PRICE ORDERS.

SILVER BULLION.

CONTROL OF PRICES ORDINANCE, No. 39 OF 1939.

Order.

BY virtue of the powers vested in the Controller of Prices by section 3 of the Control of Prices Ordinance No. 39 of 1939 as amended by paragraph (2) of the Defence (Control of Prices) (Supplementary Provisions No. 2) Regulations, I, Cedric Francis Ingledow, Controller of Prices (Miscellaneous Articles), do, by this Order—

- (i.) revoke with effect from this date Order dated October 26, 1945, in respect of Silver Bullion, published in *Government Gazette* No. 9,481 of November 2, 1945;
- (ii.) fix the price specified in column 2 of the Schedule hereto to be the maximum retail price above which Silver Bullion shall not be sold in any part of Ceylon;
- (iii.) direct that for the purpose of this Order any sale of any quantity of Silver Bullion shall be deemed to be a sale by retail;
- (iv.) direct that any person who at any premises in Ceylon exhibits Silver Bullion for sale shall exhibit in a conspicuous position at those premises a notice in which there shall be set out the maximum retail price fixed by this Order in respect of Silver Bullion;
- (v.) direct that every person who sells Silver Bullion shall give to every purchaser of such Silver Bullion, on demand, a receipt in which there shall be set out—
 - (a) the description and quantity of Silver Bullion sold;
 - (b) the price paid; and
 - (c) the date and place of the sale.

MUSTARD.

THE CONTROL OF PRICES ORDINANCE, No. 39 OF 1939.

Order.

BY virtue of the powers vested in the Deputy Controller of Prices (Food) by section 3 (read with section 2 (3)) of the Control of Prices Ordinance, No. 39 of 1939, I, Cathiravelu Sittampalam, Deputy Controller of Prices (Food) for the Matale District, do by this Order—

- (i) fix the prices specified in columns 2, 3 and 4 of the Schedule hereto to be respectively the maximum wholesale price per cwt. gross, the maximum wholesale price per lb. net, and the maximum retail price per lb. net, above which mustard shall not be sold by wholesale or retail, as the case may be within the areas specified in the corresponding entries in Column 1 of the Schedule hereto:—
- (ii) direct that for the purpose of this Order:—
 - (a) any sale of any quantity of any mustard for the purpose of resale or any sale of any quantity of any mustard in a quantity of one cwt. or more at a time, shall be deemed to be a sale of wholesale, and
 - (b) any sale of any quantity of any mustard less than one cwt. for the purpose of consumption or use by the purchaser shall be deemed to be a sale by retail;
- (iii) direct that in every area where maximum prices are fixed by this Order, no person shall sell mustard which is adulterated with any article;
- (iv) direct that in every area where maximum prices are fixed by this Order, every trader, who has any mustard in his possession or under his control at any place, shall exhibit conspicuously at that place a notice in which there shall be set out the maximum prices fixed by this Order in that area;
- (v) direct that in every area where maximum prices are fixed by this Order every person who sells any mustard by wholesale shall, and every person who sells any mustard by retail shall on demand, give the purchaser thereof a receipt on which there shall be set out—
 - (a) the date of sale;
 - (b) the quantity of mustard sold;
 - (c) the price paid for the quantity of mustard sold, and
 - (d) the nature of transaction, i.e. whether the sale was by wholesale or by retail.

Gamini Tissa Gooneratne, Assistant Controller of Prices (Miscellaneous Articles) Nuwara Eliya District, do, by this Order—

(i.) revoke with effect from this date Orders—

(a) dated September 16, 1942, on cement published in *Government Gazette* No. 9,009 of September 18, 1942.

(b) dated September 29, 1942, on cement published in *Government Gazette* No. 9,020 of October 9, 1942.

(ii.) fix the prices specified in column 2 of the Schedule hereto to be the maximum prices above which cement of the description mentioned in the corresponding entries in column 1 of the Schedule shall not be sold within the revenue district of Nuwara Eliya.

Chinnappa Coomaraswamy, Deputy Controller of Prices (Food), Jaffna District, do, by this Order—

(i.) revoke with effect from this date my Food Price Order No. J. 16 published in the *Government Gazette* No. 9,493 of December 14, 1945;

(ii.) fix the prices specified in columns 2, 3 and 4 of the schedule hereto to be, respectively the Miller's maximum price per ton, the Dealer's maximum price per cwt. and the Dealer's maximum price per

pound above which coconut poonac shall not be sold within the limits of the areas specified in the corresponding entry in column 1 of the schedule hereto ; (iii.) direct that the provisions of paragraphs (iii.) to (v.) of my Order dated August 3, 1945, in respect of coconut poonac and published in *Government Gazette* No. 9,447 dated August 10, 1945, shall apply to this Order as though they were herein embodied.

- (i.) revoke with effect from this date Food Price Order No. MR—7 published in *Government Gazette* No. 9,493 of December 14, 1945, in so far as it relates to the maximum prices fixed for coconut poonac ;
- (ii.) fix the prices specified in columns 2 and 3 of the Schedule hereto to be the maximum wholesale price per cwt. gross and the maximum retail price per pound nett above which coconut poonac shall not be sold within the areas specified in the corresponding entries in column 1 of the Schedule hereto ;
- (iii.) direct that paragraphs (iii.) to (viii.) of Food Price Order No. MR—2 of 1944, published in *Government Gazette* No. 9,316 of October 6, 1944, shall apply to this Order, as though they were herein embodied.
