KNOW Ye that by virtue of the powers vested in me by sections 3 and 6 of the Village Communities Ordinance (Chapter (198), I, Henry Monck-Mason Moore, Governor of Ceylon, do by this Proclamation :—

Limits of the area now known as the town of Maskeliya.

THE VILLAGE COMMUNITIES ORDINANCE.

Order.

WHEREAS by Proclamations the area now known as the town of Maskeliya in the Divisional Revenue Officer's Division of Uda Bulatgama in the Kandy District has, with effect from the first day of January, 1947, been excluded from the operation of the Small Towns Sanitary Ordinance (Chapter 197), and brought within the operation of the Village Communities Ordinance (Chapter 198), and added to Ambagamuwakorale village area of the aforesaid Divisional Revenue Officer's Division.

Now, therefore, by virtue of the powers vested in me by section 41 of the Village Communities Ordinance (Chapter 198), I, Henry Monck-Mason Moore, Governor of Ceylon, do by this Order, with effect from the first day of January, 1947—

- (a) transfer to the Village Committee of the aforesaid village area the whole of the property and the funds acquired or received by or vested in the Sanitary Board of the Kandy District for the use and benefit of the town of Maskeliya and specified in Schedule A hereto;
- (b) declare that such funds and the revenue derived from that part of the village area which is now known as the town of Maskeliya shall be employed by the Village Committee for the use and benefit of the aforesaid part of that area;
- (c) direct the aforesaid Village Committee to keep separate books of accounts in respect of the aforesaid part of that village area;
- (d) apportion and assign to the aforesaid Village Committee the whole of the rights, liabilities, debts or obligations of the Sanitary Board of the Kandy District under any contract entered into by the said Board for the benefit of the town of Maskeliya;
- (e) prescribe the terms and conditions set out in Schedule B hereto, as the terms and conditions on which the officers or servants specified in that Schedule and employed by the said Sanitary Board for purposes relating exclusively to the town of Maskeliya may be transferred to the service of the aforesaid Village Committee; and
- (f) direct the Government Agent of the Central Province—
 - (1) to collect all moneys due to the Sanitary Board of the Kandy District (whether as rates, taxes, licence duties or otherwise) from the inhabitants of the area now known as the town of Maskeliya.
 - (2) to recover such moneys in the manner in which they would have been recovered if that town had not been excluded from the operation of the Small Towns Sanitary Ordinance; and
 - (3) to pay such moneys when so collected and recovered to the Village Committee of the aforesaid village area.

By-law.

The by-laws made by the Wattala-Mabole-Peliyagoda Urban Council, and published in *Gazette* No. 9,477 of October 26, 1945, are hereby amended as follows:—

- (1) by the substitution, in by-law 2 of the general by-laws relating to licences, for the words "or public bathing place," of the words "public bathing place, or hair-dressing saloon or barber's shop,";
- (2) by the re-numbering of by-law 194 as by-law 245;
- (3) by the insertion, in paragraph (1) of the re-numbered by-law 245, immediately after the words "Eating-Houses and Tea and Coffee Boutiques" of the words "Butchers' Stalls", "Fish Stalls";;
- (4) by the insertion, immediately after by-law 193, of the following new by-laws:—

"Hairdressing Saloons and Barbers' Shops.

I.—Conditions of Issue of Licence.

194. No person shall be entitled to obtain a licence to keep a hairdressing saloon or barber's shop unless the building or part of the building to be used for the purpose, and the equipment of the saloon or shop, are in conformity with the following conditions and requirements:—

- (1) The building or part of the building—
 - (a) must be substantially constructed, and must have a floor space of not less than 120 square feet: provided that the requirements of this paragraph shall not apply to any building in which a saloon or shop is carried on or kept at the date of the publication of this by-law in the *Gazette*; and
 - (b) must have its walls limeplastered and lime-washed, its roof provided with a wooden or other similar ceiling painted white, its floor cemented, and the junction of the floor with the walls rounded off with cement; and
 - (c) must be well lighted and well ventilated; and—
 - (d) must be provided with satisfactory drains, and with satisfactory latrine accommodation either within the building or on the premises.
- (2) If any part of the building is used or is intended to be used for residential purposes, that part must be in conformity with the requirements of the Housing and Town Improvement Ordinance, No. 19 of 1915.
- (3) The saloon or shop must be provided with—
 - (a) a sufficient supply of water at all times during which the saloon or shop is open to customers;
 - (b) means for securing an adequate supply either of boiling water or of disinfectants, for the purpose of washing or sterilizing the instruments or appliances in daily use;
 - (c) facilities for the hairdressers or barbers to wash their hands during the course of their work;
 - (d) a sufficient number of receptacles for the disinfectants to be used for sterilizing instruments or appliances;
 - (e) a sufficient supply of towels and overalls for the use of the customers;
 - (f) a sufficient number of spittoons, kept by the side of the seats in such manner as to be readily available to customers and employees; and
 - (g) a covered and movable dust bin made of galvanized iron or other impervious material, for the reception of hair clippings and refuse.

II.—Regulations for licensed Hairdressing Saloons or Barbers' Shops.

195. The licensee of a hairdressing saloon or barber's shop shall—

- (1) keep affixed, in a conspicuous position outside the saloon or shop a board bearing the words "Licensed Hairdressing Saloon" or "Licensed Barber's Shop", as the case may be; and
- (2) keep affixed, in a conspicuous position within the saloon or shop, a framed copy of these regulations in each of the languages, English, Sinhalese and Tamil.

196. The licensee of a hairdressing saloon or barber's shop shall—

- (1) cause the walls of such saloon or shop to be limewashed and the ceiling painted at least once in six months; and
- (2) keep clean the floor, walls, ceiling, fixtures, furniture, and equipment of such saloon or shop.

197. The licensee of a hairdressing saloon or barber's shop shall cause every hairdresser or barber employed by him in such saloon or shop—

- (1) to keep his person and his wearing apparel clean;
- (2) to keep his finger nails short and free from dirt; and
- (3) to wash his hands with soap and water immediately before attending to each customer.

198. The licensee of a hairdressing saloon or barber's shop shall—

- (1) cause every spittoon in such saloon or shop to be maintained in a clean and sanitary condition;
- (2) cause every hair-brush or comb used in such saloon or shop to be washed or cleaned, and sterilized or disinfected, every day, and to be kept in a clean and sanitary condition at all times;
- (3) cause every shaving mug or cup, shaving brush, clipper, razor, or other cutting instrument, used in such saloon or shop to be well rinsed and cleaned in hot water after each occasion on which it is used; and
- (4) cause all hair clippings and other refuse to be collected after each customer has been attended to, and to be deposited in the dustbin provided for the purpose.

199. The licensee of a hairdressing saloon or barber's shop shall not use, or permit any hairdresser or barber employed by him in such saloon or shop to use, on any customer—

- (1) any styptic pencil, powder-puff or sponge; or
- (2) any alum or other material for the purpose of stopping any bleeding, unless such alum or other material is in powder or liquid form.

200. The licensee of a hairdressing saloon or barber's shop shall not supply, for the use of any customer, any towel which is not fresh from the wash or any overall which is not clean.

201. The licensee of a hairdressing saloon or barber's shop shall not—

- (1) knowingly permit any person who is suffering from any infectious or contagious disease of any kind, or who has recently been in attendance on any person suffering from any such disease, to enter the saloon or shop for any purpose; or
- (2) employ any person referred to in paragraph (1) in any capacity in such saloon or shop; or
- (3) knowingly permit any hairdresser or barber employed by him to attend in the saloon or shop on any person referred to in paragraph (1); or
- (4) permit any such hairdresser or barber who, knowingly or by error, attends on any person referred to in paragraph (1), to attend on any other customer unless that hairdresser or barber washes and cleans his hands before attending on such other customer; or
- (5) permit any instrument that has been used on any person referred to in paragraph (1) to be used on any other person until it is sterilized.

202. No person shall expectorate within any hairdressing saloon or barber's shop, except into a spittoon provided for the purpose.

203. The licensee of a hairdressing saloon or barber's shop shall not use, or permit any other person to use, the licensed premises—

- (1) as a place for taking meals at any time; or
- (2) as a place for sleeping, except at night when such premises are not open to customers.

Butchers' Stalls.

I.—Conditions of Issue of Licence.

204. No person shall be entitled to a licence to keep a butcher's stall unless the premises to be licensed comply with the following conditions:—

- (1) that the premises are in good repair and well ventilated and well lighted, and that every room is provided with windows capable of being opened, the area of which when open shall be not less than one-fifteenth of the superficial floor space;
- (2) that the walls of every room in every part are not less than 7 feet in height, and are built of brick, stone, or cobwork, with the inside thereof limeplastered and limewashed, and the lower 4 feet of the internal surface is covered with glazed tiles or is plastered in cement;
- (3) that all the eaves are at least 6 feet from the ground;
- (4) that the roof is made of some permanent material;

(5) that all the woodwork is oil-painted or limewashed;

(6) that the floor is cemented throughout;

(7) that the premises are provided with adequate drainage;

(8) that the tables and all the furniture shall be capable of being moved about for the purpose of cleaning the floor and the walls;

(9) that every table on which meat is kept shall be covered with zinc or other impermeable material;

(10) that the premises are provided with a sanitary dust bin and at least one spittoon and with sufficient latrine accommodation;

(11) that the premises are at least 50 feet distant from any latrine, cesspit, manure heap, or open sewer;

(12) that there is no cesspit, latrine, or ashpit within, or directly communicating with the premises.

II.—Regulations for Licensed Butchers' Stalls.

205. Every licensee of a butcher's stall shall keep affixed in a conspicuous position on the outside of his premises a board with his name and the words "Licensed Butcher's Stall" legibly painted thereon in each of the languages, English, Sinhalese, and Tamil.

206. Every licensee of a butcher's stall shall cause a copy of these regulations in English, Sinhalese, and Tamil to be framed and hung in a prominent place in the licensed premises. He shall also keep a list of the names and addresses of all employees including vendors of meat, so as to be at all times available for inspection.

207. Every licensee of a butcher's stall shall cause the walls of every room forming part of the stall, except such parts as are covered with glazed tiles, or are plastered in cement, to be limewashed, and all the woodwork to be limewashed or, if oil-painted, to be washed with hot water and soap at least 4 times a year, in the months of March, June, September, and December, and at such other times as may be ordered by the Chairman in writing.

208. Every licensee of a butcher's stall shall cause the floor, the tiles, the cemented portions of the walls, the tops of the tables, and the chopping blocks to be scrubbed and washed once every day at such hour as is specified in the licence. He shall cause all hooks for hanging meat to be kept polished and free from rust.

209. Every licensee of a butcher's stall shall keep every part of the butcher's stall, its surroundings, drains, furniture, utensils, and equipment used in connection with the storing, preparation, or sale of meat, in good repair, clean, and free from effluvia arising from any drain, latrine, cesspit, or other nuisance.

210. Every licensee of a butcher's stall shall cause a sanitary dust bin, and at least one spittoon to be kept on the licensed premises, so that those employed on the premises may have easy access to them.

211. Every licensee of a butcher's stall shall cause all trade and domestic refuse to be immediately placed in a covered receptacle made of zinc or galvanized iron and to be removed daily from the licensed premises. He shall cause the said receptacle to be kept always covered except at the times when refuse is being actually placed on it.

212. Every licensee of a butcher's stall shall keep the licensed premises free from rats, and shall cause all rat holes to be filled up with broken glass and shall plaster them, as soon as found, with cement.

213. No person shall keep any animal or bird in the licensed premises on any pretext whatsoever.

214. No person shall spit within a butcher's stall except into a spittoon provided for the purpose.

215. No persons suffering, or who has recently suffered, from any infectious, contagious, or loathsome disease, or who has recently been in attendance on any person suffering from such a disease, shall enter a butcher's stall or take part in the storing, preparation, or sale of meat therein or in the transport of any meat thereto or therefrom.

216. No licensee of a butcher's stall shall connive at, or permit the contravention by any person of the above regulations numbered 214 and 215.

217. No person shall keep in the licensed premises any furniture, clothes, sleeping mats, or other articles except those used for the purpose of the storing, preparation, or sale of meat.

218. No licensee of a butcher's stall shall allow any place on the same level with the butcher's stall and forming part of the same building to be used as a sleeping place, unless it is effectually separated from the butcher's stall by a partition extending from the floor to the ceiling, and unless such sleeping place is provided with an external window, the area of which when open shall not be less than one-fifteenth of the superficial floor space.

219. Every licensee of a butcher's stall shall keep on the licensed premises an ample supply of potable water.

220. No licensee of a butcher's stall shall sell or expose for sale on the licensed premises any meat except the meat of animals slaughtered either in a public slaughter-house within the limits of the Council area duly declared and proclaimed under section 21 of the Butchers' Ordinance,

or in a place appointed for the purpose by the Chairman under section 22 of the said Ordinance, or under a special licence issued under section 14 of the said Ordinance.

221. Every licensee of a butcher's stall shall keep the licensed premises open daily for the sale of meat during the hours 7 A.M. to 10 A.M. and 3 P.M. to 7 P.M.

222. No licensee of a butcher's stall shall allow any person to transport meat for sale from his licensed premises unless such person is in possession of a card of registration signed by the Chairman and by the licensee of the butcher's stall.

223. No licensee of a butcher's stall shall permit any person to transport for sale from his licensed premises any meat except in closed vehicle or a closed basket, tin, or other suitable receptacle. He shall see that every such vehicle, basket, tin, or other receptacle is at all times kept clean and wholesome.

224. The Chairman shall, on application made to him by the licensee of a butcher's stall, issue cards of registration for the use of every person employed by such licensee in transporting meat for sale.

Fish Stalls.

I.—Conditions of Issue of Licence.

225. No person shall be entitled to a licence to keep a fish stall unless the premises to be licensed comply with following conditions:—

- (1) that the premises are in good repair and well ventilated and well lighted, and that every room is provided with windows capable of being opened, the area of which when opened shall be not less than one-fifteenth of the superficial floor space;
- (2) that the walls of every room in every part are not less than 7 feet in height and are limeplastered and limewashed except such parts as are covered with glazed tiles or are plastered in cement;
- (3) that all the eaves are at least 6 feet from the ground;
- (4) that all the woodwork is oil-painted or limewashed;
- (5) that the floor is of smooth cement having a proper fall leading to a masonry drain built in cement and cement rendered and emptying into a bucket;
- (6) that every table on which fish is kept is covered with zinc or other impermeable material;
- (7) that the premises are provided with a sanitary dust bin and with sufficient latrine accommodation;
- (8) that the premises are at least 50 feet distant from any latrine, cesspit, manure heap, or open sewer;
- (9) that there is no cesspit, latrine, or ashpit within or directly communicating with the premises.

II.—Regulations for Licensed Fish Stalls.

226. Every licensee of a fish stall shall keep affixed in a conspicuous position on the outside of his premises a board with his name and the words "Licensed Fish Stall" legibly painted thereon in each of the languages, English, Sinhalese, and Tamil.

227. Every licensee of a fish stall shall cause a copy of these regulations relating to fish stalls in English, Sinhalese, and Tamil to be framed and hung in a prominent place in the licensed premises. He shall also keep on the premises a list of the names and addresses of all employees, including vendors of fish, so as to be at all times available for inspection.

228. Every licensee of a fish stall shall cause the walls of every room forming part of the fish stall, except such parts as are covered with glazed tiles or are plastered in cement, to be limewashed, and all the wood-work to be limewashed or, if oil-painted, to be washed with hot water and soap at least four times a year in the months of March, June, September and December, and at such other times as may be ordered by the Chairman in writing.

229. Every licensee of a fish stall shall cause the floor, the tiled or cemented portions of the walls, the tops of the tables, and the chopping blocks to be scrubbed and washed once every day at such hour as is specified in the licence. He shall cause all hooks for hanging fish to be kept polished and free from dust.

230. Every licensee of a fish stall shall keep every part of the fish stall, its surroundings, drains, furniture, utensils, and equipment used in connection with the storing, preparation, or sale of fish in good repair, clean, and free from effluvia arising from any drain, latrine, cesspit, or other nuisance.

231. Every licensee of a fish stall shall cause a sanitary dust bin and at least one spittoon to be kept on the licensed premises, so that those employed on the premises may have easy access to them.

232. Every licensee of a fish stall shall cause all trade and domestic refuse, to be immediately placed in an impervious covered receptacle and to be removed daily from the licensed premises. He shall cause the said receptacle to be kept always covered except when refuse is being actually placed therein.

233. Every licensee of a fish stall shall keep the licensed premises free from rats and shall fill up all rat holes with broken glass and plaster them with cement as soon as he discovers them.

234. No person shall keep any animal or bird in the licensed premises on any pretext whatsoever.

235. No person shall spit within a fish stall except into a spittoon provided for the purpose.

236. No person suffering, or who has recently suffered, from any infectious, contagious, or loathsome disease, or who has recently been in attendance on any person suffering from such a disease, shall enter a fish stall or take part in the storing, preparation, or sale of fish therein, or in the transport of any fish thereto or therefrom.

237. No licensee of a fish stall shall connive at or permit the contravention by any person of the above regulations numbered 234, 235 and 236.

238. No person shall keep in the licensed premises any furniture, clothes, sleeping mats, or other articles, except those used for the purpose of the storing, preparation, or sale of fish.

239. No licensee of a fish stall shall allow any place on the same level with the fish stall and forming part of the same building to be used as a sleeping place unless it is effectually separated from the fish stall by a partition extending from the floor to the ceiling, and unless such sleeping place is provided with an external window, the area of which when open shall be not less than one-fifteenth of the superficial floor space.

240. Every licensee of a fish stall shall keep on the licensed premises an ample supply of potable water.

241. Every licensee of a fish stall shall keep the licensed premises open daily for the sale of fish.

242. No licensee of a fish stall shall allow any person to transport fish for sale from his licensed premises unless he is in possession of a card of registration signed by the Chairman and by the licensee of a fish stall.

243. No licensee of a fish stall shall permit any person to transport for sale from his licensed premises any fish except in a closed vehicle or a closed basket, tin, or other suitable receptacle. He shall see that every such vehicle, basket, tin, or other receptacle is at all times kept clean and wholesome.

244. The Chairman shall, on application made to him by the licensee of a fish stall, issue cards of registration for the use of every person employed by such licensee in transporting fish for sale.

MOTOR CAR ORDINANCE, No. 45 OF 1938.

List of Applications for Licences for Lorries for 1946.

IN terms of section 46 of the Motor Car Ordinance, No. 45 of 1938, a list of applications for licences against the issue of licences, &c. :—
The following extract from the Ordinance applies to objections against the issue of licences, &c. :—

" 46 (2). (a) Any licensing authority, within whose area any part of the area of operation proposed by any applicant for a licence for a lorry is situated, may make objection against the issue of that licence.
46 (2). (b) Any person who is the holder of a valid licence, or who is himself an applicant for a licence, for a lorry in respect of the whole or any part of the area of operation which is proposed by any other applicant may on payment of the prescribed fee, make objection against the issue of the licence to such other person.
46 (4). Any person, who is entitled under sub-section (2) to make objection to the issue of any licence, may, on payment of the prescribed fee *, inspect the application for that licence at any reasonable time at the Office of the Commissioner. Provided, however, that no fee shall be payable by any licensing authority in respect of the inspection of any application."

Objections must be made in the manner stated below to the Commissioner of Motor Transport, Colombo, so as to be received by him not later than 2 p.m. ON WEDNESDAY, JUNE 12, 1946.
1. Every objection in respect of an application for a licence for a lorry shall be made by a written statement on good and suitable paper which shall be signed by the person making the objection. Where the objection is made by any body corporate or firm, it shall be signed by a person duly authorized in that behalf by such body or partner of the firm, as the case may be.
2. Every objection shall be made in duplicate and the original shall, where the objection is made by any person other than a licensing authority, bear stamps (uncancelled) to the value of Rs. 2.50.
3. Every statement of objection shall set out the specific grounds on which the objection is based and shall indicate, by reference to the name of the applicant, for the licence and to the distinctive number of the motor car, the application in respect of which the objection is made.

4. No objection relating to more than one motor car shall be made in any one statement of objection. Any objections not conforming to these requirements will be of no avail.
Objectors under section 46 (2) are requested to state clearly in their objections the facts entitling them to object, i.e., whether they are holders of valid licences or are themselves applicants for licences for lorries in respect of the whole or any part of the area of operation and additional services proposed by any applicant. They are also requested to give the registered number of their vehicles in the area applied for or cite the serial number of their applications as listed in the Gazette.
If the objection is in respect of any application for a licence for a lorry, "under construction" the serial number given to the application in the list should be quoted.

The clearance between the surfaces are variable and so are also the relative speeds of the two. In operation the material is taken by a variable pick up roller and two feed rollers, and impelled by means of a rotating spiral device to the space between the two opposing surfaces.

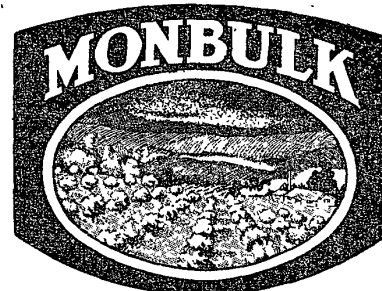

11. No tender will be considered unless the conditions laid down above have been complied with.

The Government reserves to itself the right without question to reject any or all offers and to accept any portion of an offer. No offers will be entertained from persons whose names appear on the list of defaulting contractors.

12. The successful tenderer for each area shall within such time as may be fixed by the Conservator of Forests of being informed in writing that his tender has been accepted enter into the necessary contract supplying at his own cost a stamp of the required value to be affixed to the contract and depositing as security 2½ per cent. of the value of the contract. Should he fail to comply with these requirements his tender form deposit may be forfeited to the Crown; he may render himself liable to be included in the list of defaulting contractors precluded from having any concern in a Government contract in future, and to make good any resultant loss; further the service may be offered to another tenderer in which case no claim for any profit that may accrue to Government by such offer will be entertained. Notice of acceptance of the tender will be deemed to have been received by the tenderer if it has been sent by post addressed to, or left at, the address given by the tenderer. All tender form deposits will be returned upon signature of the contracts.

13. The contract shall be entered into by the successful tenderer (hereinafter called the contractor) with the Divisional Forest Officer within whose jurisdiction the area of operation lies, acting for and on behalf of the Government of Ceylon, and the designation of such officer shall mean and include the officer for the time-being holding such office and his successors in office for the time being under the Government of Ceylon.

14. The contract may not be assigned or sublet without the authority of the Tender Board. The Tender Board reserves to itself the right to refuse to recognize a power of attorney issued by the contractor to any person authorising him to carry on the contract on the contractor's behalf.

15. The contractor shall not employ any person whose name is on the list of defaulting contractors. The Divisional Forest Officer may, for reasons which appear to him sufficient, give notice in writing of his objection to the employment by the contractor of any person specified in such notice, and no such person shall be employed by the contractor.

16. The successful tenderer will be required to employ only Ceylonese labourers in carrying out the work tendered for. The employment of only Ceylonese labourers in carrying out the work tendered for will be made a condition of the contract and the failure on the part of the successful tenderer to fulfil this condition will be treated as a breach of the terms of the contract and will render the contract liable to cancellation. Provided, however, that in exceptional circumstances the Head of the Department with whom the contract is entered into may permit the contractor to employ any non-Ceylonese labourers previously approved by him in writing with the concurrence of the Treasury. The employment of non-Ceylonese labourers without such approval in writing and concurrence will be deemed a breach of contract.

The term "Ceylonese" shall mean and include all persons born in Ceylon and no others.

17. Special rules for felling, conversion and removal of material which are to be observed by the contractor are more fully outlined in the Special Conditions given below. Nothing in these Special Conditions will exempt the contractor from liability under the Forest Ordinance, Cap. 311; should he be responsible for the commission of a Forest Offence.

Any contractor who personally or through the actions of his agents or workmen becomes responsible for any offence against the provisions of the Forest Ordinance (Cap. 311), or for the contravention of any of the conditions of this contract on more than one occasion during the currency of his contract will be liable to have his name included in the list of persons who are debarred from holding Government contracts.

18. The contractor shall indemnify the Crown against any claim by or in respect of any employee of the contractor under the Workmen's Compensation Ordinance, Cap. 117.

19. The payments to which the contractor may render himself liable under the contract may be deducted by the Divisional Forest Officer concerned from all moneys then due or that may become due to the contractor under this or any other contract he may hold under Government and/or from the security deposited by the contractor and hypothecated to the Crown or be recovered from him by action at law.

20. The Government reserves to itself the right, without question, of ejecting the contractor's employees and of rescinding the contract if the above conditions are not adhered to.

21. In case of any disagreement arising between parties to the contract except where the right of final decision is reserved to the Conservator of Forests, it shall be referred to the Tender Board whose decision in every such case shall be final and binding on the parties to the contract.

22. The contract shall be current from the date it is signed to June 30, 1947. Extension of time will not be granted under any circumstances whatsoever.

23. All wayside depots should be accessible to lorries and carts and should be established by contractors at their own expense and with the approval of the Divisional Forest Officer.

24. No lorry over 1½ tons can be used on a road not specifically included in the P. W. D. road schedule.

25. For any further information, application should be made to the officer issuing tender forms.

Special Conditions.

1. (a) Sufficient trees will be made available for the conversion of the specified quantities of sleepers, logs and sawn timber from each area. Only trees marked by the Forest Department for felling shall be felled. Control of all such fellings and the Compartments in which such fellings shall take place will be at the discretion of the Divisional Forest Officer and he may issue directions from time to time as regards fellings.

(b) Climbers on trees to be felled interfering with other growth should be cut according to directions of a Forest Officer, prior to the felling of such trees.

(c) Extraction paths shall be opened by the contractor as directed by the Forest Officer.

(d) The contractors should satisfy themselves before tendering by inspecting the area personally, the quantity the area would yield as representations made later regarding insufficiency of trees, &c., will not be considered.

2. Only trees marked by a forest officer may be felled for conversion. Should the contractor or any of his agents or workmen be responsible for the felling or damaging of any trees not so marked, the contractor shall be liable to pay a fine not exceeding double royalty for each tree so felled or damaged.

If the contractor persists in such unauthorised fellings and/or does unnecessary damage to regeneration and the Forest crop he shall be liable to have his agreement terminated.

3. The supply shall be in the proportion specified against each area in the Schedule to the Agreement and each delivery shall be regarded as complete for purposes of making payment only when the delivery consists of the various categories of supplies—logs, sleepers, sawn timber—strictly in the proportions laid down. Payment will be withheld for any particular delivery not conforming to these conditions.

Payment will be made only on accepted quantities and measurements. No payment will be made for rejections but the contractor will be given the option of purchasing rejected material at full royalty rates. Should he not choose to exercise this option such material will be sold from time to time by public auction.

4. It may be possible to supply more than the quantities shown against each area in the schedule to the Agreement but no such excess will be paid for until delivery of such excess supplies too is effected in the same proportions laid down for the original quantities in the said Schedule.

5. At any time during the currency of the contract the Conservator of Forests may in his discretion call upon the contractor to concentrate on any particular category of supply or even to cease conversion of any other category of supply and the contractor shall carry out the work accordingly.

6. Conversion of logs, sleepers and sawn timber and firewood may take place at the site where trees are felled or at a wayside depot chosen by the contractor with the approval of the Divisional Forest Officer. Converted material or logs for conversion shall not be removed from the felling site to the wayside depot until they are stamped by a Forest Officer with such distinctive hammer work as are approved for the area.

The removal of material from the forest to the delivery point shall be covered by removal permits or cart-notes issued by the Range Forest Officer in charge of the Forest. The contractor shall be responsible for the safety of the material whether at felling site, or in transit or at delivery point and the contractor shall make good the value of any timber lost or damaged.

7. The contractor shall effect the first delivery not later than three months from the date of his signing the Agreement. In the case of delay the Conservator of Forests shall be entitled to recover from the contractor as liquidated damages a sum of Rs. 50 for every month or part of a month of such delay, until the first delivery is made. Subsequent deliveries should be at intervals of not longer duration than one month and in the case of default the Conservator of Forests shall be entitled to recover from the contractor as liquidated damages a sum of Rs. 100 for each month's delay.

8. The concession of advance payment will be granted to contractors who make regular supplies, keep a steady average and maintain a high standard of production. Should any advance payment represent on final acceptance of material an overpayment such overpayment shall be recovered from sums that subsequently become due to the contractor. The concession will be withdrawn from contractors who fall behind supplies. The grant and withdrawal of the concession will be at the discretion of the Conservator of Forests.

9. The contractor shall at his own cost and charges furnish labour, transport, implements, tools, and any material whatsoever required for carrying on the work under the contract. He shall also supply labour, tools, &c., for enumerating trees, demarcating boundaries and for any other work connected with the contract deemed necessary by the Divisional Forest Officer.

10. If the contractor shall fail to make fair and reasonable progress towards completing the work within the time here in before specified, it shall be lawful for the Divisional Forest Officer (if it shall appear to him expedient to do so), to take the work into his own hands, after giving one week's notice in writing to the contractor that the said work will be completed by the

Divisional Forest Officer and thereupon to employ sufficient workmen, overseers and materials to furnish and complete the same and the contractor shall be liable to pay and make good such sum or sums of money, if any, as may be spent by the Divisional Forest Officer in the completion as aforesaid of the said work over and above what may have been payable to the contractor if he had completed the work within the time specified.

11. The contractor shall not in any manner do, cause, or procure to be done any act, matter, or thing whatsoever to delay or impede the completion of the said work by the Divisional Forest Officer under preceding condition (10) or to obstruct the person or persons so employed by the Divisional Forest Officer or to prevent them from using the plant, implement, tools, wire-shoots, and other materials which shall have been or shall be provided for the execution of the said work; and shall not in any way molest, or cause to be molested, the Divisional Forest Officer or any person or persons employed by him.

12. The contractor or his agent or agents, whose names shall be given to the Divisional Forest Officer and the Range Forest Officer in charge of the work, in writing at the commencement of work under the contract and who shall hold a written authority from the contractor shall at all times and without fail be at the working centres to supervise and control workmen and to take orders from inspecting Forest Officers. Should this condition not be complied with the inspecting officer shall have the power to eject such workmen. Further the Divisional Forest Officer shall have the power to reject without question any of the contractor's agents or employees. The contractor will be at liberty to change his agents provided the changes are duly communicated to the Divisional Forest Officer and the Range Forest Officer in writing and provided that each new agent holds a written authority from the contractor to act on his behalf.

13. Damages not exceeding Rs. 100 for any breach of the conditions or for any delinquencies on the part of the contractor in carrying out this contract may be recovered from the contractor with the approval of the Conservator of Forests whose decision shall be final.

14. The supplies of the logs, sleepers and sawn timber should be strictly according to specifications shown in conditions 15-25 below.

15. Logs shall be converted from Satin, Palu, Milla, Ranai, Hulanhik, Halmilla, Mi, Kumbuk, Suriyamara, Dawu and also from such other species as may be acceptable from time to time as required by the Divisional Forest Officer. The absolute minimum dimensions of the logs should be 3 ft. mid-girth under bark and 9 ft. in length. It should be noted that these are only minimum dimensions and that all logs should be as long as possible and of as large girths as available.

Logs of minimum dimensions should not however exceed 10 per cent. of the total supplies.

All logs should be trimmed and barked. Logs of Satin should be carefully barked as soon as they are felled. Logs of other species should be barked up to width of 8 in. at the centre. Logs should be straight and sound and should be free from knots and all forms of decay and other defects. Logs that do not conform to the above specifications will be rejected.

16. Sleepers shall be converted only from trees of Satinwood, Palu, Milla, Ranai and Na.

17. Sleepers shall conform to the Railway Department's specification which is reproduced below—

(a) The broad gauge sleepers are for the 5 ft. 6 in. gauge lines and are to be 9 ft. long, 10 in. wide and 5 in. deep, subject to a variation in length of 1 in. The narrow gauge sleepers are for the 2 ft. 6 in. gauge lines and are to be 5 ft long, 9 in. wide and 4½ in. deep subject to a similar variation in length.

(b) All sleepers shall be cut from well matured trees of the true species of timber. Sleepers must be sawn, and shall be of good sound timber free from heartshake, sapwood (except as provided in (c)) dry rot and knot holes and shall be cut square out of winding and straight.

(c) Allowance may be made for small surface sunshakes, endshakes up to 6 in. a few pinholes, but not in groups, sound and firm knots up to 2 in. in diameter, sap or wane must not exceed 2 in. on either face and not come under the rail seat.

(d) The sleepers shall not be cut on full quarter and shall be cut with an allowance of ¼ in. in width and ¼ in. in thickness to allow for shrinkage and no further allowance on account of size, except as provided above for length, shall be made.

18. Sleepers that do not conform to the specifications will be rejected but where the contractor is agreeable the Railway Department will accept as 2nd grade those sleepers that just fail to come up to standard. Payment for 2nd grade sleepers will be at ½ the accepted rates. Rejected B. G. sleepers other than those accepted as 2nd grade sleepers should be converted into N.G. sleepers and offered for inspection if in the opinion of the Railway Department such rejections are suitable for conversion into N.G. All other rejected sleepers suitable for conversion into scantlings should be so converted and delivered to the Forest Department.

19. Sleepers shall be delivered stacked at an agreed point on the Railway lineside or station yard in batches of not less than 100 and as sufficient quantities become available for handing over, the Forest Department will advise the Railway Department to this effect. Each batch of sleepers shall contain a minimum of 25 per cent. N.G. sleepers until the stipulated number of N.G. sleepers has been supplied. A Forest Department representative will pass sleepers for species at the same time that the Railway Department inspecting officer passes them for specification and payment.

20. Sawn Timber shall be converted from trees of species approved for sleepers and log supplies.

21. Scantlings and boards shall be as long as possible but not less than 10 ft. Boards should not be less than 6" in width.

22. The supply shall be subject to the grading rules below—

(i.) Material shall be flat sawn with sides parallel.

(ii.) Payment will be made on volume in cubic feet calculated by multiplying the length by the cross section or on length in cubits for scantlings or area in square feet for boards as the case may be, subject to the following limitations:—

(a) Length will be taken to the nearest and lower half foot, e.g., 10 ft. 4 in., being taken as 10 feet.

(b) In width and thickness a tolerance of ⅛" scant and ¼" full will be accepted. For example, the extreme acceptable limits for a scantling 4" by 4" are 3¾" by 3¾" and 4¼" by 4¼" and any of the possible variations between these limits will be acceptable. Measurement for payment in each case will be 4" by 4".

(iii.) Timber showing groups of pinhole borer attack, whether active or old, which in the opinion of the Inspecting Officer will reduce the strength of the timber by 5 per cent. or more will be rejected.

(iv.) All the timber showing signs of active "Powder Post" beetle attack will be rejected.

(v.) Material showing obvious fungal attack, excepting casual blue stain or other superficial discoloration, will be rejected. Severe blue stain will count as a defect under rule viii. below.

(vi.) A maximum total length of all end splits of 1/12th of the total length of the board or scantling will be allowed.

(vii.) Not more than 1" of sap either on one side or in total on both sides in boards up to 8" and not more than 1½" boards exceeding 8" in width will be rejected. This is applicable to all species except certain selected dry zone hardwoods. A list of which is available for inspection at any of the Divisional Forest Offices or at the office of the Conservator of Forests.

(viii.) Knots.—No piece of timber may contain more than 3 defects in the form of knots.

These are graded as follows:—

1 knot ⅝" to 1¼" diameter	=	1 defect
1 knot 1¼" to 2¼" "	=	2 defects
1 knot 2¼" to 3¼" "	=	3 defects
2 knots under ⅝" "	=	1 defect
3 knots under ⅝" "	=	2 defects

This applies for tight knots only. If decayed or with signs of decay around them the defects are doubled.

(ix.) Wane.—With otherwise clear specimens a limited amount is permissible but if combined with other defects the presence of wane is a serious defect as the combination results in an appreciable reduction in strength and timber showing such defect will be rejected.

23. The supply shall be in such quantities and in such sizes as may be laid down from time to time by the Divisional Forest Officer concerned.

Each delivery shall be strictly in the proportions so stipulated and if this condition is not satisfied payments for supplies delivered shall be liable to be withheld with forfeiture of security.

24. Sawn timber must be properly stacked at all times whether in the forest, wayside depot or railway yard. The necessary strikers (2" by ½" reapers) shall be supplied by the contractor. All stacking shall be as directed by the Divisional Forest Officer or an officer duly authorised by him.

25. *Firewood*.—(a) Only trees which are not of accepted timber species should be felled for firewood but trees which emit a milky exudation such as *Ficus* species, Kaduru, Lunumidella, Rukattana, Kapu, Kottan, Erabadu, Dadap, Etdemata, Kekuna, Amba, Gedumba, Walkaduru, Imbul, Del and Pulm shall not be felled for conversion of firewood.

(b) Firewood shall be cut and split into billets 3 ft. in length and not less than 2 in. or more than 9 in. in diameter. Firewood shall be stacked leaving sufficient space between the stacks for inspecting officers to walk round each stack. Stacks should be either 3 ft., 4½ ft. or 6 ft. in height.

(c) The contractor will be liable to pay a sum of Rs. 25 as liquidated damages to the Conservator of Forests should a check stack in re-stacking show a decrease of over 10 per cent.

(d) Provided his work is satisfactory the successful tenderer will at the sole discretion of the Conservator of Forests be granted permission to retail firewood at consuming centres at prices to be approved by the Conservator of Forests.

26. *Poles*.—Poles shall be perfectly straight with all knots and side branches trimmed. They should be free from all defects. The species of timber approved for the supply are all common round timbers normally issued on poles licences (excluding primary hardwoods) teak, mahogany and any other forest or plantation species that may be approved from time to time as suitable by the Divisional Forest Officer.

27. *Charcoal*.—As and when required by the Conservator of Forests the conversion of wood into charcoal should be done in accordance with instructions that will be issued from time to time by the Divisional Forest Officer as regards species, sizes, location of kiln in the forest, &c.

28. All notices to be served on the contractor shall be deemed to have been served if given to him or his agent personally or left at the address given in the tender.
