- (d) that you shall not change your place of residence or your employment if any except with the prior written approval of the probation officer;
- (e) that you shall not undertake any regular employment except with the written approval of the probation officer;
- (f) that you shall not associate with any such person or with persons of any such class, as the probation officer may specify in writing in that behalf;
- (g) that you shall obey all such orders or directions as may be issued to you by the probation officer for the purpose of securing your good conduct and welfare;

In the event of your being convicted by any Court of any other offence committed while this order is in force, this court or the Magistrate's Court having jurisdiction in the place in which you reside will have power to cancel this order and to pass or make any sentence or order for the time being authorised by any law relating to the offence in respect of which this order is made.

In the event of any failure to observe any of the conditions hereinbefore set out, this Court or the Magistrate's Court

Limits of the area now known as the town of Bogawantalawa.

North: by a line from the land mark on the north-western corner of lot 1 in town survey P. plan No. 10, approximately 33 yards west of the new bridge over the Norwood-Campion road, running through Kotiyagala estate, north-eastwards along the right bank of the Bridwel-oya to the point where it meets the northern boundary of lot 2 in the same plan, approximately due east of the 7½ milestone on the aforesaid road.

East: by a line drawn from the last-mentioned point eastwards and south-eastwards along the northern boundaries of lots 2 and 3 and the eastern boundaries of lots 3 and 6 in town survey P. plan No. 10 and crossing the road to Killarney, to the land mark on its southern boundary, thence north-eastwards along the southern boundary of the said road to the northern boundary (fence) of the C. M. S. School premises, thence eastwards and southwards along the northern and eastern boundaries (fence) of the said school premises to the land mark on the north-eastern corner of lot 12 in town survey P. plan No. 10, thence southwards along the eastern boundary of the said lot 12 to the northern boundary of lot 1 (coolie lines) in P. plan No. 7,375, thence eastwards, southwards and westwards along the northern, eastern and southern boundaries of the said lot 1 to the eastern boundary of lot 20 in town survey P. plan No. 10, thence south-eastwards along the eastern boundary of the said lot 20 to the northern boundary of lot 21 (burial-ground) in the same plan, thence eastwards and southwards along the northern and eastern boundaries of the said lot 21 to the landmark on the south-eastern corner of the said lot 21, thence southwards and south-westwards along the eastern and southern boundaries of the estate masons dwelling house premises (including the cattle shed), to a point on the east boundary of the Norwood-Campion road, 173 feet to the south-east of the 7½ milestone, thence in a straight line across the said road to its western boundary, thence south-eastwards along the western boundary of the said road to a point 363 feet from the 7½ milestone.

South: by a straight line drawn from the last-mentioned point south-westwards to a distance of 112 feet so that it would touch the south-eastern wall of the Post Office, thence north-westwards for a distance of 305 feet (so as to include the Post Office, estate dispensary, and the new Police Station), to a point 94 feet to the south-west from the western boundary of the Norwood-Campion road, thence south-westwards to a distance of 148 feet thereof (so as to include the D. M. O.'s quarters), thence north-westwards to the P. W. D. boundary stone on the southernmost corner of lot 17 (Government Dispensary) in town survey P. plan No. 10.

West: by a line drawn from the last-mentioned point north-westwards, northwards and thence north-westwards along the western boundaries of lots 17 and 16, southern and western boundaries of lot 10, western boundary of lot 9, and western boundaries of lots 8 (estate roadway) and 1 in town survey P. plan No. 10 to the starting point of the northern limit of the town.

THE VILLAGE COMMUNITIES ORDINANCE.

Order.

WHEREAS by Proclamations the area now known as the town of Bogawantalawa in the Divisional Revenue Officer's Division of Uda Bulatgama in the Kandy District has, with effect from the first day of January, 1947, been excluded from the operation of the Small Towns Sanitary Ordinance (Chapter 197), and brought within the operation of the Village Communities Ordinance (Chapter 198), and added to Ambaganuwa korale village area of the aforesaid Divisional Revenue Officer's Division.

Now, therefore, by virtue of the powers vested in me by section 41 of the Village Communities Ordinance (Chapter 198), I, Henry Monck-Mason Moore, Governor of Ceylon, do by this order, with effect from the first day of January, 1947:—

- (e) prescribe the terms and conditions set out in Schedule B hereto as the terms and conditions on which the officer or servants specified in that Schedule and employed by the said Sanitary Board for purposes relating exclusively to the town of Bogawantalawa may be transferred to the service of the aforesaid Village Committee; and

(f) direct the Government Agent of the Central Province—

- (1) to collect all moneys due to the Sanitary Board of the Kandy District (whether as rates, taxes, licence duties or otherwise) from the inhabitants of the area now known as the town of Bogawantalawa;
- (2) to recover such moneys in the manner in which they would have been recovered if that town had not been excluded from the operation of the Small Towns Sanitary Ordinance; and
- (3) to pay such moneys when so collected and recovered to the Village Committee of the aforesaid village area.

- "9 (a) The carter, driver, or person in charge of any vehicle within the Customs premises shall, forthwith after any goods have been loaded into the vehicle, obtain the cart-note, or, where the goods are for the use of any of His Majesty's Forces, duplicate cart-notes, in respect of that vehicle, duly signed by the Landing Waiter, and shall not, until he has the cart-note in his possession, move the vehicle from any place of loading except on the instructions or with permission of a Customs Officer.
- (b) The carter, driver, or person in charge of any vehicle and the person in charge of loading it shall cause all goods loaded in the vehicle to be stacked in an orderly manner and so as to facilitate counting and checking of marks and numbers.
- (c) No carter, driver, or person in charge of any vehicle or person in charge of loading it shall convey or permit to be conveyed in the vehicle any goods other than those described in the cart-notes.
- (d) The carter, driver, or person in charge of any vehicle shall, before the vehicle leaves the Customs premises, hand the cart-note, or, in the case of goods for the use of any of His Majesty's Forces, the duplicate cart-note to the Customs Officer in charge at the exit gate."

Conservancy and Scavenging.

1. The Chairman may, by notice in writing served on the owner of any premises situated within the area for which a conservancy service has been established, require such owner to provide a pail latrine of such size and type and in such a position on the premises as may be approved by the Chairman on the recommendation of the Medical Officer of Health or an officer authorised by such Medical Officer.

2. If the Medical Officer of Health or an officer authorised by such Medical Officer certifies that any cesspit or latrine (not being a pail latrine of the size and type referred to in by-law 1) situated on any premises within the area for which a conservancy service has been established is insanitary and dangerous to health, the Chairman may, by notice in writing served on the owner of such premises, require such owner to close such cesspit or latrine.

3. Every owner on whom a notice referred to in by-law 1 or by law 2 has been served shall comply with the requirements of such notice within such time, in no case to be less than two months, as may be specified in such notice.

4. Every occupier of premises provided with a pail latrine and situated within an area for which a conservancy service has been established, shall maintain such latrine at all times in a sanitary condition and in good repair.

5. No person other than a conservancy labourer employed by the Village Committee shall remove or otherwise dispose of the night soil from any pail latrine within the area for which a conservancy service has been established.

6. The occupier of any premises served by the conservancy service, other than an occupier who is exempted by the Village Committee on the ground of poverty, shall pay monthly to the Village Committee a conservancy fee at the rate specified in the Schedule hereto.

7. For the purpose of inspecting any cesspit or any latrine, whether constructed or in course of construction, on any premises, it shall be lawful for the Medical Officer of Health or an officer authorised by him, to enter the premises at any time between sunrise and sunset, and the occupier of the premises shall render such officer all such assistance as may be necessary for the purpose of the inspection.

8. Upon the establishment of a scavenging service for the whole or any specified part of the village area, the occupier of any premises situated within an area for which such service has been established, shall cause all ashes, sweepings, and other refuse from his premises to be deposited in a bucket or bin with a suitable cover and of such shape and size as may be approved by the Chairman.

9. The occupier of any premises referred to in by-law 8 shall—

- (1) daily between such hours as the Chairman may from time to time notify by beat of tom-tom or otherwise, cause such bucket or bin to be placed by the edge of the road outside such premises but so as to cause no obstruction to traffic on the road, and
- (2) cause such bucket or bin to be removed within half an hour of the emptying of such bucket or bin by the scavenging labourers of the Village Committee.

10. No person shall place on any road any bucket or bin referred to in by-law 8 except between such hours as are referred to in by-law 9.

11. The occupier of any premises served by the scavenging service, other than an occupier who is exempted by the Village Committee on the ground of poverty, shall pay monthly to the Village Committee a scavenging fee at the rate specified in the Schedule hereto.

12. The conservancy fee referred to in by-law 6 and the scavenging fee referred to in by-law 11 shall be paid to the Chairman of the Village Committee or to any person duly authorised by him in writing to collect such fees, on or before the tenth day of the month immediately following the month in respect of which such fees, are due: Provided that when the owner or occupier of any premises has given written notice in advance to the Chairman that the premises will not be occupied during the whole of any specified month, and such owner or occupier subsequently satisfies the Chairman that such premises were in fact not occupied during the month, no conservancy or scavenging fee shall be payable in respect of those premises for that month.

13. In these by-laws—

“Chairman” means the Chairman of the Village Committee;

“Medical Officer of Health” includes a Field Medical Officer.

Bakeries, Eating-houses, Restaurants, and Tea and Coffee Boutiques.

1. In these by-laws—

“Bakery” means any premises in which bread, biscuit, or confectionery is baked for sale as food for human consumption and includes any premises in which such food is prepared, or in which the materials for the preparation of such food are stored;

“Chairman” means the Chairman of the Village Committee;
“Medical Officer of Health” includes a Field Medical Officer.

2. (1) No person shall establish or carry on business at any bakery except on a licence issued in that behalf by the Chairman on the recommendation of the Medical Officer of Health.

(2) Every licence issued under this by-law shall expire on the thirty-first day of December of the year in respect of which it is issued.

3. No person shall be entitled to a licence under by-law 2, unless the premises to be used as a bakery are in conformity with the following requirements:—

- (1) the premises must be well ventilated and well lighted;
- (2) the walls must be plastered with lime mortar and white-washed;
- (3) the floor must be cemented;
- (4) the premises must be provided with sufficient latrine accommodation and sufficient drains;
- (5) a ceiling of suitable materials must be provided so as to prevent dirt and dust falling from the roof;
- (6) the premises must not be situated within fifty feet of any cesspit, permanent manure heap, latrine, or open sewer;
- (7) the premises must be provided with a separate kneading room having a superficial floor space of not less than 12 feet by 10 feet;
- (8) there must be a free external air space, not less than seven feet wide, on at least two of the sides of the kneading room which contain doors or windows;
- (9) the door of the oven must not open directly into the kneading room.

4. The licensee of a bakery shall cause—

- (1) all utensils, furniture, and other requisites used in or belonging to the bakery, to be kept clean;
- (2) the tops of the tables in the bakery to be made of well seasoned, closely-fitting planks, or of some non-harmful, impervious material, and the tables to be scraped and cleaned daily;
- (3) the floor of the bakery to be swept at least once in every twenty-four hours, and the sweepings to be placed immediately in an impervious and covered receptacle, and removed from the bakery daily;
- (4) the premises of the bakery to be kept clean and free from effluvia arising from any drain, privy, or cesspit, and from any other similar nuisance;
- (5) the flour which is used in the bakery to be kept on a platform raised at least three feet above the ground;
- (6) all refuse from the premises of the bakery to be removed, and the drains to be flushed daily;
- (7) at least two spittoons to be kept in some part of the premises other than the kneading room, but so as to be easily accessible to those engaged in the manufacture of bread;
- (8) clean water, clean towels, nail brush and soap to be provided on the premises for the use of those engaged in the manufacture of bread; and
- (9) a copy in Tamil of these by-laws relating to bakeries to be exhibited in a conspicuous part of the bakery.

5. The licensee of a bakery shall not—

- (1) allow the bakery to be used as a place for sleeping or for keeping any animal or any article other than an article necessary for the purposes of the bakery;
- (2) allow any bread, biscuit, or confectionery to be exposed for sale otherwise than in clean and properly constructed fly-proof glass cases;
- (3) allow any person engaged in the manufacture of bread, biscuit, or confectionery to use any flour, water, or other materials which are not good and wholesome;
- (4) use or keep in the bakery any furniture or equipment which cannot be moved about for the purpose of cleaning the floor; or
- (5) allow any gambling or disorderly conduct to take place on the premises of the bakery.

6. Every person employed in the preparation or baking of bread, biscuit, or confectionery, shall wash his hands before engaging in that process, and shall wear a clean white apron, covering the chest, armpits, and body, and also a white cap or turbán.

7. No person shall spit within the premises of the bakery except into a spittoon provided for the purpose.

8. No person who is suffering or has suffered from any contagious, cutaneous, or infectious disease, or has been in attendance on any person suffering from such disease, shall be permitted by any person in charge of a bakery to enter the bakery or to take part in the manufacture or sale of bread, biscuit, or confectionery, until the periods of infection and incubation have elapsed.

9. (1) It shall be lawful for the Chairman, the Medical Officer of Health, the Sanitary Assistant, or any officer authorised by the Chairman in writing, at all reasonable times, and at any time when the process of kneading or baking is being carried on, to enter and inspect the bakery.

(2) The licensee, or the person in charge of a bakery, shall permit the Chairman, or the Medical Officer of Health, or the

Sanitary Assistant, or any officer authorised by the Chairman in writing, to enter and inspect the bakery, and shall render the Chairman, or such officer, all such assistance as may be necessary.

10. It shall be lawful for the Village Tribunal, in addition to any other punishment that it may impose, to cancel the licence of any licensee convicted twice or oftener of any breach of any of these by-laws relating to bakeries; and the licensee shall not be entitled to any compensation in respect of such cancellation.

11. (1) No person shall establish or carry on business at any eating-house, restaurant, or tea or coffee boutique, except on a licence issued in that behalf by the Chairman on the recommendation of the Medical Officer of Health.

(2) Every licence issued under this by-law shall expire on the thirty-first day of December of the year in respect of which it is issued.

12. No person shall be entitled to a licence under by-law 11, unless the premises to be used as an eating-house, restaurant, or tea or coffee boutique are in conformity with the following requirements:—

- (1) the premises must be well ventilated and well lighted;
- (2) the walls must be plastered with lime mortar and white-washed;
- (3) the floor must be cemented; and
- (4) a ceiling of suitable materials must be provided so as to prevent dirt and dust falling from the roof.

13. The licensee of an eating-house, restaurant, or tea or coffee boutique shall cause—

- (1) the premises thereof to be kept in a clean and sanitary condition;
- (2) all utensils, furniture, or other equipment used in or belonging to the eating house, restaurant, or tea or coffee boutique to be kept clean;
- (3) all refuse and dirt in or about the premises of the eating-house, restaurant, or tea or coffee boutique to be swept and removed twice daily;
- (4) all cakes, sweets, and other food exposed for sale on such premises to be kept in clean and properly constructed fly-proof glass cases;
- (5) all waste tea, coffee, or milk, and all remnants of food to be collected in a fly-proof receptacle with a close-fitting lid or cover, and removed from such premises twice daily;
- (6) all utensils used in the preparation, sale, and consumption of food or drink to be washed with soap and water at least once in every twenty-four hours;
- (7) every utensil or receptacle used by a customer to be washed immediately after such use and before being used by another customer; and
- (8) a list of the names and addresses of all employees to be kept at all times in the premises, so as to be available for inspection.

14. The licensee of an eating-house, restaurant, or tea or coffee boutique shall not permit—

- (1) any waste tea, coffee or milk, or any remnants of food to be thrown on the floor of the licensed premises; or
- (2) any gambling or disorderly conduct to take place on the licensed premises.

15. The licensee of an eating-house, restaurant, or tea or coffee boutique shall cause at least two spittoons to be kept at all times on the licensed premises so as to be readily available to the visitors to the premises, as well as to the employees.

16. No person shall spit within the premises of an eating-house, restaurant, or tea or coffee boutique except into a spittoon provided for the purpose.

17. No person who is suffering, or has suffered, from any contagious, cutaneous or infectious disease, or has been in attendance of any person suffering from such disease, shall be permitted by any person in charge of an eating-house, restaurant, or tea or coffee boutique to enter such place or take part in the preparation or sale of any food or drink therein, until the periods of infection and incubation have elapsed.

18. It shall be lawful for the Chairman, the Medical Officer of Health, or the Sanitary Assistant, or any officer authorised by the Chairman in writing, at all reasonable times, to enter and inspect any eating-house, restaurant, or tea or coffee boutique, and the licensee or the person in charge, of any eating-house, restaurant, or tea or coffee boutique, shall permit the Chairman, or such officer, to enter and inspect the premises, and shall render him all such assistance as may be necessary.

19. It shall be lawful for the Village Tribunal, in addition to any other punishment that it may impose, to cancel the licence of any licensee convicted twice or oftener of any breach of any of these by-laws relating to eating-houses, restaurants, or tea or coffee boutiques, and the licensee shall not be entitled to any compensation in respect of such cancellation.

Marks and Fairs.

1. The area within a circle having a radius of one mile from any village market is hereby declared to be the market area for that market.

2. Within any market area, no person shall, on any day on which the village market is open, sell or offer or expose for sale, any vegetables, fruits, fish, meat or other perishable articles of food at any place other than the village market:

Provided that the preceding provisions of this by-law shall not apply to—

- (1) the sale of vegetables or fruits by itinerant vendors who do not sell at fixed places, or do not for the purposes of such sale establish themselves on the public roads or other public places;
- (2) the sale by the licensee of an eating-house or a tea or coffee boutique of ripe plantains or other fruits for consumption on the premises; or
- (3) the sale by any person of young coconuts.

3. Every village market or fair shall be open from 6 A.M. to 6 P.M. on such days of the week as may be approved by the Committee.

4. Where the Committee has set apart any portion of a village market or fair for the sale of any article or class of articles, no person shall—

- (1) sell or expose for sale such article or class of articles in any place in such market or fair other than the portion so set apart; or
- (2) sell or expose for sale any other article or class of articles in the portion so set apart.

5. A fee at the rates set out in the Schedule hereto shall be levied and paid for the use and occupation of any stall, seat, or space in any village market or fair.

6. No person shall hold, use, or occupy any stall, seat, or space in a village market or fair unless he is the holder of a licence issued in that behalf by or under the authority of the Chairman, or otherwise than in accordance with the terms and conditions of such licence. Every such licence shall expire on the date specified thereon.

7. The fees payable under by-law 5 shall be paid to the Chairman or to such other person as may be authorised by the Chairman; and no licence under by-law 6 shall be issued to any person until he has paid the fee due from him.

8. The Chairman shall cause to be exhibited in a conspicuous place in each village market or fair a notice setting out, in English, Sinhalese, and Tamil, the fees payable for the use and occupation of that market or fair; and no person shall demand or receive any sums higher than those set out in such notice.

9. Whenever the Committee is satisfied, after consultation with the Medical Officer of Health, that the use or consumption by the public of any particular article of food is injurious or harmful, it shall be lawful for the Committee, by beat of tom-tom or other sufficient notice, to prohibit for such time as to the Committee may appear necessary, the introduction and sale of such article of food in any village market or fair.

10. No person shall sell or expose for sale in any village market or fair—

- (1) the carcase or meat of any animal which has been slaughtered at any place other than a village slaughter-house or a licensed slaughter-house; or
- (2) any article the keeping or sale of which is prohibited by or under any by-law made by the Committee.

The preceding provisions of this by-law shall not apply to the sale of frozen meat, game, or fish.

11. No person who is suffering or has suffered from any contagious, infectious, or cutaneous disease, or has been in attendance on any person suffering from such disease, shall use or occupy any stall, seat, or space in any village market or fair, or expose for sale thereat any article whatsoever, until the periods of infection and incubation have elapsed.

12. No person using or occupying any village market or fair shall—

- (1) behave in any disorderly manner or commit any nuisance in or about such market or fair; or
- (2) carry on cooking in any such market or fair; or
- (3) remain in or loiter about such market or fair after the place is closed for business at 6 P.M. without being able to give a satisfactory account of himself; or
- (4) damage or in any way deface, any portion of the building, stalls, lamps, or any property of the Committee in or about such market or fair, or defile or pollute the water provided for use in such market or fair; or
- (5) enclose in any way any portion of the building or premises of the market or fair, or erect any permanent awning or screen or fixture of any kind; or
- (6) leave any goods in or about the premises of such market or fair between the hours of 6 P.M. and 8 A.M. without the special permission of the Chairman; or
- (7) place any fruits, vegetables, meat, flesh, fish, or other article of food exposed thereat for sale, on any unclean or insanitary surface; or

(8) expose for sale any article of food, whether cooked or uncooked, otherwise than in clean and properly constructed fly-proof glass cases.

13. Every person using or occupying any stall in a village market or fair shall keep in or near such stall a fly-proof receptacle with a close fitting lid or cover, and shall deposit all rubbish and refuse in such receptacle.

14. No person shall throw any rubbish or refuse, or any bone or skin of any animal or any article likely to be offensive or injurious to the public health, on the premises of any village market or fair.

15. No person shall obstruct or resist the keeper of any village market or fair or any other person appointed by the Committee to superintend any village market or fair or to collect rents and fees or to enforce order and cleanliness therein, in the lawful execution of his duty.

16. The driver of a vehicle shall not keep that vehicle within or alongside the premises of any village market or fair for a longer period than is necessary for loading goods into, or unloading goods from, that vehicle.

17. The Chairman shall give notice, by beat of tom-tom or in such other manner as he may deem adequate, of the establishment or the temporary closing of any village market or fair.

TRADE DISPUTE—COLOMBO MUNICIPAL COUNCIL.

THE Colombo Municipal Workers' Union presented a petition to me under section 6 of the Essential Services (Avoidance of Strikes and Lockouts) Order 1942, with regard to a trade dispute that had arisen between the said Union

and the Colombo Municipal Council, Colombo. The petition was referred to a Special Tribunal appointed by H. E. the Governor under the proviso to section 5 of the said Order for adjudication.

2. The following findings and award dated March 11, 1946, made by the Special Tribunal are published for general information in terms of section 8 (4) of the above-mentioned Order:—

I shall deal first with the demands embodied in the 2nd Schedule attached to the petition.

Item 1.—This demand was withdrawn by Counsel for the petitioner-Union and I therefore make no award regarding it.

Item 2.—As agreed to between the parties, I award that vacancies in the higher posts in the tramway service should, whenever possible, be filled by promotion of men in that service possessing the necessary qualifications and who have earned their promotion by merit and efficiency. If, however, no suitable person in the service is available, appointments will be made from among other applicants.

Item 3.—This demand which is termed "compensation for accidents" is really a claim for full-pay leave. As agreed to by the Municipal Council, the employees in the Tramway Service will be granted the same privileges regarding full-pay leave as the other employees of the Municipal Council, *i.e.*, If an employee meets with an accident while he is employed in the performance of his duty as a tramway employee, he should be granted full-pay leave for a period of one month or for such further period as may be decided by the Council. In cases where an employee is absent on account of such accident for more than 2 months, he should be paid only half-pay or wage during the whole of that period.

Item 4.—Recovery from a motorman of the cost of any damage to the vehicle caused by him.

I find that damages are recovered from a motorman only in cases where the injury to the vehicle is found to have been caused by the carelessness or negligence of the motorman, after inquiry by the Manager or as the result of a finding by a court. The document R 2* shows that during the last year such recoveries were made only in a few cases and the amounts recovered were not excessive and were paid in small instalments.

In these circumstances, I am not prepared to hold that the recovery of these damages is unjustified. I would however recommend that the Municipal Council should consider the desirability of insuring their tramcars against any accident or damage, if such an insurance can be effected on the payment of a reasonable premium.

Item 5.—Leave to tramwaymen.—It was agreed that the tramway employees be given the same leave privileges as other employees of the Municipal Council. (a) Sick leave to daily paid employees:—As would appear from the evidence of the Secretary of the Municipal Council, a minimum period of 14 days sick leave is now granted to all employees irrespective of their period of service. The Council has also decided that these employees will be granted 6 weeks leave on full pay on a medical certificate from a dispensary medical officer or any other medical practitioner approved by the Council, certifying that the employee is unfit for work. The recent resolution of the Council that the privilege of 6 weeks leave on full pay on the ground of illness can be availed of only by employees who have had a minimum service of 288 days prior to the date of the grant of leave seems reasonable.

(b) *Casual leave.*—The existing period of casual leave is 10 days. The Council has decided to increase this period of casual leave to 14 days provided the employee has attended for at least 288 days during the preceeding 12 months. The 14 days will be reduced by one day for every period of 4 days or part thereof by which the attendance falls short of 288 days. I would accordingly award that casual leave be granted to all daily-paid employees in the Municipal Service as indicated above and in accordance with the terms set out in correction slip No. 270 to F. R. 1032 of the Government of Ceylon. I would also add that casual leave will be granted at the discretion of the head of the department, which leave as a rule should not exceed 2 days at a time unless the employer sees good reason for granting leave for a longer period. It should also be noted that any period of casual leave should not immediately precede or follow the period of leave granted as the annual holiday.

(c) *Annual Holiday.*—As regards the annual holiday to daily-paid employees, I would adopt the decision of the Wages Board for the Engineering trade which came into force on March 1, 1946, whereby a decision has been made in terms of section 25 of the Wages Boards Ordinance as follows:—

"If a worker has been in continuous employment and has worked under the same employer for more than 232 days in any year (hereinafter called the "qualifying year"), he shall be allowed in the next succeeding year a holiday

or holidays calculated at the rate of one holiday for each unit of 4 days by which the number of days on which the worker has worked exceeds 232." and subject to the further provisions contained in that decision.

Item 6.—This relates to a demand that permission be given to the tramway staff to hold their Union meetings in the Recreation Hall which is used by all the employees. I understand that this hall is used during the nights also by the employees who work on the night shift for purposes of recreation. It is also apprehended that if meetings are held in this hall there is likely to be clashes between the members of the Union and other employees who do not support it. In all these circumstances, the demand for permission to use the recreation hall for Union meetings is rejected.

Use of the Notice-Board.—I do not see, however, that there can be any objection to the notice-board in the recreation hall being made available for posting up notices regarding the meetings of the Union at some other *venue*. I accordingly award that permission should be granted to post up notices of Union meetings on the notice-board in the recreation hall.

I shall now deal with the demands embodied in Schedule 1 attached to the petition. These demands relate to minimum wages, annual increments, overtime rates of pay, gratuity and the inauguration of a Provident Fund.

As regards minimum wages, I find that the various classes of workmen employed by the Municipality in the Municipal Workshops, tramway workshops and in the Printing works are being paid wages as from March 1, 1946, at the rates fixed by the Engineering Wages Board in terms of a resolution passed by the Municipal Council. These rates are fair and reasonable and I award that the minimum rates of wages payable to all such workmen as are performing essential services be fixed at these rates. I find also that the Municipal Council has formulated certain schemes for the increments of wages payable to its various workmen. I award that increments at the rates prescribed by the Municipal Council be paid to these workmen. Any workman employed in the performance of essential services, who is at present receiving a smaller wage than the minimum wage prescribed by the Engineering Wages Board, should immediately be paid that minimum wage and also receive increments thereafter according to the scale provided by the resolution of the Municipal Council.

Overtime rates of Pay.—In the case of Engineering labour, wages for overtime work is paid at time and a half. I therefore award that all Municipal workmen engaged in the performance of essential services should be paid for overtime work at 1½ times the rates payable to them for work during normal working hours.

As regards pay for work on Sundays, which must necessarily be performed by the labourers performing essential services in the scavenging and conservancy departments of the Municipality, I consider it reasonable that payment for work on Sundays in their case should be 1½ times the normal rate of pay. These labourers are compelled to work on Sundays which is the weekly holiday. It is only reasonable that they should be paid extra remuneration for working on that day.

The next demand is that the special allowance due to the increased cost of living should be paid on the overtime pay also. I find from the evidence of Mr. Tilney, the Controller of Establishments, that workmen employed by Government are given a temporary increase of 50 per cent. on the overtime rate of pay when the cost of living is above the Index of 180 and by 25 per cent. when the Index is between 150 and 180. I consider this to be reasonable and would accordingly award that all workmen engaged in the performance of essential services should receive this extra allowance on their overtime rate of pay.

Gratuity.—The Municipal Council has formulated a scheme for the payment of gratuity. Counsel for the petitioner did not press me to make any award in view of the fact that the Municipal Council has formulated a scheme for the payment of gratuity to its employees.

Provident Fund.—There is a Provident Fund in operation for tramwaymen from January 1, 1945. The Council has also approved the inauguration of a Provident Fund for its other employees from January 1, 1946. The basis of contribution by the employer and employee respectively seems acceptable to both parties and I therefore make no award except to state that the schemes regarding the Provident Fund should be duly implemented.

In conclusion, it should be noted that my award relates only to employees engaged in the performance of essential services as defined by the Order and not to other categories of employees who are not engaged in essential services. This award should take effect from March 1, 1946.

Notice.

IT is hereby notified in terms of Regulation 5 of Part II. of Head E and Regulation 4 (1) of Part III. of Head E of the Food Control Regulations, 1938, that as from 10th June, 1946 (52nd week of rationing of 5th series) until further notice the weekly ration of rice or paddy, wheat flour and whole wheat or kurakkan—

(i.) which may be sold or issued by way of sale or otherwise, to any person of any class specified in column I. of the Schedule hereto who is over one year of age and is resident on an estate as defined in the Food Control Regulation, 1938, or

(ii.) which may be sold to any person of any class specified in column I of the Schedule hereto who is over one year of age and is resident in any area, whether urban or non-urban (other than an estate) in which rationing is in force, and who is the holder of a ration book for a person of that class
