**THE DEFENCE (TRADING WITH THE ENEMY) REGULATIONS, 1939.**

IN PURSUANCE OF THE POWERS CONFERRED ON THE GOVERNOR BY REGULATIONS 1 (2), 4, 5 AND 6A OF THE DEFENCE (TRADING WITH THE ENEMY) REGULATIONS, 1939, WHICH CONTINUE IN FORCE BY VIRTUE OF THE EMERGENCY LAWS (TRANSITIONAL PROVISIONS) ORDER, 1946, I, JOHN CURTOIS HOWARD, OFFICER ADMINISTERING THE GOVERNMENT OF CEYLON, DO HEREBY—

- (1) authorise any person in Ceylon, unless otherwise directed by me and except as provided in paragraph (4) (b), to trade within Hungary with the Hungarian State or with any individual or body of persons (whether corporate or unincorporate) carrying on business therein, notwithstanding anything contained in regulation 1 of those Regulations;

(2) sanction—

- (a) any assignment of a chose in action which, on or after the 22nd day of November, 1946, comes into the ownership of the State to which, or any individual or body of persons to whom, this paragraph applies,  
(b) any transfer of a negotiable instrument issued on or after such day, and  
(c) any transfer of any security transferable by delivery, not being a coupon or a negotiable instrument, which on or after such day comes into the ownership of such State or of any such individual or body of persons,

- (3) order that Articles 1, 4 and 5 of the Trading with the Enemy (Custodian) Order, 1940, (which require payment of certain moneys to the Custodian of

Enemy Property and impose restrictions and requirements in regard to the property in Ceylon of enemies), shall not apply to—

- (a) any money which would but for the existence of a state of war become payable, on or after the day mentioned in paragraph (2), to or for the benefit of any individual or body of persons to whom this paragraph applies,
- (b) any property which on or after such day comes into the ownership of any such individual or body of persons, or
- (c) any money or property to which such Articles would apply only because any such individual or body of persons became resident, or commenced or recommenced to carry on business, in the Netherlands East Indies on or after the fifteenth day of August, 1945; and

(4) declare that paragraphs (2) and (3) shall apply—

- (a) to any individual resident in the Netherlands East Indies,

(3) order that Articles 1, 4 and 5 of the Trading with the Enemy (Custodian) Order, 1940, (which require payment of certain moneys to the Custodian of Enemy Property and impose restrictions and requirements in regard to the property in Ceylon of enemies), shall not apply to—

- (i) the performance of any contract of insurance or reinsurance entered into, before the day mentioned in paragraph (2), with or for the benefit of any individual or body of persons referred to in paragraph (1),
- (ii) the entering into of any agreement or contract of reinsurance with any body of persons (whether corporate or unincorporate) whose Registered Office is shown by the Register of the Austrian Commercial Court to be in Austria but whose Head Office is outside Austria in territory which by virtue of regulation 4 of the Defence (Trading with the Enemy) (No. 3) Regulations is to be treated for all the purposes of the Defence (Trading with the Enemy) Regulations, 1939, as enemy territory,
- (iii) the payment of any bill of exchange payable in Ceylon and drawn before such day to or for the benefit of any such individual or body of persons, or
- (iv) the encashment of any coupons by or on behalf of any such individual or body of persons, and

(c) paragraphs (2) and (3) shall apply—

- (i) to the Austrian State,
- (ii) to any individual resident in Austria, and
- (iii) as respects any business carried on in Austria, to any individual or body of persons (whether corporate or unincorporate) carrying on that business.

## Regulations.

1. The rate at which the maternity benefit referred to in sub-section (1) of section 5 of the Ordinance shall be paid shall be one rupee for each day.

2. For the purposes of sub-section (3) of section 5 of the Ordinance, the alternative maternity benefits to be provided by an employer for female labourers on his estate shall be—

- (a) the use, for the confinement, for a period of not less than ten days, of a maternity ward or a lying-in room, approved by the Commissioner;
- (b) the services of a midwife at the confinement;
- (c) food for each labourer during the period she remains in the maternity ward or the lying-in room; and
- (d) the payment in cash—
  - (i) of four rupees a week to each such labourer for the period of two weeks immediately preceding her confinement, or if she has worked during that period, four-sevenths of a rupee for each day in that period succeeding the last day on which she so worked; and
  - (ii) of four rupees a week to each such labourer for the four weeks immediately following her confinement.

3. Any notice by a woman worker to her employer under sub-section (3) of section 5 or under sub-section (1) or sub-section (2) of section 6 of the Ordinance may be given orally or in writing.

4. (1) Every oral notice by a woman worker to her employer under sub-section (3) of section 5 or under sub-section (1) or sub-section (2) of section 6 of the Ordinance shall be given by making an oral statement to the employer and by signing, or affixing her thumb impression on, the notice book in the place provided therein for that purpose.

(2) The written notices given by a woman worker to her employer—

- (a) under sub-section (3) of section 5,
- (b) under sub-section (1) of section 6, and
- (c) under sub-section (2) of section 6,

shall be respectively in the Forms A, B and C specified in the Schedule hereto.

(3) Every written notice referred to in paragraph 2 shall be given—

- (a) by delivering the notice at the residence or place of business of the employer; or
- (b) by sending the notice by ordinary or registered post to the residence or place of business of the employer.

5. For the purposes of section 7 of the Ordinance, one of the following certificates shall be sufficient proof of confinement:—

- (a) a certificate from the medical practitioner who attended at the confinement of the woman worker;
- (b) a certificate from the officer-in-charge of the lying-in home, maternity home, or other institution where the confinement took place;
- (c) a certificate from the midwife who attended at the confinement of the woman worker;
- (d) a certificate signed by any two persons who attended at the confinement of the woman worker and can bear witness to the confinement; and
- (e) a certificate relating to the birth of the child and issued under the Births and Deaths Registration Ordinance (Chapter 94).

6. Every employer shall maintain a register, substantially in the Form D set out in the Schedule hereto, of women workers in his employment, and shall cause to be entered therein, at the appropriate times, all the particulars for the recording of which provision is made in that form.

7. Every employer shall keep a notice book substantially in the Form E set out in the Schedule hereto, and shall cause to be entered therein, at the appropriate times, all the particulars for the recording of which provision is made in that form.

8. Every employer shall provide for the use of women workers in his employment on demand, a sufficient supply of the Forms A, B and C set out in the Schedule hereto.

9. In these regulations—

"notice book" means a notice book kept by an employer under regulation 7; and  
"Ordinance" means the Maternity Benefits Ordinance, No. 32 of 1939.

10. The regulations made under section 13 of the Ordinance and published in *Gazette* No. 8,793 of September 12, 1941, are hereby rescinded.

"Weekly Holiday (section 24).

Every employer shall allow each Sunday as the weekly holiday to all workers employed under him : Provided, however, that an employer may employ any worker on a Sunday, subject to the conditions—

(1) that a day within the six days next succeeding such Sunday shall be allowed to that worker as a holiday ;

(2) that in respect of work done on a Sunday—

(a) a worker who has worked for 9 hours (inclusive of one hour for a meal) or for any period that falls short of nine hours by reason of the failure of the employer to provide him with work, shall be remunerated at  $1\frac{1}{2}$  times the minimum rate of wages for a normal working day,

(b) a worker who has worked for less than 9 hours (inclusive of one hour for a meal) by reason of his unwillingness to work, shall, for each hour that he has worked, be paid  $1\frac{1}{2}$  times the hourly rate (ascertained by dividing the minimum rate of wages for a normal working day by 8),

(c) a worker who has worked for more than 9 hours (inclusive of one hour for a meal) shall be remunerated at twice the hourly rate (ascertained by dividing the minimum rate of wages for a normal working day by 8) for each hour of work in excess of 9 hours;

and (3) that the remuneration due to a worker for work done on the weekly holiday during any period shall be paid within the time prescribed for the payment of wages for such period by section 2 (b) of the Wages Boards Ordinance.

The preceding provisions of this paragraph shall not apply to workers engaged in plucking or to workers (kangany) engaged in supervising such plucking."

and (2) in the Part relating to annual holidays—

(a) in paragraph 4, by the substitution, for the words "days on which the worker has worked during that year", wherever those words occur collectively therein, of the words "days on which the worker has actually worked during that year." ;

## TRADE DISPUTE—HATTON-DICKOYA URBAN COUNCIL, HATTON.

THE Ceylon General Workers' Union presented a petition to me under section 6 (1) of the Essential Services (Avoidance of Strikes and Lockouts) Order, 1942, in connection with a trade dispute that had arisen between the said Union and the Hatton-Dickoya Urban Council, Hatton. This petition was referred by me in terms of section 6 (2) of the aforesaid Order to the District Judge, Hatton, for adjudication.

The following award dated October 22, 1946, made by the District Judge, Hatton, is published for general information in terms of section 8 (4) of the same Order :—

“The Ceylon General Workers' Union had forwarded a petition on behalf of the Conservancy and Scavenging labourers employed by the Hatton-Dickoya Urban Council to the Commissioner of Labour.

This petition has been referred to me under section 6 (2) of the Essential Services (Avoidance of Strikes and Lockouts) Order, 1942, for necessary action as it involved a Trade Dispute.

At the outset of the inquiry it was submitted on behalf of the respondents that there was no proof that the petitioner had any authority to act on behalf of the Conservancy and Scavenging labourers. The petitioner took up the position that the labourers on whose behalf the petition had been presented were members of the Union. Sufficient evidence was led to establish this fact and I am satisfied that the labourers are members of the Union. The petitioner therefore has the right to act on behalf of the labourers.

The demands of the labourers are set out in the schedule “A” annexed to the petition. The evidence shows that there are 44 labourers employed by the Hatton-Dickoya Urban Council. Of these 17 are conservancy labourers and the rest scavenging labourers.

The main demands are that their rates of pay be increased, that they be paid on a monthly instead of a daily basis and that they be given pension or gratuity on retirement. The rates of pay at present are 80 cents per day per male conservancy labourer and 60 cents per female labourer. The scavenging labourers are paid at the rate of 73 cents a day. This is the basic wage. All labourers are paid on a daily basis. The rates of pay are considered to be insufficient. It would appear that rates of pay obtaining in other Urban Councils in Up-country Districts are as follows :—

Nuwara Elhya	..	80 cents per day for conservancy labourers
Nawalapitiya	..	1 rupee per day for conservancy labourers
Wattegama	..	82 cents per day for conservancy labourers
Bandarawela	..	80 cents per day for conservancy labourers

Scavenging labourers are paid less than conservancy labourers. It would appear that the rates of pay of the Hatton-Dickoya Urban Council is more or less on level with the rates of pay of other local bodies in the area. The Nawalapitiya rates of pay are much higher than the rest but there is in evidence that it is one of the richest Urban Councils in the area.

Estate labourers in this area are paid less than what is paid by the Hatton-Dickoya Urban Council.

It is suggested that the rates of pay of the labourers employed by the respondents be raised to the level of payments made to unskilled labourers outside urban areas by Government. I am unable to accede to that request. The labourers employed by the Urban Council are provided with free quarters where free quarters are not provided they are paid 2.50 each per month as house allowance. Facilities are also provided for the labourers to cultivate garden plots and thereby supplement their incomes. It is also in evidence that conservancy labourers normally do not work in the afternoon.

Taking all these circumstances into consideration, I am not prepared to say that the rates of payment made by the Hatton-Dickoya Urban Council are inadequate. The evidence shows that there is a certain amount of disparity in the rates of pay obtaining in the various local bodies. The local bodies themselves seem to have realised that such a practice is not satisfactory. The proper course to be followed would be for all local bodies to standardise their wages or for legislation to be introduced standardising wages.

As regards the claim that labourers be paid on a monthly basis rather than on a daily basis, no convincing argument has been advanced for this proposition. There does not appear to be a single local body where employees engaged on scavenging or conservancy work are paid on a monthly basis. I do not think that the nature of work done by these labourers would permit of payment on a monthly basis. Estate labourers too are paid on a daily basis. A case has not been made out for payment to be made on a monthly basis.

As things are at present no scheme has been formulated by the respondent Council to make provisions for their employees (scavenging and conservancy labourers) when they reach the age of retirement. I do not consider this satisfactory. As



these labourers are not paid on a monthly basis, I do not think it would be possible to make provisions for the payment of pensions to them.

It would appear that the Nawalapitiya Urban Council pays gratuities to its labourers who fulfill certain conditions. I am of opinion that the system prevailing in the Nawalapitiya Urban Council as regards gratuities should be adopted by the Hatton-Dickoya Urban Council.

My award as regards the various demands in schedule "A" is as follows :—

- (1) Refused for reasons set out by me.
  - (2) Refused. Payment will continue to be as at present.
  - (3) All labourers are paid at the moment war allowance at Government rates. My award is that the respondent Council continue to do so.
  - (4) The respondent council gives its labourers two half days leave each week on pay. It will continue to grant this leave.
  - (5) Labourers are granted two weeks medical leave with pay at present. The Council will continue to grant this leave. The request for two weeks paid holiday per year is refused. All public holidays are paid holidays to the labourers of the respondent Council.
- Demands (6), (7) and (10) have not been pressed and I make no award as regards these.
- (8) I award that gratuities be paid in future on the same terms and conditions as obtained at Nawalapitiya Urban Council.
  - (9) I award that wages in future be paid on or before the 5th of each month. This will involve the discontinuance of the check store which has provided credit facilities to labourers. This award will come into operation from December 1<sup>st</sup>.

SURVEY DEPARTMENT.  
Training School for Surveyors.

AN examination for admission of about 10 students to the above will be held at the following centres:— Colombo, Galle, Kurunegala, Badulla and Anuradhapura, commencing February 14, 1947.

2. (i.) Candidates must be Ceylonese\* and must not be less than 19 or more than 25 years of age on the first day of the examination.

(ii.) Demobilized Ceylonese members of the armed forces and full-time members of the Auxiliary Fire, Air Raid Precautions and Civil Defence Services, whether officers or other ranks, except those who had left those services of their own accord, who are more than 25 years of age will however be eligible to sit for the examination, provided their age reduced by the period of their mobilized service does not exceed 25, and provided also that they fulfil the other conditions of this notice.

3. Candidates will be required to furnish the originals of the following certificates and must attach them to the form referred to in paragraph 4 below:—

- (a) A certificate of age showing the registration of the candidate's birth. (Certificates of birth issued for the purposes of the Code for Assisted Schools will not be accepted.)  
Affidavits will not be accepted as substitutes for birth certificates.
- (b) A certificate of respectability and good moral character from two or more persons whose social or official position can be accepted as a guarantee of reliability.
- (c) The Senior School Certificate (English) Examination or its equivalent with a pass in Mathematics or higher qualifications.

4. Candidates will be required to fill in an entry form, which can be obtained on application to the Surveyor-General, Surveyor-General's Office (Branch C), P. O. Box No. 506, Colombo, up to December 6, 1946. This form must be presented in person to the Assistant Surveyor-General at Colombo, accompanied by the certificates referred to in paragraph 3, or to the Superintendent of Surveys in a Division, between December 7 and 13, 1946, or on an earlier date by appointment.

5. Applications for admission to the examination will not be accepted after mid-day on December 13, 1946.

6. Candidates who are already employed in Government Departments, whether in a permanent or temporary capacity, must annex to their applications, a certificate from the Heads of the Departments in which they are serving, that they have been granted the necessary permission to sit for the examination. If any candidate fails to do so, he will be regarded as disqualified.

7. Should any of the particulars furnished by candidates be found to be false within their knowledge, they will, if appointed be liable to be dismissed. The wilful suppression of any material fact will be similarly penalized.

8. Candidates should possess good physique and eyesight.

9. The Surveyor-General will return those applications which are approved to the candidates concerned. Such applications will constitute the candidates' tickets of admission to the examination. Candidates presenting themselves for examination must produce to the officer appointed to supervise the examination their forms of application approved by the Surveyor-General. A candidate not producing such form will be refused admittance to the examination.

10. An examination fee of Rs. 10 in cash must accompany the application.

(a) No refund of the examination fee will be made, but if notice of a candidate's withdrawal is received in the Surveyor-General's Office, Colombo, seven days before the date of commencement of the examination, a voucher will be issued. This voucher will entitle the candidate to enter once more for the same examination without fee, provided that the examination is held within a year and that the regulations are complied with in other respects.

(b) Candidates who withdraw on account of illness will receive vouchers as in (a) provided the notice of withdrawal is received in the Surveyor-General's Office, Colombo, before the examination commences, and is accompanied by a medical certificate from a qualified medical officer.

II. Subjects for the examination are—

- (i.) English Language and Composition.—A one and half hour paper which will include an essay, a set of questions, and questions to test the correct usage of the English Language. 150
- (ii.) General Paper.—A two hour paper in three sections:—
- (a) 20 marks. A test of accuracy with figures, the counting of Tots and additions of various figures. 150
- (b) 50 marks. A test of general intelligence. 150
- (c) 50 marks. A test of general and local knowledge. 150

(iii.) One of the following:—

Sinhalese must be taken by Sinhalese candidates and Tamil by Tamil candidates. Candidates who are neither Sinhalese nor Tamil will be given the option of taking as a compulsory subject Sinhalese or Tamil or Arabic or a Special Paper in English, but candidates of mixed parentage must offer the language of one of their parents within the group (Special) English, Sinhalese, Tamil or Arabic.

(iv.) Drawing.—A three and half hour paper. Candidates will be required to make a free hand enlarged outline drawing of a map in ink, with colouring and lettering. 200  
(They are required to bring Indian ink, water colours and drawing materials).

A specimen of this map can be examined by prospective candidates at the Surveyor-General's Office, Colombo, and at the Divisional Survey Offices at Galle, Kurunegala, Anuradhapura and Badulla.

12. On the results of the written examination, candidates will be selected to attend a Selection Board at Colombo. The number to be called before the Selection Board will be fixed by the Surveyor-General. Service candidates selected to appear before the Selection Board will be given consideration for skill and experience gained during war service.

Note.—Service candidates selected for appointment under categories 2 (ii.) and 12 will be placed at suitable points in the salary scale so that they will receive some credit for war service if their ages exceed the maximum age in the normal age limit specified in paragraph 2 (i.).

13. Candidates who are selected by the Board will be medically examined by the Director of Medical and Sanitary Services to ascertain their physical fitness to undertake the duties of a surveyor. A fee of Rs. 5 will be charged for this examination.

14. Conditions of Admission to the Training School.—Securities for the sum of Rs. 100 in two sureties must be furnished on admission to cover the cost of lost stores or damage to instruments through wilful neglect or gross carelessness. Each candidate on selection for the Training School will be required to enter into an agreement and bond to serve for a period of 3 years. This agreement and bond will come into operation from the date each candidate is appointed to the Training School.

15. Payments to Students.—Candidates whose progress after one month at the Training School is such as to make them suitable for further training will receive Rs. 35 a month plus war allowance while in training, on condition that their progress is satisfactory.

16. Appointments to the Field.—Students will receive appointments as soon as they are reported fit to take up duty as Third Grade Surveyors. Surveyors will be appointed on probation for 3 years. If at any time during this period their work is found to be unsatisfactory or they are guilty of misconduct, their services will be dispensed with by the Surveyor-General, in which case they will render themselves liable to forfeit the cost of their training.

**Internal Purchase Scheme***Harvesting of Paddy in the Jaffna District—Kalapokam 1946-47.*

BY virtue of the powers vested in me by the Defence (Miscellaneous) Regulation 37, the Defence (Purchase of Foodstuffs) Regulations, 1942, the Defence (Paddy Cultivation) Regulations, 1943, I, Mayilvahanam Sri Khanta, Assistant Government Agent (Emergency), Jaffna District, a competent and proper authority, do hereby direct that—

1. Every person whether owner or cultivator in charge of the reaping of the harvest of any paddy or kurakkan land situated within the Jaffna District and which is expected to be harvested during 1946-47—

(a) shall inform the Kirama Vidane of the area in which the land is situated—

- (i) the dates of the reaping and threshing of the harvest not less than ten days ahead in each case;
- (ii) the name, situation and extent of the land;
- (iii) the names and addresses of the person or persons entitled to take or receive any part of the produce;
- (iv) details of the share or shares of the produce to which such person or persons may be entitled.

(b) shall not remove any paddy or kurakkan harvested in Kalapokam 1946-47 from the threshing floor until the harvest has been checked and verified by the Kirama Vidane or any other officer authorised by me in writing and until the acreage levy has been delivered to the Kirama Vidane at the rate of two (2) bushels per acre of well-winnowed paddy free from shaff, dirt, grit, &c.

2. I do further direct that—

(a) Removal thereafter to the barn or other place of storage within the same Chief Headman's or Divisional Revenue Officer's division shall only be on a permit on form I. P. S. 33 (b) issued by the Kirama Vidane of the area in which the threshing floor is situated.

(b) For transport from one Chief Headman's or Divisional Revenue Officer's division to another within the district application on form D. F. C. 34 should be made to the Chief Headman or D. R. O. of the division in which the applicant resides.

(ii) For transport from one district to another application should be made to the Government Agent, Assistant Government Agent or Assistant Government Agent (Emergency) of the area in which the applicant is resident giving all particulars asked for in Form D. F. C. 34 (in duplicate); copies of which can be obtained from any of the above officers. To expedite the issue of permits, the applicants are requested to produce reports from the Kirama Vidanes or any other duly authorised person of the area of their residence and of the areas in which the paddy or kurakkan lands are situated, giving particulars of the households and of their shares of paddy or kurakkan from the various fields.

(c) No paddy shall be utilised for consumption by an owner or his dependants possessing ration books until the surrender of the appropriate number of rice coupons.

3. If no application for removal of any shares to a place outside the Chief Headman's or Divisional Revenue Officer's area is made to me within six weeks from the date of harvesting all stocks of paddy or kurakkan are liable to be requisitioned under the Internal Purchase Scheme.

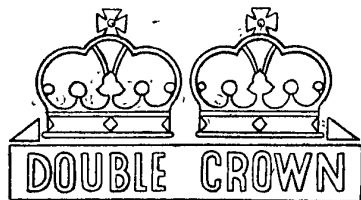

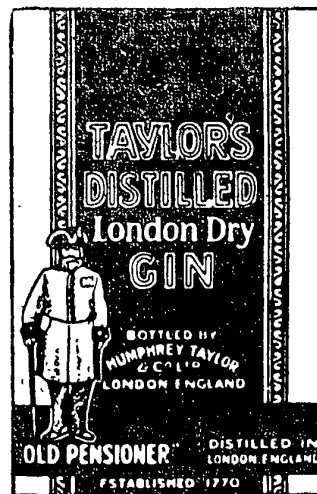

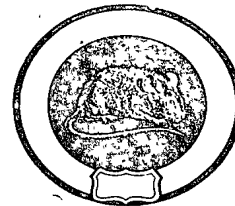
