THE DEFENCE (TRADING WITH THE ENEMY)
 REGULATIONS, 1939.

Order.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred on the Governor by regulations 1 (2), 5 and 6A of the Defence (Trading with the Enemy) Regulations, 1939, which continue in force by virtue of the Emergency Laws (Transitional Provisions) Order, 1946, I, John Curtois Howard, Officer Administering the Government of Ceylon do hereby—

- (1) authorise any person in Ceylon, unless otherwise directed by me, to trade with any individual or body of persons to whom this paragraph applies, notwithstanding anything contained in regulation 1 of those Regulations;
 - (2) sanction the transfer, by or on behalf of any individual or body of persons to whom this paragraph applies, of any such annuities, stock, shares, bonds, debentures or debenture stock registered or inscribed in any register, branch register or other book kept in Ceylon, as may on or after the twentieth day of September, 1946, come into the ownership of that individual or body;
 - (3) order that Articles 1, 4 and 5 of the Trading with the Enemy (Custodian) Order, 1940, (which require payment of certain moneys to the Custodian of Enemy Property and impose restrictions and requirements in regard to the property in Ceylon of enemies), shall not apply to
 - (a) any money which would but for the existence of a state of war become payable on or after the twentieth day of September, 1946, to or for the benefit of any individual or body of persons, to whom this paragraph applies,
 - (b) any property which on or after the twentieth day of September, 1946, comes into the ownership of any such individual or body of persons, or
 - (c) any money or property to which the aforesaid Articles would apply only because any such individual or body of persons became resident or commenced or recommenced to carry on business in French Indo-China on or after the fifteenth day of August, 1945;
- and
- (4) declare that the preceding paragraphs (1), (2), and (3) shall apply—
 - (a) to any individual resident in French Indo-China;
 - (b) as respects any business carried on in French Indo-China, to any individual or body of persons (whether corporate or unincorporate) carrying on that business so long as—
 - (i) that individual is not resident in the territory of a state at war with His Majesty, or
 - (ii) that body is not controlled by an individual so resident or by a body of persons constituted or incorporated in, or under the laws of, any such state;

- (c) as respects any business carried on in any territory which is not an area for the time being to be treated as enemy territory for the purposes of the aforesaid regulations 5 and 6A in accordance with the provisions of the Defence (Trading with the Enemy) (No. 3) Regulations, to any body of persons (whether corporate or unincorporate) carrying on that business if and so long as that body is controlled by an individual resident in French Indo-China or a body of persons carrying on business in French Indo-China which is not controlled by an individual resident in a state at war with His Majesty or by a body of persons constituted or incorporated in, or under the laws of, any such state.

THE DEFENCE (TRADING WITH THE ENEMY)
 REGULATIONS, 1939.

Order.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred on the Governor by regulation 4 of the Defence (Trading with the Enemy) Regulations, 1939, which continues in force by virtue of the Emergency Laws (Transitional Provisions) Order, 1946, I, John Curtois Howard, Officer Administering the Government of Ceylon, do by this Order sanction any assignment of any chose in action, any transfer of a negotiable instrument, and any transfer of any coupon or other security transferable by delivery and which is not a negotiable instrument, being an assignment or a transfer made by or on behalf of any of the following:—

- (a) any individual resident in territory not being an area which is under the sovereignty of a Power with whom His Majesty is at war;
 - (b) as respects any business carried on in any such territory, any individual or body of persons (whether corporate or unincorporate) carrying on that business; and
 - (c) as respects any business carried on in any territory which is neither enemy territory nor an area which is for the time being to be treated as enemy territory for the purposes of the aforesaid regulation 4 in accordance with the provisions of the Defence (Trading with the Enemy) (No. 3) Regulations, any body of persons (whether corporate or unincorporate) carrying on that business if and so long as the body is controlled by any individual resident in, or body of persons carrying on business in, any such territory.
2. Nothing in this Order shall apply to any assignment or transfer made by or on behalf of—
- (a) any State or Sovereign of a State at war with His Majesty,
 - (b) any individual resident in territory which is under the sovereignty of a Power with whom His Majesty is at war,
 - (c) any body of persons constituted or incorporated in, or under the laws of, a State at war with His Majesty,
 - (d) any body of persons (whether corporate or unincorporate) carrying on business in territory which is not under the sovereignty of a Power with whom His Majesty is at war, if and so long as the body is controlled by any such person as is mentioned in the preceding sub-paragraphs of this paragraph,
 - (e) as respects any business carried on in territory which is under the sovereignty of a Power with whom His Majesty is at war, any individual or body of persons (whether corporate or unincorporate) carrying on that business, or
 - (f) any person who is for the time being deemed by direction of the Governor to be an enemy for the purposes of the aforesaid Trading with the Enemy Regulations, 1939.

V. P. 41, in the village of Alakola-ela in the Chief Headman's Division of Matale North in the District of Matale, to be protected monuments for the purposes of that Ordinance.

Objections to the making of the above order must be received by the Archaeological Commissioner, Colombo, on or before December 1, 1946. Every such objection must contain a statement of the grounds upon which it is made.

(4) in paragraph (1) of rule 7, by the substitution for the words "in Schedule C hereto", of the words "in Schedule D hereto";

(5) in rule 10, by the insertion, immediately after the word "Lines", of the words "or call office line";

(6) in rule 11, by the substitution, for the words "Schedule C hereto", of the words "Schedule D hereto";

(7) in rule 15—

- (a) in the definition of "exchange line", by the substitution, for the word "premises", of the words "premises, but shall not include a call office line";
- (b) by the insertion, at the end thereof, of the following:—
 "attendant" means any person who has entered into an agreement with the Director for the maintenance of a call office at that person's premises;
 "call office line" means a telegraphic line and apparatus connecting an exchange with a call office;
 "caller" means any person who transmits or receives a telephone message at a call office.;

(8) by the re-lettering of Schedules B and C thereto as Schedules C and D respectively;

(9) by the insertion, immediately after Schedule A, of the following new Schedule:—

Schedule—B.

Telephone Call Office Agreement.

Colombo Exchange.

An Agreement made the _____ day of _____ One thousand nine hundred and _____ between _____, Director of Telecommunications (hereinafter referred to as the Director) acting herein for and on behalf of the Government of Ceylon, of the one part and _____ (hereinafter called "the Attendant") of the other part.

The attendant includes his heirs, the executors of his last will or the administrator of his estate.

Whereas the Attendant is the occupier of the premises known as _____ No. _____ (hereinafter referred to as "the said premises") and has agreed to allow free of rent the use of part hereof for the purpose of a Telephone Call Office with or without a cabinet and to undertake and perform the duties and obligations hereinafter mentioned.

Now it is hereby agreed by and between the parties hereto as follows:—

1. The Director shall at his own expense provide and maintain a Telephone Call Office at the said premises.

2. The Attendant will permit the Director at his own expense and free of rent to erect a signboard in a suitable position on the outside of the said premises.

3. The Attendant will by himself and his employees undertake and perform, to the satisfaction of the Director the duties of Call Office Attendant at the Call Office, and will carry out all instructions which may from time to time be given to him by the Director with reference thereto. The attendant will also keep the cabinet and telephone in a clean condition to the satisfaction of the Director.

4. The Call Office shall be kept open during the hours of _____ A.M. and _____ P.M. on week days and _____ A.M. and _____ P.M. on Sundays, and the Attendant shall permit all persons desiring to use the Call Office during such hours to do so. These hours shall be subject to alteration at the discretion of the Director.

5. The fee for use of the call office shall be 10 cents on each local call of six minutes' duration or less. Where trunk calls are allowed, the fees on such calls in addition to a Call Office fee payable and Disturbance Fee (if any) shall be paid at the rates prescribed by regulations made under the provisions of the Telecommunications Ordinance, No. 50 of 1944.

6. The Attendant shall pay on demand to the Director the certified amount due on account of all outgoing calls originated at the Call Office and sent from the Call Office, but not for incoming calls received at the Call Office.

7. The Attendant shall pay the same fees as any other caller for the use of the Call Office. He shall however be

entitled to have his name inserted in the Telephone Director free of charge.

8. The Attendant shall pay in advance by way of security for the due payment of fees for calls originated from the Call Office a minimum deposit of Rs. 20 which shall be increased when necessary up to the average amount due for one month in respect of such fees.

9. The Attendant shall be responsible for the safety of the instruments, apparatus, and other property placed by the Director on the said premises under this Agreement, and shall not damage, alter, or remove the same or allow them to be damaged, altered, or removed; or make or allow to be made any attachment to the same, and shall not do or suffer any act or thing whereby the same shall become liable to be seized or taken under any distress or process of law.

10. The Attendant shall on demand pay to the Director the certified cost of repairing, renewing or replacing in stock any part of the instruments, apparatus, or other property of the Director on the said premises which may be stolen or lost or which may be destroyed or damaged by fire or by chemical fumes or other cause (whether similar to fire or to chemical fumes or not).

11. The Director shall not be liable for any loss or damage which may be occasioned through the interruption of telephonic communication from any cause whatever, but in case of such interruption he will make every reasonable effort to restore communication as early as possible after receipt of notice of such interruption by the Supervisor of the Telephone Exchange.

12. The Attendant shall not divulge or make known to any person other than the Director any of the matters relating to the business of the Telecommunication Department or to any business of callers which may come to his knowledge in connection with the use of the Call Office. The Attendant hereby agrees to be bound by and shall accept as final the decision of the Postmaster-General as to whether or not he has committed a violation of this clause.

13. Should the Attendant fail to pay on demand the certified amount of any fees, charges, or damages due under this Agreement, the Director reserves to himself the right to disconnect the Call Office from the Exchange without notice and without prejudice to any other right or remedy of the Director under this Agreement.

14. Should the Attendant commit an act of bankruptcy or enter into any arrangement or composition with or for the benefit of his creditors or commit a breach of any of the stipulations herein contained, the Director shall be entitled to determine this Agreement forthwith or at any time thereafter by notice in writing, notwithstanding the waiver of any previous breach of this Agreement and without prejudice to any other right or remedy of the Director under this Agreement.

15. This Agreement shall be for a term of one year from the certified date on which the Call Office is first opened to the public and shall continue thereafter unless and until determined at the end of the said term or at any time thereafter by either party giving to the other one calendar month's previous notice in writing: Provided, however, if the Attendant has to leave the premises for whatever reason before the expiration of the term, it shall be open to him to determine the Agreement by giving to the Director one calendar month's previous notice in writing.

16. On the determination of this Agreement by any means the Attendant shall surrender to the Director all the instruments, apparatus, and other property of the Director in as good a condition as when placed on the said premises (ordinary wear and tear excepted) and the Director shall have access to the said premises for the purpose of removing the said instruments, apparatus, and property.

17. The Attendant shall make no claim against the Director on account of damage or injury caused by any electric current not emanating from the premises of the Director which may be conveyed to the said premises by means of the Call Office line. The Director shall, nevertheless, take all reasonable precautions to prevent damage or injury from this cause.

18. The Attendant shall not, without the consent in writing of the Director assign, underlet, or otherwise dispose of this Agreement or of any benefit or advantage thereunder.

19. Any notice which may be given by the Director under this Agreement shall be deemed to be duly given if left at the said premises or if sent by registered post to the Attendant's usual or last known place of address.

20. Nothing in this Agreement shall be regarded as entitling the Attendant to carry on the business of collecting, receiving or delivering messages or other communications transmitted by means of the Call Office or any business of a like kind.

21. In this Agreement the expression "the Director" means the person for the time being holding the Office of Director of Telecommunications, the expression "caller" means any person attending a Call Office for the purpose of originating or receiving a telephone message, and the expression

“certified” means certified under the hand of the Superintendent or Assistant Superintendent of Telecommunication Traffic and any such certificate shall be conclusive evidence of the matters certified.

THE CENSUS OF CEYLON, 1946.

THE statement published below gives figures of the population of Burghers, Eurasians and Euro-Ceylonese, and Europeans enumerated at the Census of March 19, 1946, inclusive of Ceylon residents enumerated with and by the Services. The classification is by provinces, and revenue districts (inclusive of Municipalities and Urban Council areas). All figures for 1946 are provisional.

For purposes of comparison, the 1921 census figures in respect of Burghers and Eurasians are given in Column 2 and in respect of Europeans in column 7. Columns 6 and 9 give the percentage increase or decrease over the 1921 figures of these racial groups in each area. Column 4 gives, for the first time in any Census publication, the number of Eurasians and Euro-Ceylonese grouped together and distinct from the Burghers.

It will be observed that the group of Burghers and Eurasians (including Euro-Ceylonese) shows an increase of 22.6 per cent. over the population of this group as recorded at the Census of 1921. The following table shows the numbers of Burghers and Eurasians enumerated at each census since 1871 with their rates of increase:—

The largest numerical increase of this group has occurred in the Colombo Revenue District, though the highest percentage increase has taken place in the Trincomalee Revenue District.

MOTOR CAR ORDINANCE, No. 45 OF 1938.

List of Applications for Licences for Lorries for 1946.

IN terms of section 46 of the Motor Car Ordinance, No. 45 of 1938, a list of applications for licences for lorries for the rest of the year, 1946 is published below for general information.

The following extract from the Ordinance applies to objections against the issue of licences, &c. :—

" 46 (2). (a) Any licensing authority, within whose area any part of the area of operation proposed by any applicant for a licence for a lorry is situated, may make objection against the issue of that licence, on payment of the prescribed fee, make objection against the issue of the licence to such other person.

46 (4). Any person, who is entitled under sub-section (2) to make objection to the issue of the licence, may, on payment of the prescribed fee*, inspect the application for that licence at any reasonable time at the Office of the Commissioner. Provided, however, that no fee shall be payable by any licensing authority in respect of the inspection of any application."

Objections must be made in the manner stated below to the Commissioner of Motor Transport, Colombo, so as to be received by him not later than 2 P.M., ON WEDNESDAY, OCTOBER 16, 1946.

1. Every objection in respect of an application for a licence for a lorry shall be made by a written statement on good and suitable paper which shall be signed by the person making the objection. Where the objection is made by any body corporate or firm, it shall be signed by a person duly authorized in that behalf by such body or partner of the firm, as the case may be.

2. Every objection shall be made in duplicate and the original shall, where the objection is made by any person other than a licensing authority, bear stamps (uncancelled) to the value of Rs. 2.50.

3. Every statement of objection shall set out the specific grounds on which the objection is based and shall indicate, by reference to the name of the applicant for the licence and to the distinctive number of the motor car the application is made in respect of which the objection is made.

4. No objection relating to more than one motor car shall be made in any one statement of objection. Any objections not conforming to these requirements will be of no avail.

Objectors under section 46 (2) are requested to state clearly in their objections the facts entitling them to object, &c., whether they are holders of valid licences or are themselves applicants for licences for lorries in respect of the whole or any part of the area of operation and additional services proposed by any applicant. They are also requested to give the registered number of their vehicles in the area applied for or cite the serial number of their applications as listed in the Gazette.

If the objection is in respect of a licence for a lorry "under construction" the serial number given to the application in the list should be quoted.
