in that behalf by such body or a partner of the firm, as the case may be.

2. Every objection shall be made in duplicate and the original shall, where the objection is based and shall midicate, by reference to the name of the distinctive number of the contract of objection is based and shall indicate, by reference to the name of the applicant, for the distinctive number of the
