THE QUARANTINE AND PREVENTION OF DISEASES ORDINANCE.

Notification.

BY virtue of the powers vested in me by regulation 1 of the regulations under sections 2 and 3 of the Quarantine and Prevention of Diseases Ordinance (Chapter 173), published in the Supplement to Gazette No. 7,481 of August 28, 1925, I, Henry Monck-Mason Moore, Governor of Ceylon, do by this Notification confirm the declaration of the "diseased locality" specified in the Schedule hereto, made by the

Acting Government Agent, North-Western Province, the proper authority in that behalf, on January 8, 1946.

Schedule.

The area bounded as follows:--

North—by the limits of paddy fields of Wilapola Estate; South—by the Kuliyapitiya-Madampe-P. W. D. road; East—by the V. C. road leading to Pallegama village; West—by the limits of the Crown land called Patugaha-mulawatta.

This area comprises "Pınnagolla Estate" in Udubaddawe village in Udubaddawe palata in Katugampola korale south of Katugampola hatpattu of the Kurunegala District.

Breach No. 2. Andadola-ela.

- (a) Repair breach 50 feet long 6 feet broad and 4 feet high. Allow for 250 feet of coconut trunks, and turf the bund 700 sq. ft.
- (b) Desilt the ela 2,930 feet long, 6 feet wide. 2 feet silt to be removed, 35,040 cu. ft. Allow for clearing jungle vegetation to a length of 40 chains on both banks.

Breach No. 3. Gammain-ela.

- (a) Repair breach 86 feet long, 10 feet broad and 6 feet high. 5,160 cu. ft. Allow for 450 feet of coconut trunks. Turf the three sides of the above breach. $_{c,}1,892$ sq. ft.
- (b) Desilt the ela 2,640 feet long, 6 feet broad and 2 feet of silt to be removed, 29,520 cu. ft. Allow for clearing 20 chains of jungle vegetation.

To cut a new ela from Kaduruwelakumbura to Marankadeniya-ela 175 feet long, 7 feet broad and $2\frac{1}{2}$ feet deep.

Construct two new bunds each 175 feet long. 4 feet broad and 3 feet high. Allow for 10 men for one week to transport earth, &c.

Turf the above two bunds, 1,750 sq, ft.

B. Dorakada Kumbura Pita-ela, Godagama.

(a) Desilt the ela 650 feet long, 4 feet broad and 2 feet of silt to be removed, 5,200 cu. ft.

Clear jungle vegetation from both banks and within the ela to a length of approximately 77 chains.

Blast and remove the rock 20 feet long, 4 feet broad to a depth of $2\frac{1}{2}$ feet.

, (b) Clear the ela 3,490 feet long of the jungle vegetation on both banks and within the ela approximately 53 chains.

Prospective tenderers are requested to visit the sites and satisfy themselves as to the nature of work that is required and the labour material, &c., which will be required.

Separate tenders should be sent in for items A and B.

TENDERS for effecting the following repairs, &c., to the under-noted clas will be received by the Assistant Government Agent (Emergency), Homagama, up to 12 noon, Saturday, January 26, 1946.

1. Breach in the Pita-ela, Welskanda.

Repair the breach 36 feet long, 5 feet broad and 6 feet high, 1,080 cu. ft.: and turf the breach $(36' \times 5') + (36' \times 6' \times 2)$ 612 sq ft. Allow for 5 men for 4 days to transport earth and 150 feet of coconut trunks.

2. Pitawana at Attidiya.

Dosilt the ela $1\frac{1}{4}$ miles long 6 feet, broad and 2 feet deep, 79,200 cu. ft.

 Depa-wella commencing from Kottawa and flowing into Mirihana Maduwela Depa-ela.

Dosilt the cla 5,000 feet long 6 feet broad and 2 feet of silt to be removed, 60,000 cu. ft.; and clear the jungle vegetation on both banks of the cla to a length of approximately 60 chans.

Prospective tenderers are requested to visit the sites and satisfy themselves as to the nature of work that is required and the labour materials, &c., which will be required.
