TRADE DISPUTE—PORT OF COLOMBO.

of the other part,

was referred by me for settlement on April 19, 1946, to the District Judge, Colombo, under the provisions of the Essential Services (Avoidance of Strikes and Lockouts) Order, 1942, as amended by Order published in *Government Gazette* No. 9,463 of September 24, 1945.

An award was made on April 24, 1946, and this was published for general information in *Gazette* No. 9,546 of April 26, 1946.

As the said award contained no finding on the following matters in dispute referred for settlement:—

- (1) 45-hour week instead of 48 hours;
- (2) Accident leave to be paid on 1st day and not on 8th day;
- (3) Pensions and gratuities;
- (4) House accommodation near harbour for harbour labour;
- (5) Stand-by wages of tally clerks—affecting shipping companies,

a motion was filed by me in the District Court to hear such evidence as the District Judge may deem necessary for the

investigation of the said matters in dispute and to embody his findings thereon in an award.

The following award dated November 22, 1946, made by the District Judge, Colombo, is published for general information in terms of section 8 (4) of the Essential Services (Avoidance of Strikes and Lockouts) Order, 1942.—

“The trade dispute referred to me for settlement dated April 19, 1946, under the provisions of the Essential Services (Avoidance of Strikes and Lockouts) Order contained several demands.

An award was originally made by me on April 24, 1946, but in regard to certain demands no award was made.

The Commissioner of Labour has moved that an award be made after an investigation and hearing evidence on the matters in dispute.

The matters in dispute were five. Mr. Nadesan who appeared for the Colombo Harbour Workers' Union and the All Ceylon Harbour and Dock Workers' Union stated he would only press for three of the demands. They are:—

- (1) A 45-hour week instead of 48 hours.
- (2) Accident leave to be paid on 1st day and not on 8th day.
- (3) Pensions and gratuities.

I.—Mr. Nadesan's arguments for getting a 45-hour week were that workers in Government Service get a 45½-hour week and also that the Engineering Wages Board a year ago has made such an award. Until that award was made all labour in the harbour had a 48-hour week.

When this award was made all labour in the harbour that could be brought in under the category of engineering labour had to comply with that award. Hence launchmen, cranesmen, blacksmiths, &c., since the date of the award March 1, 1946, do 45½ hours a week.

Mr. Nadesan's argument is that there should be no discrimination and that as one lot are given a 45½ hours week therefore the entire labour in the harbour must be treated in the same way.

I cannot accede to this argument. I do not see why skilled engineering labour should be classed with unskilled manual labour nor can I see any justification for the unskilled labourer to demand that he be given the same concessions given to skilled labour. If Mr. Nadesan's contention is sound he might equally contend that these two classes of labour should be treated alike even in regard to wages.

It is not leisure for these labourers that is demanded. It is not for a moment stated that their hours of work are too long. This demand is in reality a demand for increased wages. Government Factory workers cannot be compared with labour in the harbour. Harbour labour is casual in that it depends on shipping and there is nothing like regularity or consistency in the ships that call.

In factories and engineering trades the object of the 45-hour week is to give the labourers leisure. The present demand is for increase of pay in the guise of a demand for leisure.

In the Government Factory and the Harbour Engineer's Department work is continuous and sustained. It is not so in the Harbour where labour is casual in the sense that there is work only when ships call.

No evidence was led nor was any case made out that the labourers were inadequately paid. On the contrary the evidence showed that the labourers in the harbour are paid well and the conditions of service are better than in other trades.

Even when there is no work and the labourers are idle they are given stand-by pay. They get better rates of pay and overtime, and a free mid-day meal.

Again, it would appear from the evidence that a large majority of labourers cannot even get work for 45 hours in the week. Most of the labourers have work for only 3 or 4 days in the week. They have more leisure than regular labourers in other trades. What this demand amounts to then is not a demand for leisure but for a proportionate increase of wages—less work, more pay. If the demand succeeds it would mean the increase of the basic pay and a consequent increase in overtime pay.

The Competent Authority has been given the power to fix rates of pay and determine the conditions of service. He has done so. There has been no evidence led to show that he has not considered the facts or acted in an arbitrary manner. No tribunal would be justified in overriding the decisions of the Competent Authority unless it has been proved to the satisfaction of the Tribunal that the Competent Authority has acted perversely or grossly erred in the exercise of his discretion.

The learned Attorney-General who was only concerned with the public interest pointed out that a shorter week or increased pay would be detrimental to the port itself as well as affect other trades. He also demonstrated by means of graphs that it would seriously affect employment and it would be the labourers who would ultimately suffer.

Evidence was also led to show that other ports which are rivals to Colombo would benefit and the Port of Colombo would suffer. In no other port does a 45-hour week operate. Cochin, Colombo's greatest rival has a 12-hour day.

Having considered all the arguments and the evidence I do not consider the demand reasonable and I accordingly reject it.



II.—The demand for accident leave to be paid on the first day and not on the 8th day raises a very large question.

The Workmen's Compensation Ordinance, No. 19 of 1934, Vol. III., Chap. 117 makes provision for payment of compensation to workmen for injuries sustained by accident arising out of and in the course of their employment. Section 6 of that Ordinance provides for the amount of compensation, and in the case of temporary disablement "a half monthly payment payable on the sixteenth day after the expiry of a waiting period of seven days from the date of the disablement." If all workmen, whatever their occupation may be, are governed by the Workmen's Compensation Ordinance and are paid compensation in case of accident after a waiting period of seven days, I do not think any tribunal would be justified except for very good reason in making special provision for any particular class of labour.

If the waiting period of seven days is not warranted or desirable it is a matter for the legislature and no evidence was even led to show that the legislation as it exists is unreasonable. I can see no reason why a labourer in the harbour, in whatever category he falls, should have special consideration in regard to compensation for accident or accident leave.

Mr. Nadesan pointed out that in the award made in the dispute between the All Ceylon Tea and Rubber Workers Union and Messrs. Harrisons & Crossfield, Ltd., the labourers were to be given leave on full-pay if disabled by accident on the same regulations which govern such leave in Government Service (P 6)\*.

According to Financial Regulations (P 7)\* accident leave for one month on full pay may be granted by the Head of a Department provided there is a medical certificate to the effect that the employee is unfit for duty for any specified period as a consequence of the accident and that he is undergoing suitable treatment. The same objection that harbour labour cannot be treated in the same way owing to the casual nature of it, applies even to this demand.

The award (P 6) dealt with regular workers with a more or less guaranteed tenure of office, and therefore they were dealt with in the same way as those in Government Service. The labour in the harbour where work is not available for all the workers, where stand-by pay is given to idlers, cannot possibly be treated in the matter of accident leave similarly to those in Government Service who are in regular employment and not employed casually.

This demand is therefore rejected.

III.—There remains the demand for Pensions and Gratuities. Mr. Nadesan relied on certain awards made for the payment of pensions in accordance with a scheme operating in the firm of George Steuart & Co. (P 8)\*.

In those cases too the class of workers was entirely different to the Harbour Workers. One cannot think of any practicable pension scheme for the casual labourer in the harbour. Any such scheme presupposes a continuous existence of the employer and continuous and regular labour. There was no evidence led to show that a scheme was practicable, nor was there any formulated scheme.

In this dispute the employers are ten different firms. It would be absurd to treat them all alike in the matter of paying pensions and gratuities by an award in this "dispute".

Before any such award can be made there should be evidence (1) of the employer's ability financially to provide for pensions and gratuities, (2) of the number of labourers that are permanently employed in each of the ten firms, and (3) whether they are regularly employed and given work.

Mr. Nadesan contended that a pension scheme could be established affecting the labourers who are on the permanent staff of each of the ten firms. Undoubtedly such a scheme would be desirable but no evidence has been led to show that there is a substantial number of permanently employed regular employees in these firms for whom no pension fund or provident fund exists.

Where, as in the case of most of the harbour workers, there is no regular contract of service or any permanent continuing relationship between employer and employee, a pension scheme seems inappropriate, even if it were practicable.

The learned Attorney-General rightly pointed out that the question of Pensions and Gratuities was a matter of national policy and should not be considered by this tribunal where only a section of workers was involved. He cited a *Gazette* Notification of September 19, 1944, where the whole question was referred to a Commission who would report on the matter of Pensions and make suggestions for "social legislation".

Mr. Chitty also urged that this demand was not one that should be allowed by this tribunal for a very good reason. This tribunal is constituted by Emergency legislation to deal with and settle disputes during the emergency. Any pension scheme will have to operate in future years and so any award made by this tribunal may not be enforceable after the emergency, say 10 years hence.

Having considered all the arguments of Counsel, I cannot find that this demand is reasonable or that it should be granted and I reject it.

All these demands affect the community at large and the public interest, inasmuch as they are concerned with the Port of Colombo.

Even in the interest of labour generally the demands are such as ought not to be allowed. The wages and hours of work are fixed by the Competent Authority who is empowered to do so under Defence Regulations. It has not been shown to me that the Competent Authority has acted unreasonably or in any arbitrary manner. The evidence shows that the granting of these demands would be detrimental to employment in the harbour (see graphs X 6 and X 7)\* and workers will eventually have no benefit. The three demands pressed by Mr. Nadesan are therefore rejected. I also make a formal award rejecting the other two demands that were not pressed.

I would finally place on record my appreciation of the valuable assistance afforded by the learned Attorney-General, and the evidence he placed before the tribunal."

TRADE DISPUTE—W. H. BUS CO., LTD.,  
RIKILLAGASKADA.

THE Lanka Motor Workers' Union, Kandy, presented a petition to me under section 6 (1) of the Essential Services (Avoidance of Strikes and Lockouts) Order, 1942, with regard to a trade dispute that had arisen between the said Union and the W. H. Bus Company, Limited, Rikillagaskada. The petition was referred to a Special Tribunal appointed by His Excellency the Governor under the proviso to section 5 of the same order for adjudication.

The following findings and award dated November 20, 1946, made by the Special Tribunal are published for general information in terms of section 8 (4) of the above mentioned Order :—

"This petition relates to the re-instatement in employment of two workmen who were dismissed from the service of the respondent company. The demand for the re-instatement of Appuhamy, who was the conductor employed in the bus in question, has been withdrawn. The workman William was the cleaner in this bus. On the day in question he appears to have acted as conductor during the absence of Appuhamy. Unfortunately for him, Attanayake, an Inspector employed by the respondent company, boarded the bus of which William was then in charge as conductor. There were at that time 26 passengers. Only 23 tickets had been issued, although the fares had probably been collected from all the passengers. On being questioned William had no explanation to offer nor did he say that his failure to write out the 3 tickets was due to want of time.

On a report made by Attanayake to the Managing Director, William was suspended and after further inquiry his services were discontinued. He was paid his salary for March which he received without any protest.

I am not prepared to accept the explanation given by William, as I am satisfied that there was just and lawful cause for his dismissal. I refuse to order his re-instatement and make award accordingly".

Of the sum of Rs. 14,433·65 received from Co-operative Societies Rs. 4,905·37 represents interest on loans to the Jaffna Malayalam Tobacco Co-operative Sales Society, Ltd.

Loans.—As in the previous year, the amount of loans granted has been comparatively small. No loans were obtained by Government Officers for building houses or Sanitary Boards and Village Committees for any of their purposes. A sum of Rs. 25,000 was borrowed by the Municipal Council, Galle, and Rs. 337,250 by 3 Urban Councils. Co-operative Societies, on the other hand, have sought comparatively larger loans. The Jaffna Malayalam Tobacco Co-operative Sales Society, Ltd., obtained a loan of Rs. 100,000 but refunded it almost immediately. The balance of Rs. 534,550 was mainly obtained by Co-operative Stores Societies which were established during the period of emergency to deal in rationed goods.

[Section 26 (1) (c) of Ordinance No. 20 of 1942.]

STATUTE XX. of the University of Ceylon having been amended by the Court and assented to by the Chancellor is published in accordance with section 27 (5) of the Ceylon University Ordinance No. 20 of 1942.

*Statute XX.*

The scales of salaries set forth below shall apply to appointments after January 1, 1947:—

(i.) *Officers.—*

The Registrar and the Librarian .. Rs. 8,400 to Rs. 12,000 by two annual increments of Rs. 360 and six annual increments of Rs. 480.

(ii.) *Teachers.—*

- (a) Professors .. Rs. 14,400 to Rs. 18,000 by six annual increments of Rs. 600.
- (b) Readers .. Rs. 10,800 to Rs. 13,200 by five annual increments of Rs. 480.
- (c) Lecturers, Grade I .. Rs. 8,400 to Rs. 12,000 by two annual increments of Rs. 360 and six annual increments of Rs. 480
- (d) Lecturers, Grade II .. Rs. 6,000 to Rs. 8,160 by six annual increments of Rs. 360.
- (e) Assistant Lecturers .. Rs. 4,800.

Provided that, where in the opinion of the Council the University's requirement of professional qualifications makes appointment in a higher scale reasonable and desirable, the scales of salaries set forth below may apply to appointments after January 1, 1947:—

- (a) Reader . . . . . Rs. 11,280 to Rs. 13,680 by five annual increments of Rs. 480.  
 (b) Lecturers Grade, I. . . . . Rs. 8,880 to Rs. 13,200 by nine annual increments of Rs. 480.  
 (c) Lecturers, Grade II. . . . . Rs. 6,240 to Rs. 8,400 by six annual increments of Rs. 360.

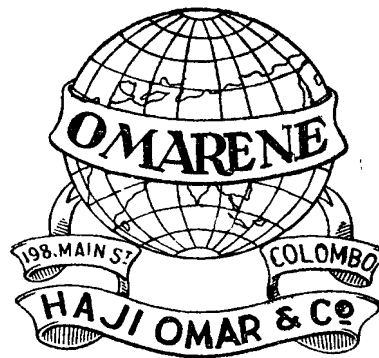

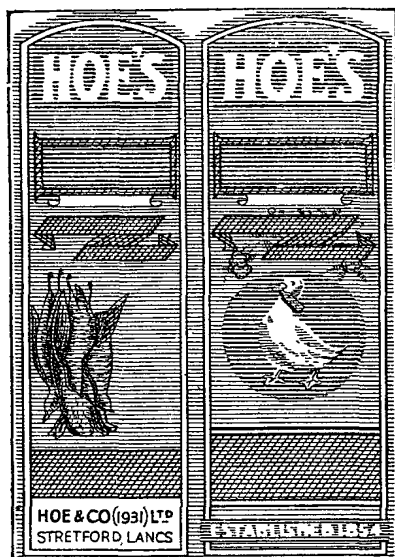
