AMENDMENT REGULATION.

## Divesting Order.

WHEREAS all movable and immovable property belonging to or held or managed for or on behalf of Claude Marcel (deceased) was vested in the Custodian of Enemy Property by virtue of the Defence (Enemy Property) Regulations, and such property is deemed to be vested in the Custodian under regulation 7 (1) of the Defence (Trading with the Enemy) Amendment Regulations.

And whereas it is expedient to divest the Custodian of such property.

Now, therefore, in the exercise of the powers vested in me by Regulation 7 (2) of the Defence (Trading with the Enemy) Amendment Regulations, which continues in force under the Emergency Laws (Transitional Provisions) Order, 1946, I, Henry Monck-Mason Moore, Governor of Ceylon, do, by this Order, divest the Custodian of such property.

## THE CO-OPERATIVE SOCIETIES ORDINANCE.

## Order.

IN pursuance of the powers vested in me by section 2 of the Co-operative Societies Ordinance (Chapter 107), I, Henry Monck-Mason Moore, Governor of Ceylon, do by this Order confer on the persons mentioned in the Schedule hereto, who are persons appointed to assist the Registrar of Co-operative Societies, the following powers of the Registrar under that Ordinance:—

- (1) the power, under section 5 (3), to require information;
- (2) the power, under section 6, to register societies and their by-laws (but not including the power to refuse to register societies and their by-laws);
- (3) the power under section 7, to sign certificates of registration;
- (4) the power, under section 8, to register amendments of the by-laws of registered societies (but not including the power to refuse to register such amendments);
- (5) the power, under section 34 (2), to sanction contributions by registered societies, out of net profits, to any charitable purpose or common-good fund;
- (6) all the powers of the Registrar under section 35; and
- (7) the power, under section 45, to decide any dispute or to refer any dispute for disposal to an arbitrator or arbitrators.

All previous Orders (except the Order published in *Gazette* No. 9,565 of 7.6.1946), made under section 2 of the above-mentioned Ordinance are hereby rescinded.

## THE PILGRIMAGES ORDINANCE.

## Regulations for St. Anne's Festivals.

BY virtue of the powers vested in me by section 2 of the Pilgrimages Ordinance (Chapter 133), I, Henry Monck-Mason Moore, Governor and Commander-in-Chief of Ceylon, do by this notification make the regulations set out hereunder in anticipation of the customary pilgrimage to Talavillu for St. Anne's Festivals in July, 1946.

*Regulations.*

1. In these regulations the expression "camp area" means the space within the boundaries specified in the Schedule hereto;

and "Assistant Government Agent" means the Assistant Government Agent of the Puttalam and Chilaw Districts.

2. No person shall camp in any place within the camp area where camping is prohibited by special or general order of the Assistant Government Agent.

3. No person shall camp himself within the camp area, except at the places provided for that purpose by, or with the approval of the Assistant Government Agent.

4. No person shall deposit any liquid or solid refuse or any rubbish within the camp area, except in the places or receptacles provided for that purpose by, or with the approval of the Assistant Government Agent.

5. (a) No cattle shall be kept within the camp area, except those brought there for slaughter and those permitted by special or general order of the Assistant Government Agent to be kept within such area.

(b) No cattle shall be kept in the vicinity of the camp area, except at a place specially appointed as a cattle gala or as a place approved for such use by the Assistant Government Agent.

(c) The person in charge of the cattle shall cause their droppings to be removed to the nearest place provided therefor and shall at all times keep clean the place occupied by his cattle.

6. All prepared foods sold within the camp area shall be protected from flies and dust by being—(a) wrapped in or covered with clean paper or cloth, or (b) kept in closed glass cases, or (c) kept in other covered containers approved by the Medical Officer, or by the Sanitary Officer in charge of the camp area.

7. No person who is likely to effect prejudicially the cleanliness of the camp area, and no person who is suffering from an infectious disease shall be permitted to enter the camp area.

8. In the event of an epidemic breaking out in the camp area during the festival, the Assistant Government Agent may direct the pilgrims to leave the place of pilgrimage, and may prescribe the routes and methods for their conveyance.

9. (a) Every person within the camp area who is suffering from an infectious disease or a contagious disease, and (b) every person who resides with him knowing that he is so suffering shall report the case to the Medical or Sanitary Officer in charge of the camp area.

10. When any tank or well within the camp area is set apart for any particular purpose and a notice to that effect is exhibited on the spot, no person shall use the tank or well for any purpose other than that for which it is set apart.

11. No person shall keep any bakery, aerated water manufactory, tea or coffee boutique, eating-house, or any boutique where prepared food is exposed for sale or any gala within the camp area without previously obtaining a licence from the Assistant Government Agent permitting him to do so. The licence shall be issued free of charge.

12. No person shall, without the previous sanction of the Assistant Government Agent, construct any booth, or extend any building within the camp area so as to encroach on the main or other streets of the camp.

13. No person shall, without the previous sanction of the Assistant Government Agent, discharge fireworks and fire-arms within the camp area, or within a radius of one mile from the boundaries of such area.

14. No person shall slaughter any animal within the camp area except in the place provided for the purpose by, or with the approval of the Assistant Government Agent, and every person slaughtering any animal in such a place shall be responsible for its cleanliness.

15. The Assistant Government Agent may, at his discretion, direct the use of any road to Talawila from Etalai or Palakudah for one way vehicular traffic only.

*The Customs Ordinance.*

REGULATIONS made by the Governor by virtue of the powers vested in him by section 101 of the Customs Ordinance (Chapter 185).

*Regulations.**Trading in Colombo Harbour.*

1. In these regulations—

“Collector” means the Principal Collector of Customs, the Deputy Collector of Customs, the Landing Surveyor, or an Assistant Collector of Customs, of the Port of Colombo;

“harbour” means the water area of the Customs premises in Colombo exclusive of the Harbour canal leading to Beira Lake;

“licensee” means a person to whom a licence is issued under regulation 2;

“service marked goods” means goods marked with any recognized markings such as W A D, A or NAAFI denoting that such goods are meant for use by members of His Majesty's Forces.

2. (1) No person shall, for the purpose of trade, bring or cause the bringing of any article into the harbour except on a licence issued in that behalf by the Collector.

(2) The issue of any licence under this regulation shall be at the discretion of the Collector.

3. Every applicant for a licence under regulation 2 shall send to the Collector—

(1) a written application stating the nature of the articles in which the applicant intends to trade in the harbour; and

(2) the Customs pass of the applicant where one has already been issued, together with two unmounted photographs of the applicant; or, where no Customs pass has been issued, an application form to be supplied by the Collector, duly perfected by the applicant, together with three unmounted photographs of the applicant. The photographs shall be about three inches in length and two inches in breadth.

4. Every person whose application for a licence under regulation 2 is allowed by the Collector shall, before the issue of the licence—

(1) deposit as security with the Collector—

(a) a sum of *eight hundred rupees*, where the articles which the licensee is authorised to bring into the harbour for the purpose of trade include silk or jewellery; or

(b) in every other case, a sum of *two hundred rupees*; and

(2) sign a bond, in such form as may be provided by the Collector, declaring the sum so deposited liable to forfeiture at the discretion of the Collector—

(a) if such person commits a breach of any of the conditions to which the licence is subject; or

(b) if such person or any of his authorised assistants commits a breach of any rule or regulation made under the Customs Ordinance, or any rule relating to the Port of Colombo and made under the Masters Attendant Ordinance.

(5) Every licence issued under regulation 2 shall—

(1) where the licensee is authorised to bring silk or jewellery into the harbour for the purpose of trade, contain a statement of such authorisation;

(2) expire on the thirty-first day of December in the year in which such licence is issued; and

(3) be subject to the following conditions :—

(a) the licensee shall not, for the purpose of trade, enter the harbour before 6 A.M. or remain therein after 6.30 P.M. on any day;

(b) the licensee shall keep and maintain a day-book in which a detailed list of all the articles which he intends to bring or to cause to be brought into the harbour on any day for the purpose of trade shall be entered prior to such articles being brought;

(c) the licensee shall not be engaged in barter in the harbour or trade in any service marked goods or any price-controlled or rationed article, and shall not purchase or otherwise acquire any junk or stores from ships;

(d) the licensee shall not on any day, for the purpose of trade, bring or cause the bringing of any of the following articles into the harbour :—

(i) any article which is not specified in the list of articles entered for that day in the licensee's day-book;

(ii) any synthetic or imitation stone;

(iii) any culture pearl;

(iv) any article the export of which from Ceylon is prohibited by any written law;

(e) where by any written law the export of any article from Ceylon is restricted or any export duty is imposed on any article, the licensee shall not, for the purpose of trade, bring or cause the bringing of any such article (other than fresh coconuts) into the harbour, unless he obtains the written permission of the Collector and gives such guarantees as the Collector may require for the payment of all export duties leviable on such article and for the compliance with all legal requirements relating to the export of such article from Ceylon;

(f) the licensee shall not, for the purpose of trade, bring or cause the bringing of any silk or jewellery into the harbour, unless he is authorised in that behalf by the Collector;

(g) the licensee shall not, for the purpose of trading in the harbour, use or cause the use of any boat other than a bumboat which is licensed for such purpose under the provisions of the Masters Attendant Ordinance;

(h) the licensee shall not approach or stay within 15 fathoms of any vessel in the harbour if he is ordered not to do so by an officer or quartermaster of that vessel;

(i) the licensee shall not on any day bring or cause the bringing of any article into the harbour for the purpose of trade, or bring or cause the bringing of any article ashore from any ship in the harbour, or remove or cause the removal of any article from the Customs premises unless, in the case of trading on board any ship in the harbour, a Charges Officer, or, in any other case, a Preventive Officer—

(i) examines that article;

(ii) inspects the licensee's day-book for the purpose of ascertaining whether that article is specified in the list of articles entered for that day in such book; and

(iii) initials and dates such book and records therein the time of such inspection, and permits that article to be so brought or removed;

(j) the licensee shall not, for the purpose of trade, go or cause any person to go on board any ship in the harbour, unless the licensee is authorised in that behalf by a permit issued by the Collector;

(k) the licensee shall not, for the purpose of trading in the harbour, employ therein—

(i) any assistant who is not authorised by a permit issued by the Collector under regulation 7; or

(ii) more than one assistant, where the licensee does not go on board any ship in the harbour for the purpose of trade; or

(iii) more than two assistants, where the licensee goes on board any ship in the harbour for the purpose of trade;

(l) the licensee shall have in his possession the licence and the day-book when he is engaged in trade in the harbour, and shall produce the licence and the day-book for inspection whenever demanded by a Customs or Police Officer;

(m) the licensee shall display prominently on his left breast a rectangular brass badge, four inches in length and two inches in breadth, with the

inscription HARBOUR TRADER No. \_\_\_\_\_ (setting forth his licence number) in bold type on it ;

(n) the Collector may cancel or suspend the licence when the licensee (i) commits a breach—

- (a) of any condition to which the licence is subject ; or
- (b) of any rule or regulation made under the Customs Ordinance ; or
- (c) of any rule relating to the port of Colombo and made under the Masters Attendant Ordinance ; or

(ii) is convicted in a court of law in respect of the Customs Ordinance or of the Penal Code.

6. Except at the written request of the master, or the accredited agents of the owners, of any ship in the harbour, the Collector shall not issue a permit to any licensee authorising him to go, alone or with any of his assistants, on board such ship for the purpose of trade.

7. (1) No person shall act in the harbour as an assistant to any licensee trading therein except on a permit issued in that behalf by the Collector.

(2) No permit shall be issued to any person under paragraph (1) except—

- (a) on the written application of the licensee who desires to employ that person ; and
- (b) on the production of the Customs pass of that person where one has already been issued, together with two unmounted photographs of that person, or, where no Customs pass has been issued, an application form to be supplied by the Collector, duly perfected by the licensee, together with three unmounted photographs of that person. The photographs shall be about three inches in length and two inches in breadth.

8. Every permit issued under regulation 7 shall—

- (1) expire on the thirty-first day of December in the year in which such permit is issued ; and
- (2) be subject to the following conditions :—

- (a) the holder of the permit shall not, for the purpose of trade, enter the harbour before 6 A.M., or remain therein after 6.30 P.M., on any day ;
- (b) the holder of the permit shall not trade in the harbour independently of the licensee at whose instance the permit was issued ;
- (c) the holder of the permit shall have the permit in his possession when engaged in trade in the harbour, and shall produce the permit for inspection whenever demanded by a Customs or Police Officer ;
- (d) the holder of the permit shall display prominently on his left breast a rectangular brass badge, four inches in length and three inches in breadth, with the inscription ASSISTANT HARBOUR TRADER No. \_\_\_\_\_ (setting forth the licence number of the trader to whom he is assistant) in bold type on it ;
- (e) the Collector may cancel or suspend the permit when the holder of the permit—

(i) commits a breach—

- (a) of any condition to which the permit is subject ; or
- (b) of any rule or regulation made under the Customs Ordinance ; or
- (c) of any rule relating to the port of Colombo and made under the Masters Attendant Ordinance ; or

(ii) is convicted in a court of law in respect of the Customs Ordinance or of the Penal Code.

9. The regulations relating to licences to trade in the Harbour of Colombo, published in *Gazette* No. 8,857 of February 2, 1942, are hereby rescinded.

THE PILGRIMAGES ORDINANCE.

REGULATIONS made by the Governor under section 2 of the Pilgrimages Ordinance (Chapter 133), in anticipation of the customary pilgrimage to Kataragama for the Esala Festival commencing in July, 1946.

*Regulations.*

1. In these regulations, "camp area" includes—
  - (a) the area within a radius of half a mile of the Maha Devale at Kataragama; and
  - (b) the area within a radius of a quarter of a mile of the Pillayer Kovil at Sella Kataragama.
2. (a) The duration of the Kataragama Esala Festival, 1946, and of the stay of pilgrims at Kataragama, shall be limited to fifteen days from July 29 to August 12, inclusive.
  - (b) No pilgrim shall arrive before July 29 or stay after August 12 in the camp area.
3. The camp area shall be under the general control of the Government Agent of the Province of Uva, and under the immediate supervision of an officer designated the "Supervising Officer" who shall be assisted by the Medical Officer and by the Chief Officer of Police in charge of the camp.
  - (1) The Supervising Officer shall have power on the line of march to and from Kataragama, and at Kataragama—
    - (a) to appoint particular places to be exclusively used by the pilgrims for washing and bathing, for drawing water, for drinking, and for natural offices;
    - (b) to appoint places for the occupation of each class of pilgrims;
    - (c) to prescribe routes for the journey of any body of pilgrims;
    - (d) to regulate the distribution of all food given to the pilgrims;
    - (e) to fix separate places of abode for pilgrims who fall ill, to prohibit communication with them and to detain them if unfit to travel.
  - (2) No person shall disobey any lawful order given by the Supervising Officer for any of the purposes specified in paragraph (1).
5. No person shall ease himself within the camp area, except at a place provided for that purpose by, or with the approval of, the Government Agent.
6. No person shall deposit any refuse, whether liquid or solid, within the camp area except in a place or receptacle provided for that purpose by, or with the approval of the Government Agent.
7. No person shall bathe in or enter the river within the camp area above the spot appointed by the Supervising Officer.
8. No person shall bring any cattle or cart bulls within one quarter of a mile of the camp area without a permit from the Supervising Officer or any person authorised by him to issue such permits.
9. Every permit issued under regulation 8 shall be subject to such conditions as may be imposed by the Supervising Officer for the purpose of enforcing the sanitation and maintaining the health of the camp and regulating traffic within the camp area.
10. No person shall establish or maintain any bakery, aerated water manufactory, tea or coffee boutique, eating-house or gala within the camp area unless he has obtained a licence in that behalf from the Government Agent. The licence shall be issued free of charge.
  - (1) No person shall expose any commodity of any description for sale within the camp area in any place not appointed for the purpose by the Supervising Officer.
  - (2) No person shall sell food which has been condemned as unwholesome by the Supervising Officer or by the Medical Officer, or in their absence, by the Chief Officer of Police.
  - (3) It shall be lawful for any police officer or any Sanitary Assistant to seize and destroy any food condemned as unwholesome by the Supervising Officer, or by the Medical Officer or in their absence, by the Chief Officer of Police.
12. (1) All eating-houses and tea and coffee boutiques shall be kept in a clean and sanitary condition.
  - (2) All cakes, sweetmeats, and other cooked food exposed for sale shall be kept in a properly constructed fly-proof-glass cases.
    - (3) No waste tea, coffee, or milk or remnants of food, cooking waste or other refuse shall be thrown on the ground. All such refuse shall be collected in the receptacle hereinafter prescribed and be kept at all times ready for removal by the Sanitary authorities.
    - (4) Every building, structure, or place used for the purpose of any trade or business shall be provided with a metal or wooden dust bin not less than 4½ cubic feet in capacity. All refuse collected in such building, structure or place shall be

deposited in such bin, and except when refuse is being deposited or taken from the bin, it shall at all times be covered with a metal or wooden cover.

13. No person shall bring any person suffering from any infectious or contagious disease into the camp area or aid or abet any such person in entering the camp area.

14. In the event of an epidemic breaking out in the camp area during the festival, it shall be lawful for the Government Agent to direct the pilgrims to leave the camp area and to prescribe the route and the conveyance by which or the manner in which the pilgrims shall depart.

15. Every person within the camp area who contracts an infectious or a contagious disease, and every person who resides with any other person knowing that such other person has contracted an infectious or contagious disease, shall report the case to the Medical Officer in charge of the camp.

16. No person shall, without the previous sanction of the Government Agent, construct any booth, or extend any building so as to encroach on any land used or set apart for use as a street within the camp area.

THE HOUSING AND TOWN IMPROVEMENT ORDINANCE.

THE following resolution passed by the State Council at a meeting held on July 1, 1946, is published for general information:—

This Council resolves under the provisions of section 3 (b) of the Housing and Town Improvement Ordinance (Chapter 199), that from the first day of July, 1946, the aforesaid Ordinance shall be in force within the area defined in the Schedule hereto.

*Schedule.*

All that area situated in Ulapane in the village area of Ganga Ihala, Uva Province in the Kandy District, and bounded as follows:—

*North*, by a line drawn from a point 83 yards due west from the centre of the Gampola-Nawalapitiya Public Works Department road at culvert No. 18/10 eastward in a straight line crossing the railway line and the said road at culvert No. 18/10 up to a point 200 yards due east from the centre of the road at the said culvert No. 18/10.

*West*, by a line drawn from the last mentioned point north-eastwards along a line everywhere parallel to and 83 yards to the north-west from the centre of the said Gampola-Nawalapitiya Public Works Department road up to a point 83 yards to the west from the centre of the said road (near 18th mile stone); thence northwards along a line everywhere parallel to and 83 yards to the west from the centre of the above mentioned road and crossing the Ulapane-oya as far as the point where it is also 83 yards to the south from the centre of the road leading to Raja-ela estate; thence north-westwards along a line everywhere parallel to and 83 yards to the south from the centre of the said road leading to Raja-ela estate as far as a point which is 83 yards to the south and 50 yards to the south-east at right angles from the centre of the said road at the bend near the masonry steps to the Post Office; thence south-westwards along a line everywhere parallel to and 50 yards to the south-east from the centre of the said road leading to Raja-ela estate crossing the Galahetiyya-ela up to a point 116 yards to the south-west from the centre of the Galahetiyya-ela; thence north-westwards in a straight line up to the centre of the level crossing (a distance of 53 yards); thence westwards and south-westwards across the railway line and along the centre of the said road leading to Raja-ela estate up to a point 50 yards from the centre of the said level crossing; thence north-westwards in a straight



line across the said road (at right angles to the said road) up to a point 83 yards to the north-west from the centre of the above mentioned road; thence north-eastwards along a line everywhere parallel to and 83 yards to the north-west from the centre of the said road, crossing the Galahetiyya-ela and passing a point 18 yards to the west of the north-western corner of the Post Office building up to a point 42 yards from the north-western corner of the Post Office building 55.2 yards to the north-west from the railway signal post and 200 yards to the west from the centre of the Gampola-Nawalapitiya Public Works Department road; thence south-eastwards in a straight line and crossing the railway line up to a point 33 yards to the north from the centre of the road leading to Raja-ela estate and 33 yards to the north-east from the northern corner of the masonry steps to the Post Office; thence eastwards along a line everywhere parallel to and 33 yards to the north from the centre of the said road leading to Raja-ela estate up to a point 83 yards to the west from the centre of the Gampola-Nawalapitiya Public Works Department road; thence northwards along a line everywhere parallel to and 83 yards to the west from the centre of the said Gampola-Nawalapitiya Public Works Department road and crossing the railway line up to the starting point of the northern boundary.

#### TRADE DISPUTE—KANUWANA VILLAGE COMMITTEE.

NINE conservancy labourers named Sundaran, Nagan, Karuppan, Muniyandi, Karangen, Venithai, Sinnamuniamma, Nallamma and Periyamuniamma of the Village Committee, Kanuwana village area, Ragama, presented to me a petition under section 6 (1) of the Essential Services (Avoidance of Strikes and Lockouts) Order, 1942, relating to a trade dispute that had arisen between them and the Chairman, Village Committee, Kanuwana village area. The petition was referred to the District Judge, Colombo, for adjudication in terms of section 5 of the said Order.

The following award made by the District Judge on June 19, 1946, is published for general information in terms of section 8 (4) of the above-mentioned Order:—

“The matter for inquiry arises out of a petition presented by 9 conservancy labourers who were working in the Village Committee, Kanuwana village area, Ragama, to the Commissioner of Labour, Colombo, against the Chairman, of the said Committee complaining against their being discontinued from work and asking that the respondent be ordered to reinstate all of them in their employment and pay them wages for the period they were without work and grant such other relief as is deemed fit. The Commissioner of Labour has referred this matter to this Tribunal for inquiry under the regulations referred to in his letter C/I 149 of April 25, 1946.

When this matter first came up for inquiry before this Tribunal Mr. Norbert Perera, the Chairman of the Village Committee referred to, submitted that he had to get instructions from his Committee and begged that a long date be given for the inquiry. He further stated that he was now getting the conservancy attended to through an independent contractor who is quite at liberty to employ the petitioners if he likes to do so, and that he had no objection to it. The matter came up for inquiry again on the 12th of this month and then Mr. Advocate J. A. T. Perera, who appeared for the respondent instructed by Mr. Amaratunga, reiterated what the respondent had stated earlier and submitted that the respondent had no employment now in which he could employ the petitioners, because he had ceased to carry on the business of conserving the town which was now being done by an independent contractor to whom the petitioners could go if they so liked it. Mr. J. A. T. Perera further submitted that if an employer elects to go out of business for any reason he could not be forced back into the business and asked to employ the petitioners. The present petition in question appears to have been the result of some sort of party rivalry between two members of the Village Committee of Kanuwana—Mr. Norbert Perera and Mr. Jayasuriya.

I agree with Mr. J. A. T. Perera and find that it is not within the jurisdiction of this Tribunal to force the respondent to reinstate the petitioners as the work of conserving the town is now being done by an independent contractor.

If the petitioners have any arrears of wages to recover they can do so in a civil court, but I dismiss the present petition. I make no order as regards costs.”

- (4) The share or shares of the produce to which such person or persons may be entitled.

2. I do further direct that—

- (1) The Government levy of two bushels of paddy per acre for the Yala season should be handed over to the Village Headman or Vel Vidane at the threshing floor,
  - (2) No paddy shall be utilised for consumption by an owner or his dependent possessing a Rice Ration Book until the surrender of the appropriate number of rice coupons to the Village Headman,
  - (3) No paddy shall be removed from the threshing floor or field until an assessment of the crop has been made by the Village Headman or Vel Vidane and except on a permit obtained from the Village Headman for the removal of such paddy,
  - (4) (a) Transport within a Village Headman's Division: Application should be made to the Village Headman of the Division,  
(b) Transport from one Village Headman's Division to another in the same Divisional Revenue Officer's Division: A permit must be obtained as under (a) but it must be endorsed by the Divisional Revenue Officer of the area before it is valid.  
(c) Transport from one Divisional Revenue Officer's Division to another within the Pasdun Korales: The application should be made in duplicate on form D.F.S. & C. 34 to the Divisional Revenue Officer of the area in which the applicant resides,

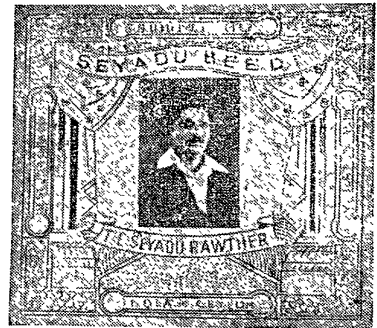

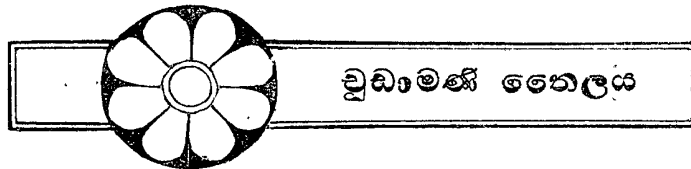
