MUSTARD.

THE CONTROL OF PRICES ORDINANCE, No. 39.

Order.

BY virtue of the powers vested in the Deputy Controller of Prices by section 3 (read with section 2 (3)) of the Control of Prices Ordinance, No. 39 of 1939, I, John William Hamilton O'Regan, Deputy Controller of Prices, Nuwara Eliya District, do by this order:—

- (1) fix the prices specified in column 2 and 3 of the Schedule hereto to be respectively the maximum wholesale price and maximum retail price above which mustard shall not be sold by wholesale or by retail, as the case may be within the areas specified in the corresponding entries in column one of the Schedule hereto:—
- (2) direct that for the purpose of this order:—
 - (a) any sale of any quantity of any mustard of the description and grade specified in the First Schedule hereto for the purpose of resale or any sale of any quantity of any mustard of the description and grade specified in the First Schedule hereto in a quantity of one cwt. or more at a time, shall be deemed to be a sale by wholesale, and
 - (b) any sale of any quantity less than 1 cwt. of any mustard of the description and grade specified in the First Schedule hereto for the purpose of consumption or use by the purchaser shall be deemed to be a sale by retail.

- (3) direct that no trader shall sell mustard of the description of the First Schedule hereto which is adulterated with any article or with mustard of any inferior description or grade or quality.
- (4) direct that any trader who, at any premises within the respective areas in column 1 of the Second Schedule hereto, sells any mustard of the description specified in the First Schedule hereto, shall exhibit in a conspicuous position at those premises a notice on which there shall be set out the maximum prices fixed by this order in respect of that mustard of that description and grade.
- (5) direct that every person who sells by wholesale any mustard of the description specified in the First Schedule hereto shall, and every person who sells by retail any mustard of the description specified in the First Schedule hereto shall on demand, give the purchaser a receipt on which there shall be set out:—
- the date of sale.
 - the description and grade of the mustard sold.
 - the quantity sold and the price paid for the quantity sold, and
 - the nature of the transaction, that is to say, whether the sale was by wholesale or by retail.

No. 9,054 of December 21, 1942, I, Damster Priyalal Wickramasuriya, Assistant Controller of Prices (Miscellaneous Articles), Matara District, do, by this Order—

- revoke with effect from this date Order dated March 16, 1943, published in *Government Gazette* No. 9,100 of March 18, 1943, in respect of Kerosene Oil for Matara District;
- fix the prices specified in columns 2, 3, 4, and 5 of the Schedule hereto, to be respectively the maximum price per four gallon tin with container, the maximum price per gallon ex-depot, the maximum price per gallon ex-cart, and the maximum price per bottle; above which Kerosene Oil of any brand shall not be sold within the areas specified in the corresponding entries in column 1 of the Schedule hereto;
- direct that no trader, or tank carter who hawks Kerosene Oil, shall sell any Kerosene Oil specified in the Schedule hereto which is adulterated with any other article or with any other oil of an inferior description or quality;
- direct that every trader or tank carter who exposes for sale Kerosene Oil specified in the Schedule hereto at any premises or from a tank cart that hawks Kerosene Oil for sale within the areas mentioned in the Schedule hereto shall exhibit in a conspicuous position, at those premises or on the tank cart that hawks Kerosene Oil for sale, a notice in which there shall be set out the maximum prices fixed by this Order for that article;
- direct that every person who sells by wholesale Kerosene Oil specified in the Schedule hereto, and any person who sells by retail shall, on demand, give the purchaser of that article a receipt in which there shall be set out—
 - the quantity of Kerosene Oil sold;
 - the price paid; and
 - the date and place of sale.

- direct that for the purposes of this Order that a "bottle" shall be deemed to be one-sixth ($\frac{1}{6}$) of an Imperial gallon;
- direct that any quantity below one bottle, shall be restricted to half bottle, three-quarter and one-quarter bottle only, and the sale of any intermediate quantity shall be prohibited;
- direct that the prices shall be calculated on the bottle rate in the case of sale by three-quarter, half or one-quarter bottle.
