KNOW Ye that by virtue of the powers vested in the Governor by section 3 (1) of the Dried Meat Ordinance (Chapter 337), I, John Curtois Howard, Officer Administering the Government of Ceylon, do by this Proclamation declare that it shall be unlawful to remove from the Divisional Revenue Officers' divisions specified in Schedule I hereto any dried meat in quantity exceeding fifteen pounds, except in accordance with the conditions set out in Schedule II hereto.

Schedule II.

Conditions.

1. In these conditions, unless the context otherwise requires—

- "dried meat" means the dried or salted flesh of any animal but does not include dried or salted fish, or any dried or salted meat which has been imported from, beyond the seas;
- "Assistant Government Agent" means the Assistant Government Agent, Puttalam; and
- "removal" means removal by land or water beyond the limits of any one of the Divisional Revenue Officers' divisions specified in Schedule I.

2. (1) The removal of dried meat of pig is permitted on a licence issued by the Assistant Government Agent and authorising the holder thereof to remove such meat.

(2) A fee of twenty rupees shall be payable for a licence under sub-paragraph (1).

(3) Every licence under sub-paragraph (1) shall be expressed to be in force for one year from the date of issue thereof.

(4) No licence under sub-paragraph (1) shall authorise or be deemed to authorise the removal of dried meat of pig from the Wilpattu Game Sanctuary and Pomparippu Sportmen's Reserve situated within the Puttalam District.

(5) The Assistant Government Agent may suspend or cancel a licence under sub-paragraph (1)—

- (a) on the outbreak of any disease among cattle or other animals, or
- (b) for any other reasonable cause affecting the public health

3. The removal of any dried meat is prohibited unless it is properly packed, and any dried meat shall be packed only at such places (hereinafter referred to as "packing depots") as the Assistant Government Agent shall approve.

4. To every portion of any dried meat that is packed there shall be left adhering a sufficient portion of the hide of the animal of which it is the flesh so as to enable the variety of the animal to be distinguished.

5. The removal of any dried meat from a packing depot is prohibited until the receptacle containing it has been numbered and marked in the manner prescribed by the Assistant Government Agent.

6. Every receptacle containing any dried meat shall, during removal, be accompanied by a pass which has been signed by the Assistant Government Agent or a person thereto authorised by him in writing and which specifies the contents of and the numbers and marks on the receptacle:

Provided, however, that where the removal of any such receptacle is by rail, the receptacle need not be accompanied by such pass, but the consignor shall show such pass to the Station Master of the Railway Station from which the receptacle is despatched.

7. The Assistant Government Agent may specify the route for the removal of any dried meat. Where such a route is specified, the dried meat shall not be removed by any route other than the route so specified.

8. The Assistant Government Agent or any person thereto authorised by him in writing may at any time inspect any packing depot and any receptacle therein used or capable of being used for the storing of any dried meat, and may open or order to be opened, in the depot, any receptacle suspected of containing any dried meat, and may remove a sample of any dried meat from the depot.

If an officer or rating of the Force, who is eligible for a pension or gratuity on the ground of disablement unreasonably refuses to undergo an operation or other medical treatment which in the opinion of a medical board appointed or recognized for the purpose by the Governor, would wholly remove or reduce in degree such disablement, such pension or gratuity may be wholly or partially withheld.

15. Wounds, injuries or disease which are due to the misconduct of the officer or rating of the Force concerned shall not be regarded as attributable to the conditions of service, or the conditions of training or exercise, as the case may be, and no pension or gratuity shall be payable in respect of disablement or death resulting therefrom.

16. (a) A disablement which is due to a wound, injury or disease which is not attributable to conditions of service but which has been and remains aggravated thereby shall be regarded as attributable to the conditions of such service.

(b) Where the death of an officer or rating is due to or hastened by the aggravation by the conditions of service of a wound, injury or disease not attributable to the conditions of such service, such wound, injury or disease shall, for the purpose of the application of regulation 27 (1) (c) of the regulations under section 10 (2) of the Naval Volunteer Ordinance (Chapter 254), be regarded as being attributable to the conditions of such service.

17. The pension payable to an officer or rating of the Force may be reduced or withheld if such officer or rating recovers partially or wholly from the disablement in respect of which such pension is paid.

18. The pension payable to the widow of an officer or rating of the Force may be withheld if such widow remarries: Provided that where the pension is so withheld, the pension payable in respect of the children, if any, of such officer or rating may be increased to that payable under paragraph 3 (b) or paragraph 10 of this schedule, as the case may be.

19. Pension may be withheld from the widow of an officer or rating of the Force, if she married such officer or rating after he had received the wound or injury or contracted the disease from which he died.

20. Pension may be withheld from the widow of an officer or rating of the Force, who at the time of the death of such officer or rating was separated from him, unless—

- (a) such an officer or rating was at the time of his death contributing to her support, or
- (b) the widow was entitled to support under a separation decree, maintenance order, or duly executed deed of separation.

21. If an officer or rating of the Force in receipt of a pension under regulation 27 (1) (b) of the regulations made under section 10 (2) of the Naval Volunteer Ordinance (Chapter 254) is called out under regulation 25 of the regulations made under section 10 (1) of the said Ordinance, such pension may be withheld for the period during which he is in receipt of pay and allowances under regulation 24 of the regulations made under section 10 (2) of the said Ordinance.

22. The following conditions should be fulfilled in respect of awards for step-children, adopted children and illegitimate children:—

- (a) For a step-child, the mother shall have married the officer or rating before he sustained the wound or injury or before he resigned or was discharged from the Force on account of disease, and the child shall have been regularly maintained in whole or in part by the officer or rating up to the date of any award or renewal of pension to him, or up to the date of his death, as the case may be.
- (b) For a legally adopted child, the child shall have been adopted by the officer or rating before he sustained the wound or injury, or before he resigned or was discharged from the Force on account of disease, unless the child would, but for the adoption have qualified for an allowance as a step-child or as an illegitimate child of the officer or rating.
- (c) For an illegitimate child, the child shall have been born before or within nine months after the date on which the officer or rating sustained the wound or injury, or the date on which he resigned or was discharged from the Force on account of disease, and the child shall have been regularly maintained in whole or in part by the officer or rating up to the date of any award or renewal of pension to him, or up to the date of his death, as the case may be, or shall have been the subject of a maintenance order in force against the officer or rating at the date of his death.

23. (1) The award to a parent or parents may be granted only if—
- (i.) the deceased does not leave a widow or legitimate or illegitimate child, step-child or adopted child eligible for a pension, and
 - (ii.) the parent or parents are in pecuniary need, and were either largely dependent on the deceased at the time of his death, or the father is deceased or incapable of self support through age or infirmity.
- (2) The pension of a parent who remarried shall cease from the date of remarriage.
24. The award to brothers and sisters may be granted only if—
- (i.) the deceased did not leave a widow, legitimate or illegitimate child, step-child or adopted child, or parent eligible for a pension; and
 - (ii.) the brothers and sisters were largely dependent on the deceased at the time of his death and, their pecuniary and other circumstances are such as, in the opinion of the Financial Secretary, would justify the grant.

CENSUS OF THE MALDIVE ISLANDS, 1946.

THE statement below is a preliminary report of the Census taken in the Maldives Islands in March, 1946, and is based on returns furnished by the Maldivian Government through its Representative, Mr. A. M. Amin Didi. All figures in this statement are provisional. The final report on the Census of the Maldives Islands will be incorporated in due course in the Ceylon Census Publications, 1946.

The aggregate population enumerated at the Census of 1946 on the several Atols, or clusters of islets, which constitute the Maldivian Archipelago is 82,068 as against 79,281 returned in 1931.

It will be observed that the population has actually increased only on 8 Atols. The largest increase has been on Malé Island, which is the capital of the Group and the seat of the Sultan and his Government. Three others showing an increase are Haddummati, Addu, and Fua Mulaku Island, which were reported in 1931 to be self-supporting in their food supplies.

7. Candidates who are already employed in Government Departments, whether in a permanent or temporary capacity, must forward their applications through the Heads of the Departments in which they are serving. If any candidate fails to do so, he will be regarded as disqualified.

Eligibility :—

8. Candidates must be of good character.

9. Candidates must be Ceylonese*.

10. Candidates must furnish proof when forwarding their applications that they have previously passed at least—

(a) The Cambridge Senior or the London Matriculation, or the Senior School Certificate (English) Examination ; or

(a) *Age* : The period of service during the war may be deducted from their ages in computing the age for the purpose of age limit.

(b) *Educational Qualifications* : The Cambridge Junior or the Junior School Certificate (English) Examination will be accepted.

(c) *Vacancies* : Twenty per cent. of the vacancies will be reserved for competition among eligible ex-service-men.

Their applications must also bear a duly cancelled stamp of Rupees Ten.

12. (i.) A certificate of the registration of the candidate's birth showing him to be born not earlier than August 1, 1924, and not later than August 1, 1929, and a certificate of good character signed by a responsible person, to the satisfaction of the Surveyor-General must be attached to the form of application.

(ii.) In the case of Ceylonese soldiers honourably discharged from the services the period of mobilized service since September 3, 1939, inclusive, will be deducted from their ages in computing the age for the purpose of age limit, provided they fulfil the other conditions.

(iii.) Certificates of birth issued for the purpose of the Code for Assisted Schools will not be accepted for this examination.

(iv.) Affidavits will not be accepted as substitutes for birth certificates.

(v.) If candidates submit certificates of registration in the register of past births, these certificates will be accepted only after consideration of the evidence by which the dates of birth were established. If the name appearing in the birth register differs either by alteration or addition, from the name by which a candidate is known—(a) the parent or guardian in the case of a candidate under the age of 21 years, should before obtaining a certificate, apply to the Registrar-General or his Assistant for such alteration in the manner set forth in section 19 of the Births and Deaths Registration Ordinance

* For the purpose of this examination a Ceylonese is—

(a) a British subject who is born in Ceylon, one of whose parents was born in Ceylon ; or

(b) a British subject who is a descendant of a person falling within category (a) ; or

(c) a British subject deemed by the Governor with the advice of the Board of Ministers, in view of special circumstances, to be a Ceylonese.

(Chapter 94, Legislative Enactments), and (b) in the case of a candidate over the age of 21 years, he should produce evidence to the satisfaction of the Surveyor-General that the certificate of birth forwarded applies to him.

(vi.) (c) A candidate who has been admitted to the examination and wishes to withdraw on account of illness should forward notice of his withdrawal to reach the Surveyor-General at least one day before the examination. A refund of the full value of stamps affixed to his application will then be made, provided his notice of withdrawal is accompanied by a certificate from a qualified medical officer to the effect that he is unfit to sit for the examination.

(d) In no other case will a refund be granted.
