THE DEFENCE FORCE ORDINANCE.

WHEREAS the Post and Telegraph Signals Unit of the Ceylon Engineers Corps of the Ceylon Defence Force, in existence on the twenty-seventh day of February, 1943, was by virtue of regulation 2 of the Defence (Ceylon Post and Telegraph Signals Corps) Regulations deemed to be a separate Corps of the Ceylon Defence Force duly formed under the Defence Force Ordinance and designated by the style of the Ceylon Post and Telegraph Signals Corps:

And whereas the aforesaid Regulations will cease to be in force on the twenty-fourth day of February, 1946:

And whereas the members of the aforesaid Corps desire to continue as a Corps of the Ceylon Defence Force and have offered their services accordingly:

It is therefore hereby notified that the Governor has been pleased, in the exercise of the powers vested in him by section 4 of the Ceylon Defence Force Ordinance (Chapter 258)—

- (a) to accept the services of the aforesaid members with effect from the twenty-fourth day of February, 1946; and
- (b) to direct that the Corps shall from that date continue to be designated by the style of the Ceylon Post and Telegraph Signals Corps.
