THE QUARANTINE AND PREVENTION OF DISEASES  
ORDINANCE.

Notification.

BY virtue of the powers vested in me by regulation 1 of the regulations under sections 2 and 3 of the Quarantine and Prevention of Diseases Ordinance (Chapter 173), published in the *Supplement to Gazette* No. 7,481 of August 23, 1925, I, Henry Monck-Mason Moore, Governor of Ceylon, do by this Notification confirm the declaration of the "diseased locality" specified in the Schedule hereto, made by the Government Agent, North-Central Province, the proper authority in that behalf, on June 20, 1946.

Schedule.

The Mihintale area in the North-Central Province, bounded as follows :—

- North—by a line drawn from East to West parallel to the Anuradhapura-Trincomalee road cutting the Mihintale-Rambewa P. W. D. road at the 82½ mile post ;
- East—by a line drawn parallel to the Rambewa-Galkulama road cutting the Mihintale-Trincomalee P. W. D. road at the 55th mile post ;
- South—by a line drawn parallel to the Anuradhapura-Trincomalee road cutting the Mihintale-Galkulama road at the 81½ mile post ;
- West—by a line drawn parallel to the Rambewa-Galkulama road cutting the Anuradhapura-Mihintale road at the 54th mile post.

THE CENSUS ORDINANCE.

RULE made by the Governor under section 4 of the Census Ordinance (Chapter 118).

Rule.

The Census Rules, 1945, published in *Gazette* No. 9,435 of July 20, 1945, as amended by any subsequent rule, are hereby amended by the addition at the end thereof, of the following:—

“VIII.—Rules for the Census of Commerce, Industry and Trade.”

1. The owner or person in charge of every commercial or industrial undertaking, whether private owned or state-aided having ten or more paid employees and/or working with a capital of one thousand rupees or more shall, within fifteen days of the publication in the *Gazette* of a notice by the Superintendent calling for such declaration, make a declaration in the form set out hereunder:—

‘Declaration (under rule 1 of the Rules for the Census of Commerce, Industry and Trade)’.

For the purpose of this rule:—

“industrial undertaking” includes:—

- (a) mines, quarries and other works for the extraction of minerals from the earth,
- (b) industries in which articles are manufactured, altered, cleaned, repaired, ornamented, finished, adapted for sale, broken up or demolished, or in which materials are transformed, including ship-building, and the generation, transformation and transmission of electricity and motive power of any kind,
- (c) construction, reconstruction, maintenance, repair, alteration or demolition of any building, railway, tramway, harbour, dock, pier, canal, inland waterway, road, tunnel, bridge, viaduct, sewer, drain, well, telegraphic or telephonic installation, electrical undertaking, gaswork, waterwork, or other work of construction, as well as the preparation for or laying the foundations of any such work or structure,
- (d) transport of passengers or goods by road or rail, including the handling of goods at docks, quays, wharves, and warehouses but excluding transport by hand.

“commercial undertaking” includes:—

- (a) banking, insurance, finance business, estate agency, imports and exports, shipping agency and associated business, lighterage, coaling and fuelling,
- (b) wholesale and/or retail business in any commodity,
- (c) dry cleaners, dyeworks, laundries, barber saloons, beauty parlours, photographic studios, theatres and picture houses, hotels, cafes, restaurants, bars, taverns, bakeries and tailoring establishments.
