COCONUT POONAC.

THE CONTROL OF PRICES ORDINANCE, No. 39 OF 1939.

Order.

BY virtue of the powers vested in the Deputy Controller of Prices (Food), by section 3, read with section 2 (3) of the Control of Prices Ordinance, No. 39 of 1939, as amended by Defence (Control of Prices) (Supplementary Provisions No. 2) Regulations, I, Murugeysan Rajendra, Deputy Controller of Prices (Food), Matara District, do by this Order—

- (1) revoke with effect from this date my Order dated February 11, 1946, and published in *Government Gazette* No. 9,523 of February 22, 1946, in so far as it relates to the maximum prices fixed for coconut poonac;
- (2) fix the prices specified in columns 2 and 3 of the First Schedule hereto to be the millers' maximum wholesale price and the chekku owners' maximum wholesale price respectively above which coconut poonac shall not be sold within the area specified in the corresponding entry in column 1 of that Schedule;
- (3) fix the prices specified in columns 2 and 3 of the Second Schedule hereto to be respectively the dealer's maximum price per cwt. and the dealer's maximum price per pound above which milled coconut poonac (i.e., coconut poonac milled at the oil mills or gram mills, Matara), shall not be sold within the area specified in the corresponding entry in column 1 of that Schedule;
- (4) fix the prices specified in columns 3 and 4 of the Second Schedule hereto to be respectively the dealer's maximum price per cwt. and the dealer's maximum price per pound above which all other varieties of coconut poonac (i.e., coconut poonac other than that milled at the oil mills or gram mills, Matara), shall not be sold within the area specified in the corresponding entry in column 1 of that Schedule;
- (5) direct for the purpose of this Order—
 - (a) "Miller" shall mean any person or company who operates a power-driven mill for the purpose of extracting coconut oil from copra;
 - (b) "Dealer" shall mean any person or company other than a miller who sells coconut poonac;
 - (c) the "miller's maximum price per cwt." shall apply to any sale of coconut poonac by a miller;
 - (d) "Chekku owner's maximum wholesale price" shall apply to any sale of coconut poonac to a dealer by a person who manufactures coconut Poonac by the use of a chekku or chekkus;
 - (e) the "dealer's maximum price per cwt." shall apply to any sale of coconut poonac of over 14 lb. at a time made by a dealer;
 - (f) the "Dealer's maximum price per lb." shall apply to any sale of coconut poonac of 14 lb. or less at a time made by a dealer;
- (6) direct that in every area where maximum prices are fixed by this Order every miller or dealer, who has in his possession at any premises any coconut poonac, shall exhibit in a conspicuous position at those premises a notice in which there shall be set out the maximum prices fixed by this Order in respect of coconut poonac;
- (7) direct that in every area where maximum prices are fixed by this Order every miller or dealer who sells any coconut poonac shall give to the purchaser thereof a receipt in which there shall be set out—
 - (a) date of sale;
 - (b) the description of the article sold;
 - (c) the weight of the quantity sold;
 - (d) the price paid for the quantity sold.

CURRYSTUFFS AND PULSES.

THE CONTROL OF PRICES ORDINANCE, No. 39 OF 1939.

Order.

BY virtue of the powers vested in the Controller of Prices (Food), by section 3 of the Control of Prices Ordinance, No. 39 of 1939, as amended by Defence (Control of Prices) (Supplementary Provisions No. 2) Regulations, I, Reginald Sydney Vernon Poulter, Controller of Prices (Food), do, by this Order—

- (i.) revoke with effect from this date—
 - (a) my Food Price Order No. C—83 published in *Government Gazette* No. 9,517 of February 8, 1946, and
 - (b) my Food Price Order No. C—86 published in *Government Gazette* No. 9,523 of February 22, 1946,
 in so far as they fix maximum prices above which the articles specified in column 1 of the First Schedule hereto should not be sold within the Municipal limits of the town of Colombo;
- (ii.) fix the prices specified in columns 2, 3, 4 and 5 of the First Schedule hereto to be respectively the importer's maximum price, the maximum wholesale price per cwt. gross, the maximum wholesale price per lb. net, and the maximum retail price per lb. net, above which the articles specified in column 1 of the First Schedule hereto shall not be sold within the Municipal limits of the town of Colombo;
- (iii.) direct that for the purposes of this Order—
 - (a) any sale of any quantity of any article for the purpose of resale or any sale of any article in a quantity of one cwt. gross or more at a time shall be deemed to be a sale by wholesale;
 - (b) any sale of any quantity less than one cwt. gross of any article for the purpose of consumption or use shall be deemed to be a sale by retail;
 - (c) an "importer" of any article shall mean any person who has cleared from the Customs in his name either that article or an article of the same description as that article;
 - (d) a "wholesale dealer" in any article shall mean any person who is in the habit of selling by wholesale articles of the same description as that article;

- (e) the "importer's maximum price" fixed for sales within the Municipal limits of the town of Colombo shall apply to the sale by wholesale of any article by an importer to a wholesale dealer ;
- (f) the "maximum wholesale price per cwt. gross" fixed for sales within the Municipal limits of the town of Colombo shall apply to all sales by wholesale in whole bags, except sales by an importer to a wholesale dealer ;
- (g) the "maximum wholesale price per lb. net" fixed for sales within the Municipal limits of the town of Colombo shall apply to all sales by wholesale in quantities less than a whole bag, except sales by an importer to a wholesale dealer ;
- (h) the "maximum retail price" shall apply to all sales by retail ;
- (i) a "whole bag" shall mean a bag or bundle filled with any commodity or article ;
- (iv.) direct that clauses (v.) to (viii.) of my Food Price Order No. C—83 published in *Government Gazette* No. 9,517 of February 8, 1946, shall apply to this Order as though they were herein incorporated.
