PRICE ORDERS.

Food Price Order No.—T. 3.

RICE.

THE CONTROL OF PRICES ORDINANCE, No. 39 OF 1939.

BY virtue of the powers vested in the Deputy Controller of Prices (Food), by section 3 of the Control of Prices Ordinance, No. 39 of 1939, as amended by the Defence Control of Prices Supplementary Provisions No. 2 Regulations, I, Stuart Murray Duff, Deputy Controller of Prices (Food), do by this Order—

- (1) revoke with effect from this date the Order dated February 11, 1946, and published in the *Government Gazette* No. 9,519 of February 14, 1946, and issued by me, in so far as it relates to the maximum wholesale prices fixed in respect of rice ;
- (2) fix the prices specified in columns 2, 3, 4, 5 and 6 of the First Schedule hereto to be the maximum wholesale prices for bags of 80 measures and 112 measures above which rice of the description and grade mentioned in column 1 of that Schedule shall not be sold within the areas mentioned in columns 2, 3, 4, 5 and 6 of that Schedule ;
- (3) fix the prices specified in columns 3 and 4 of the Second Schedule hereto to be the maximum retail prices per measure and half measure respectively above which rice of the description and grade mentioned in column 1 of that Schedule shall not be sold at the places specified in column 2 of that Schedule ;
- (4) direct that no trader shall sell any article of the description and grade mentioned in columns 1 of the Schedules hereto which is adulterated with any other article or with an article of an inferior grade or quality ;
- (5) direct that every trader who sells any article of the description and grade mentioned in columns 1 of the Schedules hereto at any premises within the Urban Council limits of Trincomalee or in the Revenue District of Trincomalee shall exhibit in conspicuous position at those premises a notice on which there shall be set out the maximum prices fixed by this Order in respect of rice ;
- (6) direct that every person who sells by wholesale rice of the description and grade mentioned in column 1 of the First Schedule hereto shall and every person who sells by retail rice of the description and grade mentioned in column 1 of the Second Schedule hereto shall on demand give the purchaser of that article a receipt on which there shall be set out—
 - (a) the date of the sale,
 - (b) the description and grade of the article sold,
 - (c) the weight and volume in measures of the quantity sold,
 - (d) the price paid for the article sold,
 - (e) the nature of the transaction, that is to say, whether the sale was by wholesale or by retail ;
- (7) direct that for the purposes of this Order—
 - (a) any sale of any quantity of the rice of the description and grade mentioned in column 1 of the First Schedule hereto for the purpose of resale shall be deemed to be a sale by wholesale ;

- (b) any sale of any quantity for the purpose of consumption or use by the purchaser shall be deemed to be sale by retail ;
- (c) "measure" shall be deemed to be the standard quart, dry measure.

COMMON SALT.

THE CONTROL OF PRICES ORDINANCE, No. 39 OF 1939.

Order.

BY virtue of the powers vested in the Controller of Prices (Food) by section 3 of the Control of Prices Ordinance, No. 39 of 1939, as amended by Defence (Control of Prices) (Supplementary Provisions No. 2) Regulations, I, Reginald Sydney Vernon Poulter, Controller of Prices (Food), do by this Order—

- (i.) fix the prices specified in columns 2 and 3 of the Second Schedule hereto to be respectively the maximum wholesale price per cwt. net and the maximum retail price per lb. above which the article specified in the First Schedule hereto shall not be sold, by wholesale or by retail as the case may be, within the areas specified in the corresponding entries in column 1 of the Second Schedule hereto;
- (ii.) direct that for the purposes of this Order—
 - (a) any sale of any quantity of the article specified in the First Schedule hereto for the purpose of resale, or any sale of the article specified in the First Schedule hereto in a quantity of one cwt. net or more at a time shall be deemed to be a sale by wholesale;
 - (b) any sale for the purpose of consumption or use of any quantity less than one cwt. net of the article specified in the First Schedule hereto shall be deemed to be a sale by retail;
 - (c) a "whole bag" shall mean a bag containing not less than $1\frac{1}{2}$ cwt. net of the article specified in the First Schedule hereto;
- (iii.) direct that in any area where maximum prices are fixed by this Order no person shall sell the article specified in the First Schedule hereto which contains less than 95 per cent. content of sodium chloride on the dry weight of the material;
- (iv.) direct that in any area where maximum prices are fixed by this Order every trader, who has in his possession or under his control at any place or in any vehicle the article specified in the First Schedule hereto, shall exhibit conspicuously at that place or on that vehicle a notice in which there shall be set out the description of that article and the maximum prices fixed by this Order for that article in that area;
- (v.) direct that in any area where maximum prices are fixed by this Order every trader, who at any premises has been in the habit of selling the article specified in the First Schedule hereto and has for the time being no stocks of that article for sale, shall exhibit in a conspicuous position at those premises for a period of three months from the date he last sold that article a notice to the effect that he has no stocks of that article available for sale for the time being;
- (vi.) direct that when the article specified in the First Schedule hereto is sold by wholesale no additional charge shall be made for the container in which the article is sold;
- (vii.) direct that when the article specified in the First Schedule hereto is sold by wholesale in a whole bag the seller thereof shall transfer free of charge to the purchaser the bag or container in which the article is sold;
- (viii.) direct that in any area where maximum prices are fixed by this Order every person who sells by wholesale the article specified in the First Schedule shall, and every person who sells by retail the article specified in the First Schedule hereto shall on demand, give the purchaser of that article, a receipt in which there shall be set out—
 - (a) the date of sale;
 - (b) the description of the article sold;
 - (c) the weight of the quantity sold;
 - (d) the price paid for the quantity sold; and
 - (e) the nature of the transaction, that is to say, whether the sale was by wholesale or by retail.
