RULE made by the Executive Committee of Local Administration by virtue of the powers vested in that Committee by section 59 (1) of the Village Communities Ordinance (Chapter 198).

The rules made under section 59 (1) of the Yıllage Communities Ordinance (Chapter 198), and published in Gazette No. 8,438 of March 10, 1939, as last amended by rule published in Gazette No. 8,722 of March 7, 1941, are hereby further amended by the addition, at the end of Part XI thereof, of the new Part XII, set out in the Schedule hereto.

SCHEDULE

Part XII-Meetings of Village Committees.

Meetings.

An ordinary meeting of a Village Committee shall be held at least once a month.

$Notice,\,Agenda,\,Quorum,\,\&c.$

- 2. (1) The notice convening an ordinary meeting of a Committee must contain the date, time, and the place of the meeting and the agenda for the day.
- (2) The Chairman shall cause such notice to be served on
- the members at least five clear days before the meeting.

 (3) The notice referred to in paragraph (1) shall, in any case where personal service cannot for any reason be effected, be deemed to have been duly served, if it is left at the usual place of residence of the member to whom it is addressed.
- (4) Where a quorum is not present at the expiration of half an hour from the time appointed for any meeting, or at any time after the commencement of the meeting, the Chairman shall adjourn the meeting to such other date not more than fifteen days after the date of the meeting so adjourned as he thinks fit, and the business which would have been brought before the meeting so adjourned, if there had been a quorum present, shall be brought before, and disposed of, at such adjourned meeting.

· Adjournment of Meeting.

(1) Any ordinary or special meeting of the Committee at which a quorum is present may, with the consent of the majority of the members present at the meeting, be adjourned from time to time, but no business other than the business left unfinished at the meeting from which the adjournment took place shall be transacted without the permission of the

majority of the members present af such adjourned meeting.

(2) Notice of an adjourned meeting shall be served on members at least three days before the time fixed for such meeting unless it was decided at the original meeting to hold the

adjourned sitting within twenty-four hours.

Strangers.

4. Strangers including representatives of the Press, may be present at meetings in the places set apart for them, but must withdraw when called upon to do so by the Chairman, when in the opinion of the majority of the members of the Committee present at the meeting, expressed by resolution, such exclusion is deemed advisable in the public interest.

Order of Business.

- The business at any meeting shall be transacted in the following order:
 - (a) Confirmation of the minutes of the last preceding ordinary or special meeting.
 Announcements by the Chairman.

 - (c) Memorials, petitions, complaints and communications addressed to the Committee.
 - (d) Questions of which due notice has been given in the
 - order in which they have been received.
 (e) Motions of which due notice has been given in the order in which they have been received.
 - (f) Any other matters set down in the agenda in the order in which such matters are set out, or in such order as the Committee may for special reasons adopt.
 - (g) Monthly statements of receipts and disbursements as are required by the Committee.

Minutes.

- 6. (1) The Chairman shall keep, in the language prevailing in the village area for which the Committee is constituted, minutes of the proceedings of the Committee and shall circulate a copy of such minutes among the members before the next succeeding meeting. In the minutes there shall be recorded the names of members present at the meeting and all decisions reached the record. and all decisions reached thereat.
- (2) At the next meeting the question shall be put that the minutes be taken as read and confirmed, but errors in the minutes may be corrected before they are confirmed, on motion made, with the leave of the Committee.

Memorials and Petitions.

- 7. (1) A member presenting a petition or memorial to the Committee may state concisely the purpose of the petition
- (2) Any member may move that any petition or memorial presented to the Committee be read. When such motion is duly seconded the question shall be put whether the petition 🛰 or memorial be read.

(3) It shall be competent for a member to move that a petition presented to the Committee be referred to the Chairman for disposal or to a sub-committee for report to the Committee.

(4) In any case where individual rights or interests may be affected by any act, order or proceeding of the Committee, all parties likely to be so affected may be heard upon petition before the Committee either in person or by a duly authorised representative.

Questions.

8. (1) No question other than a question relating to the affairs of the Committee shall be put to the Chairman.

(2) At least seven clear days' notice of each question shall

be given in writing to the Chairman.

(3) A written reply of the Chairman to each question shall be

read by the Chairman of the meeting.

(4) No member shall address the Committee upon any question, nor shall the terms of any question contain any argument, or imputation of any motive, or expression of opinion, or statement of fact, except in so far as may be necessary to explain such question.

(5) Any member may, with the permission of the Chairman, put a supplementary question for the purpose of further elucidating any matter of fact regarding which an answer has

Motions.

9. (1) Every notice of a motion shall be in writing signed by the member of the Committee giving the notice

(2) No motion shall be included in the agenda for any ordinary meeting, unless notice of such motion has been received by the Chairman at least seven clear days before the date of such meeting.

(3) All notices of motions shall be dated and numbered as

they are received, and shall be entered upon the agenda in

the order in which they are received.

- (4) Before any notice of motion is placed on the agenda paper, it shall be submitted to the Chairman, who, if he be of opinion that it is out of order, shall order that such motion shall not be included in the agenda and shall cause the giver of the notice to be so informed.
- (5) Every motion of which notice is given shall be relevant to some question affecting the administration of the Committee's affairs.
- (6) No motion to rescind any resolution which has been passed within the preceding six months, nor any motion to the same effect as any motion which has been negatived within the preceding six months shall be deemed to be in order, unless notice thereof shall have been given and specified in the agenda and the notice shall bear, in addition to the signature of the member who proposes the motion, the signature of five other members; and when such motion has been disposed of, it shall not be competent for any member to propose any similar motion within the period of six months next following.

(7) No motion shall be deemed to have been submitted for

- debate until it has been proposed and seconded.

 (8) Any member may formally second a motion or amendment by rising in his place and bowing to the Chair, without prejudice to his right to speak at a later period of the
- (9) When a motion has been proposed and seconded and the debate thereon concluded, the question thereupon shall be put to the vote by the Chairman.

Withdrawal of Motion or Amendment.

Any member may with the leave of the Committee granted without any dissentient vote withdraw a motion or amendment moved by him. Such leave shall be signified without debate, and it shall not be competent for any member to speak upon that motion or amendment after the mover has asked for permission for its withdrawal unless such permission has been refused.

Re-introduction of Motions.

" 11. A motion which has been withdrawn may be moved again at any subsequent meeting, but no motion shall be proposed which is the same in substance as any motion which within the period of six months referred to in rule 9 (6) shall have been resolved in the affirmative or negative.

Amendments.

12. (1) Every amendment to any motion shall be in writing and shall be handed to the Chairman by the member proposing it.

(2)/No amendment shall be accepted by the Chairman unless

it is relevant to the motion to which it is moved.

(3) Every amendment shall be read before it is moved. (4) No amendment shall be discussed or put to the Committee until it has been seconded.

(5) A member who has seconded an amendment in a formal manner shall be permitted afterwards to speak upon it...

(6) Whenever an amendment to any motion under discussion has been proposed and seconded, no second or subsequent amendment shall be moved until the first amendment has been disposed of.

If an amendment is carried, the motion, as amended shall take the place of the original motion, and shall become the question upon which any further amendment may be moved.

Debate ceases when Question fully put.

13. No member may speak to any question after the same has been fully put by the Chairman. A question is fully put when the voting has been taken thereon.

Voting and recording of Votes.

- 14. (1) The question shall be put by the Chairman and the votes may be taken by a show of hands, or by a secret ballot as the Committee decides, and the result shall be declared by the Chairman.
- (2) On any question being put every member present shall, unless he declines to vote, record his vote, either for the "ayes" or the "noes".

Members Dissenting.

15. It shall be competent for any member, who is in a minority, to record the reasons for his dissent from the opinion of the majority, and such written dissent, if sent to the Chairman within one week of the meeting in question shall be entered at the end of the minutes of such meeting.

Preservation of Order.

- 16. (1) It shall be the duty of the Chairman to preserve order, and his decision on any disputed points of order shall be final.
- (2) Any member of the Committee deviating from the rules relating to meetings may be immediately called to order by the Chairman or by any other member rising to a point of
- (3) When the question of order has been raised, the member who raises it shall resume his seat, and no other member; except by leave of the Chairman, shall speak till the Chairman has decided the question. Thereafter the member who was addressing the Committee at the time the question was raised shall be entitled to proceed with his speech, if he conforms to the Chairman's ruling. If he does not conform, the Chairman may refuse to allow him to proceed with his speech.

Use of Objectionable Words.

17. Any member who uses objectionable words and does not explain or retract such words, or fails to offer an apology for the use thereof to the satisfaction of the Committee, may be censured or otherwise dealt with as the Committee thinks

Chairman speaking.

18. When the Chairman has expressed his desire to address the Committee, any member then speaking shall immediately resume his seat.

Naming of Members.

- 19. (1) The Chairman may name any member who disregards the authority of the Chair, or abuses the rules relating to meetings by persistently and wilfully obstructing the business of the Committee, and the Chairman may forthwith put the question, on a motion being moved by any member or from the Chair (no amendment, adjournment, or debate being-allowed) "that such member be suspended from the service of the Committee "
- (2) If any such motion be carried and any member is suspended from the service of the Committee under this rule, his suspension on the first occasion shall continue for one month, on the second occasion for two months, and on the third or subsequent occasion for three months.

(3) Absence of any member from any meetings during the period of his suspension shall be deemed to be with the leave

of the Committee.

(4) Not more than one member shall be named at the same time, unless several members together have jointly disregarded the authority of the Chair.

(5) If any member or members acting jointly, who have been suspended under this rule from the services of the Committee, shall refuse at any time during the period of suspension to obey the directions of the Chairman to withdraw from the precincts of the meeting hall, the Chairman may direct such steps to be taken as are required to enforce his decision.

Irrelevance or Tedious Repetition.

20. The Chairman after having called the attention of the Committee to the conduct of a member who persists in irrelevance or tedious repetition, either of his own arguments or of the arguments used by other members in debate, may direct the member to discontinue his speech.

Disorderly Conduct.

- 21. (1) The Chairman may order any member whose conduct is grossly disorderly to withdraw immediately from the meeting hall during the remainder of that day's sitting, and may direct such steps to be taken as are required to enforce his order.
- .(2) If on any occasion the Chairman deems that his powers under this rule are madequate he may name such member or members in pursuance of rule 20.

(3) In the event of disorderly conduct on the part of any stranger, the Chairman shall have power to take all steps necessary for the removal of such person.

Duty to Obey Order of Suspension or Withdrawal.

22. Every member who is suspended under rule 20 or is directed to withdraw from the meeting hall under rule 21 shall forthwith withdraw from the precincts of the meeting

Power to Adjourn.

23. An adjournment of the discussion of any question may be moved by a member at any time, and, if seconded,

shall be forthwith put to the vote.

24. In the event of grave disorder arising at any meeting the Chairman may, if he thinks it necessary to do so, adjourn the meeting without putting the question of adjournment to the house or suspend the meeting for a time to be named by

Rules for Members Speaking.

- 25. In speaking to any proposition under consideration of the Committee, the following rules shall be strictly observed :-
 - (a) Every member shall address his observations to the
- (d) Every member shall speak standing.

 (b) When one member has finished his observations, any other member wishing to speak may rise in his place.

 (c) If two members rise at the same time, the Chairman shall call on the member who first catches his eye.
 - (d) Every member shall confine his observations to the subject under consideration.
 - (e) No member shall impute improper motives to any other member.

(f) All remarks of a personal nature shall be avoided.
 (g) A member may speak to the question before the house or any amendment proposed thereto.

(h) No member shall speak more than once on any question (n) No member shall speak more than once on any question before the house, except in explanation or on a point of order or when the house is in committee, or in the circumstances set out in rule 12 (e).
(i) With the permission of the Committee, a member may explain matters of a personal nature, although there is no question before the house, but such matters may not be debeted and be must confine himself.

may not be debated, and he must confine himself

strictly to the vindication of his own conduct.

(j) The mover of any resolution or motion may reply after all the other members present have had an opportunity of speaking thereon and before the question is put, but he shall strictly confine himself to answering previous speakers, and shall not introduce any new matter into the debate. The right of reply shall not extend to the mover of an amendment.

(k) No member shall interrupt any other member who is

speaking except for the purpose of raising a point

Special or Standing Committees.

26. (1) The Committee may from time to time appoint special or standing committees, consisting of such number of members as the Committee thinks fit, for the purpose of inquiring into and reporting upon any matters connected with the purpose of the Village Communities Ordinance.

(2) No special or standing committee shall take any proceedings after the close of the year for which it has been appointed.

Notice to Textile Dealers.

DEALERS are requested to note the following:-

- (1) Within the premises licensed as a shop there was found recently 107½ yds. of unused regulated textiles in two suit cases said to belong to employees. All dealers are informed that if I find in any part of a shop any regulated textiles in whatever quantity other than the stock-in-trade available for sale and exposed for sale. I shall consider such dealer to be exposed for sale, I shall consider such dealer to be unfit to hold a textile licence. The excuse that any part of the premises mentioned in the licence is used as a dwelling house will not be accepted.
- (2) In the same case the dealer and his employees refused to make a statement explaining the position. If any dealer, suspected of being guilty of a contravention, fails to make a full statement in his own handwriting in the pocket diary of the official making the detection, I shall hold such dealer unfit to hold a licence. All dealers have the right to ask the inspecting officer for the note book and write any complaint and make any complaint in it. This complaint and make any explanation in it. This requirement applies not only to dealers but to salesmen employed in the shop.
- (3) A retail dealer whose textiles were found in the possession of another in 5 pieces of 30 yds. each, pleaded that he wrote out several bills in small quantities for one transaction. Dealers who do not write one bill for the total quantity sold to any one person in one transaction may be considered by me unfit to hold a textile dealer's licence.
- (4) A dealer amongst whose textiles bought for his trade there were 3 pieces of other goods, pleaded that these had been obtained by him on approval for the use of his family. Any dealer who mixes up with the shop goods—whether in the shop or in transit—any goods that do not form part of his stock-in-trade or goods purchased on wholesale bills for his shop will be considered to be unfit to hold a textile licence
- (5) In connection with (4) above, the law does not allow a dealer to send out of his shop any goods other than what he sells on bills as prescribed by the regulations. No plea whatever will be accepted if goods are found otherwise than exposed for sale in the shop in the ordinary course.

TRADE DISPUTE-SYSTON ESTATE, ALAWATUGODA.

THE Ceylon Indian Congress Labour Union presented a petition to me under section 6 of the Essential Services (Avoidance of Strikes and Lockouts) Order 1942, with regard to a trade dispute that had arisen between the said Union and the Proprietor, Syston Bungalow Division, Syston Estate, Alawatugoda. The petition was referred to a Special Tribunal appointed by H. E. the Governor under the proviso to section 5 of the said Order for adjudication.

2. The following findings dated June 1, 1946, made by the Special Tribunal are published for general information in terms of section 8 (4) of the above-mentioned Order:—

I am not satisfied that Ramasami trespassed late at night in Omeru's bedroom in pursuit of Omeru's daughter. The evidence of that episode is thin and the daughter has not appeared.

But I believe Mahat and Hussain and Manikkam, and find that Ramasami drinks and hussain and mankkain, and that Ramasami drinks and has been quarrelsome. That fact is the only fact explaining why the 5 rooms in Ramasami's lines were vacant so long, i.e., 9 months according to Ramasami and 2 months according to his wife. Lines are not built for fun. There is no victimization. I hold that Ramasami's conduct was unsatisfactory and he was rightly sacked.

His wife Kadirai however, has done no wrong. Nothing

Nothing His wife Kadirai, however, has done no wrong.

has been said against her.

Doubtless, she would rather go with her husband, but one month's pay is not notice enough in her case. I award her Rs. 75 damages.

# List of Applications for Licences for Lorries for 1946

IN terms of section 46 of the Motor Car Ordinance, No. 45 of 1938, a list of applications for licences for lorries for the rest of the year, 1946, is published below for general information.

The following extract from the Ordinance applies to objections against the issue of licenees, &c. :--

(a) Any licensing authority within whose area any part of the area of operation proposed by any applicant for a licence for a lorry, is situated, may make objection against the issue of that licence.

(b) Any person who is the holder of a valid licence, or who is himself an applicant for a licence, for a lorry in respect of the whole or any part of the area of operation which is proposed by any other applicant on payment of the prescribed fee, make objection against the issue of the licence to such other person. Objections must be made in the manner stated below to the Commissioner of Motor Transport, Colombo, so as to be received by him not later than 2 r.m. ON WEDNESDAY, JULY 17, 1946. is made by any body corporate or firm, it shall be signed by a person duly authorised in that behalf by such body or a partner of the firm, as the case may be.

Every objection shall be made in duplicate and the original shall, where the objection is made by any person other than a licensing authority, bear stamps (uncancelled) to the value of Rs. 2.50.

motor Every statement of objection shall set out the specific grounds on which the objection is based and shall indicate, by reference to the name of the applicant for the licence and to the distinctive number of the car, the application in respect of which the objection is made.

No objection relating to more than one motor car shall be made in any one statement of objection. Any objections not conforming to these requirements will be of no avail.

"Improvement in Refrigeration".

Abstract:—The invention relates to two pressure absorption refrigeration systems, and is particulary concerned with improvements in the evaporator tubes of such systems. The liquid that flows along the bottom portions of these tubes changes from the liquid phase to gas phase due to transfer of heat from the walls of the tube.

According to the invention, helical grooves are cut on the inside of the tubes and swaged internally from the walls. As liquid trickles through the tubes, it climbs up the grooves on the walls by capillary action, so that not only is the whole of the interior surface wetted but a large surface is provided for the transfer of heat.

The inventor states that with such construction undesirable phenomena such as superheating cannot occur. There are 10 claims and one sheet of drawings.

"Improvement in Refrigeration".

Abstract:—The invention relates to two pressure refrigerating systems and its object is to vary the concentration of the absorption solution so as to keep the evaporator temperature constant irrespective of working conditions.

The device consists of a storage vessel fitted between the generator and evaporator, sensitive to the pressure difference between the two. Midway between the end connections of this vessel is another connection leading to the evaporator tubes. The device operates as follows:—

An increase of temperature of the circulating water will increase the pressure differential between the high and low pressure sides of the systems. Under such conditions, some of the liquid refrigerant which spills over from the evaporator tubes is diverted from the normal closed path into the storage reservoir. The resulting concentration of the absorbent produces a sufficiently low temperature in the evaporator in spite of the rise in temperature of the circulating water. Conversely, when the circulating water temperature drops, the pressure differential is low, and under such condition liquid refrigerant which was stored in the storage vessel is returned to the circulating system. The resulting dilution of the absorption solution prevents freezing of the refrigerant, blowing out of the evaporator tubes, or crystallisation of the salts in the solution.

"Improvements in or relating to the production of structures composed of or comprising pre-cast members".

Abstract:—The specification describes a precast member of T cross section suitable for the construction of walls, floors and the like made of concrete or similar material. The members are reinforced by bars placed at the junction of the flange and the web, and at the end of the web, these bars being connected together by suitable links embedded in the material of the web. The webs themselves may be imperforate or may be perforate so as to lighten the construction.

In the construction of a wall, the members are arranged in inverted relationship to each other so that the web of one member is interposed between the flanges of the two adjacent members. The flanges are suitably bevelled, and the ends of the webs grooved so that the units may be grouted satisfactorily in situ. The bottom and top of the wall have angle members, instead of T members.

In the construction of a floor the T members are all placed with flanges side by side so as to form a continuous surface with the ribs projecting downwards. Suitable methods are described of anchoring the reinforcing bars at the bottom of the webs to the wall. Fillets of wood are provided in the webs for fixing the ceiling boards.
