THE PILGRIMAGES ORDINANCE.

Regulations for St. Anne's Festivals.

BY virtue of the powers vested in the Governor by section 2 of the Pilgrimages Ordinance (Chapter 133), I, John Curtois Howard, Officer Administering the Government of Ceylon, do by this notification make the regulations set out hereunder which shall be applicable to every pilgrimage to St. Anne's Church, Talawila in the Puttalam District of the North-Western Province.

Regulations.

1. In these regulations-

"Camp area" means (a) the area lying within the boundaries of each of the 'camps specified in Part I. of the Schedule hereto, and (b) the land specified in Part II. of that Schedule; and "Assistant Government Agent" means the Assistant Government Agent of the Puttalam and Chilaw

Districts

2. No person shall camp in any place within the camp area where camping is prohibited by special or general order of the Assistant Government Agent.

3. No person shall ease himself within the camp area except at the places provided for that purpose by, or with the approval of, the Assistant Government Agent.

4. No person shall deposit any liquid or solid refuse, or any rubbish, within the camp area except in the places or

any rubbish, within the camp area, except in the places or receptacles provided for that purpose by, or with the approval of, the Assistant Government Agent.

5. (a) No cattle shall be kept within the camp area, except those beyonds there are a shall be the camp area.

except those brought there for slaughter and those permitted by special or general order of the Assistant Government Agent to be kept within such area.

(b) No cattle shall be kept in the vicinity of the camp area except at a place sepcially appointed as a cattle gala or at a place approved in that behalf by the Assistant Government

Agent.

- (c) The person in charge of the cattle shall cause their droppings to be removed to the nearest place provided therefor shall at all times keep clean the place occupied by the cattle.
- 6. All prepared foods sold within the camp area shall be protected from files and dust by being (a) wrapped in or covered with clean paper or cloth, or (b) kept in closed glass cases, or (c) kept in other covered containers approved by the Medical Officer, or by the Sanitary Officer, in charge of the camp area.

7. No person who is likely to affect prejudicially the cleanliness of the camp area, and no person who is suffering from an infectious disease, shall be permitted to enter the

camp area.

In the event of an opidemic breaking out in the camp during the festival, the Assistant Government Agent area may direct the pilgrims to leave the place of pilgrimage, and may prescribe the routes and methods for their conveyance.

9. Every person within the camp area who is suffering from an infectious disease or a contagious disease, and every person who resides with him knowing that he is so suffering, shall report the ease to the Medical Officer or the Sanitary

Officer, in charge of the camp area.

10. When any tank or well within the camp area is set apart for any particular purpose and a notice to that effect is exhibited on the spot, no person shall use the tank or well for any purpose other than that for which it is set apart.

11. manufactory, tea or coffee boutique, eating house, or any boutique where prepared food is exposed for sale, or any gala, within the camp area without previously obtaining a licence from the Assistant Government Agent permitting him to do so. The licence shall be issued free of charge.

12. No person shall, without the previous sanction of the Assistant Government Agent, construct any booth, or extend

any building within the camp area, so as to encroach on the main or other streets of the camp.

13. No person shall, without the previous sanction of the Assistant Government Agent, discharge fireworks or firearms within the camp area or within a radius of one mile from the boundaries of such area.

14. No person shall slaughter any animal within the camp area except in the place provided for that purpose by, or with the approval of, the Assistant Government Agent, and every person slaughtering any animal in such a place shall be responsible for its cleanliness.

15. The Assistant Government Agent may at his discretion order that all vehicles or any class of vehicles shall proceed in one direction only on any road to Talawila from Etalai or

Palakudah.

THE DEFENCE (TRADING WITH THE ENEMY) REGULATIONS, 1939.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred on the Governor by regulations 1 (2), 4, 5, and 6A of the Defence (Trading with the Enemy) Regulations, 1939, which continue in force by virtue of the Emergency Laws (Transitional Provisions) Order, 1946, I, John Curtois Howard, Officer Administering the Government of Ceylon, do hereby-

(1) authorise any person in Ceylon, unless otherwise directed by me, to trade with any individual or body of persons to whom this paragraph applies, notwith-standing anything contained in regulation 1 of those Regulations;

(2) sanction any assignment of a chose in action, any transfer of a negotiable instrument, and any transfer of any coupon or other security which is transferable

by delivery and which is not a negotiable instrument, being an assignment or a transfer made on or after the eighth day of November, 1946, by or on behalf of any individual or body of persons to whom this

paragraph applies;

(3) sanction the transfer, by or on behalf of any individual or body of persons to whom this paragraph applies, of any such annuities, stock, shares, bonds, debentures or debenture stock registered or inscribed in any register, branch register or other book kept in Ceylon, as may on or after the eighth day of November, 1946, come into the ownership of that individual or body

(4) order that Articles 1, 4 and 5 of the Trading with the Enemy (Custodian) Order, 1940, (which require payment of certain moneys to the Custodian of Enemy Property and impose restrictions and requirements in regard to the property in Ceylon of enemies),

shall not apply to-

(a) any money which would but for the existence of a state of war become payable on or after the the benefit of any individual or body of persons to whom this paragraph applies, y property which on or after the eighth day

(b) any of November, 1946, comes into the ownership of any such individual or body or persons, or

- (c) any money or property to which the aforesaid Articles would apply only because any such individual or body of persons became resident or commenced or recommended to carry on business in Poland on or after the ninth day of May, 1945;
- (5) declare that the preceding paragraphs (1), (2), (3) and (4) shall apply

(a) to any individual resident in Poland;

- (b) as respects any business carried on in Poland, to any individual or body of persons (whether corporate or unincorporate) carrying on that business so long as-
 - (1) that individual is not resident in the territory of a state at war with His
 - Majesty, or body is not (ii) that controlled by an individual so resident or by a body of persons constituted or incorporated in, or under the laws of, any such state; and
- (c) as respects any business carried on in any territory which is not an area for the time being to be treated an enemy territory for the purposes of the aforesaid regulations 4, 5 and 6a in accordance with the provisions of the Defence (Trading with the Enemy) (No. 3) Regulations, to any body of persons (whether corporate or unincorporate) carrying on that business if and so long as that body is controlled by an individual resident in Poland or a body of persons carrying on business in Poland which is not controlled by an individual resident in a state at war with His Majesty or by a body of persons constituted or incorporated in, or under the laws, of, any such state; and
- (6) declare that, for the purposes of this Order, "Poland"
 - (a) all the territory of the Republic of Poland limited in the East by the boundary defined in the Agreement of 16th August, 1945, between Poland and the Union of Soviet Socialist Republics; and

(b) any other territories for the time being adminis-tered by the Government of the Republic of Poland.

THE DEFENCE (MISCELLANEOUS) REGULATIONS.

ORDER made by the Officer Administering the Government by virtue of the powers vested in the Governor by regulation 43D of the Defence (Miscellaneous) Regulations, which in accordance with the Supplies and Services (Transitional Powers) Order, 1946, has effect by virtue of the Supplies and Services (Transitional Powers) Act, 1945.

Order.

This Order may be cited as the Price-controlled Food-

stuffs (Regulation of Sales) Order, 1946.
2. All price-controlled foodstuffs, that is to say, all articles of food in respect of which any Order is for the time being in operation under section 3 of the Control of Prices Ordinance, No. 39 of 1939, are hereby declared to be controlled articles for the purposes of this Order.

The provisions of paragraphs 4 and 5 of this Order shall apply in such area or areas as may from time to time be specified in that behalf by the Minister for Agriculture and

Lands by notification published in the Gazette.
4. (1) The Controller of Prices (Food) may, by Order prohibit the sale, in any area in which this paragraph applies, of any price-controlled foodstuffs, by any person, not being a dealer specified in the Order, or a dealer of any class or description so specified.

(2) Every Order under sub-paragraph (1) of this paragraph shall be published in the Gazette and shall come into force on

the date of such publication.

5. Where an Order under paragraph 4 in relation to any price-controlled foodstuffs is in force in any area, no parson (other than a dealer specified in the Order, or a dealer of any class or description so specified) shall in that area sell, expose for sale, or have in his possession or under his control for the purpose of sale, any such price-controlled foodstuffs.

The provisions of this Order shall be in addition to and not in substitution or derogation of the provisions of the Control of Prices Ordinance, No. 39 of 1939.

THE FOOD CONTROL ORDINANCE.

Order No. 125.

BY virtue of the powers vested in me by section 4 (l) (a) of the Food Control Ordinance (Chapter 132), read with the Defence (Food and Price Control) (Transfer of powers) Regularization (Chapter 132). lations, 1942, and with the Supplies and Services (Transitional powers) Order, 1946, I, Don Stephen Senanayake, Minister for Agriculture and Lands, do by this Order prohibit the transport or removal of any quantity of any flour from any one place in Ceylon to any other place in Ceylon except under the authority of a permit issued by or on behalf of the Deputy Food Controller or Assistant Food Controller of the area within which the first-mentioned place is situated or otherwise than in accordance with such conditions as may be attached to such permit.

Provided that nothing in the preceding Order shall apply:—

(a) to the transport of any flour by any person on behalf of the Government of Ceylon;

(b) to the transport, by any person carrying a ration book, of the quantity of flour obtained on the surrender of any coupon from that ration book, from the place at which such flour was obtained to the place of residence of the holder of that book;

(c) to the transport, by a person carrying a receipt or permit issued by or on behalf of the Deputy Food Controller or a receipt issued by a wholesale dealer in flour, of the quantity of flour obtained on such receipt or permit, from the place at which delivery of such flour was taken to the store or place of business of the wholesale dealer, Co-operative depot, authorised distributor or baker specified in the receipt or permit.

INDUSTRIAL DISPUTES (CONCILIATION) ORDINANCE, CHAPTER 110.

THE terms of settlement under section 6 (2) and report sent to the Commissioner of Labour under section 6 (3) of the above Ordinance by the Conciliation Board, established under the above Ordinance and to which the dispute which had arisen between the Ceylon Bank Clerks' Union and the Colombo Exchange Banks Association and the Imperial Bank of India was referred in order that it may endeavour to effect a settlement, is hereby published in terms of section 7 of the above Ordinance.

2. The representatives of the parties, namely, Mr. J. G. Scroggie for the Colombo Exchange Banks Association, Mr. H. A. Harden for the Imperial Bank of India, and Mr. A. E. Goonesinha for the Ceylon Bank Clerks' Union, are required to state in writing, in terms of section 7 of the above Ordinance. to the Commissioner of Labour, within 14 days after the date of publication of this notice whether they accept or reject the settlement reported in Schedule "A" under section 6 (2) of the Ordinance or the recommendations made in the report under section 6 (3) of the Ordinance.

Report.

On October 8, 1946, I received a letter from the Commissioner of Labour, appointing me a Board of Conciliation for the purpose of investigating certain disputes that had arisen between the Ceylon Bank Clerks' Union and the various Exchange Banks, forming the Exchange Banks Association, as well as the Imperial Bank of India, which is not a member of that Association.

I commenced proceedings on October 12, 1946, and thereafter sittings were held on October 14, October 15, October 17, October 18 and October 25, 1946.

The demands made by the Bank Clerks' Union are set out in a letter dated September 6, 1946, and are as follows:

- (1) Reinstatement of the two clerks victimized by the Hongkong & Shanghai Banking Corporation.
- (2) Withdrawal of notices of dismissal served on all strikers.
- (3) The Exchange Banks Association's offer of an increase of Rs. 30 all round on the basic salary is acceptable, provided the increase applies to all supervisors, members of the clerical staff, shroffs, &c., irrespective of the salary they draw at present, and provided also that the maximum of each grade is increased by the that the maximum of each grade is increased by the said amount and payable as from August 1, 1946.
- (4) Refund of seven days' pay and allowance deducted on the occasion of the last strike.
- (5) Full payment of salaries and allowances for all members of the Union in the respective banks who may be out on strike for whatever period of time.

- (6) Pension and Provident Fund Schomes to be formulated by mutual agreement. The existing scheme of the Hongkong & Shanghai Corporation Provident Fund to remain the same.
- (7) Awards made by the respective Conciliation Boards to be implemented and all payments to be made immediately.
- (8) All Assistant Shroffs should be paid Rs. 20 in addition to their basic salary as per agreement of November 7, 1945. This agreement inadvertently excluded a fair number of clerks. The margin of Rs. 20 above the Clerical Scale should be maintained all throughout their service.
- (9) All Deputy Shroffs should be placed on the Special Grade.
- (10) (a) Peons.—All peons, money testers and minor staff to receive a general increase of Rs. 10 on their present basic salary.
- (b) Peons drawing a minimum basic salary of Rs. 50 be granted Provident Fund rights.
- (c) Peons doing Sunday and Holiday duty should be paid double their day's pay as overtime.
- (11) Split turns given to labourers which necessitate their being in the premises for over 12 hours. Demand continuous eight hour work only. These men were working on a monthly basis but since the last agreement was signed they had been told that they are put on a daily-paid basis. The demand is made that they be reverted to their former terms of employment.

(12) No victimization.

(12) No victimization.
On October 18 a settlement was arrived at between the parties with regard to demands (1), (2), (3) and (5) and a memorandum of settlement was duly signed by Mr. Scroggie on behalf of the Exchange Banks Association, Mr. H. A. Harden on behalf of the Imperial Bank of India, and Mr. A. E. Goonesinha on behalf of the Bank Clerks' Union vide Schedule Demands (4) and (5) were withdrawn.

I have therefore to submit my recommendations with regard to the other demands which were subsequently investigated.

At a sitting on October 25, 1946, an understanding was arrived at with regard to demand No. (7). It was alleged that the National Bank was not implementing the recommendations made by Mr. T. W. Roberts. Mr. Gratiaen, appearing on behalf of the Banks stated that the adjustments with regard to salary went as far back as 1941, and those adjustments took some time to calculate. He gave the assurance that as soon as the necessary calculations were made the amounts due to the various clerks would be paid and in view of the assurance, the President of the Bank Clerks' Union was satisfied.

With regard to demand No. (8) it was alleged that the W. Roberts Rs. 20 which had been recommended by Mr. T. Rs. 20 which had been recommended by Mr. T. W. Roberts as an increase of salary had been treated by the Imperial Bank as an allowance. The Agent of the Imperial Bank assured me that the matter had been put right and the President of the Union was satisfied. With regard to demand No. (8) the Bank Clerks' Union submitted that even those shroffs which did not actually "pay in" and "pay out" money but still handled money were entitled to receive the Rs. 20 increase in salary as recommended by Mr. T. W. Roberts. Mr. Gratiaen on behalf of the Banks submitted that the addition of Rs. 20 was recommended because of the risk and responsibility involved in the duty of paying out and receiving cash. It was agreed that whenever an Assistant Shroff acted as "paying-in" or "paying-out" shroff he would receive the additional Rs. 20 for the period for which he was called upon to act. The President of the Bank Clerks' Union was gatisfied. was satisfied.

With regard to demand No. (9), the Union submitted that a new salary scale should be fixed for Assistant Shroffs. In the Roberts Award there were two grades, Grade 1 from Rs. 50 to Rs. 204 by certain annual increments; Grade 2 from Rs. 120 to Rs. 300, also by certain annual increments. The Banks, however, at their discretion had been placing certain employees on a special grade. The contention of the Union was that the Assistant Shroffs should be admitted to that exclusive ericle. Mr. Gratiaen on behalf of the Banks stated that the Assistant Shroffs would in the discretion of the management of the respective Banks be placed on a special grade if their services merited such treatment. It was ultimately agreed that the President of the Bank Clerks' Union should negotiate with each bank with regard to any particular individual who thought he had right to be placed on the special grade. If no agreement could be arrived at with each bank with regard to any particular employee, the matter could be considered by the Conciliation Board.

Demand No. (11), too, was adjusted. Mr. Gratiaen stated that conditions varied in the several banks and that the President of the Union should discuss the question with each bank and if no agreement could be arrived at the matter should be referred to the Board. Mr. Goonesinha, on behalf of the Union, consented to the proposal.

It therefore remains for me to make my recommendations with regard to demands (6) and (10), on which there was no agreement and which seemed incapable of adjustment. 1 shall first deal with demand No. (10).

The Union asked (a) that all peons, money testers and minor staff should receive a general increase of Rs. 10 on their present basic salary, (b) that peons drawing a minimum basic salary of Rs. 50 be granted Provident Fund rights; (c) peons doing Sunday and Holiday duty should be paid double their day's pay as overtime.

With regard to (c) it was pointed out that the usual rate of overtime pay was 1½, and the President of the Union after some discussion agreed that that rate should continue and the demand for double pay for overtime was withdrawn. With regard to (10) (b), I can make no recommendation because each individual bank has its own rules and regulations with regard to its Provident Fund. The Local Agents are powerless to make any alteration thereto unless they receive the necessary authority from their various Head Offices.

With regard to demand No. (10) (a), according to the Roberts Award, peons and other minor staff were put on a salary scale of Rs. 420 per annum rising to Rs. 1,140 by certain annual increments. I do not consider the increase of Rs. 10 on the basic salary a reasonable demand. It was brought to my notice that the employees of the Bank of Ceylon had adopted a salary scale which the President of the Bank Clerks' Union stated would be acceptable to the Union. That scale appears to me exceedingly reasonable and I would therefore recommend that it should be adopted by the Exchange Banks as well as the Imperial Bank of India. That scale is as follows:—

I shall now deal with demand No. (6). It appears that only certain banks have a Pension Scheme. The demand of the Union is that all the banks who have no such scheme should immediately provide for pensions for their staff. All the banks appear to have Provident Fund Schemes. The existing scheme of the Hongkong & Shanghai Banking Corporation with regard to the Provident Fund seems to be the best of all. There each employee contributes 5 per cent. of his salary each month and the employer adds 20 per cent. of the employee's salary each half-year and on the termination of the employee's services he receives the amount with accumulated interest. That is undoubtedly a very generous scheme. The contribution made by the other banks is on a very much smaller scale. The Union demands that all the other banks should follow the scheme of the Hongkong & Shanghai Banking Corporation. I make no recommendation in this matter for the reasons which I will set out when I presently come to deal with the demand for pension rights.

This demand was previously made by the Union and was referred to a Conciliation Board consisting of Mr. G. Crossette

Thambyah. He dealt with the matter exhaustively and made his recommendations in his report dated October 26, 1945, published in Ceylon Government Gazette Extraordinary No. 9,478 of October 27, 1945. I can only say that I am in complete agreement with those recommendations. The demands by the Union are not unreasonable and the recommendations made by Mr. Crossette Thambyah are recommendations which I myself would make if I felt that the local banks would have the authority to implement my recommendations. After Mr. Thambyah made his report an agreement was entered into botween the Exchange Banks and the Imperial Bank of India on the one hand and the Ceylon Bank Clerks' Union on the other. That was an agreement arrived at as a result of the exertions of the then Minister of Labour. It was there agreed that a certain scheme for pensions for all employees of the various banks should be referred immediately by the various Local Agents of the banks to their respective Principals for a decision on or before January 31, 1946. The Principals however, have not accepted the scheme and in the circumstances the Local Agents are powerless in the matter. Even Mr. Thambyah when he made his recommendations with regard to the Pension Scheme said that he strongly recommended to the Exchange Banks and the Imperial Bank of India the desirability of communicating his recommendations to their respective Head Offices with a view to their ultimate adoption. He added, however, that beyond doing that he could not embody the recommendations as forming part of an award on the basis of which the employer was bound to Those recommendations have now been considered by Principals of the Local Agents and rejected. The President of the Union said that until satisfactory Pension Schemes were adopted by the various banks there would be discontentment among the staff. I would point out to him and all the employees of the banks that in the absence of legislation imposing on the employer a legal obligation to pay pensions, the matter must remain one entirely within the discretion of each individual employer.

As required by section 6 (5) of the Ordmance, I nominate Mr. J. C. Scroggie, Chairman of the Colombo Exchange Banks Association as representative of the banks represented by that Association, Mr. H. A. Harden as representative of the Imperial Bank of India, and Mr. A. E. Goonesinha as representative of the Bank Clerks' Union, to take notice of my report and my recommendations.

MEMORANDUM OF SETTLEMENT.

Schedule "A".

1. The Hongkong Bank repudiates the charge of victimization and states that an offer of Rs 5,924 including Provident Fund and interest was made to I. J. R. de Silva on the basis that his case was one of retrenchment and not of victimization. It has been ascertained from the Controller of Labour that in similar cases of retrenchment a Government servant would have received a sum of Rs. 384 more than the amount offered by the Bank and in the circumstances in order to avoid further inconvenience to the public the Bank is willing to increase this offer to this extent. This offer which works out at Rs. 6,308 in total is not to be understood as in any way creating a precedent.

The Hongkong Bank desires to clear itself of the charges of victimization and would welcome a finding by the Tribunal on this issue after all the evidence has been recorded. As, however, Ivor de Silva withdraws the allegation of victimization and accepts the compensation offered the Union agrees that the issues with regard to alleged victimization do not arise.

- 2. All strikers other than de Silva and Peiris to resume work on October 21, 1946. Those who do not return on or before October 23, 1946, without good cause to be regarded as having left the services of their employers who are to be at liberty to replace them.
- 3. In the case of employees of the Hongkong Bank who resume work in terms of the above the notices of discontinuance served on them will be withdrawn by the Bank. The terms and conditions of employment of those who resume work in terms hereof will be the same as those obtaining when thoy went on strike subject to the provisions regarding the increase of Rs. 30 referred to later.
- 4. With regard to the problem of retrenchment which has arisen through the recruitment of new hands the Agent of the Hongkong Bank agrees, when it became necessary to effect retrenchment, that he will reach a decision only after negotiation with the Union. It is also agreed that either party may refer the matter in issue in any particular case to the Controller of Labour for consultation and advice.
 - 5. Demand for strike-pay are withdrawn.
- Each striker returning to work in terms of the above will receive an advance of one months pay with war allowance.

He will in addition receive pay earned before the strike. If current work and work accumulated as a result of the strike are cleared up to the satisfaction of the management within six weeks from October 23, 1946, the advance will in the case of each striker be treated as commuted overtime. During this time clerks will work overtime as required and no overtime will be paid.

It is understood that all members of the staff will co-operate in clearing off the arrears of work, that is, those who have no work of their own to do after hours will be required to

assist those who have.

7. The discontinuance of K. A. Peiris to stand but he should be paid up to September 30, 1946, in terms of the Bank's letter of August 10, 1946, at the agreed higher rate mentioned in Clause 8.

8. Agreed that the Rs. 30 increase already approved for members of the clerical staff including supervisors and shroffs to be effective in respect of the days worked from August 1, 1946, for all strikers of those classes who returned as above.

9. With regard to other demands of the Union in respect of which there is no agreement namely, demands 6, 7, 8, 9, 10 and 11, the Conciliation Board will proceed to make its recommendations after hearing the submission of both parties.

"Impregnating Machine".

Abstract.—The invention relates to a screw press specially adapted for use in impregnating certain cellulosic materials with acid for the purpose of hydrolysis in processes for the production of sugar or alcohol. Such presses are used, for instance, to apply pressure to corn cobs suitably wetted with acid, while at the same time the material is subjected to heat or cold by steam or water in order to maintain the desired temperature.

The press comprises a vertical jacketed cylinder, inside of which is a hollow shaft adapted to rotate concentrically. The shaft has sets of helical vanes which decrease in pitch from top downwards to allow for the decrease in vertical velocity of the material that is being compressed. Screw studs are fixed through the outer casing of the jacket through the barrel so as to project in the intervening space between barrel and shaft positioned between each set of vanes. This prevents the material rotating with the shaft. Heat is applied by the outer jacket. Provision is also made for the circulation of steam of water up the hollow shaft and down a concentric stationary tube about which it rotates.

Suitable apparatus is described.

Abstract.—The object of the invention is to eliminate the layer of cereal paste in dry cells. As the layer of paste has to be thick enough to prevent contact of the zinc electrode and depolariser, the amount of depolariser that can be used is unduly limited.

The inventors describe a diaphragm to be used in place of the cereal paste. This diaphragm is composed of nonfibrous, non-porous, organic film-forming material chemically inert to the electrolyte. The surface adjacent to the wet electrode is such as to form a viscous solution with the electrolyte thereby ensuring a good contact with the electrode and the surface adjacent to the depolariser mix is sufficiently resistent to the electrolyte to prevent dispersion of the viscous solution. Suitable films for such a purpose are made of alkyl to the depolariser mix being at least partially immobilised by treatmet with an organic polybasic acid for example citric of tannic acid. If necessary two films one treated and the other untreated can be used.

The inventors claim that cells manufactured in accordance with above have a larger useful life and better storage properties than cells made with cereal paste.

Manager of the Railway within the said period of 30 days accepting a part only of the quantity of sleepers and/or crossing timbers and/or bridge timbers remaining undelivered, such acceptance shall in no way be deemed to be or construed as a waiver of the written notice hereinbefore referred to, which said notice shall despite such acceptance, be deemed to be for all purposes valid and effectual with a view to enabling the Conservator of Forests lawfully to purchase in the open market such quantity of sleepers and/or crossing timbers and/or bridge timbers as shall yet remain undelivered at the expiration of 30 days covered by the said notice.

31. Should the sleepers and/or crossing timbers and/or bridge timbers so purchased cost more than the contract price, the contractor shall be liable to pay to the Conservator of Forests the full amount of the excess cost, together with all expenses attending the purchase and procuring of the

same.

32. Should the contractor fail to supply in the quantities and in the time agreed upon, or should he commit a breach of any of the covenants of the contract, the Conservator of Forests shall be at liberty by notice in writing to forthwith determine the contract, and thereupon the contractor will be liable to pay to the Conservator of Forests all costs and expenses incurred by the failure to supply sleepers and/or crossing timbers and/or bridge timbers or by the breach of any other covenant of the contract, and shall, in addition be liable to forfeit the sum deposited by him as security, which said sum shall be paid and forfeited as liquidated damages, and not by way of a penalty, and shall not be deemed to include the costs and expenses herembefore referred to.

The contract which shall be stamped by the contractor at his own expense in terms of the Stamp Ordinance, shall be entered into by the contractor with the Conservator of Forests acting for and on behalf of the Government of Ceylon and the designation of such officer shall mean and include the officer for the time being holding such office and his successors m office for the time being under the Government of Ceylon.

34. The contractor shall indemnify the Crown against

any claim, by or in respect of any employee of the contractor, under the Workmen's Compensation Ordinance (Cap. 117).

35. The amount of cash security required shall be deposited by the contractor in the name of the Conservator of Forests and shall be mortgaged assigned, and set over to and with the said Government of Ceylon for securing the due and punctual performance of the contract on the part of the contractor and the payment of all moneys which the contractor may become liable to pay to the Crown under the contract.
