SPECIAL ISSUE OF STAMPS TO COMMEMORATE  
"PEACE AND RECONSTRUCTION".

IT is hereby notified for general information that a special issue of stamps of the denominations 6 cents and 15 cents bearing the Portrait of His Majesty King George VI will be made on December 10, 1946, to commemorate "Peace and Reconstruction". The Stamps will remain on sale until March 31, 1947, or until stocks are exhausted whichever is the earlier.

During this period the sale of the corresponding denominations in the permanent series of stamps will be suspended.

TRADE DISPUTE—GRAND ORIENTAL HOTEL, COLOMBO,  
AND THREE OTHER HOTELS.

THE All-Ceylon Shop and Hotel Workers' Union, Colombo, presented four petitions to me under section 6 (1) of the Essential Services (Avoidance of Strikes and Lockouts) Order, 1942, with regard to a trade dispute that had arisen between the said Union on the one side and (1) The Colombo Hotels Co., Ltd., Colombo, (2) Galle Face Hotel Co., Ltd., Colombo, (3) The Bristol Hotel, Colombo, and (4) Ceylon Hotels, Ltd., Colombo, on the other. These petitions were referred to a Special Tribunal appointed by H. E. The Governor under the proviso to section 5 of the said Order for adjudication.

The following findings and award dated November 5, 1946, made by the Special Tribunal are published for general information in terms of section 8 (4) of the said Order:—

The petitioner-union acting on behalf of the various employees at the above hotels has presented four different petitions making several demands from the management of these hotels.

These petitions relate in the main to similar demands against all the hotels as would appear from an analysis of the demands as set out in the document 'A' hereto annexed. These petitions were, therefore, inquired into at one inquiry and I propose to make one award in respect of all the demands.

The inquiry into these demands necessarily became prolonged and both parties have placed before me various documents setting forth their respective positions. Before I make my award regarding the demands in respect of which there has been no agreement, I shall record the points relating to some of the demands on which it has been possible to effect a settlement by agreement between the parties.

(a) *Payment for overtime work.*—The hotels are prepared to make overtime payment at 1½ times the hourly rate of the basic wage only. Dr N. M. Perera, who appeared for the Union, demanded that the overtime rate should be computed on the aggregate of the basic wage and the dearness allowance. It was also agreed that the hourly rate for overtime payment should be calculated on the basis of 26 working days of 8 hours each day. My award is that payment for overtime work should be 1½ times the hourly rate payable on account of the basic wage and dearness allowance calculated in the manner set out in the agreement.

(b) The demand for free medical treatment was not pressed and I, therefore, make no award relating to it.

(c) As regards the *maintenance staff* of workmen who fall within the category of skilled, semi-skilled and unskilled labourers respectively, they should be paid their minimum wages in terms of the decisions of the Wages Board relating to the Engineering Trade. They should also be paid dearness allowance at the rates prescribed by the Engineering Wages Board subject to variations in the cost of living index. It was also agreed that the wages of *canermen* should be fixed at Re. 1.80 per diem and their dearness allowance at 72 cents per diem subject to variations in the cost of living index. I make award in terms of the above agreement.

(d) As regards *laundry hands*, it was agreed that their rate of wages and dearness allowance be the same as the rate of wages and dearness allowance fixed for unskilled labourers by the Engineering Wages Board. The agreements regarding the workmen of the maintenance staff, apply only to such workmen in the Galle Face Hotel and Grand Oriental Hotel. It is also agreed that the maintenance staff employed at the G. O. H. should in addition be paid a further 25 cents on account of their mid-day meal. It was also agreed that no workman should as a result of the above agreements receive as his wages a sum less than what he is paid at present. I make award in terms of the above agreement.

(e) As regards *porters* it was agreed that they be required to work on 8 hour shifts only except in the case of the Bristol Hotel where porters will work 8 hours over a 15 hour spread. In the case of the Bristol Hotel, it was further agreed that half the number of porters employed in that hotel should go off duty at 6 P.M. and resume work the following morning at 6 A.M. and the other half should go off duty at 9 P.M. and resume work at 6 A.M. in the following day. I make award in terms of the above agreement.

(f) *Weekly holiday.*—It was agreed that every workman should be given leave for a day and a half each week after he has worked for 5½ days. It was also agreed that in cases where a workman is required to work for more than the period of 5½ days to suit the exigencies of the employers' requirements, the employer in granting the next weekly holiday would, as far as possible enable the workman to avail himself of that holiday reckoning for that purpose the extra period he has worked during the previous week. With regard to bed-room boys and other floor staff, the 1½ days weekly holiday shall be taken to be 24 hours off from 6 A.M. on one day to 6 A.M. on the following day plus one night off from 6 P.M. to 6 A.M., but such night off need not necessarily follow or precede the day off. The weekly holiday shall be a paid holiday. The demand by the Union that all employees should be given the weekly holiday during each week-end was not pressed. My award is that the weekly holiday should be on the terms set out above.

(g) *Annual Holiday*.—As provided by section 6 of the Shops Ordinance No. 66 of 1938, workmen employed in hotels (a) shall be entitled to take and shall take a holiday of seven consecutive days with full wages and (b) shall subject to such conditions as may be prescribed, be entitled to take, on account of private business, ill-health or other reasonable cause, leave with full wages for periods not exceeding 14 days in the aggregate. The employers are bound to give these holidays during each year. As regards further periods of leave which a workman may require on the ground of illness duly certified by a qualified medical practitioner, the extent of the period and the terms on which such leave may be given by the employer must be determined by the employer himself. Although I do not propose to make any award regarding such leave on the ground of illness, I would recommend for the consideration of the employers the desirability in approved cases of the grant of leave on full pay to a workman who has been in continuous employment during the previous qualifying year up to a maximum period of six weeks. The following rules are laid down for the computation of the annual holiday.

1. (A) If an employee has been in continuous employment and has worked under the same employer for not less than 231 days in any year (in these rules called the qualifying year) he shall be allowed in the next succeeding year a holiday or holidays (hereinafter called annual leave) calculated at the rate of one day for each unit of 4 days by which the number of days on which the employee has worked exceeds 231 days. Provided, however, that it shall not be obligatory on any employer to allow any such holiday in respect of any days worked in excess of 287 days in any one qualifying year.

(B) "Days on which an employee has worked" and "days worked" shall for the purposes of paragraph 1 (A) be all days on which an employee has worked and shall for the purposes of this paragraph include:—

- (i.) Annual leave allowed by the employer under these provisions and for the purposes of the first qualifying year any annual holiday.
- (ii.) Casual leave up to a maximum of 7 days in any qualifying year.
- (iii.) Every day of absence due to a strike or lockout that is not illegal and not exceeding in the aggregate 30 days in any qualifying year.

(C) The first qualifying year shall be a period of 12 months terminating on the date the award is published in the *Gazette* in the case of employees with more than one year's service at that date or on the first anniversary of their employment in the case of employees with less than a year's service at that date.

(D) No employment at any time prior to the commencing of the first qualifying year shall be taken into account for the purposes of computing annual leave.

(E) Any leave other than casual leave and weekly holidays granted to an employee during the current year shall be taken to be part or whole as the case may be of the annual leave to which the employee is entitled in respect of the first qualifying year.

(F) If a worker is entitled in any year to annual leave of 7 days or more he shall be allowed and he shall take those days on consecutive days.

(G) An employee shall be allowed his annual holiday or holidays at a time to be determined by the employer.

(H) Remuneration for each day of the annual holiday shall be the average daily wage of the employee obtained by dividing the total wage, including the Special Allowance (excluding overtime and bonuses) earned by the employee in the last month of the qualifying year, by the number of days of that month or in the case of the daily-paid worker by the number of days actually worked during that month.

(I) Where an employee leaves of his own accord or is discontinued or dismissed from employment he shall at the time of his leaving, discontinuance or dismissal be paid remuneration for such number of days of annual leave for which he was entitled at the date of his leaving, discontinuance or dismissal.

(J) In these paragraphs year means a continuous period of 365 days.

2. A normal working day shall be 8 hours with a spread of up to 12 hours except in the case of bed-room boys and floor staff in which the spread may be up to 15 hours.

3. Notwithstanding anything in these rules contained, no employee shall receive less than 7 days annual holidays as required by the Shops Ordinance.

*Reinstatement of dismissed employees*.—The demands for the reinstatement of A. P. Thomas of the Bristol Hotel, of A. Simon of the Grand Hotel, Mt. Lavinia, and of A. Weerasinghe of the Grand Oriental Hotel, were not pressed and I accordingly make no award for their reinstatement.

*Free uniforms to all workers*.—In view of the present textile position, it is impossible for the hotels to improve upon the now existing provisions for free uniforms and the demand is, therefore, rejected.

*Arrears of wages for November and December, 1944*.—demanded by some of the workmen against the Grand Hotel,

Mt. Lavinia, has been settled by agreement between the parties and it is, therefore, unnecessary to make any award relating to it.

*Rest-room and Bathroom*.—with toilet demanded by the workmen at the Bristol Hotel is a legitimate demand. The manager has undertaken to make such suitable provisions as will meet this requirement and I award that such provision in addition to already existing facilities should be made as early as possible.

*Demand No. 11 against the G. O. H.*—The Management of this hotel has undertaken to see that if a workman is called up to work on a day in lieu of the weekly day off, such day should be reckoned as a normal working day for which he should be paid his usual remuneration.

*Application of Shop Act to all workers*.—The requirement of the law under the Shops Ordinance no doubt must be complied with. With regard to the provision of the law that no workman should be called upon to work for more than 8 hours on a working day spread over an interval of 12 hours. I find that the Executive Committee of Labour, Industry and Commerce has made a decision that in the case of certain classes of workers in residential hotels the spreadover should extend to 15 hours and that overtime payment should be made for any extra work beyond 8 hours. On behalf of the Bristol Hotel, the need for a spreadover of 15 hours was specially stressed. I would recommend to the Commissioner of Labour the desirability of getting regulations framed to give effect to the decision of the Executive Committee.

*Basic Wage of all Employees*.—The demand of the Union is that the present minimum basic wage as fixed by the Roberts Award in November, 1944, should be increased by 100% and that yearly increments be given up to certain maxima. These demands for increased wages are set out in the documents P2\* and P4\* prepared by the Union. These demands for an increase in the basic wage were strenuously opposed by the Hotels on the ground of the inability of each one of the hotels to make payments of wages on an increased scale. A consideration of the capacity of the industry to meet a demand for increased wages should not be ignored or lost sight of in fixing any scale of wages. If a high scale of wages results in the hotel companies being unable to find the necessary finance to meet the increased wage bill, the industry must inevitably close down. Such a result would not enure to the benefit of the large body of workmen who find employment in these hotels. If the hotels close down, the hotel employees will swell the ranks of the unemployed. This problem must necessarily be kept in mind in arriving at a decision. Various documents working out the increased cost on the basis of the demands made and comparative statements showing the wages earned by their employees in comparison with the wages fixed by the Wages Board to other workmen have been placed before me. It was submitted to me that the employees in these hotels get all their meals supplied to them free of cost. Much stress was laid on the fact that certain classes of employees such as waiters in the dining-room, bedroomboys, bedroom labourers, bathroom coolies, porters, waiters at the bar and restaurant receive considerable sums of money as tips from residents and casual visitors. On behalf of the hotels evidence has been given that the monthly amount of the tips which each waiter or bedroom boy receives totals up to Rs. 100 or more. Some of the workmen on the other hand gave evidence that the amount of the tips they receive does not exceed Rs. 15 a month. While it may be true that the amount of tips received by these workmen during the war years, when the hotels were fully occupied, may have been large, it is equally true that with the progressive decline in the number of customers at the hotels now, the amount of tips earned cannot be very much. It is, therefore, difficult to assess the amount of tips earned by these workmen. Nor do I consider it a basis for arriving at a decision as to the amount of the minimum basic wage. The managements of the Galle Face Hotel and the Grand Oriental Hotel were prepared to adopt what in Europe is known as the 'trone' system. According to this system, the management charges to each customer an extra percentage on the bill on account of service charges. The sum-total of the amount collected each month is distributed among all the employees on a graded basis. This system, though it has many points to commend it, was not acceptable to the Union. It seems to me that the imposition of the 'trone' system which is an innovation does not fall within the functions of this tribunal. The adoption of this system against the wishes of the employees would be an alteration in the present conditions of service and should, therefore not be undertaken. The resulting position is that such of the workmen as are at present accustomed to receive tips will continue to do so. I have given my most anxious consideration to the question whether there should be an improvement in the basic wages of the various employees as fixed by the previous award in November 1944. These wages were fixed when the cost of living was high and after a consideration of the demands by the Union as are embodied in the document P 2. The fact that the workmen receive free meals and uniforms and that some of them do receive tips are no doubt matters that should be taken into consideration in fixing the

amount of the basic wage. It is not possible to give to each category of employee a progressive increase in salary by automatic promotion to higher grades of salary. An efficient man if found suitable will no doubt be placed on a higher salary as determined by the management. The scale suggested in the documents P 2 and P 4 are in my opinion utterly beyond the capacity of any hotel to pay. I find it proved that the amount of income earned by all these hotels is progressively declining and will continue to go down until the tourist traffic is resumed. In these circumstances I find it difficult to make any improvement in the basic rates of wages as fixed by the previous award. I, therefore, award that the basic wages do remain as at present.

*Dearness Allowance.*—The demand of the Union is that the dearness allowance should be paid to each employee according to government scales. I find that payment according to that scale will be beyond the capacity of the hotels to pay.

I find, however, that since the date of the last award the cost of living index has gone up by about 50 per cent. It was probably for that reason that the hotels, except the Bristol Hotel, were prepared to increase the war allowance by 50 per cent. of the existing scale as fixed by the Roberts Award. I find, however, that the scale of war allowance as fixed by that Award is inordinately low. Taking into consideration the present cost of living, I fix the amount of war allowance payable to each class of employee as set out herein below.

*Provident Fund and Pension Scheme.*—I find that some of these hotels have a Provident Fund Scheme. The Galle Face Hotel has also been paying pensions to its employees. The previous award has formulated a Pension Scheme. Such of the schemes as are now in operation should no doubt be continued considering the financial implications involved. I do not think it opportune to formulate a general scheme for a Provident Fund and or Pensions binding upon all the hotels. My award is that such of the schemes as are now in operation should continue.”

#### THE INDUSTRIAL DISPUTE (CONCILIATION) ORDINANCE.

IN terms of section 8 of the Industrial Disputes (Conciliation) Ordinance (Chapter 110), it is hereby notified for general information that Mr. J. G. Scroggio for the Colombo Exchange Banks Association and Mr. H. A. Harden for the Imperial Bank of India, have intimated to the Commissioner of Labour, by their letter dated November 20, 1946, that they have accepted the settlement and recommendations which were published in the *Ceylon Government Gazette* No. 9,626 of November 8, 1946, subject to the qualification that the salary scale recommended for peons does not apply to peons and messenger boys under 18 years of age. As Mr. A. E. Goonesinha, President, Ceylon Bank Clerks Union, the representative of the employees, has failed to state in writing to the Commissioner of Labour, as required by section 7 (2) of the Ordinance, whether he accepts or rejects the said settlement and recommendations, he is deemed under section 7 (4) of the Ordinance to have accepted the said settlement and recommendations on behalf of the said employees.

#### LOAN BOARD.

##### Report for the Year, 1945.

THE annual report of the Commissioners of the Loan Board for the year, 1945, is submitted together with the statements of Loan Board Funds, duly audited by the Auditor-General.

*Loans.*—Loans amounting to Rs. 162,000, were granted during the year. The corresponding figure for the previous year was Rs. 380,500.

*Repayments.*—During the year a sum of Rs. 862,723·92, was received in repayment of principal. The corresponding figure for the previous year was Rs. 851,181·84.

*Interest.*—The amount of interest collected during the year, amounted to Rs. 710,225·19 as against Rs. 616,150·60 in 1944. The interest collected was insufficient in itself to pay the two half-yearly dividends and a sum of Rs. 37,242·33, was therefore withdrawn from Profits Account, to allow the payment of a total of 3½% per annum.

*Investments.*—During the year a sum of Rs. 3,050,000, was invested in sterling Securities, Rs. 552,120·79 in Indian securities and Rs. 1,388,500, in Ceylon securities.

**Internal Purchase Scheme.**

*Harvesting of Paddy and Kurakkan in Magam Pattu and East Giruwa Pattu of Hambantota District during Maha, 1947.*

BY virtue of the powers vested in me by the Defence (Miscellaneous) Regulations 37, Defence (Purchase of Food-stuffs) Regulations, 1942, and Defence (Paddy Cultivation) Regulations, 1943, I, Cedric James Oorloff, the Assistant Government Agent, Hambantota District, a competent and a proper authority, do hereby direct that every person whether owner or cultivator of any land which is cultivated with paddy or kurakkan within Magam Pattu and East Giruwa Pattu of the Hambantota District, and which is expected to be harvested before July 31, 1947, shall inform in writing, in the case of paddy fields the Vel-Vidane of the area in which the paddy field is situated, and in the case of kurakkan land the Village Headman of the area in which the kurakkan land is situated of :—

- the dates on which it is proposed to reap and thresh the harvest on the land ;
- the name, situation and extent of the land ;
- the names and addresses of the person or persons entitled to take or receive any part of the produce of the land under any contract, agreement or otherwise ; and
- the details of the share or shares of the produce to which such person or persons may be entitled.

Notice under sub-section (a) shall be given not less than ten clear days before the commencement of the operation notified. Notice under sub-section (b), (c) and (d) shall be given within ten days of the commencement of sowing.

2. I further direct that :—

(a) every shareholder whether owner, cultivator or otherwise, who, being resident in East Giruwa Pattu and Magam Pattu is entitled to take or receive any part of the produce of any paddy field or fields shall furnish me (i) within 15 days from the date of publication of this notice, a declaration on Form IPS 4 or 4 (a) of the shares he is entitled to receive during the cultivation season Maha 1947, (IPS 4 or 4 (a) forms could be obtained from the Village Headman of the area where the paddy field is situated or from this office on application); (ii) within ten days from the date of receipt of all particulars called for by form IPS 6, copies of which will be posted on receipt of the perfected forms IPS 4 or 4 (a) a declaration on form IPS 6 or 6(a), using a separate form for each Pattu or D. R. O's Division. The declarant should also specify the field or fields from which he proposes to draw his consumption allowance.

*N.B.*—The liability of ensuring the receipt of the particulars called for, rests with the declarant.

(b) paddy or kurakkan shall not be removed from the threshing-floor or chena to a barn or any other place until (i) the Field Assistant or Vel-Vidane or other person authorised by me, shall have inspected the floor and recorded the total harvest and shares, (ii) a permit on an IPS 33 form has been issued by the Vel-Vidane or other person authorised by me, (iii) the person removing has signed the form in triplicate, (iv) the levy of two bushels of paddy per acre shall have been handed over to the Vel-Vidane or transported to the nearest Government Purchasing Centre on a permit from the Vel-Vidane;

(c) no part of the paddy so removed shall be used for consumption until after the surrender of the appropriate number of coupons to the Village Headman for such paddy at the rate of 5 or 8 coupons per bushel, per person according as whether the field owner is an owner cultivator or a non-cultivating owner. (The approved rates of consumption paddy are 6 measures per head per week for owner cultivators and their dependents and 4 measures per head per week for non-cultivating owners and their dependents, up to a maximum of 50 bushels per household per cultivating season);

(d) no paddy other than paddy allowed for consumption and seed and feeding allowances at the authorised rates shall be transported or disposed of, except to a Government Purchasing Centre;

(e) the permits on the Form I.P.S. 33 for removal from the threshing-floor to the barn or place of storage, shall be surrendered to the Village Headman of the division in which the barn or place of storage is situated, as soon as the removal is completed and in any case not more than two days after the permit has lapsed.

*N.B.*—Every shareholder of fields situated in Magam Pattu and East Giruwa Pattu of the Hambantota District who does not comply with the above instructions will be liable to prosecution without further notice.

3. Permits for the removal of paddy from the threshing-floor direct to a Government Purchasing Centre situated in the same Divisional Revenue Officer's division will be issued by the Vel-Vidane. Permits for the removal of kurakkan from the chena to a Government Purchasing Centre, situated within the same Divisional Revenue Officer's division will be issued by the Village Headman. Permits for the removal of paddy or kurakkan from a bari or store-house to a Purchasing Centre situated within the same Pattu will be issued by the Village Headman of the place where the barn is situated.

4. For transport from one Divisional Revenue Officer's division to another or from one Emergency Assistant Government Agent's area to another or from one district to another, applications on the prescribed form should be made to the Deputy Food Controller or the Assistant Government Agent (Emergency) of the area where the applicant resides.

5. All walahans are advised, before commencing work, to register their names with the Cultivation Officer, sign the register and declare the fields in which they will be working. No applications for removal of shares from a pattu will be entertained, unless the walahans' names have been registered on the Cultivation Officer's list prior to commencement of harvesting.

6. **MOTOR CAR ORDINANCE, No. 45 OF 1938.**

IN terms of section 46 of the Motor Car Ordinance, No. 45 of 1938, a list of applications for licences against the issue of licences, &c. :-

The following extract from the Ordinance applies to objections against the issue of licences, &c. :-  
 "46 (2). (a) Any licensing authority, within whose area any part of the area of operation proposed by any applicant for a licence for a lorry is situated, may make objection against the issue of that licence on payment of the prescribed fee, make objection against the issue of that licence for a lorry in respect of the whole or any part of the area of operation which is proposed by any other applicant may on payment of the prescribed fee, make objection against the issue of the licence to such other person.  
 (b) Any person who is the holder of a valid licence or who is himself an applicant for a licence for a lorry in respect of the whole or any part of the area of operation which is proposed by any other applicant may, on payment of the prescribed fee, make objection against the issue of the licence to such other person.  
 (4) Any person, who is entitled under sub-section (2) to make objections to the issue of a licence for a lorry, shall be payable by any licensing authority in respect of the inspection of any application."  
 Objections must be made in the manner stated below to the Commissioner of Motor Transport, Colombo, so as to be received by him not later than 2 P.M., ON WEDNESDAY, DECEMBER 11, 1946. Where the objection is made by any body corporate or firm, it shall be signed by a person duly authorized in that behalf by such body or partner of the firm, as the case may be.  
 2. Every objection shall be made in duplicate and the original shall, where the objection is made by any person other than a licensing authority, bear stamps (uncancelled) to the value of Rs. 2-50.  
 3. Every statement of objection shall set out the specific grounds on which the objection is based and shall indicate, by reference to the name of the applicant for the licence and to the distinctive number of the motor car the application in respect of which the objection is made.  
 4. No objection relating to more than one motor car shall be made in any one statement of objection. Any objections not conforming to these requirements will be of no avail.  
 Objectors under section 46 (2) are requested to state clearly in their objections the facts entitling them to object, *i.e.*, whether they are holders of valid licences or are themselves applicants for licences for lorries in respect of the whole or any part of the area of operation and additional services proposed by any applicant. They are also requested to give the registered number of their vehicles in the area applied for or cite the serial number of their applications as listed in the *Gazette*.  
 If the objection is in respect of any application for a licence for a lorry "under construction" the serial number given to the application in the list should be quoted.

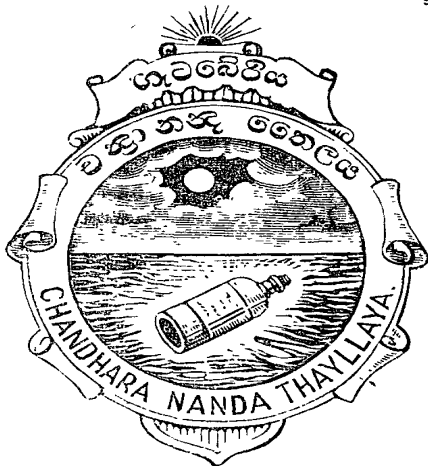

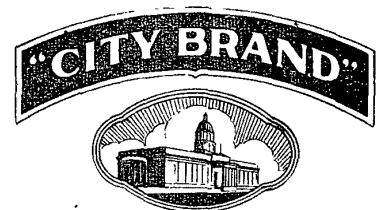
