**Internal Purchase Scheme.**

*Harvesting of Paddy in Wariyapola Emergency Area.*

IN terms of Defence (Miscellaneous) Regulation 37, Defence (Paddy Cultivation) Regulations, 1943, Defence (Food Rationing) (Special Provisions) Regulations, 1944, and Defence (Purchase of Foodstuffs) Regulations, 1942, as subsequently amended, it is hereby ordered that—

- (1) (a) No person harvesting paddy produced in fields or highlands during the season Yala, 1946, within Wannai and Dewamedde hatpattus of Kurunegala District shall proceed to thresh same unless ten clear days' notice is given of the said person's intention of doing so to the Irrigation Headman or to any other person by name or office authorised by me in writing;
- (b) No person harvesting paddy as aforesaid shall remove same from the customary threshing floor to a barn or other customary place of storage situated within the same Chief Headman's division until—(i.)

- (ii) permitted to do so in writing by the officers referred to above;
  - (iii.) the Government levy of one bushel per acre which is a first charge on the crop and any other surplus due to Government has been surrendered to the Irrigation Headman (Vel-Muladeniya) or any other person by name or office authorised by me in writing.
- (2) No person who has threshed paddy during Yala, 1946, and removed for storage in accordance with para. 1 of this order shall dispose of such paddy on any account except on written directions issued by me or an officer authorised by me in this behalf. This order, however, does not apply to the use of such paddy for—

- (i.) normal consumption by the shareholder and *bona fide* dependants for six months subject to a maximum rate of 6 cut measures per head per week in the case of owner-cultivators, and cultivators who are actually engaged in the work of cultivation, and in the case of others a maximum rate of 4 cut measures per head per week for all dependants above the age of three years subject further to a maximum of 50 bushels per family.
  - (ii.) sowing as seed in the field or fields from which the paddy was harvested subject to a maximum of 3 bushels per acre and a customary allowance of one bushel per acre as working expenses.
- (3) All paddy received from fields which are held on mortgages should not be disposed of in any account; and proviso to order 2 above does not apply to such paddy.
  - (4) All paddy stacks not threshed and accounted for as aforesaid within one month of their reaping are liable to be requisitioned by Government.
  - (5) (a) For removal of any such paddy to any other place situated outside the same Chief Headman's division as the field from which the paddy is obtained, permission should be obtained from me or an officer authorised by me. Permits for transport out of my Emergency Area shall be applied for through the Deputy Food Controller or the Assistant Government Agent (E) of the area in which such person is resident on the usual form D. F. C. 34. If no such application is made within six weeks of threshing the paddy due will be requisitioned. Application should be made on the same form and a permit obtained from me for transport of paddy from one hatpattu to another hatpattu within this area.
  - (b) Residents in this area who receive paddy from more than one Chief Headman's division must declare their stocks on I. P. S. 4 or 4a and I. P. S. 6 or 6a forms delivered to them by the Vel-Vidanes.
  - (6) Rice coupons must be surrendered at the rate of—
    - (a) 5 coupons for every bushel of paddy allowed for consumption to owner-cultivators and cultivators; or
    - (b) 8 coupons for every bushel of paddy allowed for consumption for non-cultivating owners. (No substitute coupons need be surrendered.) In the case of producers resident within the area the necessary coupons must be surrendered to the Village Headman concerned, immediately on receipt of paddy for consumption.
  - (7) Any producer acting in contravention of any of the above orders will be liable to prosecution.

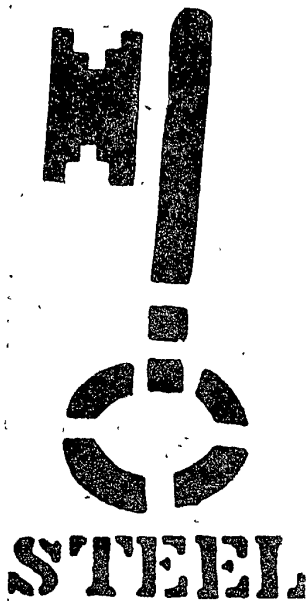

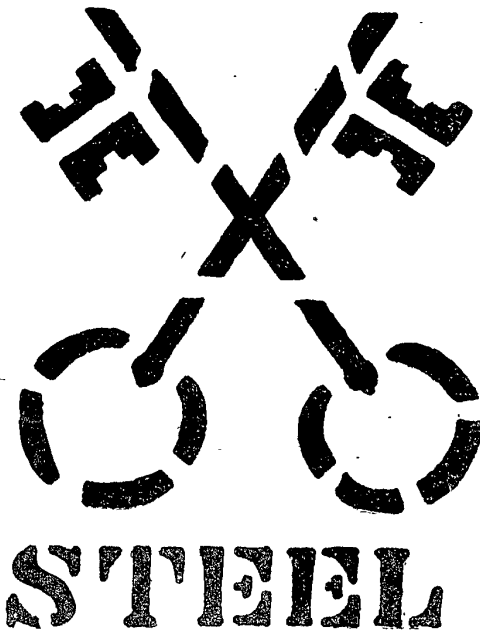
