THE QUARANTINE AND PREVENTION OF DISEASES ORDINANCE.

Notification.

BY virtue of the powers vested in me by regulation 1 of the regulations under sections 2 and 3 of the Quarantine and Prevention of Diseases Ordinance (Chapter 173), published in the *Supplement to Gazette* No. 7,481 of August 28, 1925, I, John Curtois Howard, Officer Administering the Government of Ceylon, do by this Notification revoke the Notification of July 4, 1946, published in *Gazette* No. 9,574 of July 5, 1946, confirming the declaration of a "diseased locality" made by the Assistant Government Agent, Vavuniya, on July 1, 1946.

THE PILGRIMAGES ORDINANCE.

BY virtue of the powers vested in the Governor by section 2 of the Pilgrimages Ordinance (Chapter 133), I, John Curtois Howard, Officer Administering the Government of Ceylon, do by this Notification make the regulations set out hereunder which shall be applicable to every pilgrimage to Dewundara Sri Vishnu Maha Dewalaya in the Matara District of the Southern Province.

Regulations.

1. In the event of any disease of a contagious, infectious or epidemic nature breaking out at Dondra or in its vicinity immediately before or during the pilgrimage, or at any other place in the Southern Province, from which, in the opinion of the Assistant Government Agent, it is likely to be conveyed to Dondra during the pilgrimage, it shall be lawful for the Assistant Government Agent to prohibit the pilgrimage, or to declare the pilgrimage at an end, and to direct all pilgrims to leave Dondra forthwith and return to their homes, and to prescribe the routes by which they shall depart.

2. No person who is suffering from a disease of a contagious, infectious or epidemic nature shall enter Dondra.

3. No person shall bring any person suffering from a disease of a contagious, infectious or epidemic nature into Dondra or aid or abet any such person in entering Dondra.

4. Every person who contracts a disease of a contagious, infectious or epidemic nature, and every person who resides with any other person knowing that such other person has contracted any such disease, shall forthwith report the case to the Sanitary Assistant or Medical Officer, or in their absence to the senior officer of Police at Dondra.

5. (1) No person shall expose any commodity of any description for sale at Dondra in any place not appointed for the purpose by the Chairman of the Village Committee of Dondra.

(2) No person shall sell meat, food or drink of any kind which has been condemned as unwholesome by the Sanitary Assistant or Medical Officer, or in their absence by the Divisional Revenue Officer of Wellaboda pattu or senior officer of Police present at Dondra.

(3) It shall be lawful for any Police Officer or any Sanitary Assistant to seize and destroy any meat, food or drink condemned as unwholesome under the provisions of paragraph (2).

6. (1) All eating-houses and tea and coffee boutiques shall be kept in a clean and sanitary condition.

(2) All cakes, sweetmeats and other cooked food exposed for sale shall be kept in properly constructed fly-proof glass cases.

(3) No waste tea, coffee or milk or remnants of food, cooking waste or other refuse shall be thrown on the ground. All such refuse shall be collected in the receptacles hereinafter prescribed and be kept at all times ready for removal by the sanitary authorities.

(4) Every building, structure or place used for the purpose of any trade or business shall be provided with a metal or wooden dust-bin not less than $4\frac{1}{2}$ cubic feet in capacity. All refuse collected in such building, structure or place shall be deposited in the bin, and except when refuse is being deposited or taken from such bin, it shall at all times be covered with a metal or wooden cover.

7. (1) No person shall erect any booth or building for the purpose of the pilgrimage—

- within a space of 12 feet from the side drain of the main road from Matara to Tangalla and of the approach road to the Dewale; or
- within such area as may be reserved by the Assistant Government Agent for the accommodation of pilgrims or the parking of vehicles.

(2) No person shall expose any article of any description for sale within any space referred to in paragraph (1) (a).

8. The proprietor or lessee of the premises used for the accommodation of the pilgrims shall—

- forward plans and specifications of proper latrines for the approval of the Chairman of the Village Committee of Dondra at least 10 days before the commencement of the pilgrimage;
- provide such latrine accommodation on a site and of a type approved by the Chairman of the Village Committee of Dondra;
- be responsible for the supply of a suitable quantity of coir dust or sand and disinfectants of a quality approved by the Chairman of the Village Committee of Dondra;
- cause the proper conserving and clearing of the latrines at least twice a day; and
- cause all straw, rubbish, cattle-dung, or any kind of litter to be collected at least once every day, and burned or buried at a place appointed for the purpose by the Chairman of the Village Committee of Dondra.

9. No person shall use any place for the offices of nature other than—

- a place set apart for the purpose by the Chairman of the Village Committee of Dondra; or
- a latrine provided by the proprietor or lessee of the premises used for the accommodation of pilgrims.

10. The Assistant Government Agent, Matara, shall, as early in each year as may be, notify in the *Gazette* the dates on which the pilgrimage shall commence and end in that year.

11. In these regulations "the pilgrimage" means every pilgrimage to the Dewundara Sri Vishnu Maha Dewale made in connection with the annual festival, fair and Perahera.

THE PILGRIMAGES ORDINANCE.

Regulations for Munnessaram Festival.

BY virtue of the powers vested in the Governor by section 2 of the Pilgrimages Ordinance (Chapter 133), I, John Curtois Howard, Officer Administering the Government of Ceylon, do by this notification make the regulations set out hereunder in anticipation of the customary pilgrimage to Munnessaram in August-September, 1946.

Regulations.

1. In these regulations the expression "camp area" shall mean the space within the boundaries specified in the Schedule hereto,

and "Assistant Government Agent" shall mean the Assistant Government Agent of the Puttalam and Chilaw Districts.

2. No person shall camp in any place within the camp area where camping is prohibited by special or general order of the Assistant Government Agent.

3. No person shall ease himself within the camp area, except at the places provided for that purpose by, or with the approval of the Assistant Government Agent.

4. No person shall deposit any liquid or solid refuse or any rubbish within the camp area, except in the places or receptacles provided for that purpose by, or with the approval of, the Assistant Government Agent.

5. (a) No cattle shall be kept in the camp area, and no cattle shall be kept in the vicinity of the camp area except at a place specially appointed as a cattle gala or at a place approved for such use by the Assistant Government Agent.

(b) The person in charge of cattle shall cause their droppings within the camp area to be removed to a place provided therefor, and he shall at all times keep clean the place occupied by his cattle.

6. All prepared foods sold within the camp area shall be protected from flies and dust by being (a) wrapped in or covered with clean paper or cloth, or (b) kept in closed glass cases, or (c) kept in other covered containers approved by the Medical Officer, or by the Sanitary Officer in charge of the camp area.

7. No person who is likely to affect prejudicially the cleanliness of the camp area, and no person who is suffering from an infectious disease shall be permitted to enter the camp area.

8. In the event of an epidemic breaking out in the camp area during the festival, the Assistant Government Agent may direct the pilgrims to leave the place of pilgrimage, and may prescribe the routes and methods for their conveyance.

9. (a) Every person within the camp area who is suffering from an infectious or a contagious disease, and (b) every person who resides with him knowing that he is so suffering shall report the case to the Medical or Sanitary Officer in charge of the camp area.

10. When any tank or well within the camp area is set apart for any particular purpose and a notice to that effect is exhibited on the spot, no person shall use the tank or well for any purpose other than that for which it is set apart.

11. No person shall keep any bakery, aerated water manufactory, tea or coffee boutique, eating house or any boutique where prepared food is exposed for sale or any gala within the camp area without previously obtaining a licence from the Assistant Government Agent permitting him to do so. The licence shall be issued free of charge.

12. No person shall, without the previous sanction of the Assistant Government Agent, construct any booth, or extend any building within the camp area so as to encroach on the main or other streets of the camp.

13. No person shall, without the previous sanction of the Assistant Government Agent, discharge fireworks and firearms within the camp area, or within a radius of one mile from the boundaries of such area.

14. No person shall slaughter animals within the camp area, except in the place provided for the purpose by, or with the approval of the Assistant Government Agent, and every person slaughtering animals in such a place shall be responsible for its cleanliness.

By-laws.

I.—Conservancy and Scavenging.

1. The Chairman may, by notice in writing served on the owner of any premises, situated within an area for which a conservancy service has been established require such owner to provide a pail latrine of such size and type and in such a position on the premises as may be approved by the Chairman on the recommendation of the Medical Officer of Health or an Officer authorised by such Medical Officer.

2. If the Medical Officer of Health or an Officer authorised by such Medical Officer certifies that any cesspit or latrine (not being a pail latrine of the size and type referred to in by-law 1), situated on any premises within the area for which a conservancy service has been established is insanitary and dangerous to health, the Chairman may, by notice in writing served on the owner of such premises, require such owner to close such cesspit or latrine.

3. Every owner on whom a notice referred to in by-law 1 or by-law 2 has been served shall comply with the requirements of such notice within such time, in no case to be less than two months, as may be specified in such notice.

4. Every occupier of premises provided with a pail latrine and situated within an area for which a conservancy service has been established, shall maintain such latrine at all times in a sanitary condition and in good repair.

5. No person other than a conservancy labourer employed by the Village Committee shall remove or otherwise dispose of the night soil from any pail latrine within the area for which a conservancy service has been established.

6. The occupier of any premises served by the conservancy service, other than an occupier who is exempted by the Village Committee on the ground of poverty, shall pay monthly to the Village Committee a conservancy fee at the rate specified in the Schedule hereto.

7. For the purpose of inspecting any cesspit or any latrine, whether constructed or in course of construction, on any premises, it shall be lawful for the Medical Officer of Health or an officer authorised by him to enter the premises at any time between sunrise and sunset, and the occupier of the premises shall render such officer all such assistance as may be necessary for the purpose of the inspection.

8. Upon the establishment of a scavenging service for the whole or any specified part of the village area, the occupier of any premises, situated within an area for which such

service has been established, shall cause all ashes, sweepings and other refuse from his premises to be deposited in a bucket or bin with a suitable cover and of such shape and size as may be approved by the Chairman.

9. The occupier of any premises referred to in by-law 8 shall—

- (1) daily between such hours as the Chairman may, from time to time, notify by beat of tom-tom or otherwise, cause such bucket or bin to be placed by the edge of the road outside such premises but so as to cause no obstruction to traffic on the road; and
- (2) cause such bucket or bin to be removed within half an hour of the emptying of such bucket or bin by the scavenging labourers of the Village Committee.

10. No person shall place on any road any bucket or bin referred to in by-law 8 except between such hours as are referred to in by-law 9.

11. The occupier of any premises served by the scavenging service, other than an occupier who is exempted by the Village Committee on the ground of poverty, shall pay monthly to the Village Committee a scavenging fee at the rate specified in the Schedule hereto.

12. The conservancy fee referred to in by-law 6 and the scavenging fee referred to in by-law 11 shall be paid to the Chairman of the Village Committee or to any person duly authorised by him in writing to collect such fees on or before the 10th day of the month immediately following the month in respect of which such fees are due. Provided that when the owner or occupier of any premises has given written notice in advance to the Chairman that the premises will not be occupied during the whole of any specified month and such owner or occupier subsequently satisfies the Chairman that such premises were in fact not occupied during the month no conservancy or scavenging fee shall be payable in respect of those premises for that month.

II.—Bakeries, Eating-houses, Restaurants and Tea and Coffee Boutiques.

1. In these by-laws—

“bakery” means any premises in which bread, biscuits or confectionery is baked for sale as food for human consumption and includes any premises in which such food is prepared or in which the materials for the preparation of such food are stored;

“Chairman” means the Chairman of the Village Committee;

“Medical Officer of Health” includes a Field Medical Officer.

2. (1) No person shall establish or carry on business at any bakery except on a licence issued in that behalf by the Chairman on the recommendation of the Medical Officer of Health.

(2) Every licence issued under this by-law shall expire on the 31st day of December in the year in respect of which it is issued.

3. No person shall be entitled to a licence under by-law 2 unless the premises to be used as a bakery are in conformity with the following requirements:—

- (a) the premises must be well ventilated and well lighted;
- (b) the walls must be plastered with lime mortar and white-washed;
- (c) the floor must be cemented;
- (d) the premises must be provided with sufficient latrine accommodation and sufficient drains;
- (e) a ceiling of suitable materials must be provided so as to prevent dirt and dust falling from the roof;
- (f) the premises must not be situated within 50 feet of any cesspit, permanent manure heap, latrine or open sewer;
- (g) the premises must be provided with a separate kneading room having a superficial floor space of not less than 12 feet by 10 feet;
- (h) there must be a free external air space, not less than 7 feet wide, on at least two of the sides of the kneading room which contain doors or windows; and
- (i) the door of the oven must not open directly into the kneading room.

4. The licensee of a bakery shall cause—

- (a) all utensils, furniture and other requisites used in or belonging to the bakery to be kept clean;
- (b) the tops of the tables in the bakery to be made of well-seasoned closely fitting planks, or of some non-harmful impervious materials and the tables to be scraped and cleaned daily;

(c) the floor of the bakery to be swept at least once in every twenty-four hours, and the sweepings to be placed immediately in an impervious and covered receptacle, and removed from the bakery daily;

(d) the premises of the bakery to be kept clean and free from effluvia arising from any drain, privy, or cesspit and from any other similar nuisance;

(e) the flour which is used in the bakery to be kept on a platform raised at least three feet above the ground;

(f) all refuse from the premises of the bakery to be removed and the drains to be flushed daily;

(g) at least two spittoons to be kept in some part of the premises other than the kneading room, but so as to be easily accessible to those engaged in the manufacture of bread;

(h) clean water, clean towels, a nail brush and soap to be provided on the premises for the use of those engaged in the manufacture of bread; and

(i) a copy in Sinhalese of these by-laws relating to bakeries to be exhibited in a conspicuous part of the bakery.

5. The licensee of a bakery shall not—

(a) allow the bakery to be used as a place for sleeping or for keeping any animal or any article other than an article necessary for the purposes of the bakery;

(b) allow any bread, biscuits or confectionery to be exposed for sale otherwise than in clean and properly constructed fly-proof glass cases;

(c) allow any person engaged in the manufacture of bread, biscuits or confectionery to use any flour, water or other materials which are not good and wholesome;

(d) use or keep in the bakery any furniture or equipment which cannot be moved about for the purpose of cleaning the floor; or

(e) allow any gambling or disorderly conduct to take place on the premises of the bakery.

6. Every person employed in the preparation or baking of bread, biscuits or confectionery, shall wash his hands before engaging in that process, and shall wear a clean white apron, covering the chest, armpits and body, and also a white cap or turban.

7. No person shall spit within the premises of the bakery except into a spittoon provided for the purpose.

8. No person who is suffering or has suffered from any contagious, cutaneous or infectious disease, or has been in attendance on any person suffering from such disease, shall be permitted by any person in charge of a bakery to enter the bakery or to take part in the manufacture or sale of bread, biscuits or confectionery, until the periods of infection and incubation have elapsed.

9. (1) It shall be lawful for the Chairman or the Medical Officer of Health or the Sanitary Assistant or any Officer authorised by the Chairman in writing, at all reasonable times, and at any time when the process of kneading or baking is being carried on, to enter and inspect the bakery.

(2) The licensee, or the person in charge of a bakery shall permit the Chairman or the Medical Officer of Health or the Sanitary Assistant or any Officer authorised by the Chairman in writing, to enter and inspect the bakery, and shall render the Chairman, or such Officer, all such assistance as may be necessary.

10. It shall be lawful for the Village Tribunal, in addition to any other punishment that it may impose, to cancel the licence of any licensee convicted twice or oftener of any breach of any of these by-laws relating to bakeries and the licensee shall not be entitled to any compensation in respect of such cancellation.

11. (1) No person shall establish or carry on business at any eating-house restaurant, or tea or coffee boutique, except on a licence issued in that behalf by the Chairman on the recommendation of the Medical Officer of Health.

(2) Every licence issued under this by-law shall expire on the 31st day of December in the year in respect of which it is issued.

12. No person shall be entitled to a licence under by-law 11, unless the premises to be used as an eating-house, restaurant, or tea or coffee boutique are in conformity with the following requirements—

(a) the premises must be well ventilated and well lighted;

(b) the walls must be plastered with lime mortar and white-washed;

(c) the floor must be cemented; and

(d) a ceiling of suitable materials must be provided so as to prevent dirt and dust falling from the roof.

13. The licensee of an eating-house, restaurant or tea or coffee boutique shall cause—

(a) the premises thereof to be kept in a clean and sanitary condition;

(b) all utensils, furniture, or other equipment, used in or belonging to the eating-house, restaurant, or tea or coffee boutique to be kept clean;

(c) all refuse and dirt in or about the premises of the eating-house, restaurant, or tea or coffee boutique to be swept and removed twice daily;

- (d) all cakes, sweets and other food exposed for sale on such premises to be kept in clean and properly constructed fly-proof glass cases;
- (e) all waste tea, coffee, or milk and other remnants of food to be collected in a fly-proof receptacle with a close fitting lid or cover, and removed from such premises twice daily;
- (f) all utensils used in the preparation, sale and consumption of food or drink to be washed with soap and water at least once in every twenty-four hours;
- (g) every utensil or receptacle used by a customer to be washed immediately after such use and before being used by another customer; and
- (h) a list of the names and addresses of all employees to be kept at all times in the premises so as to be available for inspection.
14. The licensee of an eating-house, restaurant, or tea or coffee boutique shall not permit—
- (a) any waste tea, coffee or milk or any remnants of food to be thrown on the floor of the licensed premises; or
- (b) any gambling or disorderly conduct to take place on the licensed premises.

15. The licensee of an eating-house, restaurant, or tea or coffee boutique shall cause at least two spittoons to be kept at all times on the licensed premises so as to be readily available to the visitors to the premises as well as to the employees.

16. No person shall spit within the premises of an eating-house, restaurant, or tea or coffee boutique except into a spittoon provided for the purpose.

17. No person who is suffering or has suffered from any contagious, cutaneous or infectious disease, or has been in attendance on any person suffering from such disease, shall be permitted by any person in charge of an eating-house, restaurant or tea or coffee boutique to enter such place or take part in the preparation or sale of any food or drink therein, until the periods of infection and incubation have elapsed.

18. It shall be lawful for the Chairman or the Medical Officer of Health or the Sanitary Assistant or any Officer authorised by the Chairman in writing, at all reasonable times, to enter and inspect any eating-house, restaurant, or tea or coffee boutique, and the licensee or the person in charge of any eating-house, restaurant, or tea or coffee boutique shall permit the Chairman, or such Officer to enter and inspect the premises, and shall render him all such assistance as may be necessary.

19. It shall be lawful for the Village Tribunal, in addition to any other punishment that it may impose to cancel the licence of any licensee convicted twice or oftener of any breach of any of these by-laws relating to eating-houses, restaurants, or tea or coffee boutiques, and the licensee shall not be entitled to any compensation in respect of such cancellation.

III.—Markets and Fairs.

1. The area within a circle having a radius of one mile from any village market is hereby declared to be the market area for that market.

2. Within any market area, no person shall, on any day on which the village market is open, sell or offer or expose for sale any vegetables, fruits, fish, meat or other perishable articles of food at any place other than the village market.

Provided that the preceding provisions of this by-law shall not apply to—

- (a) the sale of vegetables or fruits by itinerant vendors who do not sell at fixed places, or do not for the purposes of such sale establish themselves on the public roads or other public places;
- (b) the sale by the licensee of an eating-house or a tea or coffee boutique of ripe plantains or other fruits for consumption on the premises; or
- (c) the sale by any person of young coconuts.

3. Every village market or fair shall be open from 6 A.M. to 6 P.M. on such days of the week as may be approved by the Committee.

4. Where the Committee has set apart any portion of a village market or fair for the sale of any article or class of articles, no person shall—

- (a) sell or expose for sale such article or class of articles in any place in such market or fair other than the portion so set apart; or
- (b) sell or expose for sale any other article or class of articles in the portion so set apart.

5. A fee at the following rates shall be levied and paid for the use and occupation of any stall, seat or space in any village market fair:—

For any commodity sold by public auction, a fee reckoned at 2 per cent. of the gross proceeds of such sale.

6. No person shall hold, use or occupy any stall, seat or space in a village market or fair unless he is the holder of a licence issued in that behalf by or under the authority of the Chairman, or otherwise than in accordance with the terms and conditions of such licence. Every such licence shall expire on the date specified therein.

7. The fees payable under by-law 5 shall be paid to the Chairman or to such other person as may be authorised by the Chairman, and no licence under by-law 6 shall be issued to any person until he has paid the fee due from him.

8. The Chairman shall cause to be exhibited in a conspicuous place in each village market or fair a notice setting out in English, Sinhalese and Tamil, the fees payable for the use and occupation of that market or fair and no person shall demand or receive any sums higher than those set out in such notice.

9. Whenever the Committee is satisfied, after consultation with the Medical Officer of Health, that the use or consumption by the public of any particular article of food is injurious or harmful, it shall be lawful for the Committee by beat of tomtom or other sufficient notice to prohibit for such time as to the Committee may appear necessary the introduction and sale of such article of food in any village market or fair.

10. No person shall sell or expose for sale in any village market or fair—

- (a) the carcase or meat of any animal which has been slaughtered at any place other than a village slaughter-house or a licensed slaughter-house; and
- (b) any article the keeping or sale of which is prohibited by or under any by-law made by the Committee.

Provided that the preceding provisions of this by-law shall not apply to the sale of frozen meat, game or fish.

11. No person who is suffering or has suffered from any contagious, infectious or cutaneous disease, or has been in attendance on any person suffering from such disease shall use or occupy any stall, seat, or space in any village market or fair, or expose for sale thereat any article whatsoever until the periods of infection and incubation have elapsed.

12. No person using or occupying any village market or fair shall—

- behave in any disorderly manner or commit any nuisance in or about such market or fair; or
- carry on cooking in any such market or fair; or
- remain in or loiter about such market or fair after the place is closed for business at 6 P.M. without being able to give a satisfactory account of himself; or
- damage or in any way deface any portion of the building, stalls, lamps or any property of the Committee in or about such market or fair, or defile or pollute the water provided for use in such market or fair; or
- enclose in any way any portion of the building or premises of the market or fair or erect any permanent awning or screen or fixture of any kind; or
- leave any goods in or about the premises of such market or fair between the hours of 6 P.M. and 6 A.M. without the special permission of the Chairman; or
- place any fruits, vegetables, meat, fish, flesh or other article of food exposed thereat for sale, on any unclean or insanitary surface; or
- expose for sale any article of food whether cooked or uncooked, otherwise than in clean and properly constructed fly-proof glass cases.

13. Every person using or occupying any stall in a village market or fair shall keep in or near such stall a fly-proof receptacle with a close fitting lid or cover, and shall deposit all rubbish and refuse in such receptacle.

14. No person shall throw any rubbish or refuse, or any bone or skin of any animal, or any article likely to be offensive or injurious to the public health, on the premises of any village market or fair.

15. No person shall obstruct or resist the keeper of any village market or fair or any other person appointed by the Committee to superintend any village market or fair or to collect rents and fees or to enforce order and cleanliness therein, in the lawful execution of his duty.

16. The driver of a vehicle shall not keep that vehicle within or alongside of the premises of any village market or fair for a longer period than is necessary for loading goods into or unloading goods from that vehicle.

17. The Chairman shall give notice by beat of tom-tom or in such other manner as he may deem adequate, of the establishment or the temporary closing of any village market or fair.

Private Markets and Fairs.

18. No private market or fair shall be established or held within any market area.

19. (1) No private market or fair shall be established or held within any area (other than a market area) except on a licence issued in that behalf by the Chairman.

(2) Every licence issued under paragraph (1) shall—

(a) be substantially in the form set out in the Schedule hereto;

(b) be subject to the conditions specified therein; and

(c) expire on the 31st day of December in the year in respect of which it is issued.

(3) The fee for each licence issued under paragraph (1) shall be twenty-five rupees per year.

20. No person shall be entitled to a licence to establish or hold a private market or fair unless the site is approved by the Medical Officer of Health.

21. A licence issued under by-law 19 may be cancelled by a Village Tribunal on a second or subsequent conviction of the licensee for a breach of any of these by-laws or of the conditions of the licence, and the licensee shall not be entitled to any compensation in respect of such cancellation.

22. The Chairman may refuse to issue a licence under by-law 19 to any person whose previous licence has been cancelled by a Village Tribunal.

General.

23. It shall be lawful for the Chairman, the Medical Officer of Health, the Sanitary Assistant or any person authorised in writing by the Chairman, at all reasonable times to enter and inspect any market or fair or any article of food exposed or kept for sale therein, and no person shall obstruct or resist any officer aforesaid in the execution of his duty under this by-law.

24. In these by-laws—

“Chairman” means the Chairman of the Committee;

“Committee” means the Dambadeniya Village Committee;

“Market area” in relation to any village market means the area described in by-law 1;

“Medical Officer of Health” includes a Field Medical Officer.

Schedule.

Licence to establish and hold a Private Market/*Fair.

_____ of _____ is hereby licensed to establish and hold a private *market/fair on the land called _____ situated at _____ in the _____ village area from the date hereof until the 31st day of December, 19 _____, subject always to the sub-jointed conditions.

Conditions of the above licence.

1. A table in English, Sinhalese and Tamil of the rents and fees leviable at the private *market/fair shall be exhibited in a conspicuous place in the *market/fair.

2. The licensee shall not allow any person to sell or expose for sale in the private *market/fair any article the keeping or sale of which is prohibited by or under any by-law made by the Committee.

3. The licensee of every private *market/fair shall take all steps necessary to ensure that fruits, vegetables, meat, fish, or other articles of food are not placed on an unclean or insanitary surface.

4. The licensee shall not expose for sale any articles of food whether cooked or uncooked, otherwise than in clean and properly constructed fly-proof glass cases.

5. The licensee shall not allow any person who is suffering or has suffered from any contagious, infectious or cutaneous

disease, or has been in attendance on any person suffering from such disease, to use or occupy any stall, seat or place in the *market/fair, or to expose for sale thereat any articles whatsoever until the period of infection and incubation have elapsed.

6. The licensee shall keep the premises of the *market/fair clean and free from filth and rubbish and shall cause all sweepings and refuse from the premises to be burnt, buried or otherwise disposed of in such manner as to prevent the breeding of flies or the creation of any nuisance.

7. The licensee shall maintain order within the premises of the *market/fair.

8. The licensee shall provide a separate portion of land in or near the premises of the *market/fair for the parking of vehicles.

9. The licensee shall provide a sufficient number of fly-proof receptacles with close fitting lids for the deposit of rubbish and refuse.

10. The licensee shall provide on the premises of the *market/fair a sufficient number of latrines of a type approved by the Chairman on the recommendation of the Medical Officer of Health.

11. This licence may be suspended by the Chairman on the recommendation of the Medical Officer of Health during any epidemic and the licensee shall not be entitled to any compensation in respect of such suspension.

* Strike out whichever is inapplicable.

IV.—Slaughter-houses.

1. No person shall at any slaughter-house slaughter any animal—

(a) unless that animal has been inspected by the Medical Officer of Health and approved by him as fit to be slaughtered for human consumption; or

(b) at any time after the expiry of a period of thirty hours from the time of approval of that animal under paragraph (a); or

(c) except between 9 A.M. and 12 noon on any day: Provided that the Chairman may in exceptional circumstances authorise the slaughter of any animal at any time other than that herein specified.

2. No person shall at any slaughter-house slaughter any animal which has been removed alive from the slaughter-house premises after it was approved under by-law 1, unless it is again inspected and approved under that by-law as fit to be slaughtered for human consumption.

3. (1) The Medical Officer of Health may prohibit the slaughter of any animal if, after it has been approved under by-law 1, it has been found to be diseased or unfit to be slaughtered for human consumption.

(2) No person shall slaughter any animal the slaughter of which is prohibited under this by-law.

4. Every person who brings any animal into the premises of a slaughter-house shall take all such measures as may be necessary to ensure that that animal is adequately fed and watered while it remains in those premises.

5. Every person who brings any animal into the premises of a slaughter-house shall, if the animal is rejected as unfit for slaughter, forthwith remove the animal or cause it to be removed from those premises.

6. If the carcase or offal of any animal slaughtered at any slaughter house is, in the opinion of the Medical Officer of Health, diseased or unfit for human consumption, he shall cause the carcase or offal to be forthwith destroyed or disposed of so as to prevent such carcase or offal being exposed for sale or used for human food. Except under the direction of the Medical Officer of Health, no person shall remove any such carcase or offal from the slaughter-house.

7. The keeper of a slaughter-house shall not permit the slaughter therein of any animal which has not been approved as fit to be slaughtered for human consumption, or the slaughter of which has been prohibited under by-law 3.

8. No person shall remove from the slaughter-house the carcase of any animal intended for human consumption unless such carcase has been stamped on its fore quarters and hind quarters by the keeper of the slaughter-house with the letters “V.C.A.P.” and with such one of the marks “Australian Beef”, “Country Beef”, “Mutton Goat”, “Mutton Sheep”, or “Pork”, as may be appropriate to the case.

9. No animal shall be slaughtered in the presence of any other animal or until the carcase of every animal previously slaughtered in the premises has been removed or screened off and the premises cleaned.

10. No person who is suffering or who has suffered from any contagious, cutaneous or infectious disease or has been in attendance on any person suffering from such disease shall be permitted by the person in charge of any slaughter-house to enter such slaughter-house or take part in the slaughtering of any animal until the periods of infection and incubation have elapsed.

11. It shall be lawful for the Medical Officer of Health to enter and inspect at all reasonable times any slaughter-house, and the person in charge thereof shall render him all such assistance as may be necessary.

12. A fee at the following rates shall be paid in advance to the Committee for the use of any slaughter-house established by the Committee, and no animal shall be slaughtered without an official receipt in proof of payment of the fee—

For cattle	..	One rupee per head
For sheep or goats	..	Fifty cents per head
For pigs	..	Fifty cents per head

13. The keeper of every slaughter-house shall maintain in such form as the Committee may direct a register of particulars relating to each animal slaughtered at the slaughter-house.

14. The powers conferred on the Medical Officer of Health by these by-laws may be exercised by any Officer acting under the general or special directions of the Medical Officer of Health.

15. In these by-laws :—

- “animal” means any head of cattle, goat, sheep or pig;
- “cattle” includes buffaloes;
- “Chairman” means the Chairman of the Committee;
- “Committee” means the Dambadeniya Village Committee;
- “Medical Officer of Health” includes a Field Medical Officer.

V.—Dangerous Trades.

1. The following trades shall be deemed to be dangerous trades—

- (a) Storing copra.
- (b) Storing straw.
- (c) Manufacturing or storing fibre.
- (d) Manufacturing coconut oil by mills or chekkus.
- (e) Manufacturing desiccated coconut.

2. (1) No person shall carry on any dangerous trade unless he is the holder of a licence issued in that behalf by the Chairman on the recommendation of the Medical Officer of Health.

(2) Every licence shall, unless it is cancelled under by-law 4, expire on 31st day of December in the year in respect of which it is issued.

(3) No licence shall be transferable.

3. No person shall be entitled to a licence to carry on any dangerous trade unless—

- (1) the place at which that trade is to be carried on is approved by the Medical Officer of Health; and
- (2) the building or buildings, if any, to be used for the purposes of that trade are in conformity with the following requirements—

- (a) the building must be in good repair, well ventilated, well lighted, and provided with adequate drainage and latrine accommodation;
- (b) the roof of such building must be made of some permanent material, and the floor must be cemented;
- (c) the eaves of such building must be not less than six feet from the ground;
- (d) every room in such building must be provided with windows capable of being opened and the area of such windows when open shall be not less than one-fifteenth of the superficial floor space;
- (e) the wall of every room in such building must be not less than seven feet in height, and must be built of bricks, stone or cabook;
- (f) the internal surface of such walls, to a height of at least four feet from the floor, must be plastered in cement and the rest of the wall must be lime-plastered and lime-washed; and
- (g) the woodwork of such building must be oil painted or lime washed.

4. If at any time during the period for which a licence has been issued, any building used for the purposes of the dangerous trade to which the licence relates, ceases to conform to the provisions of by-law 3, the Chairman may on the recommendation of the Medical Officer of Health, cause a notice to be served on the licensee requiring him to do before a day to be specified in the notice all things necessary to make such building conform to such provisions and if the licensee fails to comply with the requirements of such notice within the time specified therein, the Chairman may cancel the licence.

5. Any notice under by-law 4 shall be deemed to have been served on the licensee if it is affixed to the premises at which the licensee carries on the dangerous trade or if it is left with any person employed in such premises by the licensee.

6. Every licensee shall cause—

- (a) the floor of every building used for the purposes of the dangerous trade to be swept and cleaned daily.
- (b) the walls of every such building to be lime washed at least once in every 12 months;
- (c) all apparatus, implements and vessels used in such trade to be kept clean, and

(d) all refuse, sweepings, scrapings and waste and by-products which are not to be subjected to further trade processes to be removed daily in covered receptacles from the premises in which such trade is carried on.

7. No licensee shall pollute or contaminate any well or tank or any river, stream, canal, channel, lake or other inland water.

8. No licensee shall carry on any dangerous trade in any manner likely to cause a nuisance to, or to be injurious to the health or comfort of persons in the neighbourhood.

9. Every licensee shall cause any offensive vapours or gases which are omitted in the course of carrying on any dangerous trade—

- (a) to be discharged into the external air in such a manner and at such a height as to admit of their diffusion without injurious or offensive effects; or
- (b) to be passed directly through a fire or into a condensing apparatus.

10. It shall be lawful for the Chairman or the Medical Officer of Health or the Sanitary Assistant or any Officer of the Committee authorised in writing by the Chairman at all reasonable times to enter upon and inspect any premises at which any dangerous trade is being carried on, and the licensee or person in charge thereof shall permit such inspection to be made.

11. In these by-laws :—

- “Chairman” means the Chairman of the Committee,
- “Committee” means the Dambadeniya Village Committee,
- “Medical Officer of Health” includes a Field Medical Officer,
- “Licence” means a licence issued under those by-laws,
- “Licensee” means a person to whom a licence is issued,
- “Dangerous Trade” means any of the trades specified in by-law 1.

Regulation.

The regulations relating to the Post Office Savings Bank published in *Gazette* No. 5,264 of December 29, 1893, and therein referred to as “rules”, as amended by any subsequent regulations, are hereby further amended as follows :—

(1) in regulation 2 (1)—

(e) 3½ per cent. per annum where the amount of the loan is Rs. 100,000 and over.

Internal Purchase Scheme.*Harvesting of Paddy in Kuruwiti, Nawadun and Kukul Korales of Ratnapura District for the 1946 Yala Season.*

BY virtue of the powers vested in me by the Defence (Miscellaneous) Regulation, 37, the Defence (Purchase of Foodstuffs) Regulations 1942, the Defence (Paddy Cultivation) Regulations, 1943, and the Defence (Food Rationing) (Special Provinces) Regulations, 1944, I, Molvill Keverne Trclawny Sandys, Government Agent, Province of Sabaragamuwa, a competent and a proper authority, do, by this Order, direct that every owner or cultivator of any land which is cultivated with paddy during the Yala Season of 1946, and which is situated within the Divisional Revenue Officers' Divisions of Kuruwiti, Nawadun and Kukul korales of the Ratnapura District shall—

- Inform the Village Headman of the area in which the paddy land is situated of the date on which it is proposed to reap the harvest on that land, not less than 10 clear days ahead;
- Give the Village Headman or other person authorised by me, at this request, the following information relating to the land—
 - the name, situation and extent of the land;
 - the names and addresses of the person or persons entitled to take or receive any part of the produce of the land, under any contract or agreement or otherwise; and
 - the share or shares of the produce to which such person or persons may be entitled.

2. I do further direct that—

- No paddy shall be removed or caused or permitted to be removed by any person from a field or threshing floor to a barn or any other place of storage until the Village Headman or other person authorised by me shall have assessed and recorded the total harvest and the shares; and accept on a permit obtained from the proper authority in terms of paragraph 4 of this Order;
- The Government levy of one bushel of paddy per acre for Kuruwiti and Nawadun korales and two bushels of paddy per acre for Kukul korale for Yala 1946 shall be handed to the Village Headman;
- No paddy shall, without prior authority, be disposed of in any manner other than by way of consumption at approved rates by the owners and his *bona fide* dependants subject to a maximum of 50 bushels or such lower quantity as they may be entitled to until the following harvest;
- No paddy shall be utilized for consumption by an owner or his dependants possessing a rice ration book until the surrender of the appropriate number of rice coupons;
- Any paddy in excess of the requirements for consumption as laid down in clause (3) and, in the case of those who normally supply seed paddy and customarily feed labourers during cultivation operations, any paddy in excess of the requirements for consumption, seed paddy at the rate of two bushels of paddy per acre and feeding allowance at the rate of one bushel of paddy per acre or such other quantity of paddy as I may order shall be sold to the Village Headman on behalf of Government.

3. The approved rates of consumption of paddy by producers at present are six measures of paddy per person per week, in the case of cultivators and owner-cultivators and their dependants and four measures of paddy per person per week, in the case of non-cultivating owners and their dependants. Coupons in respect of paddy shall be surrendered at the rate of one rice coupon for every six measures of paddy

received by a cultivator or an owner-cultivator and one rice coupon for every four measures of paddy received by a non-cultivating owner.

4. Permits for transport of paddy from the field or threshing floor to a barn situated within the same Village Headman's Division or from one Village Headman's Division to another within the same D. R. O.'s Division shall be obtained from the Village Headman concerned, who will obtain the signature of the remover on the copy of the permit on form IPS 33A as a proof of removal. For transport from one Divisional Revenue Officer's Division to another or from one Emergency A. G. A.'s area to another, or from one District to another, applications should be made to the Government Agent, Assistant Government Agent or to the Assistant Government Agent (Emergency) of the area in which the applicant is resident giving all particulars asked for in form D. F. C. 34 (duplicate) copies of which can be obtained from any of the above officers.

Harvesting of Paddy in the Colombo Mudaliyar's Division, Colombo District.

BY virtue of the powers vested in me by Defence (Miscellaneous) Regulation 37, the Defence (Purchase of Foodstuffs) Regulations and the Defence (Paddy Cultivation) Regulations, all proprietors and cultivators of paddy land situated within the Colombo Mudaliyar's Division (outside the Colombo Municipality), Colombo District, are hereby required to furnish the headmen of their divisions with the following information before August 25, 1946:—

- (a) the name, situation and extent of the paddy field;
- (b) the date on which it is proposed to reap the harvest of the land;

No proprietor or cultivator will be permitted to remove any paddy gathered during the forthcoming Yala harvest from the fields or threshing floors until a record of such paddy gathered at the field or threshing floor is taken by the village headman of the area concerned. After a record of such paddy has been taken by the Village Headman, the cultivators or proprietors may remove their paddy on a written pass obtained from the Village Headman concerned if the barn is situated within the Colombo Mudaliyar's Division (outside the Colombo Municipality), Colombo District. If the paddy is to be removed to another pattu or korale within or outside the Colombo District, a written pass should be obtained from the Divisional Revenue Officer (Emergency), Nugagoda.

3. Coupons representing the paddy allowed for the consumption of cultivators and/or proprietors within the Colombo Mudaliyar's Division (outside the Colombo Municipality), Colombo District, should be surrendered to the Village Headman (at the time a record of paddy gathered is taken) by the cultivators and/or proprietors residing within the Colombo Mudaliyar's Division (outside the Colombo Municipality), Colombo District.

4. Before any action regarding the removal of paddy from the threshing floor or field can be made, the levy of paddy imposed by Government from each acre of field which is a first charge on the crop should be delivered to the Village Headman at the threshing floor.

Harvesting of Paddy in Matale District, Headquarters Area, Yala, 1946.

BY virtue of the powers vested in me by the Defence (Miscellaneous) Regulation 37, the Defence (Purchase of Foodstuffs) Regulations, 1942, and the Defence (Paddy Cultivation) Regulations, 1943, I, Cathiravelu Sittampalam, Assistant Government Agent, Matale, do hereby direct:

(1) That all persons harvesting paddy within the Chief Headman's Division of Matale South and that part of the Divisional Revenue Officer's Division of Matale east, comprising Matale Pallesiya pattu, Laggala Udasiya and Pallesiya pattus and Pussolla, Gurubebila, Kumbaloluwa, Narangolla and Raitalawa wasamas in Arambangu korale and Puwak-pitiya, Pottotawola and Kandepitawala wasamas in Gangala Udasiya pattu shall give ten days notice of the harvesting to the Village Headman of the area in which the paddy field is situated.

(2) That any owner, cultivator, shareholder or other person having interest in any paddy field or fields situated within the areas mentioned in clause (1) of this notice—

(a) shall not remove any paddy from the fields or from the threshing floor until a record of such paddy is taken by the Velmuladeniya of the area concerned and until the levy of one bushel per acre in respect of the Yala season has been handed over to the Village Headman;

(b) may remove any threshed paddy thereafter from the threshing floor to his barn or other place of storage situated within the same Chief Headman's division or Divisional Revenue Officer's Division, only on a permit on form I.P.S. 33 obtained from the Village Headman or the Velmuladeniya of the area provided the place to which the paddy is transported does not fall within the place mentioned in clause (c) below;

(c) may remove any threshed paddy thereafter from the threshing floor to his barn or other place of storage situated within the U. C. limits of Matale Town, only on a permit obtained from the Assistant Government Agent, Matale, to whom such applications for transport should be made;

(d) shall retain the paddy so removed to the barn or other place of storage until the sale to Government of such quantity as I may order. All paddy in excess of the quantity allowable for consumption will be bought by me. The approved rates of allowances for consumption are six measures paddy per head per week in the case of cultivators and owner-cultivators and their dependants, and four measures paddy per head per week in the case of non-cultivating owners and their dependants subject to a maximum of fifty bushels paddy per household per cultivating season.

(3) That for the transport of paddy from the Chief Headman's Division or the Divisional Revenue Officer's Division to another, or from one Emergency Assistant Government Agent's area to another, or from one district to another, application in duplicate should be made to the Assistant Government Agent or the Deputy Food Controller of the area in which the applicant resides on form DFC 34, copies of which are available at any Kachcheri.

(4) That if no application for removal is made within six weeks from the date of harvesting in the manner specified above, all stocks of paddy are liable to be requisitioned under the Internal Purchase Scheme.

- (a) (1) shall inform the Village Headman of the area in which the paddy field is situated.
- (2) the dates of the reaping of harvest not less than ten clear days ahead in each case ;
- (3) the name, situation and extent of land ;
- (4) the names and addresses of the person or persons entitled to take or receive any part of the produce ;
- (5) the details of the share or shares of the produce to which such person or persons may be entitled.
- (b) shall not remove any paddy harvested in Yala 1946, from the threshing floor until the harvest has been checked and verified by the Village Headman or by any officer authorised by me in writing and until the acreage levy has been delivered to the Village Headman at the rate of one bushel per acre of clean well-winnowed paddy in respect of fields cultivated for Yala.

2. I do further direct that—

- (a) removal thereafter to the barn or other place of storage within the same Chief Headman's or D. R. O's division shall only be on a permit on form I. P. S. 33 (a) issued by the Village Headman of the area.
- (b) any person who desires to remove the whole or part of the crop of any field situated in any of the above three divisions to a place outside that division but not outside the (Emergency) area of Kandy shall apply to the Assistant Government Agent (E) of the area in which he resides on form D. F. C. 34 in duplicate within 4 weeks of harvesting of his crop.
- (c) removal out of this emergency area shall only be on a permit issued by me. Applications for permits should be made in duplicate on form D. F. C. 34, to the Revenue Officer or the A. G. A. (E) of the area in which the applicant resides. Such applications should be made at least two weeks in advance of the proposed date of transport out of this emergency area.
- (d) if in the case of (a), (b) and (c) no application is made for removal within four weeks from the date of the threshing in the manner described above the stock of paddy not so applied for is liable to be requisitioned under the Internal Purchase Scheme.

3. No shareholder shall dispose of any paddy in any way except so much as is allowable for the consumption and other purposes at the following rates :—

- (a) A customary allowance of one bushel per acre ;
- (b) An allowance of two bushels per acre for seed purposes ;
- (c) A consumption allowance of 6 measures per head per week to cultivators and owner-cultivators and the members of their house holds; and 4 measures per head per week to non-cultivating owners and the members of their households for 12 months if the fields are cultivated only once a year, and for 6 months if the fields are cultivated for both seasons, subject to the proviso that the maximum quantity allowable to a producer during any cultivation for consumption will be 50 bushels.
- (d) All remaining paddy must be delivered to the Village Headman of the area at his house or store. Government shall accept only well-dried and well-winnowed paddy for which payment will be made at Rs. 6 per bushel after delivery to the Village Headman.
- (e) Coupons shall be deducted from all ration book holders in respect of the paddy allowed for consumption under paragraph 3 (c) above on the following basis by the Village Headman ;
 - (i.) one rice coupon for every six measures of paddy received by cultivators and owner-cultivators.
 - (ii.) One rice coupon for every four measures of paddy received by non-cultivating owners.

4. It should be carefully noted that it is an offence not to comply with this Order. Further, if no application is made for the removal of paddy as required, all stocks of paddy are liable to be requisitioned under the Internal Purchase Scheme.

5. D. F. C. 34 is the usual form that has been filled before permits to transport rice or paddy are given and the information is requested in advance so that everything possible

may be done to verify the information given in the form and expedite the issue of permit. Copies of D. F. C. 34 can be obtained at my office.

Notice to Producers of Paddy in Alutkuru and Hapitigam Korales.—Yala and Dewareddiri, 1946.

BY virtue of the powers vested in me by the Defence (Miscellaneous) Regulation 37, the Defence (Purchase of Foodstuffs) Regulations, 1942, the Defence (Paddy Cultivation) Regulations, 1943, and the Defence (Food Rationing) (Special Provisions) Regulations, 1944, I, Cecil Theodore Perera, Assistant Government Agent (Emergency), Alutkuru and Hapitigam korales, a competent and proper authority, do, by this Order, direct that every owner or cultivator of any land which is cultivated with paddy during the 1946 Yala and Dewareddiri seasons and which is situated within the Chief Headman's Divisions of Alutkuru korale South, Alutkuru korale North B, Alutkuru korale North A and Hapitigam korale shall —

- (1) inform the Village Headman of the area in which the paddy land is situated of the date on which it is proposed to reap the harvest on that land, not less than 10 clear days ahead;
- (2) give the Village Headman or other person authorised by me, at his request, the following information relating to the land :—
 - (a) the name, situation and extent of the land;
 - (b) the names and addresses of the person or persons entitled to take or receive any part of the produce of the land, under any contract or agreement or otherwise; and
 - (c) the share or shares of the produce to which such person or persons may be entitled.

2. I do further direct that—

- (1) no paddy shall be removed or caused or permitted to be removed by any person from a field or threshing floor to a barn or any other place of storage until the Village Headman or other person authorised by me shall have assessed and recorded the total harvest and the shares; and except on a permit on due form obtained from the proper authority in terms of paragraph 4 of this Order;

(2) the Government levy of two bushels per acre on every paddy field cultivated for the Dewareddiri season and one bushel per acre on every field cultivated for Yala season shall be handed over to the Village Headman at the threshing floor;

(3) no paddy shall, without prior authority, be disposed of in any manner other than by way of consumption at approved rates by the owner and his *bona fide* dependants subject to a maximum of 50 bushels or such lower quantity as they may be entitled to until the following harvest;

(4) no paddy shall be utilized for consumption by an owner or his dependant possessing a rice ration book until the surrender of the appropriate number of rice coupons;

(5) any paddy excess of the requirements for consumption as laid down in clause (3) and in the case of those who normally supply seed paddy and customarily feed labourers during cultivation operations, any paddy in excess of the requirements for consumption, seed paddy at the rate of two bushels of paddy per acre and feeding allowance at the rate of one bushel of paddy per acre, or such other quantity of paddy as I may order shall be sold to the Village Headman on behalf of Government.

3. The approved rates of consumption of paddy by producers at present are six measures of paddy per person per week in the case of cultivators and owner-cultivators and their dependants and four measures of paddy per person per week in the case of non-cultivating owners and their dependants. Coupons in respect of paddy shall be surrendered at the rate of one rice coupon for every six measures of paddy received by a cultivator or any owner-cultivator and one rice coupon for every four measures of paddy received by a non-cultivating owner. In this connection the attention of all paddy producers is drawn to the Defence (Food Rationing) (Special Provisions) Regulations, 1944, by which the onus of surrender of coupons equivalent to the quantity of paddy obtained is laid on the producers themselves.

4. Permits for transport of paddy from the field or threshing floor to a barn situated within the same Chief Headman's or Divisional Revenue Officer's Division shall be obtained from the Village Headman concerned who will obtain the signature of the remover on the duplicate of the permit on Form D. F. S. & C. 12 or I. P. S. 33 in proof of removal and detach the requisite number of coupons from the rice ration books of the members of the producer's household. It is important that those permits should be surrendered to the Village Headman of the area to which the paddy is transported within three days of such removal thereof. For transport from one Chief Headman's or Divisional Revenue Officer's division to another or from one Emergency A. G. A's area to another, or from one district to another, application should be made to the Government Agent, Assistant Government Agent, or the Assistant Government Agent (Emergency) of the area in which the applicant is resident giving all particulars asked for in Form D. F. C. 34 (duplicate), copies of which can be obtained from any of the above officers. To expedite the issue of permits the applicants are requested to produce reports from the Village Headman or any other authorised person of the areas of their residence and of the areas in which the paddy lands are situated giving particulars of their households and of their shares of paddy from the various fields.

5. If no application is made in the manner described above within six weeks from the date of harvesting, all stocks of paddy are liable to be requisitioned under the Internal Purchase Scheme.

Surveying and Levelling Examination.

THE examination for the Surveyor-General's licence in surveying and levelling, will be held in two parts, written and practical. The written examination will begin on October 7, and the practical examination on November 11, 1946.

2. The examination will be held in Colombo only.

3. To enter for the above examination application must be made on the forms prescribed by the regulations. These forms can be obtained from the Surveyor-General.

(i.) An applicant to sit for this examination should produce a certificate to the effect that he has passed the Cambridge Senior Examination or any other equivalent or higher examination, or a certificate from the Principal of the Ceylon Technical College or the Head of any Government or Assisted School or any other school, which in the opinion of the Surveyor-General is a recognized educational institution, to show that he has studied Arithmetic, Algebra, Geometry and Trigonometry up to the standard specified in paragraph 5 (ii.) & (iii.) in the syllabus given below.

(ii.) Each applicant must also produce a certificate to show that he has studied surveying, or levelling, or both surveying and levelling, at the Ceylon Technical College or under a duly Licensed Surveyor, Leveller, or Surveyor and Leveller, for at least one year before the examination.

4. Candidates must pay the following fees to the Surveyor-General before the date of closing of entries, viz., September 6, 1946 :—

5. The subjects of the written examination will be as follows :—

(i.) *English*.—one paper.—[An exercise in composition and questions set to test the candidate's knowledge and command of English.

(ii.) *Arithmetic and Algebra*.—one paper.—[*Arithmetic*.—The principles and process of arithmetic applied to whole numbers and vulgar and decimal fractions. The metric system. Approximations to a specified degree of accuracy. Contracted methods of multiplication and division of decimals. Ratio and proportion; percentage. Averages. Practical applications of arithmetic.

Algebra.—Symbolical expression of general results in arithmetic, algebraic laws and their applications. Factors of simple binomial or quadratic expressions; Equations of the first or second degree, and problems leading thereto. Square root. Graphs of simple rational integral algebraic functions. Arithmetical and harmonical progression. Geometrical progression. Theory of indices, Logarithms and the use of logarithmic tables. Binomial theorem for a positive integral index.

(iii.) *Geometry and Trigonometry*.—one paper.

[*Geometry*.—The subjects of Euclid I.-IV., with simple deductions, including easy loci and the areas of triangles and parallelograms, of which the bases and altitudes are given commensurable length. (All proofs of geometrical theorems must be geometrical. Euclid's proofs will not be insisted upon). Similar figures. Mensuration of the circle. Mensuration of the simpler solid bodies, namely, the cube, the rectangular block, the tetrahedron, the sphere, the cylinder, the wedge, the pyramid, and the cone.

Trigonometry.—Up to and including the solution of triangles, together with the practical solutions of triangles and applications, and numerical examples involving the use of logarithmic and other tables.

(iv.) *Surveying*.—one paper.—[Chain surveying. The transit and cradle theodolites, their use and their adjustments. Theodolites and compass traverses including the use of plane rectangular co-ordinates. Curve ranging. Subtense methods and tacheometry. Plane table surveying. Plane triangulation. The determination of azimuth by astronomical observations.

(v.) *Levelling*.—one paper.—[The dumpy, Y and Cooke's reversible levels, their use and their adjustments. The practice and theory of levelling. Computation of earth-work. Road and Railway surveys and setting out. Surveys for water supply works. Contours and the calculation of contents therefrom.

The percentages of marks required for a pass will be : in papers (i.), (ii.), and (iii.), 40 per cent. in each paper and 50 per cent. in aggregate; in papers (iv.), and (v.) 60 per cent.

6. Candidates in Surveying only will be required to pass in papers (i.)-(iv.) inclusive; and candidates in Levelling only in paper (v.)

7. Candidates who fail in the written examination will not be required to present themselves for the practical examination.

8. Candidates who pass the written examination will be duly notified of the time and place of the practical examination which will be set on the syllabuses in surveying and levelling of the written examination.

9. Candidates will work in the field between hours fixed by the Examiner, and must produce instruments in good order. Defects in instruments will not be accepted as an excuse for bad work. Candidates found to be in communication with anyone during examination hours will be disqualified.

10. All candidates must provide their own instruments, poles, pickets, drawing boards, drawing materials, stationery, labourers, &c., and no assistance in providing requirements will be given in any way.

11. No application will be accepted after September 6, 1946.

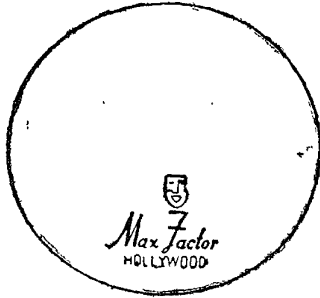
