THE FOOD CONTROL ORDINANCE.

Order No. 114.

BY virtue of the powers vested in me by section 4 (1) (d) of the Food Control Ordinance (Chapter 132), read with the Defence (Food and Price Control) (Transfer of Powers) Regulations, 1942, and with the Supplies and Senanayake, (Transitional Powers) Order, 1946, I, Don Stephen Senanayake, Minister for Agriculture and Lands do by this Order prohibit Minister for Agriculture and Lands, do by this Order prohibit the removal from the Customs premises at any port or place mentioned in the first column of the Schedule hereto, of any rice, paddy, wheat, wheat flour or kurakkan which is imported into Ceylon, except under a permit issued by the person mentioned in the corresponding entry in the second column, of that Schedule, and except in accordance with such directions as he may issue in regard to the time at which, the manner in which and the place to which such rice, paddy, wheat, wheat flour or kurakkan may be so removed.

THE FOOD CONTROL ORDINANCE.

Order No. 116.

BY virtue of the powers vested in me by section 4 (1) (g) of the Food Control Ordinance (Chapter 132), read with the Defence (Food and Price Control) (Transfer of Powers) Regulations, 1942, and with the Supplies and Services (Transitional Powers) Order, 1946, I, Don Stephen Senanayake, Minister for Agriculture and Lands, do by this Order direct the Food Controller to take steps for the allocation of supplies of paddy or other grain or any preparation made mainly or of paddy or other grain or any preparation made mainly or wholly from such grain to merchants and distributors in all parts of Ceylon and to organize and administer a system of rationing such supplies on and after the date hereof.
