THE DEFENCE (MISCELLANEOUS) REGULATIONS.

ORDER made by the Governor under regulation 43D of the Defence (Miscellaneous) Regulations.

Order.

1. This Order may be cited as the Transfer of Powers of Civil Defence Commissioner (No. 2) Order, and shall come into operation on the Twenty-second of February, 1946.

2. The Controlled Articles (Chillies and Onions) Order, 1943, is hereby amended, by the substitution, for the words "Civil Defence Commissioner", wherever those words occur collectively in that Order, of the words "Director of Food Supplies".

3. Every permit issued, under the Controlled Articles (Chillies and Onions) Order, 1943, or under the Controlled Article (Chillie Powder) Order, 1943, by the Civil Defence Commissioner or by any officer or person authorised by the Civil Defence Commissioner to issue a permit, and in force on the day immediately preceding the date on which this Order comes into operation shall, on and after that date, continue in force and be deemed for all purposes to have been issued by the Director of Food Supplies.

4. Every officer or person authorised by the Civil Defence Commissioner to exercise any powers for the purposes of the Controlled Articles (Chillies and Onions) Order, 1943, or the Controlled Articles (Chillie Powder) Order, 1943, and exercising such powers on the day immediately preceding the date on which this Order comes into operation shall, on and after that date, continue to exercise such powers in like manner as though such officer or person had been authorised in that behalf by the Director of Food Supplies.

THE FOOD CONTROL ORDINANCE.

Notification.

IT is hereby notified in terms of section 4 (3) of the Food Control Ordinance (Chapter 132), read with the Defence (Food and Price Control) (Transfer of Powers) Regulations, 1942, that the Orders specified in the Schedule hereto made by me under section 4 (1) of the Ordinance and published in *Gazette* No. 9,516 of February 6, 1946, have been confirmed by the Board of Ministers on February 11, 1946.

Schedule.

1. Order No. 106 section 4 (1) (d) prohibiting the removal from the Customs premises of any rice, paddy, wheat, wheat flour or Kurakkan which is imported into Ceylon, except under permit.

2. Order No. 107 under section 4 (1) (e) assuming control of the Chalmers Granary.

3. Order No. 108 under section 4 (1) (g) directing the Food Controller to take steps for the allocation of supplies of rice or other grain or any preparation made mainly or wholly from such grain to merchants and distributors in certain parts of Ceylon, and to organize and administer a system of rationing such supplies.
